Key Message Narrative

- As a resident of a ferry-dependent community, and as a former ferries critic in Opposition, I have heard first-hand the concerns of British Columbians about our coastal ferry service.
- British Columbians and ferry users have a huge issue with affordability, and they're also concerned about the levels of service provided by BC Ferries.
- It's been almost 15 years since the current ferry service delivery model was established.
- A lot has changed with the service since then. Fares have more than doubled in that time, and many routes have seen service reductions.
- I know that British Columbians who rely on our coastal ferry service are **counting on our government** to ensure this **service is operating in a manner that meets their interest**.
- It's **time for a long**, **hard look** at the provision of our coastal ferry service, and I've retained the services of Blair Redlin to lead a comprehensive review **to ensure British Columbians best interests are being served.**

Background information from BC Corrections on Nanaimo Correctional Centre.

The NCC facility was originally established in 1955 as a reform school for boys, which operated until 1977. The facility then operated from 1979-1981 as a provincial drug and alcohol treatment centre. In 1983, it was converted for use as a provincial correctional centre for minimum custody male offenders. In the mid-1990s, it was upgraded to a medium security correctional centre with the installation of a secure perimeter fence, approximately one kilometre in length, around the main part of the site.

NCC is a key component of BC Corrections' current provincial operations and future inmate accommodation plan. It is the only medium security correctional facility on Vancouver Island, with unique characteristics which enable BC Corrections to provide inmates with programs which have proven to reduce the frequency and severity of reoffending. The current capacity of 190 cells provided by NCC is required to meet current and projected inmate population demands both provincially and on Vancouver Island.

The immediate need for renovation or replacement of NCC is required as outlined in the 2016 project concept plan^[1], and as summarized below:

- The buildings are over 60 years of age, are functionally and economically obsolete, and the facility's physical condition is rapidly deteriorating;
- NCC's buildings were not designed for the delivery of correctional services, and their physical layout and construction present ongoing challenges and operational risks;

- NCC's location results in efficiencies in accommodating inmates from central and northern Vancouver Island, and results in cost savings for the justice sector related to inmate transportation;
- NCC is a provincial resource for BC Corrections together with local community supports and linkages, NCC
 operates a therapeutic community for inmates with substance use needs from all areas of the province.

NCC has been targeted for replacement by BC Corrections for the past 15 years. Recent building related health and safety issues have forced the closure of some inmate living areas, necessitating the displacement of inmates to other areas within the facility and requiring BC Corrections to consider immediate options for remediation and/or plans for building replacement.

EMBC UPDATE - January 23, 2018 AS OF 0700 HRS - ASSESSMENT

At 0132 PST this morning, an 8.0 magnitude earthquake occurred 175 km SE of Kodiak City, Alaska. At 0138 PST, the National Tsunami Warning Centre issued a tsunami warning for British Columbia, the Juan de Fuca coast, the outer west coast of Vancouver Island, the central coast and northeast Vancouver Island, and the north coast and Haida Gwaii. Subsequently, EMBC issued a tsunami warning notification to areas A, B, C, and D along the BC coast. There was no warning or advisory for area E. The earthquake was felt in Alaska but there were no reports of it being felt in BC. The confirmed maximum wave heights did not exceed 21 cm at Old Harbor, Alaska and 12 cm at Langara, Haida Gwaii.

EMBC notified coastal communities by means of social media through Twitter and the Provincial Emergency Notification System (PENS) at 01:51 PST. A broadcast interrupting message was sent to Alert Ready at 02:15 PST. The Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre and Regional PREOCS were activated shortly thereafter.

Several coastal communities enacted their emergency plans and began evacuations to higher ground. At 04:13 PST, the NTWC issued a cancellation to the tsunami warning for coastal BC. This messaging was sent out by means of the PENS at 04:33 PST. EMBC will continue to support local authorities as they cancel their emergency plans and return to a normal level of preparedness. Due to the size of this significant event, we can expect several aftershocks for the foreseeable future. Aftershocks up to a magnitude 7.0 are possible.

