Primary Care When You Need It

Having access to a family doctor or a nurse practitioner for basic health needs is essential to your family's health. But for too many, the endless search for a family doctor, and long waits at walk-in clinics or emergency departments has become the norm. For the 2018/19 budget we are investing in better care when and where you need it.

By shifting to a focus on team-based care – bringing together doctors, nurse practitioners, and other health-care professionals - we can create the community networks of care to better meet the needs of families like yours.

Whether sharing physical office space or creating virtual teams, health-care providers who pool their knowledge and focus on a patient's health challenges together provide better, faster and more coordinated care. These community networks not only better support people's health, but support doctors, nurse practitioners and health-care providers in providing the best care possible for their patients.

Shifting to team-based care also expands access to care outside traditional working hours. Having somewhere you can go to have stitches removed, lab work done or a cast applied in the evening or on the weekend, will do more to cut ER wait time and make life easier for people. We will implement team-based care in Urgent PrimaryCare Centres, which will provide comprehensive health services 'after hours' for non-life threatening illnesses or injuries. The centres will be designed to meet the needs of local communities, and will be part of a network that connects with patients' family doctor, nurse practitioner, community health centre, or helps people find what type of care works best for them.

Providing Seniors With the Care They Deserve

For too long, the wellbeing of seniors in BC has been put at risk, with the vast majority of seniors' care centres not meeting the minimum standard for daily hours of care. Beginning last year, your new government began taking action to improve care for seniors.

And with new investments beginning this year, we will be continue bringing BC back in line with the standards it set, making sure seniors get the care they need.

Over the next three years, government will be investing up to \$500 million in improving care for seniors – whether they're in care facilities or living at home.

We'll give seniors the caring support they need and help them live in dignity by:

- Increasing the time caregivers spend with seniors
- Provide more supports to family members caring for elderly loved ones

Investing in Surgeries to Reduce Wait Lists

We are investing funding to do more dental, hip and knee replacement surgeries, MRIs, and colonoscopies to clear the backlog of patients currently waiting, as well as to manage waitlists more effectively into the future to ensure we keep up with demand.

We also recognize the need for better patient support from referral to post-surgery care for those having hip and knee replacements. The 2018/19 budget will invest in more MRI machines over the next few years to make sure people don't have to travel as far to access these diagnostic services. All of this will be supported by the health-care professionals we know we need to engage, educate, recruit and retain.

Making Prescription Drugs More Affordable For Families

No parent should have to make the difficult decision between their family's health and putting food on the table. But for working families with the lowest incomes in the province, that decision is too often a reality.

Budget 2018 makes investments in Pharmacare that will make life more affordable for British Columbians while making sure they get the care they need.

The \$105 million being invested in Fair PharmaCare over the next three years will eliminate or reduce the deductibles on prescription drugs for 240,000 BC families. Beginning on January 1, 2019:

- Deductibles will be eliminated entirely for families with net annual incomes between \$15,000 and \$30,000.
- All families with net annual incomes between \$30,000 and \$45,000 will have their deductibles reduced.

This is an essential step forward, as statistics show that families with household incomes below \$45,000 are the least likely in BC to fill prescriptions due to the competing household costs of rent, groceries and heat.

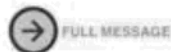

Nate, I had a stab at it as well, but I don't trust my judgement at the moment. A JS hack won't work the way the site aggregates sections together as you know, and cleans out stuff it doesn't want us to have = JS. So that approach is out. ☹

It looks like a trade-off. Lets see what Karl thinks. If we need to use the random image piece for the 20th, Steve's got the main pieces working, and his solution is making sense. The php side of the marketing page template is setup to handle it, and this makes complete sense, as it was built this way before but you needed to do some of your magic to get the effect you wanted in the child element. The fact that the business folks can populate images from the media library with tags I personally love. However, from the front end it needs some of your CSS love. Reassignment of classes and IDs to the root section which was previously just an empty placeholder for the sections to grab onto. Section-01 is no longer really usable except for your image border (purple) to finish the bottom? It should be workable, but might not get the background effect you had at the child, and it adds a bit more work on your plate to tweak it.

