# **Child Support enforcement bill**

# Background:

- The Government introduced legislation to strengthen family maintenance enforcement by enabling ICBC to cancel the driver's licence of a person with substantial arrears.
- Some have raised concerns that taking away a driver's licence could harm an individual's ability to make a living.
- The legislation allows for discretion and each case is evaluated individually, taking into
  account a person's history, how much a person owes, and other aspects of a person's
  current situation.
- Current federal and provincial laws provide for denying passport-applications, denying renewal of driver's licences, and intercepting funds owing to the person such as tax refunds and EI benefits.

# Message:

- We are providing additional tools to ensure that children and families are receiving the support payments they deserve.
- We want to make sure that if someone has the ability to make payments, and the obligation to, that we have appropriate tools to ensure they do so.
- Each case will be evaluated individually and that the person's history and circumstances are taken into account.
- The goal is ensuring children and families are receiving support payments so we certainly
  would not be looking to take away anyone's ability to make the income they need to
  fulfill those obligations.

He calls the appointment of Minister Eby as the neutral arbiter a "dubious" decision.

Horgan learns how to soft pedal changes (Dec. 2) – Palmer writes about Premier Horgan's support for a move to proportional representation. Minister Eby is mentioned as the neutral arbiter of the process. Palmer is once again critical of the appointment, saying he is a partisan defender of PR.

**Eby prepared to deal government's cards (Dec. 7)** – Palmer's article contains quotes from the Minister and focuses on the "Vancouver model" of money-laundering. Palmer also touches on Peter German's initial recommendations.

**Electoral reform foes eschew partisanship (Jan. 12)** – Palmer's article focuses on the formation of the "no" PR campaign, led by Bill Tieleman. Tieleman worries that PR will ruin the NDP's chances at forming a majority government and that it will lead to a rise in far right parties.

**Liberals' Plan to Delay ICBC Fix Failed Big Time (Jan. 27)** – Palmer is critical of the previous government's refusal to release the E&Y report. He says the blame belongs with the previous government and that responsibility falls on the NDP to "clean up" the job.

**Eby floats reforms to clean up ICBC mess (Jan. 30)** – Palmer calls the ICBC deficit an impossible situation and praises Minister Eby's approach to dealing with the problem. The article is critical of the previous government, stating it had a "craven record."

NDP's diluted promises to test voters' patience (Feb. 14) – Palmer is critical of the NDP's throne speech, saying it falls short on many campaign promises. Palmer specifically criticizes the speech's comments on housing, child care, transit, and the oil pipeline.

### **ICBC Q3 financial results**

### **Key Messages:**

- Years of bad decisions and mismanagement by the former government have undermined ICBC's ability to deliver low-cost insurance to B.C. drivers.
- We never expected to find this level of mismanagement by the previous government.
- ICBC must become financially sustainable to keep rates affordable for British Columbians.
- ICBC's year-end loss is now projected to hit \$1.3 billion that's nearly the amount the former government siphoned out of ICBC while ignoring the needs of B.C. families.
- Now, B.C. drivers are looking at a hike of at least \$400 more in their premiums by next year unless we take immediate action to keep rates more affordable.
- Last week, we learned that the previous government received clear recommendations in 2014 from independent auditors that could have saved the corporation hundreds of millions of dollars.
- Yet they did not act, they did not make these recommendations public, and they scrubbed them from a report presented to ICBC.
- We will be taking strong, decisive and significant action in the coming weeks to repair the damage done.
- We are working on solutions that will keep rates affordable and see high-risk drivers pay more while low-risk drivers pay less.
- We are looking to cut down on legal costs and to focus instead on providing more care for those hurt in crashes.
- We will have more to say on these details in the days and weeks ahead.
