Federal funding for protection of Southern Resident Killer Whales

Background:

- On October 31, the federal government announced \$61.5 million for a suite of measures aimed at protecting Southern Resident Killer Whales.
- These measures are as follows:
 - continuing to identify and protect new areas of habitat necessary for survival or recovery of the Southern Resident Killer Whale Population;
 - introducing important measures aimed at protecting and recovering Chinook salmon stocks that are significant for the Southern Resident Killer Whales;
 - expanding the vessel slowdowns to further reduce underwater noise;
 - developing agreements with ferry operators and other marine industry partners to formalize current voluntary measures to reduce noise;
 - expanding vessel monitoring systems and capabilities to develop real time ability to avoid whale encounters and providing funding to Ocean Wise for the development and deployment of a Whale Report Alert System;
 - launching consultation with marine industry on development and implementation of Noise Management Plans;
 - advancing feasibility work on one or more South Resident Killer Whale
 sanctuaries within sub-areas of critical habitat the whales use for foraging; and
 - enhancing regulatory control of five key organic pollutants, including two flame retardants to lessen contaminants impacting these whales.

- Fisheries and Oceans Minister Jonathan Wilkinson said the federal government is examining the option of funding a new hatchery to increase the stock of chinook salmon.
- Minister Wilkinson also said the new areas of critical habitat are: Swiftsure, in the Juan de Fuca Strait between Vancouver Island and Washington state, and Le Perouse Banks off Tofino.
- Lastly, Minister Wilkinson said they are considering moving shipping lanes further away from areas preferred by killer whales and using quieter ships to reduce noise from vessels. He noted a conservation agreement is in the works with BC Ferries to ensure vessels take a wide berth around whales.
- The \$61.5 million announced on October 31 is part of the federal government's \$167 million "Whale Initiative," which was first announced in Budget 2018.

Sea Lice

Background:

- On October 30, Living Oceans Society and Raincoast Research, released a report showing sea lice on salmon farms are developing a resistance to SLICE - a pesticide used to eradicate sea lice. The report references both Clayquot Sound and Broughton Archipelago fish farms.
- In their report, Living Oceans Society and Raincoast Research claim Fisheries and Oceans Canada and industry have known about sea lice becoming resistant to this pesticide since 2014.
- On November 1, Fisheries and Oceans Canada confirmed that sea lice are becoming
 resistant to SLICE on salmon farms. They also confirmed they are conducting a review of
 a Cermaq fish farm in Clayoquot Sound to determine whether the company properly
 followed protocols for reporting and treating a sea lice outbreak in the spring.

FLNRO staff in the Invasive Plants Program will be notified on Monday, August 20th of the decision to issue Pesticide Use Permit 738-0027-18-21 for the use of Roundup Weathermax (active ingredient glyphosate) to control knotweed in the area between the water's edge and one-meter above the high water mark along a 70 kilometer stretch of the Upper Nimpkish River, close to Port McNeil on Vancouver Island.

Permit Overview

- Pesticide use is for the purpose of controlling Bohemian knotweed, Japanese knotweed, and Himalayan knotweed using the herbicide Roundup WeatherMAX (P.C.P. number 27487, active ingredient glyphosate) between the water's edge and one-meter above the high water mark along a 70 kilometer stretch of the Upper Nimpkish River
- Knotweed is a pernicious invasive plant that has spread rapidly in various parts of the province in recent years, and can have a strong negative impact on local ecosystems. Its spread is managed by the various Invasive Species Groups across the province, and management techniques, including pesticide applications, are generally conducted under a Pest Management Plan (PMP) held by FLNR. However, the use of herbicides around lakes, streams, and other water bodies is restricted under the terms of the PMP due to the the Pesticide Free Zone, and as knotweed is often found in these areas, a Pesticide Use Permit is required to authorize herbicide use close to water.
- The term of the permit is three years, and the issuance of the permit must be advertised in the local newspaper.
- Under the terms of the permit, FLNRO is authorized to use Roundup Weathermax between the water's edge
 and to one meter above the high water mark via the application methods of stem injection, wick/wipe on, or
 foliar spraying with drift shielding. The majority of applications will be conducted by stem injection, which has
 the lowest potential for off-target drift or other environmental contamination. The wick/wipe on and foliar
 spraying methods are only authorized if the plants are too small to be treated by stem injection.

