

Hi all,

With estimates slated to begin next week I wanted to give a brief run through of how it works and what we have scheduled.

How it works:

For those that are unfamiliar with it, estimates it the main way in which opposition gets to question the government on its finances. Estimates happens in two venues here, in "Committee B" (also called the big house) which takes place in the main chamber, or in "Committee A" (also called the little house) which takes place in the Douglas Fir Room. The opposition gets to nominate three ministry estimates to take place in the big house and all others occur in the little house. During your Ministers estimates they will answer questions from the opposition on almost anything that refers to their Ministry's.

Your Minister must be present for the duration of their estimates and you should coordinate with your DM's office to ensure your Minister is appropriately briefed ahead of time and that the required ministry staff are present with your minister during their estimates. On that note, if you have specific concerns about the order/timing of individual topics, crown corporations, etc, please reach out to your opposition critic to coordinate.

The schedule:

The little house will begin estimates this Monday and continue until all estimates are complete. Meanwhile, the big house will continue to debate legislation, then do estimates for the three ministries that were chosen(starting around Oct 16th), then go back to debating legislation. Below is the order in which ministries will do estimates, the approximate time the opposition thinks they will take, and a tentative schedule for next week. Also attached is a reference note on how long each Ministry took last year for you to have a rough idea of how long to expect.



Subject: Executive Message from Rebecca Denlinger: The Great B.C. ShakeOut



The Great B.C. ShakeOut

A damaging earthquake is a certainty for coastal British Columbia – one we need to be prepared for both as citizens and public service employees.

On **October 19**, we all have an opportunity to practice earthquake response and consider our overall personal preparedness during the <u>Great British Columbia ShakeOut</u>. Last year, more than 800,000 British Columbians took part, including many BC Public Service employees.

This year, my challenge to you is to reach 100 per cent BC Public Service participation, and take at least one new step to improve your readiness.

How do you participate?

Take part in the "Drop, Cover, Hold" event! Registration can be completed at the ministry or branch level by visiting the ShakeOutBC website. Ministries registering their entire organization should communicate this to all employees.

In the event of an earthquake, you must:

- **Drop:** Drop to the ground before the shaking drops you.
- Cover: Take shelter under a desk or table. If you're not near a heavy piece of furniture, protect your head and neck with your arms, and crawl to an interior wall if possible.
- Hold On: If you are under cover, hang on to it with one hand as it could bounce away, and protect your head and neck with the other hand. Be prepared for up to two minutes of shaking. When the shaking stops, count to 60. The simple act of counting can help you stay calm and regain the ability to think clearly. It also provides time for unstable objects to settle

before you get up.



Are you ready?

At home, I encourage you to ask the following questions:

- Do I have an emergency kit or enough emergency supplies to sustain my household for a week?
- Do I have an emergency plan that outlines how family members will respond to an earthquake, how we'll communicate afterwards and how we'll reunite if separated?

Considering these questions is critical. Taking one step towards personal preparedness today means you'll be better positioned to weather the worst. As public service employees, it also means we'll be able to assist with recovery efforts faster knowing the people we love are safe.

Earthquake response is an "in it together" prospect. We all need to be ready to do our part. For more information on emergency preparedness, please visit the <u>PreparedBC website</u>, and thank you in advance for rising to the challenge.

Further, I have used the term 'protest' but remind everyone that we are asserting our aboriginal rights as leaders and owners of these territories, and that we are not protesters but are in fact the authorities of these lands, waters and territories.

