As requested, here is an overview.

General Messaging:

- The Province and the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary are still in active response to flooding in Grand Forks.
- In anticipation of needs throughout B.C., the Province is standing up the Recovery Branch which supports communities starting with re-entry through to long-term recovery.
- The Province is working with key ministries and B.C. communities to identify needs and services available.
- Town Hall meetings were held in Rock Creek and Grand Forks last week. Provincial staff
 attended to provide information on Disaster Financial Assistance (DFA) and short-term recovery.
 Service BC is also providing access to computers for residents to complete DFA claims.
- Currently, rapid damage assessments of properties are being completed in the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary.

Industries impacted:

Interfor - evacuated May 10 at 9:00 a.m. rescind to alert May 19th at 8:00 pm (shut down for 11 days)

 Rockwool / remainder of industrial park - evacuated May 10 at 9:00 a.m. Rescinded May 21 at 3:00 pm (shut down for 11 days)

Families impacted:

• At the height of the flooding, we had over 1,600 addresses, and 3,200 people evacuated from their homes in the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary.

Colour Placards on properties:

As part of the response to the emergency, notices (placards) have been placed on buildings in and around the risk area. The placards indicate that a basic safety assessment had been carried out and as a result, structures were classified as red, yellow or green.

- RED Do not enter the building because it is unsafe.
- YELLOW Buildings are considered either suitable for restricted access until issues are resolved, or use may be possible in those parts of the building that have not been damaged.
- GREEN The building has been assessed and while no apparent structural or other safety hazards are found, a more comprehensive inspection may reveal safety hazards.

2018 Flood Support and Investments

DAILY UPDATE REPORT FOLLOWS BELOW

ADVICE AND RECOMMENDED RESPONSE:

General Messaging:

- We must all work together to prepare for and respond to flooding and other disasters.
- During this trying time, we want British Columbians to know we will be here to help.
- Our government will assist them in any way we can.
- We continue to plan and prepare. This includes shipping flood mitigation equipment and millions of sandbags to the interior.
- We continue to work with the federal and local governments to protect communities and are monitoring the situation closely.
- The Province has announced several major flood prevention and emergency preparedness projects this year, including funding for the National Disaster Mitigation Program, the Community Emergency Preparedness Fund, and several other structural and non-structural flood mitigation projects throughout B.C.

Matching Red Cross contribution:

- The B.C. government is matching contributions to the Canadian Red Cross and will match donations up to \$20 million to help those impacted by the recent devastating floods.
- We're seeing incredible strength and resilience in communities affected by flooding and British Columbians from all corners of the province want to provide a helping hand. Donations to the Canadian Red Cross will provide vital help in a time of greatest need for so many people and communities.

Federal Flood Support:

- Public safety is our top priority.
- We remain committed to stand with British Columbians through this challenging flood season.
- Up until this point, the province has been able to provide the necessary support for communities in need. Now that this event has significantly challenged provincial capacity, the Province has requested Federal assistance.
- We thank and commend the federal government for partnering with us to provide more support and resources to help B.C. communities struggling with the impacts of flooding.
- The Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) have deployed personnel to work with the province.

- The Military is providing flood mitigation work in the Regional District of Okanagan Similkameen, the Regional District of Central Okanagan, and the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary (Grand Forks).
- The Canadian Armed Forces and Canadian Coast Guard have also deployed small boats in the Fraser Valley.
- The Province is always in communications with the Federal government, and representatives from the Canadian Armed Forces, Environment Canada and Public Safety Canada have been stationed at our Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre for weeks.
- This additional support will help us provide the resources needed to better protect B.C. communities and public safety.

General Federal RFA Messaging:

- If a local government needs support of any kind in an emergency beyond what they have available, that request is elevated to the Provincial Regional Operations Centre (PREOC) in the area.
- The PREOC then looks to source support from the region. If regional support is not readily available, the request is elevated to the Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre (PECC) in Victoria who will look for support in unaffected regions of the province.
- When the capacity of the province is no longer able to meet the needs of communities, a request for federal
 assistance is made. Requests are not made for military assistance specifically the federal government will fill
 the need with their available resources from their various program areas.

Fraser River Flooding

- Persistent warmer than normal temperatures across British Columbia for the past three weeks has led to a much earlier than normal runoff period for the Fraser River.
- The Lower Fraser River is currently experiencing high-flow rates.
- The Fraser River Basin has not seen a combination of weather conditions, including high temperatures, snow melt and river-flow of this nature in many years.
- Over the last few weeks, regions that contribute to the Fraser River have experienced temperatures of five degrees above normal.
- This means a potential for flooding in communities in the Lower Mainland along the Lower Fraser.
- With hot weather forecast to continue over the Fraser River watershed through this week, additional rises on the lower Fraser River are expected this coming weekend.
- The higher temperatures will increase snowmelt and contribute to higher flows.
- Weather will be the key factor in how the situation progresses, as we go forward. As snowpacks become diminished, rainfall will become the key risk for the potential for flooding in the coming week or two.

Current Actions

- The River Forecast Centre continues to monitor river flow levels and provide guidance.
- Southwest PREOC is working closely with First Nations and local governments, supporting them and identifying areas at risk.
- Emergency Management BC is working with First Nations and local governments to determine what support is needed and how the province can help.
- EMBC continues to prepare for an increased need for Emergency Social Services, critical infrastructure assessments and evacuation support.

