Selected comments on the budget:

Although the government reported a surplus, but in fact it is very small, as the ICBC loss continues, the less optimistic about the economic situation in the province.

- This sugar budget would warm the heart of some workers, but it does not see any niche for businesses.
 On the whole, this is a budget is all about the livelihood issues but have not done so on the overall economic blueprint. For example, the major industries in our province: forests, minerals, oil and gas, fisheries and agriculture have not been mentioned in the Budget. It is incredible.
- The NDP government's political calculation in their budget seems too obvious. Its emphasis is only on
 real estate market and social welfare. This obviously targets the needs of voters in the metropolitan
 area. It is precisely NDP's political base. The lack of mention of such industries as agriculture, forestry,
 fishing and mineral mines implied they are ignoring the voters in the hinterland or the north shore, as
 these places have never been a base for the New Democrats.
- Similarly, the question of the funding for Richmond Hospital mentioned before the election has not been
 included in this budget, nor is it because the city of Richmond has no relationship with NDP
 government? Liu Hai (sp), a commentator who lives in Richmond and who is going to run for City Council
 this year, said it is unfair to residents of Richmond. He and many community workers plan to go on a
 march in March to protest the provincial government's indifference to hospital resources and safety
 behavior.
- 17 years later, the NDP came up with the blueprint for their policies, and its decision-making is certainly
 mixed, but time can always prove that, in contrast to the Liberal Party, is the NDP really able to stabilize
 the BC economy.