- All pesticide applications must be done in accordance with the pesticide label and by trained and certified
 pesticide applicators.
- The sites fall within the traditional territory of the 'Namgis First Nation. The 'Namgis provided a letter of support for the project. An excerpt from their letter reads:

"The purpose of this letter is to express 'Namgis support for the present permit application via BC's Integrated Pest Management Act, now under public consultation. 'Namgis also supports the ongoing herbicide treatment of knotweed, outside of the River's high water mark through the authority of existing permits".

 No concerns or feedback in relation to the proposed activities were received either by the proponent or the ministry during the public consultation process.

Otherwise, the previous government brought in IPM regs in 2016, where forestry and other industrial users of pesticides (e.g., mosquito control, vegetation control on rights-of-way) need to ensure all pesticide applicators are trained using a course developed by government.

- FortisBC met with the BCUC from 2-3:30 this afternoon to review their compliance filing on a System
 Preservation and Service Restoration (SPSR) Plan. Fortis is seeking BCUC's endorsement. They have applied to
 keep some sections confidential, which the BCUC will consider. We now have the full filing, as well as the public
 redacted version and briefing deck, and are working that information into our BN.
- Fortis reports that they met with EMBC this week and will be meeting again with them on Monday to further beef up their SPSR Plan.
- BCUC has approved the changes to Rate Schedule 46 for LNG transportation customers on an interim basis subject to consultation with affected customers. Fortis has already spoken to these customers and sees no issues.
- I spoke with David Morton and he will speak with Peter Watson of the NEB about joint regulatory action and how the two organizations want to position themselves publicly as we work through the recovery from this event.
- I drafted a letter last week to support BCUC actions which Minister Mungall has reviewed and commented on. She would like to send a letter to the BCUC tomorrow. The letter has been shared with Geoff for comment.

Given the volume of new material we now have, Dave and I have are proposing that we have a revised BN and timeline for our call on Monday. I have attached an excerpt of the BC Hydro material with their risk analysis on the power curtailment option.

Here are key messages/facts for you.

Clean (holding bullets from HQ on climate - for use in speeches throughout November)

- We love B.C. and we want to protect what makes it so special -- for now and for our children and grandchildren.
- People in B.C. want to see a strong, sustainable economy, that creates good jobs and works for people. Now, and into the future.
- We are soon launching a climate plan that will put B.C. on a path to a cleaner, better future.
- First, we're tackling the buildings we work and live in, our vehicles and the fuels we use, and the Clean Growth Program for Industry.
- People need affordable choices for cleaner, healthier, more efficient buildings and transportation, to cut pollution and improve quality of life in our communities.
- We're seizing opportunities to innovate and lower emissions to meet our climate goals, while continuing to create good jobs and economic opportunities for people and businesses.
- The same innovations that reduce our emissions and improve our quality of life can drive economic growth helping our people and businesses to succeed.

Electric Vehicles/Low Carbon Fuels

- British Columbia's Clean Energy Vehicle (CEV) Program was designed to reduce barriers to the adoption of CEVs.
- The CEV Program has been highly successful in starting the transition to a transportation system that is powered by clean energy.
- B.C. has the highest adoption rate of zero-emission vehicles in Canada ZEVs made up 4% of new light-duty vehicle sales in the first half of 2018.
- In 2017, the CEVforBC participation rate increased by 55% over 2016, and in the first half of 2018, the rate of submission has increased 220% over 2017's rate. The highest growth rate has been in the affordable vehicle brands.
- British Columbia is a leader in clean energy vehicles (CEVs) with one of the largest public charging infrastructure networks in Canada (approximately 1,500 charging stations), the first public hydrogen fuelling station in Canada with plans to build out more, and the highest per capita adoption of CEVs in the country (4% of new light-duty vehicle sales in the first half of 2018). It is estimated there are approximately 12,000 electric vehicles in B.C.
- An average EV driver will avoid producing at least four tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions each year, compared to a gasoline vehicle. EV drivers also save approximately \$2,400 per year in fuel costs and maintenance.