Provincial Flood Support and Investments

Emergency Management BC is assisting local governments in flood response. As of May 22, the province has:

- Activated the Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre (PECC) to support the Central (CTL), Southeast (SEA) and Northeast (NEA) Provincial Regional Operation Centres (PREOCS).
- Activated PREOCS in Kamloops, Prince George, Surrey and Nelson to provide assistance to local governments.
- Deployed over 3.56 million sandbags to local governments to protect homes and public infrastructure.
- Provided 12 sandbag machines to Cache Creek, Oliver, Vernon (2), Willowbrook, Kelowna (2) and Prince George staging area (3), Enderby (1).
- Six sandbag machines are on loan from Saskatchewan.

- Currently deployed 331 BC Wildfire Service fire fighters to Kelowna, Lower Nicola Indian Band, Okanagan, Grand Forks, Oliver, Osoyoos to assist with sandbagging.
- Shipped 3.316 km of Gabions and 14.3 km of tiger dams to the interior.
- FLNRORD's River Forecast Centre and Water Stewardship Branches are providing water flow expertise, as well
 as geotechnical specialists and engineers.
- EMBC has additional flood response resources ready to deploy:
 - o Prince George:
 - 144000 sandbags
 - 3116 metres of Gabions
 - 2,000 metres of tiger dams
 - 1 sandbagging machines
 - Kelowna:
 - 81,000 burlap sandbags
 - 42,000 plastic sandbags
 - 960 metres of gabion
 - O Chilliwack:
 - 28,000 burlap sandbags
 - 1,982,000 bio degradable sandbags
 - 11.925 metres of tiger dam
 - 5,142 metres of gabions
 - 6 sandbag machines
 - Disaster Financial Assistance (DFA) is also available for eligible British Columbians who may have been impacted by overland flooding or landslides from heavy rains.
 - This DFA is available in the geographic areas within the Regional Districts of Kootenay Boundary, Okanagan Similkameen, Central Okanagan, Columbia Shuswap and North Okanagan (including electoral areas, municipalities and First Nations communities).
 - DFA is available to eligible homeowners, residential tenants, small business owners, farmers, charitable
 organizations and local government bodies that were unable to obtain insurance to cover disaster-related
 losses.
 - British Columbians can access the DFA application at: http://www.gov.bc.ca/disasterfinancialassistance
 - While we're prepared to respond to flooding to protect public safety, anything we can do to understand and prepare for flood risk is a step in the right direction.
 - That is why the Province funds programs such as National Disaster Mitigation Program and the Community Emergency Preparedness Fund for local governments.
 - The National Disaster Mitigation Program and Community Emergency Preparedness Fund enable communities to develop flood risk assessments, maps and mitigation plans in addition to constructing flood protection infrastructure. A full list of potential funding programs can be found at Emergency Management British Columbia's Disaster Mitigation Branch webpage.
 - We are committed to working collaboratively to improve public safety and disaster preparedness for all British Columbians.

If asked about recent investments in mitigation:

• EMBC is committed to improving the public safety of all British Columbians; that is why we are investing heavily in flood prevention and protection.

- In April, 2018, the Province announced \$6.5 million in disaster-mitigation projects throughout the province. Funding highlights include:
 - \$2.6 million to plan and undertake structural and non-structural flood-mitigation projects in various locations throughout B.C.;
 - \$1.75 million to further assess earthquake-related hazards in the Metro Vancouver area:
 - \$1.5 million to the Union of British Columbia Municipalities (UBCM) for the Community Emergency Preparedness Fund:
 - \$450,000 to the Fire Chiefs Association of British Columbia to support road rescue, fire safety and prevention;
 - \$130,000 to Avalanche Canada and the District of Stewart to support avalanche reporting and mapping.

National Disaster Mitigation Program:

- On Feb. 2, 2018, the Governments of Canada and B.C. announced funding for 30 projects, valued at approximately \$12.1M (including investments from local governments and NGOs) through the National Disaster Mitigation Program.
 - B.C. government contribution: approximately \$5 million.

April 2018 Mitigation Funding:

- \$2.5 million to plan and undertake structural and non-structural flood-mitigation projects in various locations throughout B.C., including:
 - \$1.5 million to support local government flood-mitigation projects through the UBCM Community Emergency Preparedness Fund.
 - \$1.45 million for the Okanagan Water Basin Board to obtain aerial photos and surface topography for the entire Okanagan watershed during the current spring freshet.
 - \$500,000 for the Central Coast Reginal District to develop a flood risk assessment and to model several flood scenarios in the Bella Coola Valley.
- Previous investments:
 - In March 2017, EMBC announced the investment of \$60 million for flood mitigation projects in B.C. communities.
 - This followed the announcement in 2016 of \$50 million of funding earmarked for 15 community hazard mitigation projects including upgrades to dikes.