I recommend setting the root home page random image to none, let Jeff do his magic for migration, and then working on this in test.

I think we should be set for the random banner images. I have pushed the code to test and it doesn't appear to have broken any current functionality... ☺

To accomplish this, I have added a few new options to the Media menu and "Marketing Home" template.

So we aren't pigeon holed in to using a set number of possible images, I have added a new "Media Tags" taxonomy to the media menu. The idea here is to create a new tag to group together all images that should be in contention for the random page banner. This will also allow doing this with different image sets on each sub-page if required. Once a new Media Tag is created, just copy/paste the slug into the new "Media Tags" field on the Attachment Details screen (go to Media and select any image), on the right side below the other options.

On the Parent Page for the "Marketing home page" template, there are now new options for the banner display:

- Banner Display Option
 - o Parallax – What the theme is currently doing. If a featured image has been set, set it in the background with a parallax scroll effect.
 - o Block – Add the image as a responsive-img that acts like a traditional hero image. No parallax.

- Random Banner Tag (This is where the magic happens)
 - o The default option is “none” which will just use the featured image as before.
 - o New radio options are loaded for every Tag that has been added to the Media Tags taxonomy.
 - o When one of these tags has been selected, it will ignore the featured image (unless the featured image is included in the Media Tag) and randomly select one of the possible images and add it to the top of the page in parallel or block format.

Notes:

- I am not sure what this will do for the “Making life more affordable...” banner that Nate has added. CSS may need to be adjusted when using the block option.
- All banner images in a tag set should be the same size
- It might not stretch properly on superwide displays, we will need to test once we get images in place.

want to go that approach to meet Karl's needs. As Karl saw end of last week, it took me just over an hour to recreate a multilingual instance that way for BetterBC in a manner that his team could do with little overhead.

Lastly, when we copy the environment over Nate, we have to get rid of the CDNs 'at the end of the day', as we can't use those due to policy. So if there are includes you need, or if you are just referencing your own stylesheet for easier effort, let's have you connect with Steve H. on how to get those into the core and feature custom post types/video custom post type. My requested design changes:

1. It would be good to have a positioning statement on the housing, childcare, etc, sub-pages consisting of a headline and some sub text underneath. Please position this above the three images. OR, perhaps we can incorporate the positioning statement along with the "Housing Branding Line" and "Second Line Here" section. We should be able to fit in an additional 2-3 sentences, for an overarching positioning statement.

2. Please make the 'Message from the Premier' a 'Message from Finance Minister Carole James'

3. I prefer using images rather than icons for the sub-pages, thus let's go with option 1a, rather than 1b.

4. I'd like to be able to have a sentence or two below each of the 4 focus link boxes on the index page, but still obviously part of the clickable element. This will allow us to convey the key priorities of this budget and describe in a sentence or two what we're going to do. For housing, that might look like:

