SA Roundtable, March 2, 2018

March 2 is celebrated as Holi (for Hindus) and Hola Mohalla (Sikhs). It will be nice if the Premier acknowledge these festivals. They might sound like similar festivals but are different and therefore important that both are acknowledged separately keeping in mind religious sensitivities.

- March 2 Holi/Hola Mohalla (Hinduism, Sikhism). A colourful and joyous festival that welcomes spring. Also referred to as festival of colours. For Sikhs a festival started by the 10th Sikh Guru, Guru Gobind Singh as a time for military exercises. Widely celebrated.
- Spice Radio, 1200 AM is also marking the end of their 4th Annual Raise Your Hands against Racism campaign in an official ceremony on March 3. It would be nice to acknowledge this important campaign.

Other important days for March are:

- March 21: NowRuz, or Persian New year. A very important festival celebrated widely by people
 of Iranian descent.
- March 23 National Day Pakistan

the SA community is generally quite pleased with some of the measures the government has taken such as removal of tolls, announcement of a concept plan for a new Hospital* in Surrey, replacement of Patullo bridge etc, but the narrative very subtly is being changed to NDP being anti-jobs and a party of tax and spend. There is talk of broken promises, death of construction jobs, hardships on small businesses and constant references made to people of Surrey and what the government must do to fulfil their demands since they have played a key part in NDP's win. *Surrey Mayor Linda Hepner has suggested that the province buy a site in Cloverdale, close to Kwantlen University for this hospital.

<u>Issues</u>

- 1. **Health Tax:** a lot of confusion about double dipping. The government is being perceived as tax and spend once again. The community is happy about some of the measures that the government has taken such as reducing the MSP, but with this new tax the perception is that it will definitely hurt small and medium sized businesses and schools.
- 2. Housing affordability Although the community is happy about some of the measures that are being taken by the government, the construction industry feels that the government is not doing enough to increase supply. They feel under all the new taxes, the housing market will considerably slow down leading to reduced work for them. Giving assurances to the construction industry is very important.

- Child Care: Seen as a broken promise. It is widely believed that the childcare announcement
 and funds were postponed because of the tensions between the Feds, Alberta and BC. They
 feel its over ambitious and NDP might not be able to fulfil it.
- 4. Renters rebate: Seen as a broken promise, only to capture votes.
- Minimum wage: although generally perceived as a good thing, the businesses still need to be confident that this will not eat into their profit margins. Emphasizing all the measures we have taken is important.
- 6. **Pipeline issue—** There is a lot of misinformation about the pipeline issue in the community. The perception is that the NDP is blocking the pipeline only to please their green partners and the environment lobby. The perception is that thousands of jobs are at stake but because only because NDP needs the support of the Greens, they are doing this. The BC-Alberta wine war also caused a lot of mixed comments. People were generally happy that the government had done a wise thing by backing down.
- 7. Relationship between Federal government and Provincial government (Surrey LRT) Some feel that with the pipeline issue BC government has damaged its relationship with the federal government and this could adversely funding for major infrastructure projects in BC and specifically Surrey (eg) the LRT* project in Surrey. Mentioning Patullo would be good. *Surrey Mayor Linda Hepner was on Mr. Thind's show this morning clarifying that there is money in both the budgets for this project. She said feds have committed \$2.2 B and the province has committed \$1.77 B approx.
- 8. **Transit in Surrey:** SA community are extremely concerned about lack of public transit and growing traffic on the streets.
- Coquihalla Highway

 A number of people are very upset with the way the highway is being managed. A large number of members of the SA community are truck drivers and they are calling upon the government to fix issues relating to speed, overloading and maintenance of the highway.
- 10. Trucking issue: UTA whose membership has a large number of SA truckers are extremely concerned about issues with labour mobility, unlawful industry activities. They have complained that despite several meetings with local MLAs in regards to the commissioner of container trucks, aid no steps have been taken, instead 40 new tags have now been issued to big trucking companies.
- 11. **Proportional representation** A lot of confusion and fear mongering in regards to this issue, clarity needed.
- 12. Jaspal Atwal controversy: The controversy surrounding PM Justin Trudeau's trip to India continues to be a topic of conversation. Some media outlets have said that people of all political parties have connections with Mr. Jaspal Atwal including NDP minister Jinny Sims who took Mr. Atwal's help during elections. The question that might be posed to the Premier could be that since MP Randeep Sarai has had to resign from his post as caucus chair for Western Canada, will the Premier also ask Minister Sims to do the same?

 *This controversy today is more focused on the Conservative Motion that was to be introduced in the House of Commons and has since been deferred.

- 13. **BC-India relations** There might be a question about BC's trip to India and what the Premier thinks about the recent controversy surrounding the PM's trip. We need to steer clear of the controversy but at the same time reiterating that BC shares strong ties with India and BC is much interested in furthering trade with India. If pressed about the Khalistani issue, I think we should simply say that British Columbians have a right to express their opinion in a peaceful manner and human rights is something that is valued greatly here. He could also talk about the full Human Rights Commission that we are re-instating in the province.
- 14. ICBC: A lot of confusion about soft tissue injury. There is fear that premiums will go up.

Other issues: Ride hailing, grant issue and gangs and shooting.