If asked about Disaster Financial Assistance (DFA):

- Disaster Financial Assistance is a provincial program to help individuals and local governments recover from uninsurable disasters. The program is administered by Emergency Management BC.
- The purpose of DFA is to provide a helping hand to get people and local governments back on their feet after an uninsurable disaster.
- The eligibility criteria for DFA, which has been consistently and fairly applied since 1995, is defined according to the Emergency Program Act and Disaster Financial Assistance Regulation.
- DFA is available in the event of a disaster in respect of which the minister, or designate, has determined that disaster financial assistance may be provided.
- When this determination is made, Emergency Management BC defines the eligible dates and geographic locations, notifies affected local governments, posts this information on its website, publishes information in local papers, and attends community meetings if requested.
- For flooding disasters, DFA is available to qualifying home owners, residential tenants, small business owners, farm owners, and charitable organizations. Applicants should be aware of the following:
 - Financial assistance is provided for each accepted claim at 80% of the amount of total eligible damage that exceeds \$1,000, to a maximum claim of \$300,000.
 - Claims may be made in more than one category (e.g., home owner and farm owner).
 - A home owner or residential tenant must show that the home is the applicant's principal residence.
 - Seasonal or recreational properties, hot tubs, patios, pools, garden tools, landscaping, luxury items (like jewelry, fur coats and collectibles), and recreational items (like bicycles) are not eligible for assistance.
 - Small business owners and farm owners must demonstrate the business or farm is the applicant's primary source of income.
 - Charitable organizations must provide a benefit of service to the community at large.

Assistance is also available to local governments for essential materials and to rebuild or replace essential
public infrastructures to the condition it was in before the disaster. Assistance is provided for each accepted
recovery claim at 80% of the amount of total eligible damage that exceeds \$1,000. There is no maximum
claim.

If asked about the impact of overland flood insurance on DFA assessments:

- Until recently, overland flood insurance was only available for commercial buildings. The B.C. Government expects
 that within two years DFA will be available to family residences throughout B.C. Overland flood insurance is now
 available in certain municipalities throughout B.C.
- Disaster Financial Assistance is not applicable where flood insurance is readily and reasonably available. In communities where flood insurance has not yet been introduced, DFA is applied according to the eligibility criteria established since 1995.
- All residents or tenants who make a DFA application will be treated on a case-by-case basis and, as is normal
 practice, will be given a form to fill out and then present to their insurance agent or broker to determine whether the
 resident was offered the flood insurance option.

If asked about support provided for the 2017 freshet:

- EMBC supported evacuees through Emergency Social Services.
- During the 2017 freshet, EMBC coordinated the deployment of hundreds of personnel to assist communities—including technical experts from several fields and ministries. For example:
- EMBC deployed flood mitigation resources to support local authorities, including:
 - Approximately 4.4 million sandbags
 - o 7.5 km of gabions (wall-like structures filled with sand)
 - o 6.7 km of Tiger Dams (stackable orange tubes filled with water)

Community Emergency Preparedness Fund

The Community Emergency Preparedness Fund (CEPF) is a suite of programs designed to enhance the resiliency of local governments and their residents. The Province provides the funding, which is administered by UBCM. In March 2017, the Ministry of Transportation & Infrastructure launched CEPF as part of an \$80 million announcement for emergency preparedness. In April, the government provided \$1.5 million to the CEPF to support local government flood mitigation projects throughout the province.

Funding streams:

- Flood Risk Assessment, Flood Mapping & Flood Mitigation Planning
- Emergency Social Services
- Emergency Operations Centres & Training
- Structural Flood Mitigation

Flooding Safety Preparedness:

British Columbia has geared up for the busy spring flooding season, also known as freshet.

The Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre has been activated to support emergency operation centres and affected communities as they prepare for localized flooding.

Steps you can take to help protect your home, property and family:

- Create a household emergency plan, put together your grab-and-go bag, and connect with your neighbours
- Move equipment and other assets to higher ground
- Clear perimeter drains, eavestroughs and gutters. Maintain your sump pumps
- Move electrical appliances to upper floors and make sure to anchor fuel supplies

Park vehicles away from streams and waterways

If you are placed under Evacuation Alert:

- This is the time to get prepared to leave your home on short notice.
- Get your <u>grab-and-go bags</u> ready (which should include several days of clothing, toiletries and medications), your emergency plan, copies of important documents and important mementos.
- Listen to local emergency officials for further information on the situation.

If you are placed under Evacuation Order:

- Leave the area immediately.
- Follow the directions of local emergency officials and evacuate using the route(s) they've identified.
- Do not return home until you've been advised that the Evacuation Order has been rescinded.
- For those needing additional support, an Emergency Social Services Reception Centre may be opened.

Tips for staying safe around flood waters:

- Never drive or walk through flooded streets. Water can be deeper than it appears, and levels can rise very quickly
- Keep clear of eroded banks, as they may result in unstable ground. Most importantly, keep children and pets away from stream banks
- Stay alert for changing conditions, particularly if you live in low-lying areas or near waterways
- · Listen to local officials and follow their instructions if asked to evacuate

DAILY UPDATE REPORT (NEW INFORMATION IN RED):

EMBC UPDATE - May 22, 2018 AS OF 0700 HRS - ASSESSMENT

The PECC will remain activated today at level 2 in support of the CTL, SEA, NEA/NWE, and SWE PREOCs.

The Provincial situation continues to stabilize. There are still areas of concern with the Lower Fraser River and Okanagan Lake continued to forecast to rise. Significant rainfall and high temperatures remain strong influences driving rapid snowpack melt into high river flowrates. The water levels in lakes and rivers across the province continue to react to influences from snowmelt compounded by weather patterns.

The updated Regional summaries are below.