Energy Efficiency – EfficiencyBC Program (launched September)

- Launched at the end of September this year, EfficiencyBC (https://efficiencybc.ca) is an integrated offer of financial incentives, information and support to help households and businesses save energy and reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by switching to high efficiency heating equipment and making building envelope improvements.
- EfficiencyBC, along with partner programs, will provide up to \$14,000 for a home and \$200,000 for a
 commercial business to switch to high-efficiency heating equipment and to make building envelope
 improvements. It is a new program launching in partnership with the federal government, BC Hydro, FortisBC,
 BC Housing and many local governments.
- This new program makes life more affordable by providing you with the financial incentives you need to make energy-saving improvements. EfficiencyBC will help us lower greenhouse gas emissions while creating opportunities for people, including lasting good jobs through energy retrofits.
- In addition to financial incentives, EfficiencyBC offers homeowners a free home energy Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources coaching service and guidance on home energy upgrades. For commercial buildings, the program will also help pay for energy studies that identify opportunities for energy savings. The program is fully integrated with existing incentive programs.
- The funding is also aimed at fostering improved standards in buildings, improving the quality of energy-efficiency installations and increasing market share of low-carbon, energy-efficient building technologies.
- Energy efficiency in Canada improved by 25% between 1990 and 2014. This improvement helped avoid more than 85 million tonnes of carbon pollution and saved Canadians more than \$38 billion.

Energy Efficiency – BC Hydro

- We're fortunate in B.C. to have access to clean, renewable hydroelectricity. Last year, BC Hydro generated 98 per cent clean electricity.
- BC Hydro also has a robust demand-side management (conservation) program through which has been helping customers save energy and money for more than 25 years.
- This includes programs, online tools, tips and education programs to help customers reduce their electricity use, such as seasonal rebates on energy-efficient products at our partner retailers, rebates on energy-efficient home renovations as well as programs to help income-qualifying customers improve their homes' efficiency.
- BC Hydro will be investing \$330 million in its conservation programs over the next three years, and will also be
 expanding it tools and education programs to help commercial and industrial customers adopt a strategic
 energy management model, identify and implement capital projects that will result in energy savings

Electrification - general

- Government is working collaboratively to move toward a clean growth future for B.C. with a climate action strategy that will drive sustainable economic growth with cleaner energy and fewer emissions
- Low-carbon electrification supporting the transition from fossil fuels to clean electricity to reduce GHG emissions will drive demand for clean, firm electricity to power upstream natural gas and LNG operations.
- With 98 per cent of the electricity generated in B.C. coming from clean and renewable resources, electrification can provide significant GHG reductions.
- We are working to embed an electrification strategy within the climate action strategy we are developing.
- Government will also examine opportunities for further electrification as a strategy to achieve the Province's new GHG emissions reduction targets as part of Phase 2 of the comprehensive review of BC Hydro.

*Electrification of natural gas industry

- Electrifying upstream development in British Columbia's natural gas sector will reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- We have been clear all along that LNG operations must fit within our climate action targets. Electrifying upstream operations is one way for the natural gas industry to meet our legislated emissions reductions targets.
- Electricity demand in the South Peace region continues to grow as a result of natural gas exploration and development in the area. Electrifying upstream operations includes upgrades to transmission lines in northern B.C. enabling the industry to use clean, affordable hydro power for the processing facilities and compressors.
- There are several projects supporting an increase the natural gas sector's use of clean power, including:
 - The Dawson Creek-Chetwynd Area Transmission line project. This \$299-million project is in-service and supplies the majority of power to the growing natural gas industry.

- BC Hydro's Peace Region Electricity Supply (PRES) project. Construction on this \$298 million project started this summer. It will provide facilities with clean power, offsetting the use of natural gas for energy needs.
- (Note: The North Montney Power Supply projects was an industry joint venture between Atco Electric and Progress Energy that has not moved forward.)
- Other ways we can support the electrification of northern B.C. are being explored as part of our clean growth strategy to be release later this year. Full electrification of expected new industrial loads in the South Peace Region could avoid up to about four million tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions per year.

