

Minister of Advanced Education, Skills and Training Melanie Mark was joined by post-secondary students and college presidents at the Parliament Buildings in Victoria to celebrate the second annual BC Colleges Day. The provincial proclamation recognizes the vital role that colleges have in the post-secondary system.

"Our colleges are an important part of our education ecosystem," said Mark. "Education is a powerful tool that puts people on pathways to opportunity, employment and better lives. I'm proud to help celebrate BC Colleges Day."

B.C. is home to 11 public colleges, with more than 60 campuses and learning centres throughout the province. With over 250 academic, trades, technology and vocational programs, public colleges serve more than 125,000 students annually, plus thousands more through continuing education.

"B.C. college graduates are highly skilled by the time they complete their credential because of the

depth of experience they get through their program, which includes applied learning, and real-world, hands-on experience," said John Bowman, BC Colleges chair. "Over 90% of our graduates are employed within six months of graduation."

B.C. colleges have also responded to demand for flexible delivery options by offering options such as online delivery, video conferencing, and hands-on learning through practicums and apprenticeships.

"As a single mom, it was important for me to be able to go to school in my home community," said Jaimie Davis, a Gitxsan/Nisga'a second-year student in Northwest Community College's Freda Diesing School of Northwest Coast Art. "Northwest Community College offered me a way to do both. Because I can take care of my family and still get an education, it helps me build my career as an Indigenous woman."

Over the next decade, 917,000 job openings are expected due to a combination of retirement and economic growth. About eight out of 10 jobs will require some post-secondary education or training: 42% will require a diploma, certificate or apprenticeship training, while 36% will require a bachelor, graduate, or first-professional degree and/or significant work experience. Many of those bachelor degrees are started at B.C. colleges, where students can take their first two years of university-transfer credits before moving on to a university.

BC Colleges is an association of British Columbia's public, post-secondary colleges. The role of the organization is to facilitate collaboration between the colleges, so they can more effectively produce a well-educated and highly skilled workforce for British Columbia.



VANCOUVER - The Government of British Columbia is investing in people in the Downtown Eastside with approximately 450 units of affordable rental housing being constructed for low-to-moderate-income households.

"We are building a mix of housing here that will help people who have been struggling to find homes they can afford in their community," said Selina Robinson, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "People in the Downtown Eastside shouldn't have to leave their community because of a lack of appropriate housing. Our government cares about making sure people can transition from shelters to supportive housing to affordable, independent housing within their own communities. That's how we foster healthy communities."

These units will have rental rates ranging from \$375 to \$1,272 and are being funded through the government's Budget 2017 Update, which included a commitment of \$208 million to build 1,700 affordable rental-housing units over the next four years. The Province is working in partnership with the City of Vancouver, Vancouver Coastal Health and four non-profit service providers to ensure the appropriate housing and support services will be made available.

The B.C. government is committing approximately \$83 million for the following four projects:

- * 58 W. Hastings St., operated by the Chinatown Foundation
- * 23-51 Cordova St., operated by the PHS Community Services Society
- * 616 Cordova St., operated by Union Gospel Mission-Women and Families Centre
- * 301 E. Hastings St., operator still being determined

Vancouver Coastal Health plans to operate community health centres at the 58 W. Hastings St. and 301 E. Hastings St. projects. Health-care services at these centres will be made available to the broader community.

The Province, through BC Housing, continues to work with partners to determine other operating details for each project.

VICTORIA - Tuesday, Feb. 27, 2018 is a day to recognize the diverse range of affordable, accessible and applied education programs that B.C. colleges offer students in every corner of the province.

Minister of Advanced Education, Skills and Training Melanie Mark was joined by post-secondary students and college presidents at the parliament buildings in Victoria to celebrate the second annual BC Colleges Day. The provincial proclamation recognizes the vital role that colleges have in the post-secondary system.

"Our colleges are an important part of our education ecosystem," said Mark. "Education is a powerful tool that puts people on pathways to opportunity, employment and better lives. I'm proud to help celebrate BC Colleges Day."

B.C. is home to 11 public colleges, with more than 60 campuses and learning centres throughout the province. With over 250 academic, trades, technology and vocational programs, public colleges serve more than 125,000 students annually, plus thousands more through continuing education.

"B.C. college graduates are highly skilled by the time they complete their credentials because of the depth of experience they get through their program, which includes applied learning, and real-world, hands-on experience," said John Bowman, BC Colleges chair. "Over 90% of our graduates are employed within six months of graduation."

B.C. colleges have also responded to demand for flexible delivery options by offering options such as online delivery, video conferencing and hands-on learning through practicums and apprenticeships.

"As a single mom, it was important for me to be able to go to school in my home community," said Jaimie Davis, a Gitxsan/Nisga'a second-year student in Northwest Community College's Freda Diesing School of Northwest Coast Art. "Northwest Community College offered me a way to do both. Because I can take care of my family and still get an education, it helps me build my career as an Indigenous woman."

Over the next decade, 917,000 job openings are expected due to a combination of retirement and economic growth. About eight out of 10 jobs will require some post-secondary education or training: 42% will require a diploma, certificate or apprenticeship training, while 36% will require a bachelor, graduate, or first-professional degree and/or significant work experience. Many of those bachelor degrees are started at B.C. colleges, where students can take their first two years of university-transfer credits before moving to a university.

BC Colleges is an association of British Columbia's public, post-secondary colleges. The role of the organization is to facilitate collaboration between the colleges, so they can more effectively produce a well-educated and highly skilled workforce for British Columbia.

VICTORIA - Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources Minister Michelle Mungall has established a B.C. Mining Jobs Task Force that will review exploration and mining in the province and find ways to strengthen this important industry.

