Volunteers spring into action to install new playground

VICTORIA – A team of volunteers and public servants are pitching in to assemble a new playground at the Victoria Courthouse today, creating a fun and interactive play space in the heart of Victoria for people of all ages to enjoy.

The playground assembly team includes members of the B.C. public service, Christ Church Cathedral Parish and School community, Our Place, and former tent city campers.

The 540 square-metre (5,800 square-foot) playground will include equipment chosen by children attending Christ Church Cathedral and Sir James Douglas Elementary schools, and will include swings, slides, climbing nets, a toddler play area and a spinning globe. The redesigned property will feature chess tables, benches and a rubberized safety surface with artistic designs.

The space will include a permanent monument to Canadian Afghanistan veterans. The memorial is a project financed by the Greater Victoria Afghanistan Memorial Project Society, which is currently fundraising to create this memorial. The memorial will be dedicated to all Canadians who served in Afghanistan. It will recognize the families and loved ones of those who served and those who returned with physical and mental wounds, while honouring those Canadian Armed Forces and Public Service of Canada members who paid the supreme sacrifice.

Habitat Systems Incorporated will be on site to guide volunteers through the installation and will conduct a safety inspection following its assembly. For easy assembly, all tools required for the day, including levels, hammers, hand drills, nails and shovels, will be supplied.

A generous donor, who wishes to remain anonymous, has contributed \$150,000 toward the cost of the playground equipment. Tire Stewardship B.C. has donated \$80,000 toward the rubberized safety surface. The Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens' Services has contributed an additional \$50,000 toward the playground.

A playground emerged as the most-popular choice for the block-wide site during discussions with neighbours. The playground is expected to be ready to open to the public this spring, once the rubberized safety surface is poured and landscaping is completed.

- Consultations for redeveloping the site included local residents, the YMCA, the Christ Church Cathedral and students at Christ Church Cathedral and Sir James Douglas Elementary schools.
- Landscaping will feature 17 new trees, including two maidenhair, one southern catalpa, two Raywood ash, six eastern redbud and six Kwanzan cherry trees.
- In 2015-16, the B.C. government spent close to \$5 million to provide housing and shelter for residents of the Victoria courthouse encampment.

Questions and Answers

Victoria Courthouse Playground Opening

March 17, 2017

1. What is being announced today?

- A team of volunteers and public servants are pitching in to assemble a new playground at the Victoria Courthouse, creating a fun and interactive play space in the heart of Victoria for people of all ages to enjoy.
- The playground assembly team includes members of the B.C. public service, Christ Church Cathedral Parish and School community, Our Place, and former tent city campers.
- The playground will include equipment that over 500 children who attend nearby schools have helped to select including swings, slides, climbing nets, a toddler play area, and a spinning globe.
- There will also chess tables, benches and a rubberized safety surface with artistic designs.
- The playground is scheduled to open to the public this spring, once the rubberized safety surface and landscaping is completed.

2. Playgrounds are typically owned by municipalities, does the B.C. government own other playgrounds?

- Yes. For example, provincial parks and campgrounds often feature large playgrounds.
- In the case of the Victoria Courthouse playground, the land is owned by the Province.

3. How did the idea of a "volunteer day" come about?

- The idea of using volunteers to assemble the playground equipment first came from the supplier, Habitat Systems, who offers a supervised community installation model as one of their services.
- Ministry staff jumped at the chance to organize this unique opportunity as a way of giving back and creating a safe public space and playground that the community can enjoy.

4. How were the volunteers selected?

• A call for volunteers was put out to ministry staff and organizations that were instrumental to providing supports to the former tent city camp, as well as former tent city campers.

5. Are the public service volunteers being paid their regular wage?

- While the public service employees are going to be paid their regular salary for the day, it's
 important to note that these employees are participating as volunteers. Employees are not
 being directed by the Province to attend, they are doing so at their own choice.
- The number of public service staff was capped at 15 to ensure members of other organizations could be involved.

6. Were residents in the area invited to volunteer?

 Given the level of interest, the call for volunteers was limited to ministry staff and organizations that were instrumental to providing supports to the former tent city camp, as well as former tent city campers.

7. Who was consulted on building a playground on the site?

- Four separate discussions were held with neighbours of the site.
- In addition, discussions have also been held with the YMCA, the Christ Church Cathedral and the Christ Church Cathedral School.
- In addition, design input has been sought by over 500 children who attend nearby schools, including Christ Church Cathedral School and Sir James Douglas Elementary School.

8. Were there other suggestions for the site that came up in the consultations?

• Discussions with neighbours showed an overwhelming interest in turning the space into a playground. Out of respect for the neighbours, the idea for the playground was pursued.