PROVINCIAL WEATHER

The warm weather continues today as a ridge of high pressure establishes itself today from about Prince George southwards. Valley bottom temperatures close to 30 degrees are expected over the Fraser Canyon, Thompson, Okanagan, West Columbia and Boundary; about 8 to 10 degrees above average highs for late May. A broad dome of warm air with freezing levels greater than 3600 metres will develop south of Prince George and east of Tofino.

The ridge shifts slightly to the east but the warm air holds for Wednesday and Thursday, supporting melting of the remaining of high elevation snowpack. The weather charts are also showing increasing instability and the possibility of thunderstorms for late Wednesday and Thursday. It's too early to tell exactly where these showers or thunderstorms will be, but some localized rainfall can be expected. The forecast location and amounts from these thunderstorms by the models will be watched closely.

Longer term the upper ridge of high pressure will shift further eastwards and an upper trough of low pressure will begin to push in from the Pacific on Friday and Saturday. Lowering freezing levels are expected as we move into the weekend with initial computer model estimates showing 3000 metre freezing levels over the south coast and Okanagan, and 2500 metre freezing level over the Cariboo and central interior including Prince George.

Dear Mr. Hayes,

I appreciate our conversation Friday, \$.22

As you know, our government has committed to making life more affordable for the people in our province, including by ensuring travel by ferry is affordable. The Transportation Ministry worked very closely with BC Ferries for several months to negotiate an agreement that would enable government's ferry fare relief commitments which went into effect on April 1st, 2018. This included freezing fares on the three Major routes, reducing the fares on all other routes by 15 percent and reinstating the 100% discount on seniors' passenger fares on travel Monday through Thursday. To achieve these reductions, government increased the subsidy to BC Ferries by \$59 million over two years, the highest single increase in more than a decade.

During the last week, I was surprised and disappointed to learn that BC Ferries was going to announce publicly the removal of the fuel rebates of 2.9 percent on the Major and Minor routes and 1.9 percent on the Northern Routes, less than two months after government's fare reduction strategy was put into place. As a Minister I am personally committed to delivering on our government's promise to freeze fares. I expressed that to you, and I

believe the move by BC Ferries to eliminate the fuel rebate,	thus increasing the cost Brit	ish Columbians pay, is
contrary to that.

UPASS is a discounted pass program offered to universities and colleges through an agreement with the university, the student union and the local government. For the UPASS program to be implemented agreement much be reached between the three parties. Students must then vote through a referendum process to agree to participate in the program which has a mandatory fee, whether they use the service or not. At this time VIU does not offer a UPASS program.

The Cowichan Valley Transit Future Plan identifies a number of transit expansion initiatives over the new 3 years to improve transit service. The initiatives identified focus on improvements to evening and weekend service as well as potential improvements to transit services to Victoria and new connections to Nanaimo. These initiatives are subject funding being available from local government and the province.

- In 2017/18, DBC worked collaboratively with the communities of Golden, Osoyoos and Merritt to successfully transition the operation and management of the BCVCs in their areas to community-led management models. These communities are all now funded members of the Visitor Services Network Program.
- Benefits to communities that are members of the Visitor Services Network include Visitor Services branding, use
 of trademarks, highway signage, training and training materials, and the opportunity to participate in social
 media visitor services training programs..
- Total operating costs for the Community Visitor Services program for 2018/19 is \$2.68 million which includes base funding, highway signage, social media visitor services, training and other operational expenses.

Merritt VC Info:

- DBC divested itself from directly providing visitor services in Merritt for the following reasons:
 - Visitor volume had declined significantly over the years, with the increased reliance on digital information and changes in consumer behaviour;
 - The building was used predominantly as a washroom stop, not for visitor services;
 - The centre was costly to operate. The facility's septic infrastructure had reached its end of life and required significant investment to upgrade;
 - Transitioning to a community based model equates to a cost savings of \$230,000 annually, which is being redirected to other priorities;
 - Local First Nations have expressed interest in redeveloping this site; and
 - Visitor services were simultaneously being offered in downtown Merritt (at the Baillie House);
- Transitioning visitor services from a provincial to community model allows for a more flexible, location-based, customer-centric model aligning to the unique services required by travelers and local businesses in the area, and driving visitors into the City of Merritt.
- The City of Merritt is now a member of DBC's Visitor Services Network Program and receives \$25,000 per year in base funding to assist with the delivery of visitor services.

 The City of Merritt is now providing visitor services through Tourism Merritt in a variety of ways, including face-to-face visitor services from the Merritt Visitor Centre at the Baillie House located in downtown Merritt, summer Tourism Ambassadors, social media and digital channels.

The new Rest Area 37 km east of Merritt on Hwy 97C (the Okanagan Connector) opened in February 2018 to complement the existing Rest Areas at Britton Creek (67 km south of Merritt), at the Coquihalla Lakes (former Toll Booth) on Hwy 5 (70 km South of Merritt and 64 km north of Merritt on Hwy 5 towards Kamloops at Walloper. Surrey Wrap Funding:

- In October, we announced secure, annual funding of \$500,000 for the Surrey Wraparound program, commonly known as Surrey Wrap.

- Wrap is a proven program it has helped hundreds of families and youth as young as
 11, and it has reduced participants' negative police contacts by two-thirds.

I am writing a story about the following Human Rights Tribunal case: Deborah Ashton v. IDM Youth Services and Her Majesty the Queen in the Right of the Province of British Columbia as represented by the Ministry of Children and Family Development.