"Over the coming months the B.C. Mining Jobs Task Force will work with First Nations, the mining industry and communities to develop recommendations on possible actions government could take to bring more certainty to the mining sector and create good jobs for people today, tomorrow and beyond," said Mungall. "One of our goals with this review is to find ways to ensure mines in B.C. remain viable when commodity prices fluctuate, so that people can keep working and communities can thrive."

The 12-member task force will include representatives from industry, First Nations, municipal government, an environmental non-governmental organization, labour, post-secondary/training and the financial sector. The task force will submit its final report, including recommendations for legislative and/or regulatory amendments to the minister by Nov. 21, 2018.

Mungall announced the Mining Jobs Task Force in conjunction with Mining Day events at the parliament buildings. Organized by the Mining Association of B.C. (MABC), the annual Mining Day in Victoria brings together 40 delegates from major mining companies, proponents and supplier companies, and provides an opportunity for industry and government to discuss the importance of the sector, while identifying responsible opportunities for growth.

"We look forward to working with the government, First Nations and other important stakeholders on the task force to ensure our industry is globally competitive and well positioned to sustain the mining jobs of today and, importantly, create the mining jobs of tomorrow," said Bryan Cox, president & CEO of the Mining Association of British Columbia (MABC). "A strong and thriving B.C. mining industry can continue to play a pivotal leadership role in Canada's transition to a clean tech, lower-carbon future, for the benefit of B.C. families and workers."

"We fully support the provincial government's commitment to the future of mining in British Columbia and the employment it supports," said Michelle Laurie from the United Steelworkers. "The Mining Jobs Task Force will help government find ways to strengthen the sector, so it's able to sustain good, accessible jobs and training opportunities for British Columbians, workers and their families throughout the province."

At today's announcement, Mungall also highlighted the B.C. mining flow-through share tax credit, which was extended in Budget 2018. The previous tax credit expired Dec. 31, 2017.

"In an era when we will need minerals for an electrified economy and for transportation, we want B.C. to be the most attractive jurisdiction in Canada for exploration investment," said Mungall. "The mining flow-through share tax credit is one of the tools we can use to get there."

The Mining Jobs Task Force will look at all aspects of mineral exploration and mining in British Columbia, and provide recommendations to government on measures it might implement to make B.C. the most attractive jurisdiction for investment in this important industry.

Mining Jobs Task Force to review B.C.'s exploration and mining sector

Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources Michelle Mungall has established the 12-member B.C. Mining Jobs Task Force. The task force is mandated to work with First Nations, the mining industry and mining communities to make jobs secure and mines viable as commodity prices fluctuate.

The task force will be responsible for providing the Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources with recommendations on the following areas:

- * Establishing baseline metrics (e.g. cost of production, carbon intensity, employment statistics, expenditures and revenues, etc.) to measure the current state of the industry and provide an economic impact analysis of the mining sector in B.C.;
- * Skills training and development, so that British Columbians can enter and grow careers in the sector;
- * A co-ordinated provincial approach to geoscience;
- * Potential financial incentive programs and the Province's competiveness and approach to attract mining investment into BC;
- * Potential government actions to ensure the sustainability of existing mines and job protection during commodity cycles;
- * Identify innovation and partnership opportunities that ensure an environmentally sustainable mining sector;
- * Identify best practices in mining jobsite health and safety;
- * Increasing public awareness of the importance of the mining sector to the Province and its role in a low-carbon future; and
- * In consultation with the Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources, any other matters arising over the course of the review that the Task Force considers significant.

Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources assistant deputy minister Peter Robb will chair the task force. The other members of the task force include:

Edie Thome, president & CEO of the Association for Mineral Exploration (AME):

Thome brings a wealth of experience in government relations, permitting and public affairs as well as on-the-ground experience working with stakeholders, First Nations, elected officials and land owners on projects in the resource sector. Through her work, she is familiar with advocacy efforts at both the provincial and federal levels and, specifically, how the legislative and regulatory framework can support or hinder productive, responsible resource development within British Columbia and Canada.

Most recently, Thome was director of Environment, Permitting and Compliance, Aboriginal Relations and Public Affairs at BC Hydro, responsible for permitting and compliance, Aboriginal relations and public affairs for the Site C Clean Energy Project. Prior to that she worked in risk management, environment, operations and customer service for BC Hydro. Her management experience also includes four and a half years as vice-president, Customer Service, Airport Operations and Corporate Communications for Harmony Airways. Thome has brought to AME a keen understanding of leadership in an industry association, gained through her service from 2013 to 2017 as chair of the board of the Canadian Hydropower Association (CHA), a national, non-profit organization, comprised of nearly 50 members - spanning hydropower producers, manufacturers, developers and engineering firms to individuals.

Bryan Cox, president & CEO of the Mining Association of British Columbia (MABC):

As the preeminent voice and advocate for the mining industry in B.C., Cox leads a team actively working with governments, business leaders, First Nations, communities, and the broader public to advocate for and communicate the economic and social value of mining. MABC is focused on keeping the interests of its members and the value of mining forefront in the minds of British Columbians, especially regarding society's transition to a lower carbon economy.

Don McPherson, mayor of Tumbler Ridge:

McPherson moved to Tumbler Ridge in 1981, two years before it ever became a community. Working on the Province's North East Coal Project at the 1,000 person camp, he contracted to Quintette and Bullmoose Mines. In 1986, he moved his business into the downtown core and saw the community rise up around him.

The mayor was first elected to council in 2000 during a by-election. The circumstances surrounding this election has given the mayor deep insight into both the strengths and vulnerabilities of a mining community. As the town emptied during the shutdown of the two mines then councillor McPherson fought to ensure the community did not close, retained its infrastructure and attracted new residents through a first of its kind mass housing sale. McPherson will bring a unique perspective to the task force as its only municipal representative on issues such as community needs, sustainability, and how government can work with industry to ensure the success of all.