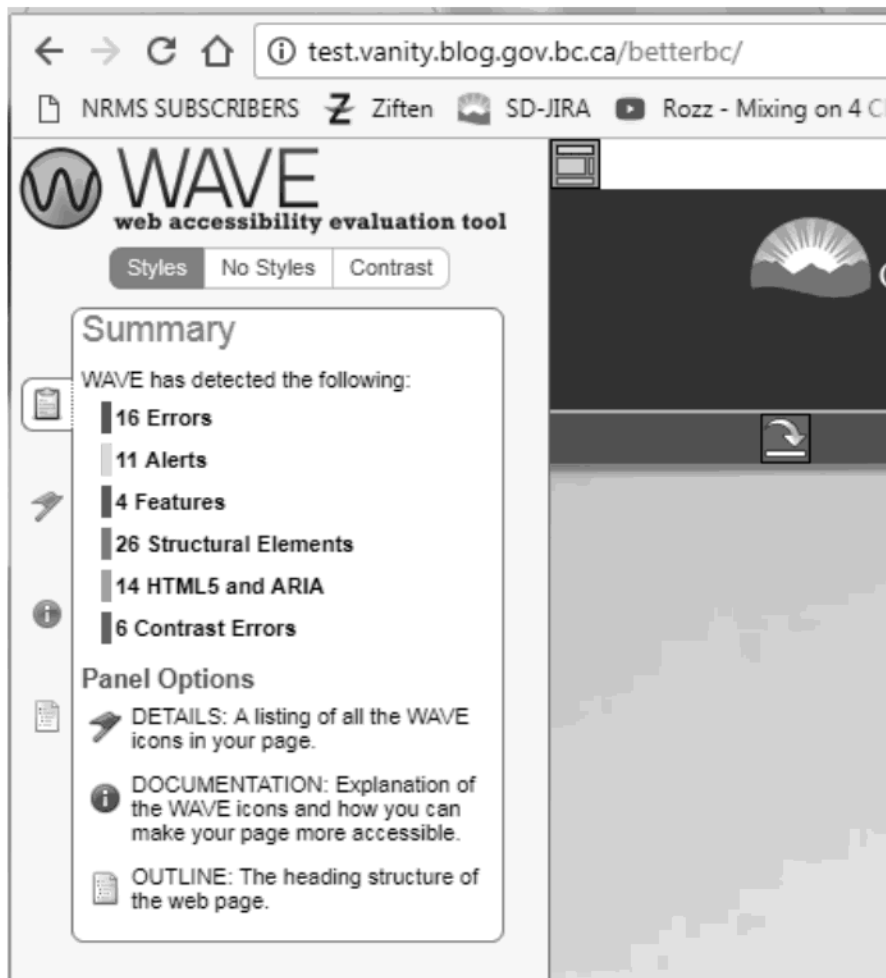

I've corrected the issue: Currently when attempting to upload media I receive the error: *Unable to create directory wp-content/blogs.dir/491/files/sites/491/2018/02. Is its parent directory writable by the server?*

Our WP environment uses an app/uploads/sites/ scheme for uploads, and when I created the new network test.workingforyou.gov.bc.ca I forgot to set the upload path to an empty string. This forces WP to determine the proper path based on the config options so instead it knows to go to app/uploads/sites/491 which I've just tested as working. Going forward this shouldn't be an issue for the subsites in this network because they'll use the option set here as their default, and being an empty string they'll use the proper same scheme with their own site ID.

Further to that last email about CSS, the web server shouldn't be able to write to the location that stores themes and plugins, so we shouldn't have to worry about the situation I outlined before where changes from the dashboard only impact the server they were made on. I'm assuming now that the "additional CSS" is stored in the database, in which case we're fine since that is what is replicated between the servers.

I'll check my email occasionally over the next two days so if you have any questions just let me know.