Gilakas'daxw'la Dzawada'enuxw, Kwikwasut'inuxw, Haxwa'mis, and Gwa'wa'enuxw of the Musgamagw tribes of Kingcome Inlet and surrounding territories,Â

We are aware of the recent developments and actions taken by the RCMP. We have reviewed the Protocol Agreement presented by the RCMP but were not able to come to an agreement or provide any feedback for revisions to the pending agreement. We understand that the RCMP have pressed charges against one of our most high ranked official Hereditary Chiefs of the Musgamagw Dzawada'enuxw, and couldn't be more disturbed. The RCMP have now acted before we were able to put the proper protocols in place. More concerning is that the RCMP, to date, have not taken the statements from our family members at Midsummer Island for a previous incident involving Marine Harvest staff, and the ill advised actions of Marine Harvest to remove occupation members personal property with knives or weapons. I have shared my concerns with Sgt. Michael Carey of the RCMP over a recorded telephone call dated Sept. 29th 2017.

We are demanding that Marine Harvest halt all operations and activities at Midsummer Island fish farm site until proper protocols are in place, and the measures of conflict resolution discussions can happen between all parties. Furthermore, we are calling for Marine Harvest to begin respecting and honouring the rights of the Musgamagw Dzawada'enuxw people to peacefully protest in their territory without anymore harassment by staff of Marine Harvest or the RCMP. This is the same company that was previously given a notice of eviction to take their business elsewhere. Marine Harvest has not respected our collective call to leave the territory peacefully, and therefore we will not honour their wishes to do the same. The Musgamagw, Mamalilikala or Namgis Nations are not being unreasonable. Marine Harvest Canada are the unreasonable party in this case, and after 30 years, we all remain positive in our decision to not have fish farms in our collective territorial waters. Marine Harvest continues to abuse our aboriginal right to have this position of protest, and we plan to challenge this in a Court of law.Â

We request that the RCMP remain a neutral party and to not take any further action against our members without proper investigations and consultations with all of the Hereditary Chiefs of the Nations involved. 

"One of the key reasons why young people are unable to pursue farming is due to the cost of land. By allowing ALR land to be subject to international real estate speculation, we are limiting their opportunities to get into this vital, sustainable industry.

"Alberta, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Quebec and PEI have all passed similar legislation to protect their agricultural land. This leaves B.C. as the only western province without such a law. It's time we took action on this important issue so that we can ensure that ALR land is used as it is intended - to offer opportunities to local communities across the province and to promote the overall food security of our province."

Out-of-Country Emergency Medical Care

The cost of medical care outside Canada can be much higher than the amounts payable by MSP and extended health care plans. For complete protection, additional medical insurance should be purchased from a private insurance company, even if you only plan to leave the country for a day. Check the exclusions and limitations of your private insurance policy carefully to ensure that the policy meets your personal needs.

If you have extended health benefits through your employer you should contact them to determine the policy provisions prior to purchasing additional medical insurance.

When you receive medical services outside Canada (or in some instances outside B.C.), you will need to claim reimbursement from MSP using an Out of Country Claim Form. The completed form should be returned with:

- an itemized account, including the dates of service and details of services performed, and
- either the unpaid bills or the original receipts if the bills have been paid.

Note: Out of Country claims must be submitted within 90 days of the date of service. In-patient hospital claims (and any associated medical claims) must be submitted within six months of discharge.

Payment for physician services will be issued in Canadian funds only and will be paid at the same rate that would have been paid if the services were received in B.C.

Health Care Assistants - Workplace Violence

Background - Health care assistants, including frontline caregivers in homes and residential care facilities, held a conference on workplace safety on October 3rd. At the conference it was stated that health-care assistants have the highest risk of on-the-job injury in the province. Workplace violence was stated as one of the reasons for this.

- All health-care providers deserve to work in violence-free workplaces, despite the very real risk of violence many face when caring for vulnerable individuals.
- This is something I firmly believe and earlier this year signed the BC Nurses' Union pledge to make workplaces safer.
- We are committed to making workplaces safer for people and working closely with frontline staff, health authorities, WorkSafeBC, SafeCare BC, Doctors of BC and unions, including the Hospital Employees' Union and the Health Sciences Association, to develop specific strategies to reduce and prevent violence.
- Part of this will be delivering a provincial policy framework that builds on the \$37-million Health and Safety in Action initiative and its investment in a province-wide violence prevention education program.
- The policy framework will aim to improve injury reporting systems, provide more effective violence prevention training, and create greater accountability for policies and practices among all public and private health employers.
- In addition the Ministry and Nurses' Bargaining Association continue to invest in making high-risk sites safer, providing \$6 million in combined funding to support violence prevention at 10 high-risk sites