BUDGET/FUNDING

9. What is the estimated budget of the playground?

- Including the contributions of our generous donors, the total cost of the playground is approximately \$50,000.
- We have received \$230,000 in donations that will go towards the costs of the playground. The ministry has contributed \$50,000.
- The total cost of fully restoring the greenspace, including soil remediation, landscaping, security fencing and installation of a playground will be around \$770-thousand.

10. Did government save money by using volunteers to assemble the equipment?

- The ministry gained some savings, about \$5,000, within the contract with Habitat Systems by using the supervised community installation model.
- We were able to put this savings towards the purchase of additional play equipment.

11. How much has the Province paid for the site since the first tent went up, including the playground and landscaping and such?

- Altogether, the Province has spent approximately \$2.1-million for costs associated with the encampment and for the revitalized playground space.
- These costs include:
 - \$1.3M: security, garbage collection, port-a-potties and upkeep, gravel, water hookup, power installation, BC Hydro service, fencing and demolition.
 - \$770K: remediation, playground, landscape architecture, project management.

12. Any update on the legal fees that the Province is being ordered to pay?

- The Province is disputing some of the claimed fees and disbursements and has asked counsel for the campers for a revised bill of costs and disbursements.
- We won't know the total payment of costs in this matter until the Province has received a
 revised bill of costs, and either agrees to the amounts, or the amount is settled by the
 registrar.
- Once we are in receipt of that revised bill, the Province will pay the amount.

AFGHAN MEMORIAL

13. What can you tell us about a memorial to Afghan veterans, we hear that's part of the plan for the site, is it?

- The Greater Victoria Afghanistan Memorial Society was formed to create a memorial to Canadian Afghan veterans. The restoration of the Courthouse Greenspace presented an ideal opportunity to design the site in harmony with a memorial.
- The memorial is a project financed by the Greater Victoria Afghanistan Memorial Society, who is currently seeking donations to create this memorial to Canadian Afghan veterans.
- We are honoured to be able to provide a site for the memorial. The people who have given their lives in the service of Canada deserve to be recognized.

14. Who is paying for this?

• The memorial is led by the Greater Victoria Afghanistan Memorial Society and funded through donations to the society.

15. How was this location selected for the memorial?

- The Victoria Courthouse property is a good location for the memorial as it's a centralized downtown location and is fully accessible.
- The society requested this location to be considered for the memorial, and they are pleased with the design presented.

16. Had any other groups come forward requesting a similar memorial in this space and if so, why was this one chosen?

• There were no other memorials requested to go into the space.

17. How many Afghan veterans are there in Victoria? In B.C.?

 More than 40,000 Canadian Armed Forces members served in Afghanistan from 2001 to 2014. During Canada's longest military campaign, 158 Canadian soldiers and five members of the Public Service of Canada lost their lives.

SUPPLIER

18. How was the supplier selected?

- Habitat Systems was selected from a pre-existing corporate supply arrangement with the Ministry of Education.
- They are a Canadian supplier with offices throughout western Canada, including one in Burnaby.

19. Are there any B.C. suppliers that could have been chosen?

 There are a number of suppliers on the corporate supply arrangement with the Ministry of Education.

<u>SAFETY</u>

20. Is a courthouse really the best place for a playground?

- Every effort has been made to transform the space into a safe space for kids and families to enjoy and we are confident in the security mechanisms in place at the courthouse.
- The space has been designed with security in mind. For example, the new landscaping will
 provide clear sightlines of the space which will increase public safety. Overhead lighting will
 also be installed.
- Victoria police have conducted a security analysis of the courthouse site and advised on crime prevention through environmental design.

21. What would you say to parents who say they wouldn't take their kids to this playground in case there are still needles or contaminants?

- We have complete confidence that the site will be safe for everyone to enjoy. The extensive clean-up and remediation work, including removing the contaminated soil, provides us with the reassurance that the space is safe for kids and families.
- The site is now deemed to be clean to an urban park standard according to the Ministry of Environment regulations.
- The rubberized safety surface has the added benefit of not concealing sharp objects, as can be the case with other surface treatments.
- The space has been designed with security in mind. For example, the new landscaping will
 provide clear sightlines of the space which will increase public safety. Overhead lighting will
 also be installed.
- We are confident in the security mechanisms in place at the courthouse.

22. If a kid is hurt or injured on the site or playground, than who is liable?

- In Canada, there are case law precedents for injuries occurring at playgrounds. The law allows governments to install playgrounds in public spaces, provided they are properly manufactured, maintained and installed. The BC Government will only install CSA approved equipment with a manufacturer's warranty and that is what is happening here.
- Habitat Systems will conduct a safety inspection once the equipment is assembled and issue a 100-year warranty on the equipment.

23. Who will be responsible for maintaining the property?

• The Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens' Services will retain ownership of the site and be responsible for its maintenance.