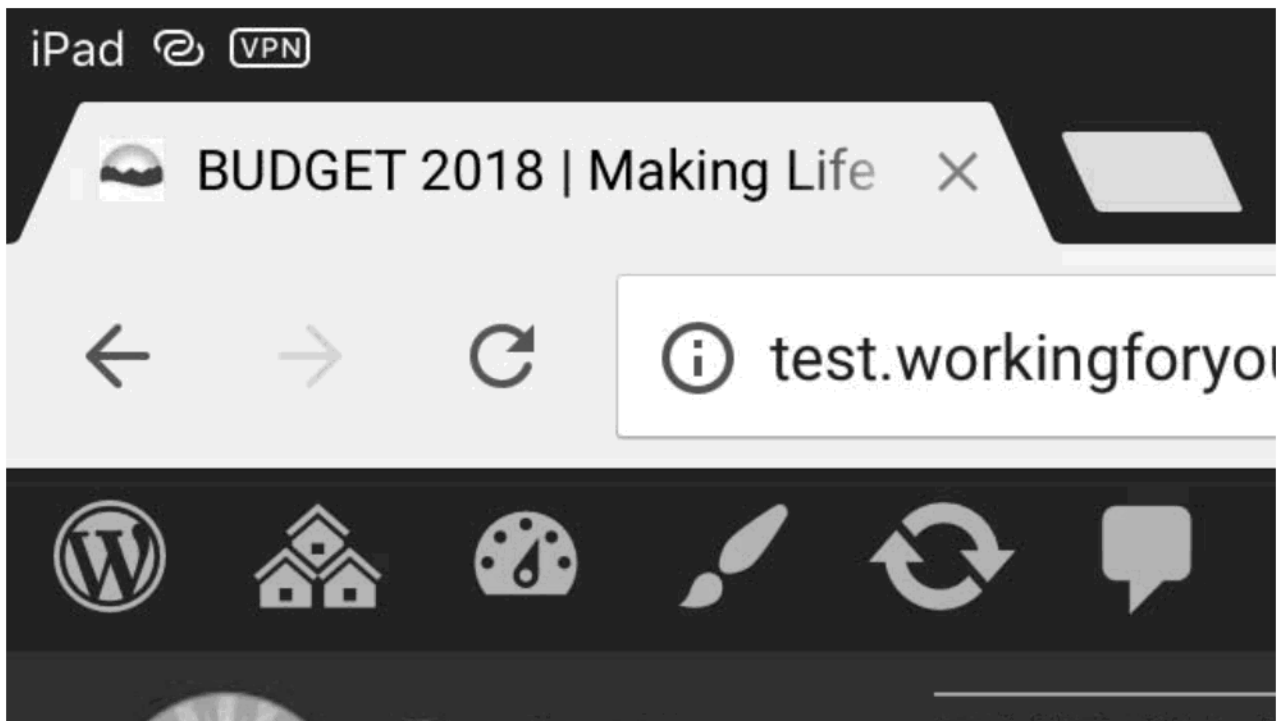

Because the nature of the home page requires a layered effect these are not the section's featured image as

defined in Wordpress, and they will likely have random points of interest, so I think the ideal solution would be to set a random addClass addition on the #home-section-01 .section-content selector such as:

- * #home-section-01 .section-content.banner-01
- * #home-section-01 .section-content.banner-02
- * etc.

That way you can set the load event to randomly dictate the image class used and the CSS can define the positioning based on the specific area of interest positioning of the photo on mobile devices.

Nate, I had a stab at it as well, but I don't trust my judgement at the moment. A JS hack won't work the way the site aggregates sections together as you know, and cleans out stuff it doesn't want us to have = JS. So that approach is out. ☹

It looks like a trade-off. Lets see what Karl thinks. If we need to use the random image piece for the 20th, Steve's got the main pieces working, and his solution is making sense. The php side of the marketing page template is setup to handle it, and this makes complete sense, as it was built this way before but you needed to do some of your magic to get the effect you wanted in the child element. The fact that the business folks can populate images from the media library with tags I personally love. However, from the front end it needs some of your CSS love. Reassignment of classes and IDs to the root section which was previously just an empty placeholder for the sections to grab onto. Section-01 is no longer really usable except for your image border (purple) to finish the bottom? It should be workable, but might not get the background effect you had at the child, and it adds a bit more work on your plate to tweak it.

I recommend setting the root home page random image to none, let Jeff do his magic for migration, and then working on this in test.

I think we should be set for the random banner images. I have pushed the code to test and it doesn't appear to have broken any current functionality... 😊

To accomplish this, I have added a few new options to the Media menu and "Marketing Home" template.

So we aren't pigeon holed in to using a set number of possible images, I have added a new "Media Tags" taxonomy to the media menu. The idea here is to create a new tag to group together all images that should be in contention for the random page banner. This will also allow doing this with different image sets on each sub-page if required. Once a new Media Tag is created, just copy/paste the slug into the new "Media Tags" field on the Attachment Details screen (go to Media and select any image), on the right side below the other options.