Regina Saimoto, associate dean for Northwest Community College (NWCC), Eastern Region:

Saimoto has played an instrumental role in NWCC's award-winning School of Exploration & Mining and collaborated on curriculum development of the Environmental Monitoring Assistant Program (EMAP) since 2006. Previously, she developed curricula for a number of courses and programs related to the natural resource sector, working with government and industry to identify key competencies. Saimoto has also served as the executive director for the Centre of Training Excellence in Mining (CTEM), the dean of instruction and has taught in numerous natural resources related programs and courses.

Alan Young, director, Materials Efficiency Research Group:

Since 1990, Young has worked as a facilitator and strategist for a wide range of conservation groups, Indigenous organizations, progressive companies and governments across Canada and internationally. His primary focus has been on implementing sustainability and leadership strategies for the extractive sector in North America, Latin America, Europe and Scandinavia. His work includes ethical practices certification programs in the forestry and mining sectors, cross sector collaboration design and facilitation, large-scale conservation strategies, as well as various legislative reform initiatives in the extractive sectors nationally and internationally. He is chairperson of the International Institute for Sustainable Development, Steering Committee member of the Initiative for Responsible

Mining Assurance, and is a former chair of the Forest Stewardship Council of Canada.

Tom Syer, director of Government Affairs, Teck Resources Limited:

Syer has 20 years of experience in leadership roles within the public and private sectors, working on policy development with specific focuses on natural resource development, climate change and Indigenous relations. He has been involved in the development and roll-out of numerous provincial and federal policy initiatives and, in the private sector, has been responsible for advancing resource development policies and Indigenous relationships, including successfully negotiating comprehensive agreements for the largest wind farm and run-of-river projects in Western Canada.

Additionally, Syer has actively led and participated in numerous multi-lateral initiatives, policy committees and reviews including chairing the Energy and Indigenous Affairs Committees at the Business Council.

Richard Tremblay, Taseko Gibraltar Mine vice-president and general manager:

Tremblay is a seasoned mining professional who has 29 years of experience in the mining industry. He is currently vice president and general manager of the Gibraltar Mine located north of Williams Lake, B.C. and previous to that was vice president of Operations at Coalspur. Tremblay has also been general manager of Teck Coal's Fording River and Line Creek Operations, located in the Elk Valley in south east British Columbia.

Tremblay holds an MBA from Simon Fraser University and is a professional engineer with a bachelor of Science in Chemical Engineering from Queen's University. He and his wife Sue have been married for twenty-eight years and have three adult children, all of whom work in the mining industry. The Tremblays live in Williams Lake with their 14 dogs, 2 cats and 3 horses.

Michelle Laurie, staff representative for the United Steelworkers - Western Canada:

Laurie has lived and worked throughout British Columbia: on the coast, Vancouver Island, the far northern portion of the province, and in the east central region. She is a red-seal certified electrician, having served her apprenticeship in a coal mine in Tumbler Ridge B.C. Prior to that, she was employed in Cassiar, B.C., in the asbestos mine as a labourer, drill oiler and truck driver. Laurie has been trained in mine rescue (surface) and has also worked as a paramedic in central and southern B.C.

Currently, Laurie is primarily involved in collective bargaining and dispute resolution matters in various sectors of the Steelworkers, as well as delivering training to workers on those issues and others. She is married, with four adult children and five grandchildren, all living in various parts of B.C., and clearly has an ongoing interest the economic security and development of our province.

Earl Graham, staff representative for the United Steelworkers:

Earl Graham is employed as a Staff Representative for the United Steelworkers and services through-out the lower mainland, Vancouver Island, Sunshine Coast, as the Interior of British Columbia, and also goes as far north as to include the Yukon. Graham, at a young age, started in the logging industry on Vancouver Island, then transferred to the manufacturing side of the business back on the mainland. He then moved on to serving as a business agent with the IWA in 1996. In 2006 the IWA merged with the United Steelworkers where he then became a USW staff representative. In his capacity of staff representative, he has been involved in many sectors from agriculture, forestry and mining.

More importantly, with respect to this task force, he has serviced in the mining sector for over 10 years at the Quinsam Coal Mine in Campbell River, and Texada Quarrying (A Division of LaFarge), Imperial Limestone Company, and Blubber Bay Quarry (Ash Grove Cement Company), all of which are located on Texada Island. In 2017, Graham was appointed from labour to the Health and Safety Review Sub-Committee for the review of the Health, Safety and Reclamation Code for Mines in British Columbia. Graham is married and has three adult girls who live and work in greater Vancouver and Surrey region. He continues to support working families to make their lives a better place to live in the wonderful province of British Columbia.

Mark Podlasly, senior advisor, First Nations Energy and Mining Council:

Podlasly, member of the Cook's Ferry Indian Band (Nlaka'pamux Nation), is a consultant with over 20 years of experience in corporate strategy, strategic partnerships and revenue sharing mechanisms related to extractive industries.

A graduate of Harvard University, he is currently a Trustee of the NLX Legacy Trust, managing and operating a seven-figure mining-based, sovereign wealth fund shared by eight Indigenous communities in South Central B.C. He also serves as chair of the First Nations Limited Partnership (FNLP), a 16 First Nations commercial entity allied to Chevron Canada's Kitimat LNG Project.

Podlasly previously ran a successful executive education and consulting practice in Asia, USA and Europe where he designed and delivered corporate strategy, leadership, and globalization programs for a client list that includes GE, Unilever, General Mills, Clorox, Goldman Sachs and Praxair. Podlasly is a regular contributor in the Kellogg School of Management's mining leadership programs in Chicago, and an active participant to global business and indigenous engagement for the International Finance Corporation's Sustainability Exchange and DPI Mining.

Student success continues to build in B.C.

VICTORIA - High-school completion rates continue to improve for all B.C. students, as confirmed by the latest Ministry of Education data released today.