SOIL REMEDIATION

24. What was the total cost of the soil remediation?

Soil remediation has been completed on budget at \$350,000.

25. Whose decision was it to send the contaminated soil to Tervita in the Highlands?

- My ministry contracted the services of Pinchin, one of Canada's largest environmental, engineering, health and safety consulting firms.
- Pinchin subcontracted Tervita to remove and dispose of the soil appropriately.
- Tervita is certified by the Ministry of Environment and satisfies the requirements set out by both the Province and the Capital Regional District.
- Tervita's Highwest facility was included as an option in the bid they provided.

26. Was it the Minister or Ministry that ultimately signed off this decision?

- Our contractor, Pinchin West Ltd. tendered the soil removal through a competitive bid process and ultimately chose Tervita.
- Pinchin discussed its decision with Shared Services BC and our outsourced property management company – WSI Inc.
- Tervita is a certified soil recovery company operating since 1979, with dozens of facilities across Canada.
- Their Highwest facility was included as an option in their bid.

27. Why would your ministry pay for the soil disposal but not pick the company doing it?

- Through a competitive bid process, my ministry subcontracted Pinchin, which has the requisite experience and knowledge to select the best soil disposal company for the job.
- I am told that cost effectiveness and proximity to the courthouse site were considerations In Pinchin's selection of Tervita, through a competitive bid process.

If pressed as to the number of bidders:

• I am told there were a total of four bidders seeking to dispose of the soil.

28. Why this particular location in the Highlands?

- That was a decision made by Tervita upon competing and winning the competitive bid process.
- That said, I am told that cost effectiveness and proximity to the courthouse site were considerations in Tervita's decision.

29. How was the soil disposed of? Was it treated?

- Given the type of contaminates found on the site, Tervita's Highwest facility met the requirements necessary to dispose of the soil and is certified by the Ministry of Environment to do so.
- The soil has been disposed of at that site according to Ministry of Environment and CRD regulations.

30. What contaminants did you find in the soil?

- Testing of soil samples determined several contaminants, including lead, gasoline, diesel and trace amounts of methamphetamines were found in the soil.
- Previously contaminated soil has been removed, and in its place 1.5 feet of new top soil has been laid to ensure that a safe environment has been created.
- The site is now deemed to be clean to an urban park standard according to the Ministry of Environment regulations.

31. What can you tell me about pest control on the site?

- Pest control is completed for the most part, however some rodent traps remain at the site to ensure the population doesn't return.
- The rodent population has been reduced significantly, allowing us to move into the remediation phase.

32. Are there still rats on site?

- It's important to keep in mind that rats exist all over the downtown of Victoria and will never be completely eradicated.
- That said, we are pleased with the results we've had on the pest control measures.

TREES/LANDSCAPING

33. Has there been a landscaper/designer involved in selecting the new trees?

• Both an arborist and a landscape architect have provided input into tree health and appropriate species. In total, 17 new trees will be planted.

34. Are these native trees? How were they selected?

- The 17 new trees have been selected by experts in the field based on a balance of considerations. The trees will be suited to the local climate, drought tolerant, easy to maintain and aesthetically pleasing.
- The design and placement of trees will provide a burst of spring colour (fuschia) and allow more sunlight to enter the centre of the site.

35. Can you remind me what trees were removed?

- Of the 20 trees previously on the courthouse site, 11 are healthy and have been preserved. Every effort was be made to preserve as many of the established trees as was safe.
- Nine trees were identified as having shallow roots making them unsafe and unlikely to survive the soil remediation. Those trees were removed and included seven Crimson King Maples, one Tree of Heaven and one Rubinia.

FORMER ENCAMPMENT:

36. Why not just return the space to its former state?

- We consulted with area neighbours and they overwhelmingly supported a community playground at the site.
- The courthouse site is in a nice centralized downtown location surrounded by a neighbourhood, schools, and a community YMCA.
- This playground will create a play space for families in the downtown core that doesn't currently exist.
- It will also bring vitality and energy to the site, and a playground was deemed the best way to encourage mixed use.

37. Will the homeless be able to camp there?

- No, there will be no overnight camping allowed on the site.
- The City of Victoria has a bylaw against overnight camping in playgrounds.
- In addition, the playground will be closed from dusk until dawn, with signage stating this.

38. Who will be enforcing that?

• It will be up to the Victoria Police Department to enforce the bylaw.

39. Did you choose a playground to keep the homeless away?

• Discussions with neighbours showed that there was overwhelming interest in turning the space into a playground.

- Additional, the City of Victoria had previously identified a need for a downtown playground.
 This playground will fulfill this need and create a play space for families in the downtown core that doesn't currently exist.
- The courthouse site is in a nice centralized downtown location surrounded by a neighbourhood, schools, and a community YMCA.
- The playground will also bring energy to the site, and the various features have been included for people of all ages to enjoy.

