### SUMMARY:

- The BC Community Forest Association (BCCFA) will want to introduce the minister to their directors and invite the minister to their annual general meeting scheduled for summer 2024.
   Each year the BCCFA publishes an Indicators Report that summarizes activities on community forest agreements (CFAs) and is widely distributed through government: https://bccfa.ca/indicators-report/.
- The BCCFA supports greater emphasis on wildfire management and the concept of a wildfire
  objective to reduce risk to communities from catastrophic wildfire. The current priority of the
  BCCFA is engagement on the addition of "wildfire" to the suite of Forest and Range Practices
  Act (FRPA) values through Bill 23.
- In 2018, the BC Wildfire Service developed the Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) Risk Class
  Framework based on structure density to support initiatives related to wildfire risk reduction
  (WRR). Most community forest agreements (CFAs) have portions of their tenures that overlap
  with areas in the WUI. Staff have been engaging with the BCCFA since November 2022
  through the Wildfire Regulation Working Group (WRWG) and the Office of the Chief Forester.
- The BCCFA has three areas of concern related to the WUI, and believe the outcome may be that legislation will create a significant financial disincentive to critically important WRR work:
  - CFAs currently benefit from a discounted tabular rate stumpage and there are challenges in reaching agreement as to how to acknowledge the costs of fuel treatments in the Stumpage System.
  - Once fuel treatments become a legal requirement, CFAs are concerned they will be unable to obtain outside funding to support fuel treatments.
  - There are also concerns around the level of treatments that will be required given there
    has been limited operational engagement with industry. FOR is proposing the
    regulation would provide authority to the chief forester to establish standards. The
    BCCFA would prefer standards be discussed prior to any regulatory authority being
    established.
- Another priority for the BCCFA is maintenance of the discounted tabular rate pricing and the
  one-cutting permit (CP) model. The group is aware of the challenges government has
  rationalizing this model in discussion with First Nations, and over time has engaged in
  discussions with Forest Tenures Branch and Timber Pricing Branch.

### STRATEGIC CONSIDERATION AND MESSAGES:

- Government recognizes the leadership role the Community Forest Program demonstrates in the province.
- In light of recent wildfire seasons, including the 2023 season, and the impacts to interface communities across North America, including B.C., government is taking a multifaceted approach, which includes regulating forest practices in combination with funding to reduce risks to communities and fire fighting personnel.
- Community forests have played an important role as proponents of historic and current WRR
  treatments. In response to feedback from the BCCFA, I have directed staff to continue
  working with your board through the WRWG, established in November 2022.
- Staff have heard the BCCFA concern that establishing legal requirements in FRPA may limit
  access to WRR funding; and concern that the Appraisal System will not fully account for costs
  of treatments for tenures, like community forests, who are eligible to use the discounted
  stumpage rates.
- We will work towards a solution that enables community forests to continue harvesting and treating the WUI with a cost structure that will minimize additional costs to CFAs
- I acknowledge your concerns around the transition between regulatory mechanisms and chief forester standards being in force. Staff will continue to work with you as we develop these standards using a continuous improvement approach to make adjustments as needed.
- I recognize the importance of tabular rates and the one-CP model to the success of the program, in its current form. Government is also working on other priorities such as the New Fiscal Framework with First Nations, which may create challenges with the current model.
- I am aware of the strong relationships you have built with government staff and that much of the work with this ministry is coordinated through a Joint Working Group (JWG) with Forest Tenures Branch. I encourage you to continue to raise any issues through the JWG.
- I have been advised that there is a directors' meeting scheduled in Victoria on November 29, 2023, and I will see if my schedule allows me to attend a portion of the meeting.
   I hope that senior executive will be available to participate in the discussions.
- Please advise me once you have selected dates for the BCCFA AGM in 2024, I would be interested in attending.