The six-year completion rates from 2016-17 throughout the province show that more students overall are completing high school, with the greatest increases for Indigenous students and students with special needs.

"As a new government, our vision is to boost student achievement and grad rates. High school completion is a key that opens doors for people, no matter what path they choose," said Education Minister Rob Fleming.

"These consistent increases mean more students are able to take advantage of those opportunities. We will keep working to raise the six-year completion rate. We've seen positive improvements for students with diverse needs and Indigenous learners, but there is more work to be done to ensure all students can recognize their full potential."

The completion rate for Indigenous students in 2016-17 increased 2.1% over 2015-16, to 65.9%. Over the last 10 years, the rate for Indigenous students has increased by 19%, up from 46.9% in 2007-08.

Students with special needs are completing high school at a rate of 69.4%, up 2.4% from the year before. These students have seen a 25.3% increase in completion rates over the last 10 years, up from 44.1% in 2007-08.

Overall completion rates increase steadily each year; 84% this year, up from 83.6% last year. The overall completion rate has increased 5.2% over the past 10 years, from 78.8% in 2007-08.

The six-year completion rate calculates the number of students who graduated within six years from the time they enrolled in Grade 8.

New homes and withdrawal centre for people in Vancouver

VANCOUVER - The Province is working with the City of Vancouver and Vancouver Coastal Health to build approximately 100 affordable rental homes, as well as a new withdrawal management centre for people seeking treatment for addictions.

"Addressing both the urgent housing needs of British Columbians and the health needs of people living with addiction issues requires new partnerships and a new approach," said Selina Robinson, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "This model of creating a mixed-use development means we're able to provide homes for the people who need it most, while also reaching out to the larger community with essential addictions services, resulting in long term and comprehensive solutions for people in Vancouver."

A new evidence-based withdrawal management centre within the planned complex will replace Vancouver Coastal Health's current withdrawal management services facility on East 2nd Ave. It will include a range of enhanced services such as inpatient and outpatient withdrawal management, and sobering and at-home withdrawal management, which are trauma-informed and culturally appropriate.

Approximately 20 new spaces of short-term transitional housing are also included in the plans for people who have completed detox, so they can continue receiving access to supports and health services while they transition into longer-term housing and treatment for substance use.

"It's exciting to see this forward-thinking plan for delivering addiction treatment services to those in need, while also providing affordable and transitional housing," said Judy Darcy, Minister of Mental Health and Addictions. "We recognize the social factors, like poverty and housing, contribute to mental health and addictions, and are critical to a person's pathway to

hope and recovery. I expect this centre will make a difference in many people's lives. "

The proposed mixed-use re-development, located at 1636 Clark Dr. and 1321-1395 East 1st Ave. is a collaborative response to the housing crisis and the health-care needs of the community. It will serve low-to moderate-income people, and include a social enterprise space for local residents, focusing on Indigenous healing and wellness through employment and alignment with culturally informed treatment.

"The city is a proud partner for this innovative project that combines urgently-needed, affordable housing with new addictions support services for our most vulnerable residents. This is yet another example of how we are helping people with the greatest needs," said Gregor Robertson, mayor of Vancouver. "Whether it's the 600 new modular homes for the homeless, hundreds of affordable homes for low-income residents at 58 W. Hastings, and now this major project at 1st and Clark, we are making significant headway on helping Vancouver residents rebuild their lives through affordable-housing options and addiction treatment support."

The Province, Vancouver Coastal Health and the City of Vancouver will work with existing tenants on site and the surrounding community to share project details. The proposed project is subject to a rezoning approval by Vancouver city council and a development permit approval process.

VANCOUVER - People in the Lower Mainland will soon experience reduced traffic delays

thanks to six new motorist advisory signs that will be installed at key road and railway crossings in Langley, Surrey and the Township of Langley, as part of the Railway Crossing Information System project.

The signs will complement the railway overpasses constructed in the Langley and Surrey area along the Robert Banks rail corridor that were built to improve shipments and traffic flow, while enhancing trade with the Asia-Pacific region. Community consultation has shown strong support for the signs, as their purpose is to improve community liveability and help manage increased traffic along the corridor, which has as many as 22 train crossings per day.

"Our government is continuously working to build stronger, more efficient transportation corridors to international markets," said the Honourable Marc Garneau, Minister of Transport. "With this contribution of \$300,000 to the intelligent transportation system, we are providing drivers with the information they need to choose the most efficient route, while making the trade corridor more reliable."

Intelligent by design, the advisory signs will operate through a central control system and will provide drivers with real-time train crossing information - indicating if the crossing is open or closed - so drivers can make informed decisions about their travel routes. The signs will specify the train's location and travel direction, enabling drivers to use alternate crossing options at adjacent railway overpasses in order to avoid traffic delays.

"These motorist advisory signs are a great example of how new transportation technology can improve the day-to-day lives of the people who live in high-traffic, trade-oriented communities," said Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure Claire Trevena. "The Province will continue to work with our partners when it comes to innovating beneficial transportation solutions."

In addition to reducing traffic congestion and minimizing greenhouse gas emissions due to decreased vehicle idling times, the signs will also increase travel efficiency and mobility for emergency vehicles.

"The Railway Crossing Information System is a critical piece of the Roberts Bank Rail Corridor program that will help drivers make informed choices when planning their route to minimize delays by rerouting to one of the eight new overpass crossings," said Kevin Desmond, CEO of TransLink. "This is another example of business and government coming together to improve travel on major road arterials."

"The Port of Vancouver is Canada's largest, keeping our country connected with the global economy," said Cliff Stewart, vice president, Infrastructure at the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority. "We recognize the movement of goods to and from the port can impact communities, and we're always looking at ways to reduce that impact working with a wide variety of stakeholders. The joint effort and support of all funding partners involved in this

project will help to relieve traffic congestion and delays for drivers, while improving community safety and quality of life for daily commuters."