On the Parent Page for the "Marketing home page" template, there are now new options for the banner display:

- Banner Display Option
 - o Parallax – What the theme is currently doing. If a featured image has been set, set it in the background with a parallax scroll effect.
 - o Block – Add the image as a responsive-img that acts like a traditional hero image. No parallax.
- Random Banner Tag (This is where the magic happens)
 - o The default option is "none" which will just use the featured image as before.
 - o New radio options are loaded for every Tag that has been added to the Media Tags taxonomy.
 - o When one of these tags has been selected, it will ignore the featured image (unless the featured image is included in the Media Tag) and randomly select one of the possible images and add it to the top of the page in parallel or block format.

Notes:

- I am not sure what this will do for the "Making life more affordable..." banner that Nate has added. CSS may need to be adjusted when using the block option.

- All banner images in a tag set should be the same size
- It might not stretch properly on superwide displays, we will need to test once we get images in place.
- It doesn't account for human error on tagging. If someone tags a PDF as something that should be included in the banner, expect a broken image 😊
- Should be polylang/translation ready.

Well the third option could be simply writing out an internal style declaration from the array of tagged images returned from the media library.

If the output to the template were to overwrite the background image for the content section it would absolve is of having to rework the site and keep the text as text.

It's a bit of a hybrid one-off for this implementation but it would still allow the images to be populated through media as well as giving us the ability to display the copy as text. This latter part would mitigate the fact that mobile resolution would reduce the copy to illegibility if it were part of the image itself.

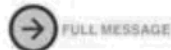

It looks like a trade-off. Lets see what Karl thinks. If we need to use the random image piece for the 20th, Steve's got the main pieces working, and his solution is making sense. The php side of the marketing page template is setup to handle it, and this makes complete sense, as it was built this way before but you needed to do some of your magic to get the effect you wanted in the child element. The fact that the business folks can populate images from the media library with tags I personally love. However, from the front end it needs some of your CSS love. Reassignment of classes and IDs to the root section which was previously just an empty placeholder for the sections to grab onto. Section-01 is no longer really usable except for your image border (purple) to finish the bottom? It should be workable, but might not get the background effect you had at the child, and it adds a bit more work on your plate to tweak it.

I recommend setting the root home page random image to none, let Jeff do his magic for migration, and then working on this in test.

I think we should be set for the random banner images. I have pushed the code to test and it doesn't appear to have broken any current functionality... 😊

To accomplish this, I have added a few new options to the Media menu and "Marketing Home" template.

So we aren't pigeon holed in to using a set number of possible images, I have added a new "Media Tags" taxonomy to the media menu. The idea here is to create a new tag to group together all images that should be in contention for the random page banner. This will also allow doing this with different image sets on each sub-page if required. Once a new Media Tag is created, just copy/paste the slug into the new "Media Tags" field on the Attachment Details screen (go to Media and select any image), on the right side below the other options.

On the Parent Page for the "Marketing home page" template, there are now new options for the banner display:

- Banner Display Option
 - o Parallax – What the theme is currently doing. If a featured image has been set, set it in the background with a parallax scroll effect.
 - o Block – Add the image as a responsive-img that acts like a traditional hero image. No parallax.
- Random Banner Tag (This is where the magic happens)
 - o The default option is "none" which will just use the featured image as before.
 - o New radio options are loaded for every Tag that has been added to the Media Tags taxonomy.
 - o When one of these tags has been selected, it will ignore the featured image (unless the featured image is included in the Media Tag) and randomly select one of the possible images and add it to the top of the page in parallel or block format.

Notes:

- I am not sure what this will do for the "Making life more affordable..." banner that Nate has added. CSS may need to be adjusted when using the block option.
- All banner images in a tag set should be the same size
- It might not stretch properly on superwide displays, we will need to test once we get images in place.
- It doesn't account for human error on tagging. If someone tags a PDF as something that should be included in the banner, expect a broken image 🤔
- Should be polylang/translation ready.

As as follow up to our office conversation, for WP security on our infrastructure, whitelisting is the best option we have which we use for restriction user access to our WordPress production sites.