Would it be possible to arrange an interview with a spokesperson?

Some of my questions include:

- When would a person's criminal record affect their chances of being hired to work with children and vouth?
- How does the Ministry view criminal records where an individual has been acquitted of the charges? Does the record have any bearing on their chances of employment?
- Does everyone who works with children undergo a criminal record check? What other types of vetting do they undergo before being permitted to work with youth?

Background

Have advised the reporter that an interview is unlikely as this is a case-specific matter before the courts, but that I could get her some background information on hiring and record checks.

Recommendation

Background and criminal record checks are required for any position that directly delivers services to children and families.

We would consider all aspects of the criminal record check – charges, as well as convictions.

In circumstances where an applicant has been acquitted of past charges, we would need to weigh a number of factors, including: the nature and the circumstances of the charges, the reasons for the acquittal, and the nature of employment being sought.

We also check our child protection database to ensure the individual has not previously placed children at risk.

Our paramount consideration is always the safety and well-being of children and youth. We would take appropriate steps to ensure that anyone who is deemed unsafe or unfit does not work with vulnerable young people.

KEY MESSAGES for CBC INVU:

- The Province recognizes the value that visitor services contribute to B.C.'s tourism industry and to the quality of the visitor experience.
- We know that traditional bricks and mortar visitor centres are seeing a steady decline in visitation.
- Based on consultations with the local community, the decision was made to close the Visitors Centre at the exit ramp of the Coquihalla and Highway 97C in January in order to give the community and visitors enough time to adjust before the busy summer tourist season.
- What was also confirmed was those using this public space was not for visitor information – it was to use the bathroom facilities.
- As part of Destination BC's strategy to transition the operation and management of BC Visitor Centres to local communities, all visitor services for the City of Merritt are now provided at the city's existing downtown location, the Visitor Centre at the Baillie House.
- This brings these services closer to the community and brings them into the city centre – providing a benefit to local businesses.
- For those planning to visit Merritt, there remains a wealth of information online.
- Destination BC will continue to work with the City of Merritt to ensure the Exit 286 booth is kept clean and maintained. The province will be funding that maintenance throughout the summer.
- As well, the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure is installing signage ahead of the long weekend to indicate the Visitor Centre at Exit 286 is closed and to redirect people into Merritt for visitor information and rest facilities.
- For those who are looking for rest services, there are nearby rest-stops along Highway 97C and Highway 5/5A:
 - Clapperton Chain-up on Highway 5 5KM north of Merritt (1 toilet)
 - Hamilton Brake Check on Highway 5A 10KM southeast of Merritt (1 toilet)

- Nikola Lake on Highway 5A 13KM east of Merritt (2 toilets)
- Loon Lake rest area on Highway 97C 40KM south of Merritt (8 toilets when fully operational – currently porta-potties while filtration system is being installed for washroom facilities)
- For more information about rest stops in the area, check out DriveBC.ca.

If asked what will happen to the land and building where the Visitor Centre sits?

- The land at the site of the old Provincial Visitor Centre is owned by the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations & Rural Development (FLNRO), and the building is owned by the Strategic Real Estate Services, in the Ministry of Citizen's Services.
- The Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development recently awarded a grant to Spayum Developments Ltd. to create a master development plan that will identify the best future use of this property.
- This project will include a technical site assessment, servicing plans and consultation with local communities and First Nations.
- The plan is expected to be developed over the next year.

If asked if the province worked with local government on closing the old Visitor Centre

- The decision to move the visitor services was done in consultation with the community. The visitor services that were moved from the old highway location are now available closer to the very community it serves.
- We did not make this decision in isolation. It was made after careful consideration of what is best for visitors, for the community and for the responsible stewardship of facilities.
- The Merritt council was part of this decision including, at the time, the Mayor Merritt.
- This centre was primarily used as a bathroom rest stop and that was not serving the community or visitors.

• I know the Mayor has voiced concerns regarding the maintenance of the land around the old Visitor Centre and the province is working to not only maintain the current site but to find a new use for this property.

Response: The Government of Canada is aware that there are a number of Canadian families currently in Japan seeking to bring children to Canada for the purpose of adoption. Provincial Central Adoption Authorities, as well as accredited adoption agencies, must ensure that adoptions follow the legal process in all countries, including Japan. This must be done before the Government of Canada can issue immigration visas for children to come to Canada. The Government of

Japan has <u>recently informed the United States government</u> that under Japanese law, the courts must authorize intercountry adoptions. This has not been part of the process for Canadian families adopting children in Japan. We are seeking clarification from the Japanese government to ensure adoptions respect Japanese laws. We are treating this issue as a priority. While this is being further investigated, Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) cannot finalize the processing of cases where the adoption will be completed in Canada and where the transfer of custody is not confirmed by a court order.

Canada is party to *The Hague Convention on the Protection of Children and Co-operation in Respect of Intercountry* Adoption (Convention). The Convention puts in place international safeguards to make sure that intercountry adoptions are in the best interests of children and respects their fundamental rights. It also establishes a system of cooperation among countries to prevent the abduction of, sale of, or traffic in children.

Canada has an obligation to comply with the Convention and applies the same standard to all adoptions, regardless of the country of origin of the child and whether they are parties to the Convention.