- B.C. is currently piloting two adjustments, called AGHI-Plus, to the AQHI to improve the accuracy of the reported health risk during smoke events (Ministry of Environment).
- Each of these AQHI Plus adjustments was developed by the BC Center for Disease Control for the Province and are being piloted from May 2018 through April 2019.
- One adjustment operates in summer, the other in winter:
 - The Wildfire Season AQHI Plus adjustment will be piloted for five months (May through September 2018) and is designed to better communicate health risks that are associated with wildfire smoke.
 - The Cool Season AQHI Plus adjustment is under development. When completed it will operate for seven months (October 2018 through April 2019).

- Your statement of below With LNG Canada's final investment decision, we are engaged with Kitselas to implement the provisions of the agreement that are linked to that decision. Looking at the backgrounder with the March 30, 2017 release, I'm taking it the 25ha near the Northwest Regional Airport has been transferred. And that some of the \$13.35 million has already been paid, eg. \$250,000 for community hall planning. Can you confirm the rest of the money contingent upon the Kitselas signing this LNG agreement?
 - The LNG Benefits Agreement was signed in 2017
 - Under the agreement, certain payments are linked to conditions such as the final investment decision and the commencement of construction. As those events occur, we are making transfers per the

agreement: https://www2.gov.bc.ca/assets/gov/environment/natural-resource-stewardship/consulting-with-first-nations/agreements/kitselas lng benefits agreement 2017march30.pdf

- The rest of the funding is continent upon project milestones. Only payments I can confirm that have been made so far are from signing the agreement, and we <u>are currently processing payments</u> contingent upon FID and commencement of construction which includes the \$2 million to support community hall construction or other purposes (clause 3.3 b).
- And now that LNG Canada has announced its FID, there's an additional \$3 million on its way eg. \$2 million for a
 community hall project. Has that been paid yet? As well, can you define "start of construction" for LNG Canada
 in terms of additional lands and money? I ask that because dirt has been flying at the LNG Canada site and
 associated locations already so wondering if that work qualifies as "start of construction".
 - The Kitselas LNG Benefits Agreement defines the commencement of construction as: "Commencement of constructions means the date on which the proponent of the PNW LNG Project, the LNG Canada Project, an Other LNG Project, or the Kitimat LNG Project, as applicable, issues a notice or notices to proceed to its EPC contractor in respect of all material engineering, procurement and construction contracts for the project, excluding other site assessments of exploration work." Both of the events (final investment decision and commencement of construction) have occurred.
 - Land transfers do not occur automatically upon the final investment decision or the commencement of construction. Certain other provisions also must be met, such as notice from the First Nation that they wish to proceed with the transfer. The LNG Benefits Agreement land transfers have not yet occurred.
- In reading the Lax Kw'alaam agreement tied to the Pacific NorthWest LNG project, because that project has now been cancelled, has the trust money paid to the First Nation's law firm in anticipation of a FID been returned?
 - The province has exercised an option to extend the agreement, to allow the money to remain in trust with the law firm while other opportunities in support of reconciliation with Lax Kw'alaam are explored with the Nation.

Reporters seeking a response about a NR issued by the Peace River Regional District. The release states:

It has come to the attention of the Peace River Regional District that the Province and area First Nations are very close to signing an AIP

(Agreement In Principal) on the creation of a large area dedicated to the protection of the Caribou. The purpose of the area is said to be in response to the federal government concerns about southern mountain caribou recovery in the Burnt Pine Herd. Sources tell us that this may include

loss of access by industry and the general public to a large area of approximately 420,000 acres or 650 sq. miles located from Chetwynd to Mt Lemoray North and South. This could result in significant loss of annual cut in the forestry industry.

The Peace River Regional District demands that the province and the federal government suspend any further discussion on these issues until a comprehensive impact analysis is completed on all socioeconomic impacts of any changes to land use in our communities.

