has asked to remain anonymous with this report so I am doing it on their behalf.

Rumor's were swirling a month ago that Retallack (who has a license of occupation for both cat skiing and mountain biking) was planning on cutting down trees to block access and use of the mountain bike trails that they built and use. These trails are on Crown Land and as a condition of license are open and available for public use.

I met with Tracy Ronmark (director of Lands) a few weeks ago and brought this to her attention and asked her to look into it (she did not).

Last week someone felled many trees blocking access to many of the trees under license to Retallack including large diameter merch trees. Obviously the local community suspects that Retallack was behind this and is asking for a investigation and remediation.

Details of the violation

Retallack appears to have felled trees in contravention of Schedule A of their Occupant License to Cut.

I heard through the grapevine that Retallack had felled hundred of trees, including some old growth, to block access to the mountain bike trails on Stenson FSR. I went to check it out and I found about 40-50 recently felled trees blocking several of the bike trails. I noted one high value old growth Cedar snag (80cm DBH) that had been felled and a mix of live & dead non-merchantable and merchantable stems ranging between 12.5cm-40cm.

I had a look into their OLTC License document (L51456), and under 3.00 Timber Harvest Limitations it states "The Licensee must comply with the forestry legislation and the conditions and requirements set out in Schedule A to this Licence."

Schedule A of the license states that the Licensee must prepare, sign, and submit an Annual Plan for the OLTC Exhibit A area, and that this plan must be approved.

I looked at the L51456 Annual Plan, and there was no reference to the felling of trees to restrict access to the mountain bike trails. Therefore, this tree felling does not appear to be consistent with their OLTC.

Also 6.00 of the Scehdule A stahts that the licensee must leave areas "in an orderly and sanitary condition". The areas where tree felling has occured, are not orderly or sanitary.

Retallack appears to have felled trees in contravention of Schedule A & B of the Occupant License to Cut L51456.

I heard through the grapevine that Retallack had felled hundred of trees, including some old growth, to block access to the mountain bike trails on Stenson FSR. I went to check it out on November 27, 2023, and I found about 50-60 recently felled trees blocking several of the bike trails. I noted one high value old growth Cedar snag (80cm DBH) that had been felled and a mix of live & dead non-merchantable and merchantable stems ranging between 12.5cm-40cm.

I had a look into their OLTC License document (L51456), and under 3.00 Timber Harvest Limitations it states "The Licensee must comply with the forestry legislation and the conditions and requirements set out in Schedule A to this Licence."

Schedule A of the license states that the Licensee must prepare, sign, and submit an Annual Plan for the OLTC Exhibit A area, and that this plan must be approved. I looked at the L51456 2023 Annual Plan, and there was no reference to the felling of trees to restrict access to the mountain bike trails. Therefore, this tree felling does not appear to be consistent with the OLTC.

Also 6.00 of the Schedule A states that the licensee must leave areas "in an orderly and sanitary condition". The areas where tree felling has occured, are not orderly.

Schedule B states: "1.00 The Licensee must not cut any timber unless authorized to do so in this License. and the Annual Plan". Given that cutting trees to restrict access to trails was not identified in the 2023 Annual Plan, the felling that took place does not appear to be consistent with the Schedule B.

It also seems somewhat problemtatic to fall trees (green, merchantable, high value wildflife snags, etc) as a means to limit public access to crown lands.