The Railway Crossing Information System project is jointly funded by the Government of B.C., Transport Canada and Vancouver Fraser Port Authority, each providing \$300,000, in addition to \$2.9 million from TransLink. The total project cost is \$3.8 million, which includes development of the central control system and a recently issued civil-works contract valued at \$1.7 million awarded to Crown Contracting Limited from Surrey. The project is expected to be complete and in operation by December 2018.

VICTORIA - Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources Minister Michelle Mungall has established a B.C. Mining Jobs Task Force that will review exploration and mining in the province and find ways to strengthen this important industry.

"Over the coming months, the B.C. Mining Jobs Task Force will work with First Nations, the mining industry and communities to develop recommendations on possible actions government could take to bring more certainty to the mining sector and create good jobs for people today, tomorrow and beyond," said Mungall. "One of our goals with this review is to find ways to ensure mines in B.C. remain viable when commodity prices fluctuate, so that people can keep working and communities can thrive."

The 12-member task force will include representatives from industry, First Nations, municipal government, an environmental non-governmental organization, labour, post-secondary/training and the financial sector. The task

force will submit its final report, including recommendations for legislative and/or regulatory amendments to the minister by Nov. 21, 2018.

Mungall announced the Mining Jobs Task Force in conjunction with Mining Day events at the parliament buildings. Organized by the Mining Association of BC (MABC), the annual Mining Day in Victoria brings together 40 delegates from major mining companies, proponents and supplier companies, and provides an opportunity for industry and government to discuss the importance of the sector, while identifying responsible opportunities for growth.

"We look forward to working with the government, First Nations and other important stakeholders on the task force to ensure our industry is globally competitive and well positioned to sustain the mining jobs of today and, importantly, create the mining jobs of tomorrow," said Bryan Cox, president and CEO of MABC. "A strong and thriving B.C. mining industry can continue to play a pivotal leadership role in Canada's transition to a clean tech, lower-carbon future, for the benefit of B.C. families and workers."

"We fully support the provincial government's commitment to the future of mining in British Columbia and the employment it supports," said Michelle Laurie from the United Steelworkers. "The Mining Jobs Task Force will help government find ways to strengthen the sector, so it's able to sustain good, accessible jobs and training opportunities for British Columbians, workers and their families throughout the province."

At today's announcement, Mungall also highlighted the B.C. mining flow-through share tax credit, which was extended in Budget 2018. The previous tax credit expired Dec. 31, 2017.

"In an era when we will need minerals for an electrified economy and for transportation, we want B.C. to be the most attractive jurisdiction in Canada for exploration investment," said Mungall. "The mining flow-through share tax credit is one of the tools we can use to get there."

The Mining Jobs Task Force will look at all aspects of mineral exploration and mining in British Columbia, and provide recommendations to government on measures it might implement to make B.C. the most attractive jurisdiction for investment in this important industry.

Mining Jobs Task Force to review B.C.'s exploration and mining sector

Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources Michelle Mungall has established the 12-member B.C. Mining Jobs Task Force. The task force is mandated to work with First Nations, the mining industry and mining communities to make jobs secure and mines viable as commodity prices fluctuate.

The task force will be responsible for providing the Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources with recommendations on the following areas:

- * Establishing baseline metrics (e.g. cost of production, carbon intensity, employment statistics, expenditures and revenues, etc.) to measure the current state of the industry and provide an economic impact analysis of the mining sector in B.C.;
- * Skills training and development, so that British Columbians can enter and grow careers in the sector;
- * A co-ordinated provincial approach to geoscience;
- * Potential financial incentive programs and the Province's competiveness and approach to attract mining investment into B.C.;
- * Potential government actions to ensure the sustainability of existing mines and job protection during commodity cycles;
- * Identify innovation and partnership opportunities that ensure an environmentally sustainable mining sector;
- * Identify best practices in mining jobsite health and safety;
- * Increasing public awareness of the importance of the mining sector to the province and its role in a low-carbon future; and
- * In consultation with the Minister of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources, any other matters arising over the course of the review that the task force considers significant.

Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources assistant deputy minister Peter Robb will chair the task force. The other members of the task force include:

Edie Thome, president and CEO of the Association for Mineral Exploration (AME):

Thome brings a wealth of experience in government relations, permitting and public affairs as well as on-the-ground experience working with stakeholders, First Nations, elected officials and land owners on projects in the resource sector. Through her work, she is familiar with advocacy efforts at both the provincial and federal levels and, specifically, how the legislative and regulatory framework can support or hinder productive, responsible resource development within British Columbia and Canada.

Most recently, Thome was director of environment, permitting and compliance, Aboriginal relations and public affairs at BC Hydro, responsible for permitting and compliance, Aboriginal relations and public affairs for the Site C Clean Energy Project. Prior to that she worked in risk management, environment, operations and customer service for BC Hydro. Her management experience also includes four and a half years as vice-president, customer service, airport operations and corporate communications for Harmony Airways. Thome has brought to AME a keen understanding of leadership in an industry association, gained through her service from 2013 to 2017 as chair of the board of the Canadian Hydropower Association (CHA), a national, non-profit organization, comprised of nearly 50 members - spanning hydropower producers, manufacturers, developers and engineering firms to individuals.

Bryan Cox, president and CEO of the Mining Association of British Columbia (MABC):

As the preeminent voice and advocate for the mining industry in B.C., Cox leads a team actively working with governments, business leaders, First Nations, communities, and the broader public to advocate for and communicate the economic and social value of mining. MABC is focused on keeping the interests of its members and the value of mining forefront in the minds of British Columbians, especially regarding society's transition to a lower carbon economy.