At approximately 19:00 PST yesterday, there was a collision between a Canadian Pacific Railway locomotive and a fuel truck at the CP Rail yard in Port Coquitlam. This resulted in a rupture of the fuel truck tanks that were carrying ethanol and it caused an intense fire and Code 2 DGIR notification. Fortunately, the train was not carrying any toxic materials but the locomotive sustained severe damage. RCMP initially decided to do a tactical evacuation within a 1 km radius around the incident as a precautionary measure. Ministry of Environment are engaged in the spill response and are working with responders to contain any spill once the fire is controlled and the site is safe to enter.

Updates to ongoing incidents appear in the regional summaries below.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

A large trough just west of the BC west coast will not be moving away until the end of January. The trough remaining in place allows a parade of low pressure systems to swing in and across BC, one after another right through the week. This morning, the next storm is well defined and set to impact the south coast imminently. The low centre will drive northwards, while the frontal band rides the southwest flow into BC. Clear conditions remain in the north of the province.

Wednesday afternoon and evening, winds will be decreasing as locally heavy bands of snow continue to ramp up in the Kootenay, Boundary and Columbia regions.

Looking towards the end of the week we see another Pacific storm approaching the coast on Friday.

SOUTHEAST REGION (SEA)

Central Kootenay Regional District – Evacuation Alert remains in place for eight homes in Castlegar due to a landslide that occurred in Bloomer Creek in May.

CENTRAL REGION (CTL)

Columbia Shuswap Regional District – Landslide. A SOLE (extension expires Jan 26th) and an Evacuation Order remain in place to prohibit entry to homes destroyed by landslide in early April.

Columbia Shuswap Regional District – Evacuation Alert remains in place for 4 addresses in the Vicker's Trail and Robinson Creek areas due to flooding concerns.

Thompson Nicola Regional District – Evacuation Alert remains in place for Spences Bridge area pending confirmation that flood remediation work is complete.

Nooaitch Indian Band – BCR remains in place to support an evacuation Order for homes rendered uninhabitable during spring freshet flooding.

SOUTHWEST REGION (SWE)

District of Kent – Rockslide. A SOLE (extension expires Jan 25th) and an Evacuation Order remains in place for six properties that lie below steep terrain in the area of concern. The District is coordinating a thorough geotechnical assessment. Three couples (6 people) are receiving ESS. The SOLE and ESS will continue until further assessment.

NORTHEAST REGION (NEA)

No significant incidents of note.

VANCOUVER ISLAND REGION (VIR)

- Strathcona Regional District has closed the EOC.
- Nanaimo Regional District activated their EOC to level 1 for flooding in the Whiskey Creek and French Creek area.
- City of Campbell River activated their EOC, declared a SOLE and issued an Evacuation Order for a landslide affecting four homes.

NORTHWEST REGION (NWE)

DGIR Code 2 - Train derailment. CN Rail reported that 27 coal cars derailed at mile 48.5 of the Bulkley Subdivision between New Hazelton and South Hazelton. Coal has been confirmed to have entered the creek in one location. Protective measures are in place to limit the spread of coal into the creek. Removal of the rail cars has been completed, allowing crews to assess the entire area. Removal of the coal will be ongoing in a systematic approach to minimize any further impacts to the environment. This incident has been downgraded to a Code 1 and this will be the final update.

To clarify: you are certain this \$15 million is new funding?

Yes, this is newly committed funding from the Province to build new affordable rental housing for families and seniors in Maple Ridge.

Also, is the Salvation Army going to be the operator of this new facility? Do you have any concerns about the Salvation Army's positions on harm reduction or capacity to carry out harm reduction services?

Yes, the Salvation Army will be the operator for the proposed project at Burnett Street.

The Salvation Army has deep roots in the community and for over 20 years has provided shelter and community services to the City of Maple Ridge.

The Salvation Army is operating a similar supportive housing and shelter project in Langley (Gateway of Hope) that has proven to be a successful model.

The local Intensive Case Management Team will provide clinical services and supports at the Burnett site as required.