Our hearts go out to the prospective parents, who have travelled to Japan to adopt children. We understand and sympathize with their very difficult situation, however IRCC must respect its obligations under international and Canadian laws which is in the best interests of the children involved. We have reached out to the families who are in Japan trying to bring their prospective adopted children back to Canada. We have fully informed them of the situation and committed to providing them with further information as soon as it is available.

Merritt Tourism Centre Closure

Background:

A June 11 Global News story highlighted the closure of the Merritt Visitor Centre.

The closure took place in January but according to the article has gained more attention with tourism season picking up. It included comment from Merritt Mayor Neil Menard, suggesting he redirects traffic and answers many calls from people wondering why it closed. He says Merritt did everything they could to stop the closure.

Message:

Destination BC has assured us this was not an easy decision, but there are many factors at play including the construction of the new rest stop at the Loon Lake interchange.

A number of trends also played into the decision:

More people are planning their travel online and seeking their travel information online rather than at visitor centres Communities have greater flexibility to reach tourists through social media, roaming ambassadors and pop-up tents. The site had become predominantly a washroom stop, and the infrastructure at the site was in need of substantial investment to bring the septic field, water supply and parking lot up to standard.

Destination BC did extend an offer to the City of Merritt to join its visitor services network program and provide funding for that service which Merritt accepted.

Visitor services are now being provided by the City of Merritt through a community-led model, similar to other communities in British Columbia.

We will continue to work with municipalities across B.C. to ensure they have the resources they need to welcome visitors from the rest of the province, across Canada and the world.

Reporter is also interested in the work being done. He says: "There was a big controversy over the road and people held rallies to save the green space, so I am wondering what has been done to minimize the impact on the green space, etc."

Background

Recommendation:

The Highway 97/ Stickle Road intersection improvement project is a very important safety upgrade, as there have been many crashes at this location over the past 10 years.

This project will make travel safer for motorists by adding acceleration and deceleration lanes, and by no longer allowing cars to cross the highway from the side streets.

Work is now underway, and improvements to the intersection will include:

Converting Stickle Road at Highway 97 to a left-in, right-in and right-out intersection; Lengthening the northbound and southbound left-turn lanes on the highway; and Providing right-turn acceleration and deceleration lanes at the east and west approaches.

Extension of 20th Street, connecting it to the south end of the existing Stickle Frontage Road.

The main intersection work is expected to be complete this fall, while the 20th Street extension will likely be completed in 2019.

Cost increases

The estimated total project cost is approximately \$15 million. \$13.5 million will cover the cost of the main work, with an additional \$1.5 million from the rehabilitation program required to resurface the exiting 4 lanes through the intersection.

This project was tendered twice; each time there was low interest by contractors and bid prices were substantially higher than the ministry's estimate. Due to the increased bids prices, we have adjusted our cost estimates to complete the 20th street construction.

The ministry also has an agreement with the City of Vernon for their contribution of land for the construction of the 20th Street Connection.

Environmental considerations

We are committed to doing everything possible to address environmental concerns on the BX Creek Corridor. The ministry has taken a number of steps to mitigate environmental impacts, including implementing a comprehensive environmental management plan.

The ministry has acquired all environmental approvals and a comprehensive environmental assessment has been completed by Golder Associates, which is available to the public on the project website.

The ministry is working with Ducks Unlimited to develop new wetland habitat that is 3 times the amount of wetland habitat that will be impacted. This will ensure critical habitat is still there for the animals in the area.

Response statement:

We recognize the value that exceptional visitor services contribute to B.C.'s tourism industry and to the quality of the visitor experience.

A number of issues factored into the decision to close the Merritt Visitor Centre at Exit 286 and transfer visitor services to the Baillie House Visitor Centre, run by the City of Merritt:

- In recent years, fewer and fewer people stopped at the visitor centre for information, opting instead for obtaining travel information online.
- Face-to-face visitor information was also being provided by the nearby Baillie House
 Visitor Centre in downtown Merritt.
- The site had become predominantly a washroom stop, and the infrastructure at the site was in need of substantial investment to bring the septic field, water supply and parking lot up to standard.

For these reasons, visitor services in Merritt were transition to the City of Merritt in January of this year. We are aware that some people are disappointed with this decision. However, there are no plans to reopen visitor services at the highway location.

Some additional background facts:

- The City of Merritt is now a member of Destination BC's Visitor Services Network Program and receives fee-for-service funding to assist with the delivery of visitor services at the Baillie House Visitor Centre.
- Tourists who make the five minute trip into the heart of Merritt for visitor information are likely
 to see more of the city and spend time and money there generating greater local, economic
 benefits.
- In March of this year, the land's owners the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development awarded \$80,000 through the Rural Dividend program to Spayum Development Ltd to undertake a feasibility study into potential options for future use of the former site of the visitor centre.
- This will include a technical site assessment, servicing plans and consultation with local communities and First Nations.

Key Messages:

Horse-drawn carriages - Tourism impact

- I'm aware of calls for restrictions to horse-drawn carriage rides in Victoria.
- These rides not only provide good jobs for many in the Greater Victoria area, they also contribute to the \$1.2 billion in tourism revenue this city delivers to the provincial economy.
- It is important that any operator take every possible step to ensure the safety of the passengers and the well-being of the horses that help deliver this experience to riders.
- As licensing of these horse-drawn carriage rides falls under municipal jurisdiction, I am confident the City of Victoria will continue to monitor this issue.
- The horse-drawn carriage industry has historically been a major component of tourism in this city and with that, it's important the welfare of the animals is of the highest priority.
- We will continue to watch this issue and any actions the City of Victoria make take going forward.