Recommendation

- The province is taking all reasonable efforts to support the recovery of Southern Mountain Caribou in British Columbia.
- The BC Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy (ENV) and Environment Climate Change Canada (ECCC) have been developing a S.11 Bilateral Conservation Agreement (S.11 Agreement) under SARA. This S.11 Agreement will contain overarching commitments and meaningful strategies for the recovery of Southern Mountain Caribou in BC while minimizing implications to local governments and to the various industry sectors that operate in caribou habitat.
- The S.11 Agreement is looking to increase efforts for habitat restoration, maternity penning, and minimizing land disturbance, etc.
- The Province of BC has also been negotiating a Caribou Recovery Partnership Agreement (Partnership
 Agreement) with the federal government and West Moberly and Saulteau First Nations. This Partnership
 Agreement will contain conservation and recovery measures specific to the recovery of the Central Group
 (South Peace area) of Southern Mountain Caribou.
- The area to which the Partnership Agreement will apply, and the potential constraints in terms of development
 and recreation activities, are still under negotiations, and face-to-face engagement with local governments,
 other Indigenous nations, sectors and stakeholders in this area will take place before both the S.11 Agreement
 and the Partnership Agreement are finalized and signed.
- Seniors official with the provincial government have met with PRRD twice over the past three weeks, and have
 provided them the information they have requested. The Province will continue to meet with the PRRD to
 address their concerns.
- All of these caribou recovery efforts are opportunities where existing and new partnerships with industry and community stakeholders can contribute to successful caribou recovery.

Thank you for taking the time to write on September 26, 2018 regarding quarrying activity on the property of GT Farms on Kingburne Drive, Cobble Hill, BC.

Thank you for meeting with Ministry staff to discuss this application on July 9, 2018. Since that meeting, nothing has substantially changed related to this application or the items discussed during the meeting.

To confirm, in 2009, following discussions with the Ministry of Agriculture and Cowichan Valley Regional District, the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources (EMPR) had determined that excavation of the irrigation pond was for agricultural purposes and did not constitute mining activities. At that time, regulation of the activities related to excavation of the pond would have fallen to the Ministry of Agriculture, the Agricultural Land Commission, WorkSafeBC and local government.

There are not two sets of regulations for mining activities, EMPR is the primary regulator for mines in BC, but regulations from other regulators may also apply on a mine site. As noted above, other agencies are responsible for regulating agricultural activities.

The Ministry of Agriculture does not permit mining activities. As noted above, the pond excavation was originally an activity for agricultural purposes, but as the operation changed with time, it became a mining activity and EMPR began to take steps to regulate it.

When potential compliance issues at this site became known to EMPR, EMPR began inspecting the site in 2016. Once EMPR had determined that the activities at the site were mining activities, EMPR then directed the proponent to apply for a *Mines Act* permit.

Hi Leila – here is our general messaging, which you should be able to use to create some bullets on this report I think.

The report does actually mention language added to the commitment document on provincial legislation similar to C-262 on page 12. If asked specifically about that, could we just use some holding language that we expect to have more to say about that in the coming days?

This is what is says on page 12:

"2. A broad legislative and policy agenda has been set that includes implementation of the *UN Declaration*. The 2015 Commitment Document between the BC Cabinet and BC First Nations Leadership Council, which had only made passing reference to the *UN Declaration*, was jointly

amended in July 2018 to make implementation of the *UN Declaration* a focus (see Appendix B). In particular, language was added to jointly pursue provincial legislation similar to the federal Bill C-262, An Act to ensure that the laws of Canada are in harmony with the *United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples*.

Bill C-262, a federal private member's bill advanced by NDP MP Romeo Saganash, which has now won the support of the federal government and which has widespread support from Indigenous peoples and organizations across the country, confirms the application of the *UN Declaration* in Canadian law and establishes a requirement for a national action plan and reporting mechanism to ensure the laws of Canada are aligned with the *UN Declaration*. The bill is now moving through Parliament.

Provincial legislation using Bill C-262 as a minimum will provide a legislative foundation to ensure the ongoing work of implementing the *UN Declaration* in British Columbia. The goal is to embed the *UN Declaration* in BC law and to provide a framework for ensuring that all past and future BC laws, policies and government practices are compliant with the *UN Declaration*. It is expected that such legislation could be passed as soon as Spring 2019."

However it makes it as a recommendation later on, so probably okay as reporters may not read that as a commitment made yet...

The four-point action plan for the implementation of the UN Declaration in BC

Action

Action

1. Establish a preliminary legislative foundation as soon as possible that brings transparency, coherence and a measure of accountability to the process, as part of a broader long-term approach to legislative change.

Summary

Foundational legislation developed in full co-operation with Indigenous peoples will provide a transparent, coherent and binding path to implementation.