Is the \$15 million for rental housing for seniors and low-income families is a new announcement? Or has this been announced previously?

Our government is taking a new approach and working to provide a full spectrum of housing options and supports to help people in need in the community.

The \$15 million in funding for Maple Ridge housing announced today is newly committed funding from the Government of British Columbia for the development of affordable rental housing that will provide a safe and secure home for families and seniors.

This is in addition to the \$3.6 million to purchase the Burnett Street site for 40 new supportive housing units. The Province has also allocated funding for capital and operating costs for a modular development for people struggling with homelessness in Maple Ridge.

Has modular housing for Maple Ridge come in yet? The minister said in October: "We're confident that we'll be able to come to a resolution with the city and the residents to make sure people have a dry, safe place to stay as winter comes in." http://www.cbc.ca/news/canada/british-columbia/maple-ridge-may-get-modular-housing-for-homeless-camp-residents-1.4369580

Did this happen?

As announced this morning, the B.C. government is working to purchase land to build temporary high-support modular housing so that people experiencing homelessness, including those at the St. Anne homeless camp, will have immediate access to safe and secure housing.

In order to provide housing as quickly as possible, the Province is looking at using repurposed modular housing for a period of one-to-two years. The units would include a private washroom, meals, support services and 24/7 staffing. Following this, more permanent housing will be designed in consultation with the community. Further details will be shared with the public once a site is confirmed.

1. Merritt Visitor Centre

VISITOR SERVICES:

- In January 2018, Destination BC closed the British Columbia visitor centre at Exit 286 and transitioned visitor services to a community-led model.
- The City of Merritt's application for the Baillie House (the City's existing Visitor Centre) to join Destination BC's Visitor Centre Network has been approved. The Baillie House has received \$25K from DBC to assist with providing visitor services. As a network member, Baillie House will receive \$25K in funding annually.
- This community-based model allows for more flexible customer service to meet the needs of the community as well as visitors.

EXIT 286 – LOCATION AND FUTURE USE:

- The Ministry of Citizens' Services (CITZ) owns the building at Exit 286 and is working with the landowner, the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resources and Rural Development (FLNR) to determine the best use for the site.
- As the land owner, FLNR is now leading consultations with the local First Nations. Ministry staff continue to support these discussions. We expect to have more information about this in the coming months.
- The gate at Exit 286 was closed on February 1, 2018, but access to the trail network will remain. The building has been secured and will be maintained by CITZ, pending future decision on the use of the location and First Nations consultations.
- Old directional Visitor Centre signage on the highway has also been removed. New signage has be posted at the nearest Exit 286 location directing travelers to the Baillie House in downtown Merritt (for visitor

information), as well as to nearby Ministry of Transportation Rest Areas (offering public washroom facilities).

Is there a problem with the contractor?). If feedback or additions let me know and we can update before you go into the House.

Suggested talking points:

- The accident on the Coquihalla last night was extraordinary in scale, and my thoughts are with the many people injured
- As Minister, safety is my top priority and I/the ministry take any incident on our highways very seriously
 particularly when people are hurt
- The RCMP are investigating the cause of the crash, and the ministry and CVSE will fully cooperate and assist
- I also understand from ministry staff that yesterday:
 - weather travel advisory was in effect

- British Columbians are at the center of every choice we have made in Budget 2018.
- We're investing \$1 billion over three years to create 22,000 childcare spaces and make childcare more affordable for parents.
- We have laid out a comprehensive housing plan that will:

- Close loopholes and fight real estate speculation
- Tax sales on homes worth over \$3 million
- Build 114,000 affordable housing units through direct construction and partnerships with the private sector
- We're investing \$548 million over three years to improve seniors care and \$150 million to connect people without a family doctor with team-based primary care.
- We're fully eliminating unfair MSP Premiums.
- Investing a record \$15.8 billion in building schools, hospitals and transportation projects.
- All while balancing the budget and continuing to invest in creating good jobs in every corner of BC.