Abuse in Sport

- I am aware of this case involving a coach who worked in the Alpine Canada organization in the 1990s and my heart goes out to anyone who has had to deal with abuse or harassment of any kind.
- The lifting of the publication ban on this three-year-old decision means these women's voices and their experiences can be heard.
- This government and my ministry take these issues very seriously and while Alpine Canada is a national
 organization, we require Provincial Sport Organizations that receive provincial funding to have policies
 and guidelines in place to address and discourage this type of behaviour.

- Now that the ban is lifted, we will follow the matter closely so we can find even more ways to
 encourage these organizations to better protect young athletes against those that would abuse their
 coaching relationship.
- Again, I want to acknowledge the courage it takes for athletes to come forward and it is my sincere hope that we can all work together to protect our athletes.

Sport Safety - Injury & Concussion

- Our government is working with injury prevention organizations to educate and train athletes, parents, coaches, and health care professionals on the most current concussion management and return-to-play protocols.
- In sport, we know that education, proper enforcement of rules and regulations, and protective equipment help to prevent injuries. We are working with viaSport and the sport sector to educate and raise awareness about these prevention tactics at the local and provincial levels.
- Ongoing research in the area of sport safety continues to bring awareness of safety considerations, such as concussion prevention and management practices.
- In 2017, sport ministers from across Canada received the new guidelines on concussions and agreed to a Framework for Action to respond to concussions in sport.
- We are working with our federal, territorial and provincial counterparts across Canada on a coordinated approach to awareness, prevention, detection, management, and surveillance of concussions.



Reporter says: I have a few questions about E&N commuter rail, from Langford to Victoria.

- 1) Premier Horgan recently told the Chamber of Commerce that there seems to be no business case for rail. To what business-case analysis was he referring?
- 2) What research exists on the business case for alternatives to rail, such as buses?
- 3) MLA Mitzi Dean has been engaged in consultations with various interest groups including Songhees and Esquimalt First Nations -- about the E&N corridor and commuter rail. How will she report out on her findings, and by what date will this be done?
- 4) What discussions have already happened with the Island Corridor Foundation about ripping out the tracks from Langford to Victoria, in order to run buses or other modes of transportation on the corridor?
- 5) The Island Corridor Foundation owns the rail corridor. Does the province have the authority to reclaim ownership of this corridor?

Background

Revitalizing the E&N corridor in the Capital Regional District is something that the Province is looking at as a way to address the frustrations people have with mounting traffic congestion between downtown Victoria and the West Shore, and we're committed to looking at solutions to get people moving in the CRD.

As the Premier has stated, studies do not support a case for rail on the corridor – the tracks stop in Vic West and don't go all the way into town, and study after study proves that if people need to transfer more than once, they will opt to stay in their cars.

There are a number of studies that have been undertaken over the years, by BC Transit, the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure and many others, that have estimated the costs related to track upgrades and capital costs in the CRD (including rolling stock) range from \$17.8 million to \$165.7 million. Reinstatement of passenger rail along the corridor in the CRD is not a simple or cost effective solution to meeting the demands of commuters.

The Province is looking at options for how to use the E&N corridor to get people moving quickly, efficiently and for the best value for people living and working along the corridor. Transit is an option being seriously considered.

The consultations led by MLA Mitzi Dean with local mayors and Esquimalt and Songhees First Nations have opened important discussions. This work is complex and involves a number of stakeholders, including ICF, local governments and First Nations. There a number of factors to consider, and the Province continues this work in an ongoing way.

Earlier this week, Minister Trevena met with the Chair of ICF, and we're hopeful that we can work collaboratively to find solutions to revitalize the E&N corridor.

The Province is encouraging the ICF to consider all options for the corridor, including transit service, multi-use trails, rail - if and where it's feasible - or a combination of approaches.

The ministry will continue working with stakeholders and the ICF to determine a way forward, and will provide an update in the process while respecting the confidential and sensitive nature of the discussions.

For too long, childcare has been in crisis in BC which is why our government is rolling out a comprehensive childcare plan to make quality childcare accessible and affordable for families.

Over the first year of our government, we've heard from parents, childcare providers and educators. Their message has been clear- we need to act quickly to fix the childcare crisis for BC families.

With our first Budget, we took steps to make child care more affordable with a fee reduction that is saving parents as much as \$350 per month per child. We will be delivering further savings to families with the Affordable Child Care Benefit this September.

Background:

- On Tuesday, July 24, Vancouver council approved the rezoning of Area 10C with two options:
 - 1) Approved 400,000sqft at up to 300ft in height with no conditions or restrictions.
 - 2) Approved 400,000sqft at up to 400ft with condition that all residential units are designated as secured market rental housing.
- This would allow for provincial Crown corporation PavCo to build a 40-storey (400 foot tall) or 300 foot tall residential tower on Pacific Boulevard, between Rogers Arena and B.C. Place Stadium.
- PavCo's original proposal to the City of Vancouver for Area 10C was for a 300ft building.

- Subsequently, a taller building up to 400ft with a smaller floorplate was brought forward as a second option.



Q. The news release says legislation will include a focus on "Supply and boundaries for taxis and other passenger directed vehicles." What does this mean?