A security whitelist group is placed on a WordPress instance that is actually in production. Only those IP addresses that exist in that security whitelisted group will be directed to the WordPress production instance. All others that are aware of the domain, are redirected to gov.bc.ca.

For additional sensitive information, you can also unpublish your pages in your production WP instance. This may have an undesired affect on testing your production site, such as pages not aggregating as they should, but you can take this approach and it will work within the confines of how WordPress aggregates unpublished content. Only those users who can login to the WordPress site through wp-admin can actually see those pages rendering. Publishing in WP is basically instant.

Hi Karl,

No problems here. Just for clarity, We have a Webtrends ID which corresponds to a whole site and is in the footer of the html on every page of the site. It is javascript that shoots back info like a pixel to Webtrends.

When we say a "profile" I mean a dashboard on the webtrends backend that is directly related to that ID and reads that data which allows us to see the analytics for that ID/site.

So basically when you talk to Ryan Janes to do this in the future, you want to do the following:

1. Ask him to setup a Webtrends ID (can only be done during a small change window once a week on Tuesdays or Wednesdays I think)
2. He will give you the ID and you need to add it to the Gov2 page through CMS Lite or the Wordpress page through a special plugin Justin/Steve made
3. You will also need to ask Ryan to create a profile on Webtrends so you can look at the data sent by the website and tell him who needs access to it.
 - a. IMPORTANT to NOTE: Ryan can create multiple profiles related to one ID. For example you can ask him to create a profile for everybody in the world. And you can also ask him to make a 2nd profile that ignores BC Government employee IPs. This means you can get an idea for how much of the public are actually viewing the content versus something that is just important to government employees.

Once you have done all that you can be sure that A) Webtrends is recording stats for your website and B) You can look at the stats it is recording.

So long story short, no we don't need another "profile" or ID. We have added the ID Ryan created to the wordpress plugin and it will now collect

DESCRIPTION: For too long, the wellbeing of seniors in B.C. has been put at risk, with the vast majority of seniors' care centres not meeting the minimum standard for daily hours of care. And with new investments beginning this year, we will bring B.C. back in line with the standards it set, making sure seniors get the care they need.

Providing Seniors With Care They Deserve: Over the next three years, government will be investing over \$500 million in improving care for seniors – whether they're in care facilities or living at home. After a lifetime of hard work, seniors deserve respect and quality care.

Helping seniors live with dignity: Seniors deserve to live full lives, without having to worry about the cost of housing or the quality of care in assisted living facilities. We are helping seniors stay at home longer by increasing Shelter Aid for Elderly Renters, and increasing standards at care homes.

Nate, I had a stab at it as well, but I don't trust my judgement at the moment. A JS hack won't work the way the site aggregates sections together as you know, and cleans out stuff it doesn't want us to have = JS. So that approach is out. 😞

It looks like a trade-off. Lets see what Karl thinks. If we need to use the random image piece for the 20th, Steve's got the main pieces working, and his solution is making sense. The php side of the marketing page template is setup to handle it, and this makes complete sense, as it was built this way before but you needed to do some of your magic to get the effect you wanted in the child element. The fact that the business folks can populate images from the media library with tags I personally love. However, from the front end it needs some of your CSS love. Reassignment of classes and IDs to the root section which was previously just an empty placeholder for the

sections to grab onto. Section-01 is no longer really usable except for your image border (purple) to finish the bottom? It should be workable, but might not get the background effect you had at the child, and it adds a bit more work on your plate to tweak it.

I recommend setting the root home page random image to none, let Jeff do his magic for migration, and then working on this in test.

I think we should be set for the random banner images. I have pushed the code to test and it doesn't appear to have broken any current functionality... 😊

To accomplish this, I have added a few new options to the Media menu and "Marketing Home" template.

So we aren't pigeon holed in to using a set number of possible images, I have added a new "Media Tags" taxonomy to the media menu. The idea here is to create a new tag to group together all images that should be in contention for the random page banner. This will also allow doing this with different image sets on each sub-page if required. Once a new Media Tag is created, just copy/paste the slug into the new "Media Tags" field on the Attachment Details screen (go to Media and select any image), on the right side below the other options.