Background:

Making Life More Affordable

 Building on the Province's progress to date, Budget 2018 takes action to make life more affordable by:

- Introducing a new affordable child-care benefit that will reduce child-care costs by up to \$1,250 per month for every child and support 86,000 B.C. families per year by 2020-21.
- Providing up to \$350 per month directly to licenced child-care providers to reduce fees for an estimated 50,000 families per year by 2020-21.
- Curbing speculation in B.C.'s housing market and helping to build 114,000 affordable rental, non-profit, co-op and owner-purchase housing units through partnerships.
- Eliminating Medical Services Plan (MSP) premiums by Jan. 1, 2020, saving individuals up to \$900 a year, and families up to \$1,800 a year.
- Making ferries more affordable by freezing fares on all major BC Ferries routes, reducing fares on non-major routes and fully restoring the Monday to Thursday seniors passenger fare discount.
- Improving B.C.'s Fair PharmaCare program to eliminate deductibles for families with annual net incomes below \$30,000, starting Jan. 1, 2019. Approximately 240,000 families will receive expanded coverage.
- Reinstating free bus passes with the flexibility to support other transportation needs will help over 100,000 people receiving disability assistance to better connect them with their communities and the services they rely on.

<u>Delivering the Services People Count On</u>

- British Columbians deserve services they can depend on. That's why Budget 2018 invests in priority services, including:
- Significant investments in health care, with funding of \$548 million over three
 years to improve care for seniors and \$150 million to help connect those who do
 not have a family doctor with team-based primary care.
- Hiring more teachers, bringing the total to over 3,700 new hires around the province to support students and meet the need for qualified teachers in B.C.
- Making a historic investment of \$50 million this fiscal year to support the revitalization and preservation of Indigenous languages in B.C.

- Dedicating \$18 million to services that provide outreach and counselling support for women and children affected by violence.
- Improving access to justice through increased funding for legal aid, family law services, and the hiring of more sheriffs and court staff to help reduce court delays.

Building a Strong, Sustainable Economy

- Budget 2018 invests in a strong, sustainable economy through B.C.'s greatest resource its people, by:
- Supporting communities hit the hardest by the 2017 wildfire season and investing in wildfire preparedness to protect people, communities and wildlife.
- Increasing funding for B.C.'s agrifood sector to support enhanced Buy BC, Grow BC and Feed BC initiatives to drive consumer demand and get B.C.'s goods to overseas markets.
- Confirming the removal of fees for Adult Basic Education and English Language Learning to give people opportunities to grow and succeed.
- Partnering with industry, the federal government and First Nations communities to support Indigenous skills training programs with \$30 million over three years.
- Increasing grants administered through the BC Arts Council and Creative BC, which support B.C.'s vibrant communities and creative economy.
- Expanding B.C.'s tuition waiver program and increasing financial support for former youth in care while they attend post-secondary school or training programs.
- Budget 2018 commitments are being funded by improved revenue forecasts over the fiscal plan period, as well as new revenue sources, including:
- A speculation tax, and increases in the foreign buyers' tax, to address housing affordability in B.C. by reducing foreign demand, and curbing speculation in the residential property market.
- An employer health tax to allow for the full elimination of MSP premiums.
- "For too long, British Columbians have not been able to get the services that they need or afford to live in the communities in which they work or grew up

in," James said. "We are taking bold action to change that with Budget 2018 - a budget that works for everyone in B.C."

Economic Outlook

- British Columbia experienced stronger than previously forecast economic growth in 2017. Budget 2018 reflects an upward revision to the 2017 real GDP estimate, to 3.4% from 2.9%, estimated in the Budget 2017 Update, due to better-than-expected performance of B.C.'s main domestic indicators, including employment, retail sales, housing starts and exports.
- Strong growth is expected to continue with the provincial economy projected to grow by 2.3% in 2018. Private sector forecasters expect B.C.'s economic growth to continue to rank near the top of provincial standings in the nearterm.
- The near-term global economic outlook has also improved since Budget 2017 Update, with upward revisions to 2018 real GDP growth for the United States, Japan, China and the euro zone.
- Downside risks remain, including uncertainty regarding U.S. fiscal and trade
 policy and ongoing economic challenges in Asia and the euro zone. The Budget
 2018 economic forecast is prudent, compared to the outlook provided by the
 independent Economic Forecast Council, in recognition of the downside risks to
 the outlook.