Don McPherson, mayor of Tumbler Ridge:

McPherson moved to Tumbler Ridge in 1981, two years before it ever became a community. Working on the Province's North East Coal Project at the 1,000-person camp, he contracted to Quintette and Bullmoose Mines. In 1986, he moved his business into the downtown core and saw the community rise up around him.

The mayor was first elected to council in 2000 during a byelection. The circumstances surrounding this election have given the mayor deep insight into both the strengths and vulnerabilities of a mining community. As the town emptied during the shutdown of the two mines then-councillor McPherson fought to ensure the community did not close, retained its infrastructure and attracted new residents through a first of its kind mass housing sale. McPherson will bring a unique perspective to the task force as its only municipal representative on issues such as community needs, sustainability, and how government can work with industry to ensure the success of all.

Regina Saimoto, associate dean for Northwest Community College (NWCC), Eastern Region:

Saimoto has played an instrumental role in NWCC's award-winning School of Exploration & Mining and collaborated on curriculum development of the Environmental Monitoring Assistant Program (EMAP) since 2006. Previously, she developed curricula for a number of courses and programs related to the natural resource sector, working with government and industry to identify key competencies. Saimoto has also served as the executive director for the Centre of Training Excellence in Mining (CTEM), the dean of instruction and has taught in numerous natural resources related programs and courses.

Alan Young, director, Materials Efficiency Research Group:

Since 1990, Young has worked as a facilitator and strategist for a wide range of conservation groups, Indigenous organizations, progressive companies and governments across Canada and internationally. His primary focus has been on implementing sustainability and leadership strategies for the extractive sector in North America, Latin America, Europe and Scandinavia. His work includes ethical practices certification programs in the forestry and mining sectors, cross-sector collaboration design and facilitation, large-scale conservation strategies, as well as various legislative reform initiatives in the extractive sectors nationally and internationally. He is chairperson of the International Institute for Sustainable Development, steering committee member of the Initiative for Responsible Mining Assurance, and is a former chair of the Forest Stewardship Council of Canada.

Tom Syer, head of Government Affairs, Teck Resources Limited:

Syer has 20 years of experience in leadership roles within the public and private sectors, working on policy development with specific focuses on natural resource development, climate change and Indigenous relations. He has been involved in the development and roll-out of numerous provincial and federal policy initiatives and, in the private sector, has been responsible for advancing resource development policies and Indigenous relationships, including successfully negotiating comprehensive agreements for the largest wind farm and run-of-river projects in Western Canada.

Additionally, Syer has actively led and participated in numerous multi-lateral initiatives, policy committees and reviews including chairing the Energy and Indigenous Affairs Committees at the Business Council.

Richard Tremblay, Taseko Gibraltar Mine vice-president and general manager:

Tremblay is a seasoned mining professional who has 29 years of experience in the mining industry. He is currently

vice-president and general manager of the Gibraltar Mine, located north of Williams Lake and, previous to that, was vice-president of Operations at Coalspur. Tremblay has also been general manager of Teck Coal's Fording River and Line Creek Operations, located in the Elk Valley in southeast British Columbia.

Tremblay holds an MBA from Simon Fraser University and is a professional engineer with a bachelor of science degree in chemical engineering from Queen's University. He and his wife Sue have been married for 28 years and have three adult children, all of whom work in the mining industry. The Tremblays live in Williams Lake with their 14 dogs, two cats and three horses.

Michelle Laurie, staff representative for the United Steelworkers - Western Canada:

Laurie has lived and worked throughout British Columbia: on the coast, Vancouver Island, the far northern portion of the province, and in the east-central region. She is a red-seal certified electrician, having served her apprenticeship in a coal mine in Tumbler Ridge. Prior to that, she was employed in Cassiar, in the asbestos mine as a labourer, drill oiler and truck driver. Laurie has been trained in mine rescue (surface) and has also worked as a paramedic in central and southern B.C.

Currently, Laurie is primarily involved in collective bargaining and dispute resolution matters in various sectors of the Steelworkers, as well as delivering training to workers on those issues and others. She is married, with four adult children and five grandchildren, all living in various parts of B.C., and clearly has an ongoing interest the economic security and development of the province.

Earl Graham, staff representative for the United Steelworkers:

Earl Graham is employed as a staff representative for the United Steelworkers and services through-out the Lower Mainland, Vancouver Island, Sunshine Coast, as the Interior of British Columbia, and also goes as far north as to include the Yukon. Graham, at a young age, started in the logging industry on Vancouver Island, then transferred to the manufacturing side of the business back on the mainland. He then moved on to serving as a business agent with the IWA in 1996. In 2006 the IWA merged with the United Steelworkers where he then became a USW staff representative. In his capacity of staff representative, he has been involved in many sectors from agriculture, forestry and mining.

More importantly, with respect to this task force, he has serviced in the mining sector for over 10 years at the Quinsam Coal Mine in Campbell River, and Texada Quarrying (A Division of LaFarge), Imperial Limestone Company, and Blubber Bay Quarry (Ash Grove Cement Company), all of which are located on Texada Island. In 2017, Graham was appointed from labour to the Health and Safety Review Sub-Committee for the review of the Health, Safety and Reclamation Code for Mines in British Columbia. Graham is married and has three adult children who live and work in greater Vancouver and Surrey region. He continues to support working families to make their lives a better place to live in the wonderful province of British Columbia.

Mark Podlasly, senior adviser, First Nations Energy and Mining Council:

Podlasly, member of the Cook's Ferry Indian Band (Nlaka'pamux Nation), is a consultant with over 20 years of experience in corporate strategy, strategic partnerships and revenue sharing mechanisms related to extractive industries.

A graduate of Harvard University, he is currently a Trustee of the NLX Legacy Trust, managing and operating a seven-figure mining-based, sovereign wealth fund shared by eight Indigenous communities in south-central B.C. He also serves as chair of the First Nations Limited Partnership (FNLP), a 16 First Nations commercial entity allied to Chevron Canada's Kitimat LNG Project.

