BC Hydro purchases remaining interest in the Waneta Dam and Generating Station

VANCOUVER: BC Hydro announced today that it has finalized the purchase of the remaining two-thirds interest in the Waneta Dam and Generating Station from Teck Resources Limited (Teck) for \$1.2 billion.

The purchase was finalized following a thorough internal review by BC Hydro prior to it submitting an application to the British Columbia Utilities Commission (BCUC). The BCUC approved the application last week, confirming the purchase is in the best interest of BC Hydro customers.

"This purchase provides BC Hydro with an additional source of clean, reliable power at a cost-effective price," said Chris O'Riley, BC Hydro President and Chief Operating Officer. "The addition of the Waneta Dam and Generating Station will provide ongoing financial benefits that will help keep rates affordable for our customers."

BC Hydro was presented with the opportunity to purchase the remaining two-thirds interest as part of its right to first offer that it negotiated as part of its purchase of a one-third interest in the facility in 2010.

Today's purchase provides BC Hydro with complete ownership of the Waneta Dam and Generating Station and includes a 20-year lease agreement with Teck where two-thirds will be leased to Teck, and one-third will continue to supply BC Hydro customers.

Facts

- The Waneta Dam is located close to the Canada-US border, near the mouth of the Pend d'Oreille River just before it enters the Columbia River, near Trail, B.C.
- The dam was originally constructed in 1954 by the Consolidated Mining and Smelting Company of Canada Limited (now known as Teck Resources) to generate power specifically for use at its smelter located in Trail, B.C.
- Its four generating units total 490 megawatts of capacity and produce approximately 2,800 gigawatt hours of energy per year.
- In 2010, BC Hydro purchased a one-third share of the Waneta Dam for \$825 million.
 - The purchase included a Co-Ownership and Operating Agreement that provided BC Hydro with the right of first offer on any future sale of the remaining interest in the dam.
 - BC Hydro informed Teck in August 2017 of its plan to purchase the remaining two-thirds of the dam.



- At approximately 5am on May 27, 2018, Kinder Morgan notified the ministry of an oil spill at their Darfield Pump Station near Barriere, B.C.
- The Kinder Morgan initial report indicated at least 100 litres of light crude oil had leaked from a flow meter. Under provincial regulations, 100 L is the minimum threshold that needs to be reported.
- The leak was reported by Kinder Morgan on their property, no waterways were affected and a
 more specific volume would be forthcoming upon further investigation. The company's
 emergency response was activated and spill clean-up was initiated.
- Regulatory notifications to First Nations, neighbours and other stakeholders in the vicinity were completed at the time of the spill.
- Later, on the day of the spill, Kinder Morgan issued a public statement indicating clean-up was underway, they were investigating and there was no specific estimate of volume spilled available.
- On May 31st Ministry environmental emergency response officer visited the site.
- The next day, June 1st and 5 days after the initial report, a specific estimate was provided when Kinder Morgan revised the spill volume from at least 100L to 4800L.
- Ministry officials have communicated with Kinder Morgan the importance of accurate and timely volume reporting. The Ministry strives to ensure information from an ongoing event is documented and reported out as specifically as possible.

MAACFA report

Strategic Recommendation

Strengthen the precautionary approach to regulating salmon farming in B.C. to reduce the potential risk of serious harm to wild salmon.

- 1.1. Adopt an area-based approach to managing salmon farms and initiate work to identify geographic areas and their management requirements, including the maximum number of permitted net-pen salmon farms, and maximum total allowable biomass based on the environmental capacity and other scientific considerations. This approach should also examine the feasibility of locating salmon farms in areas with lower salinity and that may result in fewer sea lice.
- 1.2. Place greater emphasis on the cumulative effects of multiple salmon farms operating in the same geographic area as part of site approval process and area-based approach to managing salmon farms.
- 1.3. Provide regulatory flexibility to relocate existing salmon farms to new sites based on the primary objective of reducing risks to wild salmon, in addition to other considerations such as addressing First Nations and community concerns and reducing the number of farms operating in sub-optimal locations.
- 1.4 Define in a prescriptive manner how the precautionary principle will be applied in the siting of salmon farms outlining its key elements and objectives.

Longer-Term Recommended Actions

- 1.5 Establish criteria to govern any future siting of net-pen salmon farms in B.C., including evidence that the farm poses no more than a minimal risk of serious harm to wild salmon, the location of the farm has First Nations support at the outset, and the location of the farm is favourable from an environmental perspective.
- 1.6. Increase investment in the assessment of wild salmon stocks, the public dissemination of stock assessment information and in the restoration of wild salmon habitat and other resources, such as Pacific herring, on which they depend.

Strategic Recommendation

Acknowledge and incorporate First Nations' rights, title and stewardship responsibilities in all aspects of fish farm governance, including tenuring, licensing, management and monitoring in a manner consistent with the United Nations Declaration of Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP).

- 2.1. Establish policy requiring industry to have agreements with a First Nation(s) affected by a net-pen aquaculture site as a condition of any new or replacement site tenure, and provide guidelines to industry for developing these agreements.
- 2.2. Review and strengthen B.C. government engagement processes with individual First Nations governments on new or replacement net-pen aquaculture site tenures.
- 2.3. Establish a salmon aquaculture forum comprised of coastal and B.C. Interior First Nations organizations and where possible using appropriate existing provincial and federal advisory bodies to provide advice on net-pen aquaculture management issues such as site applications and farm operations in First Nations shared territories.

[13] In the *Vancouver* case, I concluded that, given British Columbia's constitutional limitations, the nature of the process before the NEB and the federal cabinet, and the applicable legislation, the Ministers' decision to issue an EAC to the TMX fell within the range of possible, defensible outcomes. It therefore met the reasonableness standard reviewing courts must apply, and was entitled to deference. I found no lack of procedural fairness or absence of jurisdiction. In those circumstances, I was obliged to dismiss Vancouver's petition.

[14] In this case, given those same parameters, I conclude for the reasons set out below that the consultation that took place was adequate, and that the Ministers' conclusion to that effect was reasonable and therefore entitled to deference. In particular, I conclude that it was reasonable and lawful, in the circumstances of this case, for the provincial Crown to rely on the NEB assessment as the assessment for the British Columbia process, and to accept the concept of information deferral to project conditions. It follows that Squamish's petition must also be dismissed.



Where Information Access Operations (IAO) has advised the head that a discretionary exception may apply, it is important that the head consider the possibility of releasing the information despite the fact that an exception may apply.

Factors relevant to the exercise of discretion include:

- the general purposes of the legislation: public bodies should make information available to the public; individuals should have access to personal information about themselves;
- the wording of the discretionary exception and the interests which the section attempts to balance;
- whether the individual's request could be satisfied by severing the record and by providing the applicant
- with as much information as is reasonably practicable;
- the historical practice of the public body with respect to the release of similar types of documents;
- the nature of the record and the extent to which the document is significant and/or sensitive to the public body;
- whether the disclosure of the information will increase public confidence in the operation of the public body;
- the age of the record;
- whether there is a sympathetic or compelling need to release materials;
- whether previous orders of the Commissioner have ruled that similar types of records or information should or should not be subject to disclosure; and
- when the policy advice exception is claimed, whether the decision to which the advice or recommendations relates has already been made.