Budget Outlook

- Budget 2018 projects surpluses of:
 - o \$219 million in 2018-19
 - o \$281 million in 2019-20
 - o \$284 million in 2020-21
- Government has included several layers of prudence into the fiscal plan, to help account for lower-than-expected revenues, unforeseen expenses or emergencies. Budget 2018 includes a forecast allowance of \$350 million in 2018-19, \$500 million in 2019-20 and \$600 million in 2020-21. Budget 2018 also

includes contingencies of \$550 million in 2018-19, \$750 million in 2019-2020 and \$750 million in 2020-21.

Revenue Outlook

• Total government revenue is forecast at \$54.2 billion in 2018-19, \$57.6 billion in 2019-20 and \$58.6 billion in 2020-21.

Expense Outlook

• Total expenses over the three-year fiscal plan are forecast at \$53.6 billion in 2018-19, \$56.8 billion in 2019-20 and \$57.8 billion in 2020-21.

Capital Spending

- Taxpayer-supported capital spending over the fiscal plan will total a recordlevel \$15.8 billion, and includes urgently needed investments in critical infrastructure, such as:
 - o Education: \$2 billion to maintain, replace, renovate or expand K-12 facilities.
 - Post-secondary education: \$2.6 billion to build capacity and help meet the province's future workforce needs in areas like science, trades and technology.
 - Health: \$3.1 billion to support major construction projects and upgrading health facilities, medical and diagnostic equipment, and information management technology systems.
- Housing: \$379 million to preserve existing affordable housing and to help fund the construction of supportive housing units.
- Student housing: \$450 million for a student housing program for public postsecondary institutions that will help finance 5,000 new student housing beds.
- Transportation: \$4 billion in provincial operating and capital funding, which will leverage an additional \$1.3 billion through federal cost sharing and partnerships with private organizations, local governments and other agencies.

Debt Affordability

- The operating debt is forecast to be eliminated by the end of 2018-19, one year earlier than forecast in Budget 2017 Update. Primarily, this is a result of stronger-than-predicted economic growth in 2017. This will be the first time the government has been free of operating debt in over 40 years.
- The taxpayer-supported debt-to-GDP ratio, a key indicator used by credit-rating agencies, is expected to remain below 16% over the fiscal plan period, despite record-level capital spending.

• Business in Vancouver article on the fear among some in the B.C. tourism sector that Albertans would cancel vacations to B.C. The general consensus, however, is that Albertans will continue to visit B.C., and that if they were to stop coming to B.C. - to ski, for example – the decision would end up hurting fellow Albertans. "The majority of the accommodation in those resorts are also owned by Albertans," said Big White Ski Resort senior vice-president Michael Ballingall. Ballingall said he doubts Albertans will boycott B.C. ski resorts and hurt fellow Albertans, adding that he has seen no sign so far that Albertans intend to boycott Big White. "Right now Alberta visitors are booking ahead of the pace that they were booking year-to-date at this time last year," he said.

Tourism, Arts and Culture Minister Lisa Beare told Business in Vancouver that she is not concerned that fewer Albertans will choose to vacation and spend money in B.C. "I am confident that people from across Canada and around the world will continue to find B.C. a compelling place to visit and enjoy. B.C. offers amazing experiences and unrivalled natural beauty. I appreciate the many Albertans who choose to vacation in our province."

- The Civil Forfeiture Act allows the CFO to apply to a Supreme Court judge to seek the forfeiture of property that has been used to commit unlawful activity or is the proceeds of unlawful activity.
- Under the Act, the CFO has no independent investigative or seizure powers. Instead, the CFO relies on voluntary referrals from its law enforcement partners. Police determine investigative priorities and refer assets seized under their criminal law powers as they deem appropriate.
- The CFO has successfully applied for forfeiture of property using money laundering and fraud as the basis for the claim.