On the Parent Page for the "Marketing home page" template, there are now new options for the banner display:

· Banner Display Option

- o Parallax – What the theme is currently doing. If a featured image has been set, set it in the background with a parallax scroll effect.
- o Block – Add the image as a responsive-img that acts like a traditional hero image. No parallax.
- Random Banner Tag (This is where the magic happens)
- o The default option is “none” which will just use the featured image as before.
- o New radio options are loaded for every Tag that has been added to the Media Tags taxonomy.
- o When one of these tags has been selected, it will ignore the featured image (unless the featured image is included in the Media Tag) and randomly select one of the possible images and add it to the top of the page in parallel or block format.

Notes:

- I am not sure what this will do for the “Making life more affordable...” banner that Nate has added. CSS may need to be adjusted when using the block option.
- All banner images in a tag set should be the same size
- It might not stretch properly on superwide displays, we will need to test once we get images in place.
- It doesn’t account for human error on tagging. If someone tags a PDF as something that should be included in the banner, expect a broken image 😊
- Should be polylang/translation ready.

I ended up overriding the display none on the Budget 2018 title and ensuring it would fit inline on a 320px small screen – think iPhone SE width. I did this as the logo points to the main BC Gov site and should this remain the case there was no way to navigate back to the homepage.

Not sure the policy on this so if you want me to back it off, just let me know and I'll reset it.

Second, and this is simply for future consideration:

Left this until after I was done making changes so it didn't seem like I was trying to pile on, but I have a recommendation for improving structure for working with CSS.

I ended up adding (and then removing) CSS declarations based on IDs because it made life easier to structure in-section. Thinking background attachments/images etc as a big one.

It would be a pretty good boost to CSS implementation if at the page level where the ID is written into the container (based on the page slug) if we had the ability to add custom classes, then nothing at the section level would be cut off from reusable declarations.

Just a thought, it would give make having to set über-wide margins on backgrounds a thing of the past and also enable a far more accurate placement mechanism for in-section content relative to background placement...among other things.

That's it for now.

Hello,

With the Online Meeting that Justin sent out earlier, there is a way for us to share screens using Skype for Business on our end.

Here is a rudimentary reference on the theme, which will be more clear once we do a walkthrough tomorrow morning. Everything is very point form, but it should make more sense once you get a chance to play around with things.

First a quick background on the Marketing Theme: this theme was started about 18 months ago primary aimed at making modern, single-page websites promoting various government initiatives. Each section on the single page possibly needed to have different backgrounds, CSS styles, and parallax effects while presenting similarly structured featured information in a variety of ways. We did this by adding a template to a parent level page, with each child page rendering as a section in this one page design.

The structure of one of these single pages is like this:

- Parent page with the “Marketing Home” template
 - Child page/section (order controlled by Page Attributes->Order)
 - Child page/section
 - Child page/section

Once a page is selected as the “Marketing Home” template:

- The WYSIWYG editor is removed (upon save)
- Meta options get added for the parent page:
 - These options allow a parent banner image to be added for the single page
 - The image has parallax scrolling effect by default. Will change this so it can be a regular fixed

- banner image as well.
 - Text and css for an overlay banner caption
 - If an image isn't set using featured image, then the banner section won't show up at all and the parent will only be a container for the other sections
- Meta options get added for the child pages
 - Background colour for the entire section
 - CSS options for the title(page title) and font (WYSIWYG) parts of the section
 - Options to not show the header and disable links for the feature boxes
 - Featured image, if added, will become the parallax background image for the section

There is also a custom post type called "Features" which is essentially meant to be a Swiss Army knife that can display information in a variety of styles on sections using shortcodes. They are meant to be grouped by the 'Feature Categories' taxonomy so it is easier to break everything up to be displayed in sections.