Podlasly previously ran a successful executive education and consulting practice in Asia, the United States and Europe where he designed and delivered corporate strategy, leadership, and globalization programs for a client list that includes GE, Unilever, General Mills, Clorox, Goldman Sachs and Praxair. Podlasly is a regular contributor in the Kellogg School of Management's mining leadership programs in Chicago, and an active participant to global business and indigenous engagement for the International Finance Corporation's Sustainability Exchange and DPI Mining.

Neil Pogany, partner, Deloitte and Touche LLP:

Pogany is a tax partner with a big-four accounting firm, and has over 22 years of experience serving major and junior mining companies. He has provided a variety of taxation services to these companies, including Canadian/provincial income tax and mining tax consulting, tax compliance and government audit defence services. Pogany is recognized as one of the leaders in mining taxation in Canada for his firm and has significant experience in the mining industry.

Pogany has presented at the BC Mining Forum, Federated Press Understanding Natural Resources Taxation Seminar and the Canadian Institute's Global Mining Finance & Law Seminar.

Codie Morigeau, Ktunaxa Nation Council:

Morigeau is the director of Education and Employment for the Ktunaxa Nation Council in Cranbrook. Edie Thome, president and CEO of the Association for Mineral Exploration (AME):

Thome brings a wealth of experience in government relations, permitting and public affairs as well as on-the-ground experience working with stakeholders, First Nations, elected officials and land owners on projects in the resource sector. Through her work, she is familiar with advocacy efforts at both the provincial and federal levels and, specifically, how the legislative and regulatory framework can support or hinder productive, responsible resource development within British Columbia and Canada.

Most recently, Thome was director of environment, permitting and compliance, Aboriginal relations and public affairs at BC Hydro, responsible for permitting and compliance, Aboriginal relations and public affairs for the Site C Clean Energy Project. Prior to that she worked in risk management, environment, operations and customer service for BC Hydro. Her management experience also includes four and a half years as vice-president, customer service, airport operations and corporate communications for Harmony Airways. Thome has brought to AME a keen understanding of leadership in an industry association, gained through her service from 2013 to 2017 as chair of the board of the Canadian Hydropower Association (CHA), a national, non-profit organization, comprised of nearly 50 members - spanning hydropower producers, manufacturers, developers and engineering firms to individuals.

Bryan Cox , president and CEO of the Mining Association of British Columbia (MABC):

As the preeminent voice and advocate for the mining industry in B.C., Cox leads a team actively working with governments, business leaders, First Nations, communities, and the broader public to advocate for and communicate the economic and social value of mining. MABC is focused on keeping the interests of its members and the value of mining forefront in the minds of British Columbians, especially regarding society's transition to a lower carbon economy.

Don McPherson, mayor of Tumbler Ridge:

McPherson moved to Tumbler Ridge in 1981, two years before it ever became a community. Working on the Province's North East Coal Project at the 1,000-person camp, he contracted to Quintette and Bullmoose Mines. Intelligent signs to improve traffic flow along Roberts Bank rail corridor

VANCOUVER - People in the Lower Mainland will soon experience reduced traffic delays thanks to six new motorist advisory signs that will be installed at key road and railway crossings in Langley, Surrey and the Township of Langley, as part of the Railway Crossing Information System project.

The signs will complement the railway overpasses constructed in the Langley and Surrey area along the Roberts Bank rail corridor that were built to improve shipments and traffic flow, while enhancing trade with the Asia-Pacific region. Community consultation has shown strong support for the signs, as their purpose is to improve community liveability and help manage increased traffic along the corridor, which has as many as 22 train crossings per day.

"Our government is continuously working to build stronger, more efficient transportation corridors to international markets," said the Honourable Marc Garneau, Minister of Transport. "With this contribution of \$300,000 to the intelligent transportation system, we are providing drivers with the information they need to choose the most efficient route, while making the trade corridor more reliable."

Intelligent by design, the advisory signs will operate through a central control system and will provide drivers with real-time train crossing information - indicating if the crossing is open or closed - so drivers can make informed decisions about their travel routes. The signs will specify the train's location and travel direction, enabling drivers to use alternate crossing options at adjacent railway overpasses in order to avoid traffic delays.

"These motorist advisory signs are a great example of how new transportation technology can improve the day-to-

day lives of the people who live in high-traffic, trade-oriented communities," said Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure Claire Trevena. "The Province will continue to work with our partners when it comes to innovating beneficial transportation solutions."

In addition to reducing traffic congestion and minimizing greenhouse gas emissions due to decreased vehicle idling times, the signs will also increase travel efficiency and mobility for emergency vehicles.

"The Railway Crossing Information System is a critical piece of the Roberts Bank Rail Corridor program that will help drivers make informed choices when planning their route to minimize delays by rerouting to one of the eight new overpass crossings," said Kevin Desmond, CEO of TransLink. "This is another example of business and government coming together to improve travel on major road arterials."

"The Port of Vancouver is Canada's largest, keeping our country connected with the global economy," said Cliff Stewart, vice-president, infrastructure at the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority. "We recognize the movement of goods to and from the port can impact communities, and we're always looking at ways to reduce that impact, working with a wide variety of stakeholders. The joint effort and support of all funding partners involved in this project will help to relieve traffic congestion and delays for drivers, while improving community safety and quality of life for daily commuters."

The Railway Crossing Information System project is jointly funded by the Government of B.C., Transport Canada and Vancouver Fraser Port Authority, each providing \$300,000, in addition to \$2.9 million from TransLink. The total project cost is \$3.8 million, which includes development of the central control system and a recently issued civil-works contract valued at \$1.7 million, awarded to Crown Contracting Limited from Surrey. The project is expected to be complete and in operation by December 2018.