The Civil Forfeiture Act became law in 2006. It targets the proceeds and instruments of unlawful activity. It was created to ensure that people cannot profit from unlawful activity or use property in a way that may harm other persons.

Civil forfeiture is designed to target property, not people. Proceedings are initiated by the director of civil forfeiture against both the profits of alleged unlawful activity and the instruments used to acquire it. Anyone who contests the allegations has the right to examine the director's evidence and provide their own evidence before a Justice of the Supreme Court of B.C.

- In terms of process, administrative forfeiture has been in place since 2011. It was created due to
 the previously low response rate of defendants that the CFO tried to engage in the civil
 forfeiture process. Administrative forfeiture ensures procedural fairness, efficiency and
 economy for the self-funding CFO.
- Administrative forfeiture provides an opportunity for a defendant to dispute that the asset in
 question is an instrument or proceeds of unlawful activity. This notification takes place outside
 the court process (by registered mail and newspaper ad). Those who wish to dispute that the
 property is from unlawful activity simply need to respond by mailing an affidavit to the Civil
 Forfeiture Office (CFO) within the required time period, which is approximately two months.
- When a defendant chooses not to participate in the administrative forfeiture process, it costs
 the CFO/government about \$500 to complete the process. Before administrative forfeiture was
 put in place in 2011, it would cost the CFO/government over \$5,000 in legal costs to go through
 the regular civil forfeiture process when a defendant chose not to participate in the regular civil

forfeiture process. Thus, administrative forfeiture avoids the high procedural costs of seeking default judgment in the full civil forfeiture process, and enables the CFO to take on lower-value cash and car referrals from police agencies in an efficient and economical manner. The vast majority of these involve street-level dealing of hard drugs, including fentanyl.

- If a defendant disputes the CFO's claim in the administrative forfeiture process, the CFO has the option to commence civil forfeiture proceedings, which fully takes place within a court setting.
- Notably, administrative forfeiture can only be used in cases involving assets valued at less than \$75,000 and that are not real property (i.e., houses or land) and are not subject to registered third-party interests (e.g., auto loans).
- The CFO has commenced just over 3,700 administrative forfeiture files since the program started in 2011. Of those, 2,989 were not disputed and concluded with an administrative forfeiture. Another 718 (less than one in five) have been disputed, and of them, 579 have resulted in civil court proceedings, 128 have been discontinued and 11 are still in process.

The Civil Forfeiture Office (CFO) may forfeit the following:

- Real property (houses, land), or
- Personal property (vehicles, jewellery, electronics etc.)

Proceeds of the sale of forfeited properties are paid into the civil forfeiture special account where they are used to pay for operational costs, compensation and grants.

Property is liquidated in the following ways:

- Real property (houses, land) is sold through a realtor and listed on the multiple listing service (MLS)
- Personal property (vehicles, jewellery, electronics etc.) is sold through the Ministry of Citizen Services' B.C. Auction website
- Property that cannot be sold is disposed of or sent for salvage

Sometimes property is given a reserve price on the B.C. Auction website. This allows the CFO to ensure that it obtains the maximum price that can be sustained by the market in selling property.

From 2006 until mid 2017, the Civil Forfeiture Office (CFO) has received over 4900 file referrals from law enforcement agencies. These have resulted in the forfeiture of \$73 million with \$31 million of this money being re-invested in B.C. communities in the form of crime prevention grants and compensation to eligible victims.

Currently 8 of the 10 provinces in Canada have a civil forfeiture program. In B.C., civil forfeiture actions are commenced in the B.C. Supreme Court and a small number of cases have been heard by the B.C. Court of Appeal. One case in Ontario has been heard by the Supreme Court of Canada.