Bill C-262 is a logical starting place for this legislation, as it provides a confirmation of legal application in BC; a legislated requirement for an orderly, clear and transparent process of implementation; and a recognition of the need for oversight and accountability frameworks.

Establishment of legislation should be reflective of a new approach to litigation regarding Indigenous Rights: collaboration, not conflict.

Action One: Legislative framework

Establish a preliminary legislative foundation as soon as possible that brings transparency, coherence and a measure of accountability to the process, as part of a broader long-term approach to legislative change.

In Canada, legislation has been a main tool of colonization of Indigenous peoples. In 2018, the primary legislation regarding First Nations is the Indian Act — a colonial enactment that has a role in all aspects of Indigenous life, from establishing the reserve system and the former residential school system to limiting basic rights and freedoms, including rights related to movement, voting, equal treatment, the hiring of lawyers, etc. More broadly, federal and provincial laws — with almost no exceptions — reflect a presumption that Indigenous Rights, protected by the Constitution Act, 1982, do not exist. This is seen, for example, in all of British Columbia's land and resource laws, which effectively have been drafted and are implemented as if Aboriginal Title and Rights in British Columbia have been extinguished or surrendered or have no legal force or effect. It is for this reason, for example, that the Supreme Court of Canada in the Tsilhqot'in Nation decision found the provincial Forestry Act to infringe on Aboriginal Title, and to not apply on Aboriginal Title lands.

To alter this historical and ongoing use of legislation to deny or limit Indigenous Rights, legislative change is needed. Laws and their impacts cannot be changed through policies, practices or agreements. Only changes to the law itself can accomplish this.

Legislation is enacted through transparent, deliberative and democratic processes. Legislation is also, generally, enduring. It cannot easily be changed or altered without full public and legislative vetting — unlike policies and practices — or simply ignored. Institutions are charged with following and enforcing the law, and if the law is to change it similarly must go through a public, transparent and deliberative process.

With respect to implementation of the *UN Declaration*, all of these elements that characterize legislation are vital. As outlined earlier, implementation of the *UN Declaration* is an ongoing process and will require many different types of actions. Foundational legislation is critical on this journey. It can provide a transparent, coherent, binding and enduring process through which the *UN Declaration* is implemented. It can bring coherence and systematic effort to the way forward.

What might such legislation look like? Bill C-262 is a logical starting place. It would provide:

1. A confirmation of the legal application of the *UN Declaration* in British Columbia — which reflects already-established principles as to how international declarations can be used to interpret domestic law;

- 2. A legislated requirement for an orderly, transparent and clear process over time for implementing the UN Declaration; and
- 3. A recognition of the need for oversight and accountability to ensure this work is being done over time.

And here are some general key messages you can use some of to respond to the report:

Key Messages:

Reconciliation

- Our government is moving forward on reconciliation, in partnership with Indigenous peoples through government-togovernment relationships with First Nations based on recognition and respect.
- Indigenous peoples have lived on this land since time immemorial, and our government honours and respects the
 Indigenous title, inherent rights and treaty rights that come from this history.
- We acknowledge historic injustices and ongoing discrimination that continue to affect the lives of Indigenous peoples.
- Together with Indigenous peoples, we are doing the hard work to help build healthier communities and create shared prosperity that benefits all British Columbians.
- Reconciliation is a shared responsibility that will make life better for everyone in B.C.

Accomplishments

- For our government, reconciliation with Indigenous peoples a cross-government priority that's why every B.C. cabinet minister shares this mandate.
- With Indigenous peoples, we are working to revitalize environmental assessment consistent with UNDRIP, reduce the
 number of Indigenous children in care, build affordable housing for Indigenous peoples on and off reserve, bring
 Indigenous learning into our classrooms, revitalize Indigenous languages and incorporate traditional knowledge into
 resource decision-making.
- This is just the beginning reconciliation is a continuous and ongoing commitment to engaging as partners in ways that respect the right of Indigenous peoples to determine their own futures.
- We are working together in partnership with Indigenous peoples to address important issues, like housing, emergency
 and wildlife management, community-based solutions to support children and families, and waiving tuition for young
 people who have been in government care.
- Together we are moving toward a better future for all British Columbians.