New homes for vulnerable people in Richmond

RICHMOND - The Province is partnering with the City of Richmond to build 40 new homes with 24/7 support services to address the immediate needs of people in the community struggling to find a stable place to live.

"Homelessness is a critical issue in Richmond and across the province, which has put a strain on our communities and our families for too long," said Selina Robinson, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "Our government understands that housing is the heart of community. We are focused on working with local governments to build homes where people have the safe foundation they need to rebuild their lives."

Each studio home will include a self-contained kitchen and bathroom. The combination of housing and support services will give people the opportunity to transition from temporary housing to secure, longer-term options.

RainCity Housing will operate at the homes and will be onsite 24/7 to connect residents with support services, as

well as provide them with daily meals, life-skills training, and access to primary health and mental health services. The homes will also feature accessible designs for people living with disabilities and provide residents with a shared amenity space.

"Since the inception of the Affordable Housing Strategy in 2007, the city has been instrumental in the creation of over 1,500 affordable units in the community," said Malcolm Brodie, mayor of Richmond. "The proposed modular, supportive housing fills a gap in the housing continuum and helps to support individuals in need to achieve stable and permanent housing."

The City of Richmond is contributing use of the land at 7300 Elmbridge Way for the proposed homes for up to five years.

Project partners will hold a community meeting on Wednesday, Feb. 28, 2018, from 3:30-7:30 p.m. at the Richmond Public Library - Brighouse (Main) branch located at 7700 Minoru Gate.

Information and an online survey to hear community feedback will also be available on LetsTalkRichmond.ca from Monday, Feb. 19 until Sunday, March 4, 2018.

Quick Facts:

- * In the last Metro Vancouver homeless count, homelessness increased in the City of Richmond by 84% since 2014.
- * The Government of B.C. is providing approximately \$5.9 million towards the project.
- * This is part of a provincewide investment of \$291 million to build 2,000 homes around the province and more than \$170 million over three years to provide 24/7 staffing and support services.
- * Through this program, more than 1,200 new homes for people most in need have started development throughout the province.
- * The Province will be working with local governments and community partners to develop a Homelessness Action Plan to reduce homelessness through permanent housing and services.

VANCOUVER - Premier John Horgan, MLA for Vancouver-Mount Pleasant Melanie Mark, and Minister of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation Scott Fraser have issued the following statement to acknowledge the annual Women's Memorial March in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside:

"On February 14th, thousands gather on the streets of the Downtown Eastside, on the unceded territories of the Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh people, to remember and honour the lives of women and girls from this community who have died or have gone missing, and to support their loved ones. It is with heartfelt regret that we cannot physically be there with you today. We stand with you in heart and spirit.

"The annual Women's Memorial March is a chance to come together, grieve the loss and honour the lives of beloved sisters, mothers, daughters, aunties, community members and friends. For us, it is also a call to action and one of the reasons we have committed to fully adopt and implement the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and the calls to action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada.

For editing links, when you click into the link are you given the box to edit the link near the top of the page? Or is that tab not showing for you?

There should also be a similar tab visible when you have selected inside a table cell, that will give you options to change the table cell.



It appears that changing font face and size is disabled - likely to ensure that the sharepoint sites have a consistent look between pages. If you want to change the look of headings or text you would need to use the Styles or Markup styles options.



Minister of Advanced Education, Skills and Training Melanie Mark was joined by post-secondary students and college presidents at the Parliament Buildings in Victoria to celebrate the second annual BC Colleges Day. The provincial proclamation recognizes the vital role that colleges have in the post-secondary system.

"Our colleges are an important part of our education ecosystem," said Mark. "Education is a powerful tool that puts people on pathways to opportunity, employment and better lives. I'm proud to help celebrate BC Colleges Day."

B.C. is home to 11 public colleges, with more than 60 campuses and learning centres throughout the province. With over 250 academic, trades, technology and vocational programs, public colleges serve more than 125,000 students annually, plus thousands more through continuing education.

"B.C. college graduates are highly skilled by the time they complete their credential because of the

depth of experience they get through their program, which includes applied learning, and real-world, hands-on experience," said John Bowman, BC Colleges chair. "Over 90% of our graduates are employed within six months of graduation."

B.C. colleges have also responded to demand for flexible delivery options by offering options such as online delivery, video conferencing, and hands-on learning through practicums and apprenticeships.

"As a single mom, it was important for me to be able to go to school in my home community," said Jaimie Davis, a Gitxsan/Nisga'a second-year student in Northwest Community College's Freda Diesing School of Northwest Coast Art. "Northwest Community College offered me a way to do both. Because I can take care of my family and still get an education, it helps me build my career as an Indigenous woman."

Over the next decade, 917,000 job openings are expected due to a combination of retirement and economic growth. About eight out of 10 jobs will require some post-secondary education or training: 42% will require a diploma, certificate or apprenticeship training, while 36% will require a bachelor, graduate, or first-professional degree and/or significant work experience. Many of those bachelor degrees are started at B.C. colleges, where students can take their first two years of university-transfer credits before moving on to a university.

BC Colleges is an association of British Columbia's public, post-secondary colleges. The role of the organization is to facilitate collaboration between the colleges, so they can more effectively produce a well-educated and highly skilled workforce for British Columbia.

Question 1: Back in October of last year, there was a known issue of the HUB going to sleep and not putting out scheduled releases if no one has logged into it for a certain length of time. While I have never experienced this, I've been informed that Linda has a few times, most recently, within the last month or so. Does this issue have an ETA for resolution? As I say, it seems that it has only happened to Linda and only on the weekends by all accounts.

Question 2: Before Christmas, I emailed Carolynn about getting access to the HUB's media lists. Is there a way to send those to me in Excel or Word or a searchable/copy-able format? The lists we currently have are totally out of date now.