BC procurement modernization - Overview:

- Procurement is the process by which government acquires goods, services or works from an external source, normally via a competitive bidding process. It is an important tool for the delivery of government services.
- A procurement modernization strategy is being developed by the Ministry of Citizens' Services and is currently in draft form. The Ministry is working towards finalizing this strategy for the Minister by March 31, 2018.
- The strategy will align government's procurement principles and processes with today's economy. The strategy will maximize the benefits of procurement to citizens, buyers, and businesses, while directing attention to the social and environmental impact of procurement for all British Columbians.
- The strategy has four goals: (a) ensuring best value and increased social benefit; (b) creating more opportunity for business of all sizes; (c) making it easier to do business with government; and (d) creating greater capacity to support procurement.
- The strategy aims to leverage the important strategic tool of procurement to support government's three main objectives: making life more affordable, delivering the services that people count on, and building an economy that works for everyone.

RESULTS:

- The report includes information on all 13 provinces and territories for the first time.
- PEI scored the highest of any jurisdiction at 11 out of 15, followed by Quebec at 10 and New Brunswick and Ontario tied at 9.5.
- BC received a score of 7 out of 15, which is identical to the score received on the 2014 report. All sub-scale scores are also identical between 2014 and 2017 reports.
- A score of 7 puts BC in 10th position out of 13, ranked ahead of Alberta, Nunavut, and the Yukon Territory. BC was in 7th position out of 11 in the 2014 report.
- BC is one of only three jurisdictions that did not improve its score in the three years between reports.

- The report compares the relative state of child care between Canadian provinces and territories, and provides some comparison between Canada and other Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) countries.
- The report provides scores for each participating province and territory across five domains deemed to be important by the OECD in a landmark 2006 report: governance, funding, access, learning environments and accountability. Scores are aggregated and each province receives a total score out of 15.
- Information submitted for the report is reflective of the 2016/17 fiscal year, which does not reflect any changes
 related to actions of the current BC government.

Good Evening Kevin;

Tonight, we hosted the Public Open House for Haney Bypass Improvements from 4pm to 8pm at the ACT Arts Center in Maple Ridge.

We had 133 attendees, including:

- 2 Maple Ridge Councillors (Gordy Robson & Craig Speirs)
- MLA Bob D'Eith
- Minister Lisa Beare and her EA Korleen Carreras
- HUB representative (who will be sending in formal feedback from HUB)
- 1 media, a local TV outlet (See TV)

FYI: Just prior to the open house, I also did an interview with the Maple Ridge News, outlining the scope of the project and the need for a sliver take at the Salvation Army site.

In addition, we had:

- 12 MoTI reps (including consultants)
- 4 reps from City of Maple Ridge
- 1 rep from BC Housing (Naomi Brunemeyer)
- 2 plain clothed security guards

35 hardcopy feedback forms completed at the open house

1 hand written submission provided at the open house

Feedback forms are available online for completion until February 28

Feedback Themes:

- There were very few concerns raised about the Salvation Army site.
- People were clearly able to separate the transportation improvements from the housing issue once they understood that we did not require the full property for the proposed improvements.
- Lots of inquiries around if we were 4-laning the corridor as part of the project. People seemed satisfied to hear that these improvements focused on safety and congestion relief, with the long term vision being 4-laning (with no timeframe).
- Questions / concerns around the removal of left turns on Lougheed (specifically NB left turn onto 222nd due to business).
- Few concerns about the removal of left turns on Haney as people appreciate that these movemetns were difficult and most residents indicated they already took an alternate route to avoid making left turns.
- While some concerns were raised around backups as a result of the new traffic signal at Callaghan, there was general support from the safety standpoint and improved access.
- Very little support for the traffic signal at 227th people already used alternate routes.
- River Road strong support for the acceleration lane to replace the yield condition
- Kanaka Way improvements had strong support for the second left turn lane, and lane extensions, however general comments that we needed to make a larger improvement at that location, extending the two westbound lanes as far as possible.
- Prevalent interest in seeing as few signals as possible on Haney so that it would work better as a bypass.
- A few comments around disappointment that there no interchange at either end of the bypass.
- General comments about pedestrian, jay-walking and cyclist access.
- Questions about the purposes of the multi-use path on Lougheed between 220th and 222nd (directed to the City)
- Safety of pedestrians using the existing underpass (near Callaghan) lighting, etc.