40. Why not build social housing for the homeless in this space?

- In October 2016, Premier Clark announced a \$45 million provincial investment in 500 new units of affordable housing in Victoria for individuals, seniors and families.
- We can generate more housing by reusing existing buildings for this purpose. We can also generate housing more quickly when we reuse existing buildings. That's what we did though the purchase of the former Central Care Home and the former Super 8 hotel.
- Since November 2015, the Province has invested approximately \$26 million to create more than 400 new units of shelter and transitional housing (includes 51 units at the former Super 8 hotel, which has not yet opened).
- That's in addition to the \$13 million that was provided in the community last year to support close to 990 housing units for the homeless.

41. Will you be dedicating the site to the homeless?

- This site has been used as a park for many years and is now being transformed into an amenity that offers enjoyment to all segments of society.
- We support an approach that is inclusive.

42. Will you consider putting a plaque on the site to commemorate the homeless that lived there?

- We always look to support those who are homeless by providing housing and services.
- Housing was provided for all of the homeless that were living on the site.
- In addition, Premier Clark announced a \$45 million provincial investment in 500 new units of affordable housing in Victoria for individuals, seniors and families.

43. How much money has the Province spent on this site since the homeless camp went up?

In addition to providing housing, provincial costs associated with managing the
encampment site were allocated for things such as security, garbage collection, port-apotties and upkeep, fire extinguishers, gravel, water hookup/service, power pole
installation, BC Hydro service, fencing and site demolition. These costs totalled
approximately \$1.3 million between December 2015 and October 2016.

- In 2015/16, the B.C. government spent close to \$5 million to provide housing and shelter for residents of the Victoria courthouse encampment.
- In 2016/17, the Province will spend approximately \$28 million, which includes capital costs for the Central Care Home, as well as the Super 8 hotel. This includes \$373,000 to PHS Community Services for support and outreach services at the encampment site between April and August 2016.
- The total cost of fully restoring the greenspace, including soil remediation, landscaping, security fencing and installation of a playground will be around \$1 million.

VICT IA - A team of volunteers and public servants are pitching in to assemble a new playground at the Victoria Courthouse today, creating a fun and interactive play space in the heart of Victoria for people of all ages to enjoy.

The playground assembly team includes members of the B.C. public service, Christ Church Cathedral Parish and School community, Our Place, and former tent city campers.

The 540 square-metre (5,800 square-foot) playground will include equipment chosen by children attending Christ Church Cathedral and Sir James Douglas Elementary schools, and will include swings, slides, climbing nets, a toddler play area and a spinning globe. The redesigned property will feature chess tables, benches and a rubberized safety surface with artistic designs.

The space will include a permanent monument to Canadian Afghanistan veterans. The memorial is a project financed by the Greater Victoria Afghanistan Memorial Project Society, which is currently fundraising to create this memorial. The memorial will be dedicated to all Canadians who served in Afghanistan. It will recognize the families and loved ones of those who served and those who returned with physical and mental wounds, while honouring those Canadian Armed Forces and Public Service of Canada members who paid the supreme sacrifice.

Habitat Systems Incorporated will be on site to guide volunteers through the installation and will conduct a safety inspection following its assembly. For easy assembly, all tools required for the day, including levels, hammers, hand drills, nails and shovels, will be supplied.

A generous donor, who wishes to remain anonymous, has contributed \$150,000 toward the cost of the playground equipment. Tire Stewardship B.C. has donated \$80,000 toward the rubberized safety surface. The Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens' Services has contributed an additional \$50,000 toward the playground.

A playground emerged as the most-popular choice for the block-wide site during discussions with neighbours. The playground is expected to be ready to open to the public this spring, once the rubberized safety surface is poured and landscaping is completed.

- * Consultations for redeveloping the site included local residents, the YMCA, the Christ Church Cathedral and students at Christ Church Cathedral and Sir James Douglas Elementary schools.
- * Landscaping will feature 17 new trees, including two maidenhair, one southern catalpa, two Raywood ash, six eastern redbud and six Kwanzan cherry trees.
- * In 2015-16, the B.C. government spent close to \$5 million to provide housing and shelter for residents of the Victoria courthouse encampment.
- * In 2016-17, the Province will spend approximately \$28 million, which includes capital costs for the Central Care Home, as well as the Super 8 hotel. This includes \$373,000 to Portland Hotel Society (PHS) Community Services for support and outreach services at the encampment site between April and August 2016.
- * As of January 2017, more than 260 people from the Victoria courthouse camp are housed at four different housing projects in the region.
- * To date, approximately 80 people from the courthouse encampment have moved into permanent housing.