Supporting Facts

- The people working to care for British Columbians provide over 30-million health services to patients each year;
 0.01 per cent of those interactions involve violence.
- While this figure may seem small, the number of reported violent incidents for all health-care workers has steadily increased by 18 per cent over the past four years:
 - From 210 reported violent incidents per month to 248 reported incidents per month as of early 2017 (Source: Workplace Health Indicator Tracking and Evaluation database).
 - Over the same period, time-loss claims related to violent incidents have increased three per cent:
 - From 0.64 per 100 full-time equivalent (FTE) employees to 0.66 per 100 FTE employees.
- Typically, these incidents have been under-reported in the past and it is our goal to ensure they get reported and addressed, and that associated time away from work decreases long-term.

- All health authorities offer violence prevention training to staff and physicians working in areas with increased exposure to violence such as mental health units, emergency departments, and residential care facilities.
- The Ministry of Health requires health authorities to assess the risk for violence and aggression in all facilities, and ensure there are associated safety plans and programs in place.
- The provincial Occupation Health, Safety and Violence Prevention Committee works with the regional violence prevention committees in each health authority to help guide location-specific programs.
- Every health authority has a standardized Code White response protocol and response teams that are used to defuse potentially dangerous situations and help protect staff, patients and bystanders.

Marine Harvest fish farms have been occupied by members of the Musgamagw nations for the last month, including their sites at Wicklow and Midsummer Island. They have indicated that they will remain so until the industry has removed all open-net farm sites from their traditional waters. Midsummer is a main point of contention as Marine Harvest is midway through restocking. If this is allowed to proceed, it will allow the company to be there past the expiry of their current license of occupation. Essentially, if DFO and the Provincial Government allow this to happen they are unofficially renewing those licenses, without the consent of the MDTC membership.

To date, the RCMP have not yet responded to an incident involving Marine Harvest workers armed with knives arbitrarily confiscating a banner owned by the occupiers on September 27th. We are utterly disappointed in the recent RCMP conduct where a Hereditary Chief was arrested in relationship to a small length of rope. The Musgamagw Dzawada'enuxw Tribal Council is hereby requesting a meeting with the top level of Senior RCMP officials to rectify this absurd situation.

About the Musgamagw Dzawada'enuxw Tribal Council:

The MDTC is an umbrella organization that comprises of the Dzawada'enuxw First Nation (DFN), the Kwikwasutinuxw Haxwa'mis First Nation (KHFN) and Gwawaenuk Tribe, providing direction and support for the political, social, cultural and economic needs of the individual communities with respect and unity for the individual and collective tribe vision.

Ralph Fairbrother, a 97 year-old resident of George Derby, passed away on Sept. 25, 2017.

According to an Oct. 5, 2017 interview with Roundhouse Radio and Fairbrother's granddaughter Chloe Fairbrother, Ralph died of injuries following a punch to the head from another resident. The altercation took place on Sept. 25 but Ralph was not taken to the hospital until found unconscious three days later. Chloe says the doctors told her they were shocked by the amount of medication Ralph had been taking.

Chloe said while the coroner is still determining the cause of death, they have been told Ralph did not die from natural causes and the RCMP are investigating. Chloe said a family member was approached by a worker at George Derby who told her the facility was trying to cover-up up the death.

Ralph and his wife were both residents of George Derby, and Ralph had dementia. When his wife passed away on Aug 11, Ralph became confused and agitated, visiting other rooms and accusing people of killing his wife. According to Chloe, the facility worked to limit his mobility by removing his cane, attempting to keep him strapped to a chair and giving him anti-psychotic medications.

Both Chloe and the host raise staffing issues and cuts as a cause for the lack of supervision.