So if three features were created (Initiative One, Initiative Two, Initiative Three) for display on the home page, a category could be created ('home-initiatives') and added in the style of choice on Section 1 using the shortcode [display-cards cat="home-initiatives"]. Examples of each style and shortcode references can be found in the backend menu BCGov Settings->Marketing Theme Settings.

Each "Feature" has numerous meta options that affect how it will be presented based on the display shortcode that is used. Which options are used for which shortcodes is also documented on the menu BCGov Settings->Marketing Theme Settings.

Hopefully that helps and once you play around with the site let us know if (when) you have questions!

Primary Care When You Need It

Having access to a family doctor or a nurse practitioner for basic health needs is essential to your family's health. But for too many, the endless search for a family doctor, and long waits at walk-in clinics or emergency departments has become the norm. For the 2018/19 budget we are investing in better care when and where you need it.

By shifting to a focus on team-based care – bringing together doctors, nurse practitioners, and other health-care professionals - we can create the community networks of care to better meet the needs of families like yours.

Whether sharing physical office space or creating virtual teams, health-care providers who pool their knowledge and focus on a patient's health challenges together provide better, faster and more coordinated care. The \$105 million being invested in Fair PharmaCare over the next three years will eliminate or reduce the deductibles on prescription drugs for 240,000 BC families. Beginning on January 1, 2019:

- Deductibles will be eliminated entirely for families with net annual incomes between \$15,000 and \$30,000.
- All families with net annual incomes between \$30,000 and \$45,000 will have their deductibles reduced.

This is an essential step forward, as statistics show that families with household incomes below \$45,000 are the least likely in BC to fill prescriptions due to the competing household costs of rent, groceries and heat.

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

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

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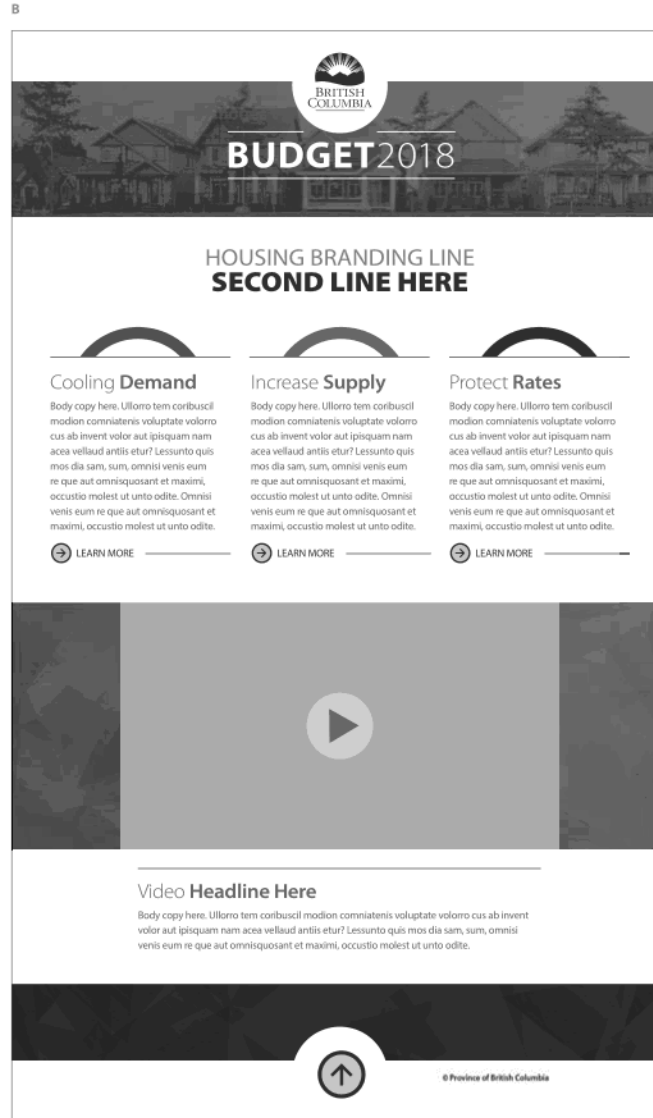