- We know the current system isn't meeting the needs of consumers.
- There are gaps especially during peak hours and late at night and during busy events and tourist seasons.
- Our legislation will look at how we can ensure the system best meets demand, including for accessible vehicles.

Q. Will there be an open market on taxis or still limits on the number of taxis?

BC liberal says BC NDP's childcare plan will lead to loss of 8138 childcare spaces in BC.

1. What is the government's response to BC liberals' findings?

Our plan will create more spaces. Last week we announced our plan to invest \$221 million over three years specifically earmarked to create 22,000 spaces. We held our first information session for this funding this week, with almost 70 child care providers joining to learn more about the program.

For too long, there has been a child care crisis in this province, and I am proud that our government is taking concrete steps to address this for B.C. families. We are with municipalities, school districts, and childcare providers across the province. In June, we also expanded our Childcare BC Maintenance Fund, which provides funding for providers to carry out repairs and maintain existing spaces. We have already received around 160 applications, and provided more than \$400,000 in funding to ensure that child care providers can continue to provide quality care to families in their communities. We also launched Startup Grants, which will support unlicensed providers to become licensed and allow them to care for more children.

In addition, we are working on a plan to increase the number of child care workers to ensure the new spaces are staffed. We know that wages for the child care sector are a major issue, and I can assure you that we are working on it and more details will be available in the coming months.

We continue to work with partners across government and other key stakeholders as we work to bring universal child care to B.C.

2. What are the restrictions for childcare facilities if they are opted into the plan? why implement such restrictions?

Child care providers who choose to opt-in to our fee reduction initiative are provided with the funding to be passed down to parents, up to 350 a month, plus a 10% boost on their CCOF grant. We require providers who opt-in to provide us with a fee schedule which is reviewed to ensure that parents do not see unreasonable costs added. Providers are approved to increase fees for reasonable costs associated with running their business.

3. The study shows that of the 70% of respondents who have opted into the plan, 49% felt coercive. What's your response to that?

Participation in the fee reduction initiative is completely optional. We are pleased that 85% of eligible providers have chosen to join the initiative and pass along savings to families. So far, more than 47,000 licensed child care spaces have been approved for fee reductions. We're also receiving new applications for providers who are looking to receive Child Care Operating Funding for the first time, so that they can participate in the Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative.

While I can't comment on the specifics of a survey without seeing the questions or methods used, I can say that we've received positive feedback from providers across the province. I hear every day from childcare providers who are happy to pass on savings to parents and are excited about the bright future for childcare and children in our province.

POLICE – N. Cowichan, Duncan, Shawnigan Lake Model

BACKGROUND:

Following a review of the service models for both North Cowichan/Duncan and Shawnigan Lake Detachments, the E Division Management Team approved the option of a single integrated detachment in North Cowichan with a Community Policing Office in the current Shawnigan Lake Detachment building.

Shawnigan Lake and Mill Bay supported the option of having a second detachment built in Mill Bay and a petition was presented to the BC Legislature, saying in part that the South Island Traffic Services would be better run out of a Mill Bay site so they could respond more quickly.

While there will not be a new building in Mill Bay, the Shawnigan Lake Detachment will see renovations and SITS will operate from time to time out of the Community Policing Office. The RCMP believes the integrated model eliminates redundancies and duplication of services.

SUGGESTED RESPONSE:

- The safety of the public is my primary responsibility and we understand the RCMP's new policing model in BC communities will not jeopardize that.
- I'm aware there are some concerns about Shawnigan Lake detachment becoming a community policing office and we absolutely recognize how important it is to ensure the Shawnigan Lake area remains wellpoliced. We expect it will continue to be in the future.
- Shawnigan Lake RCMP and the South Island Traffic Services will start and finish their shifts in the new North Cowichan/Duncan building, but they will actually work out of the renovated community policing office which will continue to be open to the public.
- Overall this policing model will offer a better coordinated service better information sharing and 24/7 coverage.

KEY #'S:

- North Cowichan/Duncan Detachment is municipal and provincial and has 31 municipal members, 24 provincial members, four First Nations Police and 23 support staff, serving the Municipality of North Cowichan, Duncan, Cowichan Tribes, Halalt First Nation and Chemainus First Nation.

 calls, before customers who do not require accessibility.

Background:

- In September, the Capital Regional District sent a letter to the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General asking it to consider installing interval cameras, also known as point-to-point technologies, as a pilot study on the Malahat highway.
- This technology is designed to catch speeders.
- It is not yet used in North America, and would require significant investment.
- In a meeting with the CRD Chair, the Minister told the CRD that if there is public support for something like this he would consider looking at it.
- In February, the CRD started a public promotion campaign to urge British Columbians to write into the Minister on point-to-point on the Malahat. This promo campaign included radio and TV ads as well as a News Release.
- The Ministry is currently reviewing the correspondence received on this topic.
- Once the Ministry has completed its review of the approximately 1,400 submissions received with regard to point-to-point on the Malahat, it will be providing a written response to the CRD, likely in the next few weeks.

Message:

- We need to keep people safe on our roads and highways.
- We know that distracted driving, excessive speed, and impairment are the top three contributing factors to motor vehicle fatalities.
- While this technology hasn't been used in North America before, we are willing to look at any option that is proven to be effective at savings lives and keeping people safe.
