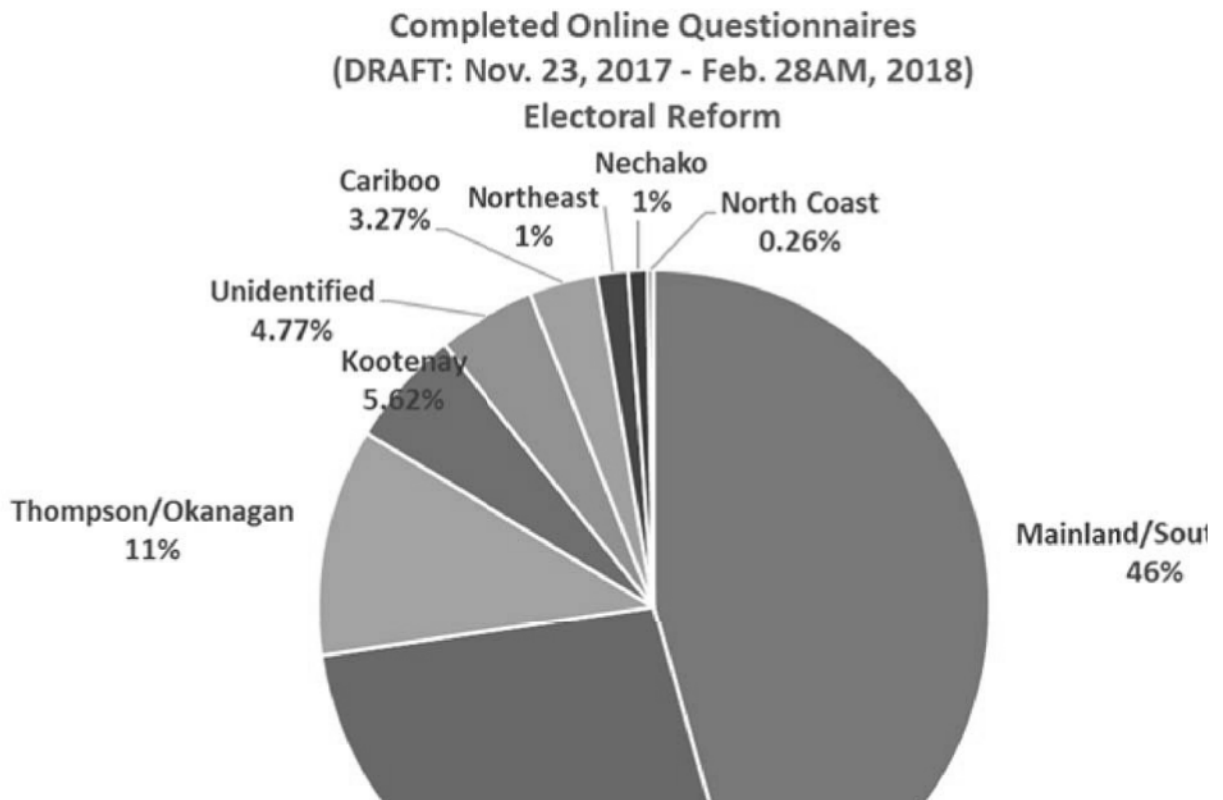

Hi all (Shelley, I'm including you because I think Don may wish to reference this info at DMC),

This is to advise that we have sorted out a revised policy regards complans in Cabinet (or Cabinet Committee) submissions. Evan, Mike and I would appreciate all you EDs notifying your CDs about this.

As a general rule, complans are required for all submissions, however exceptions will now apply:

- RFL's: Because there is some considerable time between a request for legislation and its introduction, complans should not be included at the RFL stage but rather developed (when necessary) for introduction in the House.
- Some policy submissions: in some cases, submissions present quite drastically different options and there is uncertainty around acceptance of the recommended option. In these situations, developing complans may be time consuming (if all options have to be addressed) and quite speculative – therefore, there is little point in a full complan. That said, **whenever possible**, Communication Directors should consider preparing a one-page **communication outline** that includes: Item Summary; Key Audiences; Key Messages; Key Stakeholders. We are urging this because we believe there will be some commonalities in these four areas, regardless of which option may be selected. We reinforce, this should be done **whenever possible or practicable** – again, this is not required.

Deciding When:

- Any decision around when, and when not, to include a full complan is at the discretion of the Communications Director; we encourage CDs to connect with their ED if they need guidance (and EDs with ADMs). If CDs encounter any further pushback on their decision, they and their ED should consult Mike Lowe or Robb Gibbs for further assistance and direction.

Finally, Cabinet Operations and the Premier's Office are aware of this change.

Attached is BCH's IN on their current power smart campaign which Rob asked about. It's being updated info on ad campaigns going back to 2010. (see table below). Also below is the BCH response to Rob's questions:

BCH Response

We have one campaign in market right now about conservation. We typically do this twice a year – once in the spring and once in the fall. We also run annual safety campaigns about staying safe around downed lines.

As you know, we offer a number of conservation programs and different types of billing support. Our goal during these campaigns is to raise awareness about the programs we offer and provide tips on how customers can reduce their electricity use to save money on their bills. The total cost of the campaign is \$1.8 million.

I should point out overall spending for our individual advertising campaigns has decreased in recent years. The budget for each of these individual campaigns is close to half of what it was in 2010.

On your questions about the lifeline rates, are you asking if we have any advertising planned? We don't. At this point, we're planning to begin consultation with customer groups in the coming weeks on what the rate could look like.

Follow up:

That's right. We run two conservation campaigns each year (spring and fall). The current campaign runs from mid-February to mid-April. We've broken this campaign into two phases. The total cost for both phases is about \$3.0 million (this includes the \$1.8 million mentioned below).

The fall campaign, which runs every October, has a budget of \$2.0 million.

- There is momentum—British Columbians want to talk to us. We had over 88 000 responses to Electoral Reform, and ICBC has garnered nearly 30 000 at time of writing.
- When you think about counting up all the words and data points on the engagements, sometimes you see British Columbians write enough words to fill all 7 volumes of the Harry Potter series in a matter of weeks
- Electoral reform saw British Columbians commit almost a decade of person time to informing government about their ideas

I think a clear statement from you about how it is critical to close the loop to ensure British Columbians know their effort isn't wasted would be really helpful.

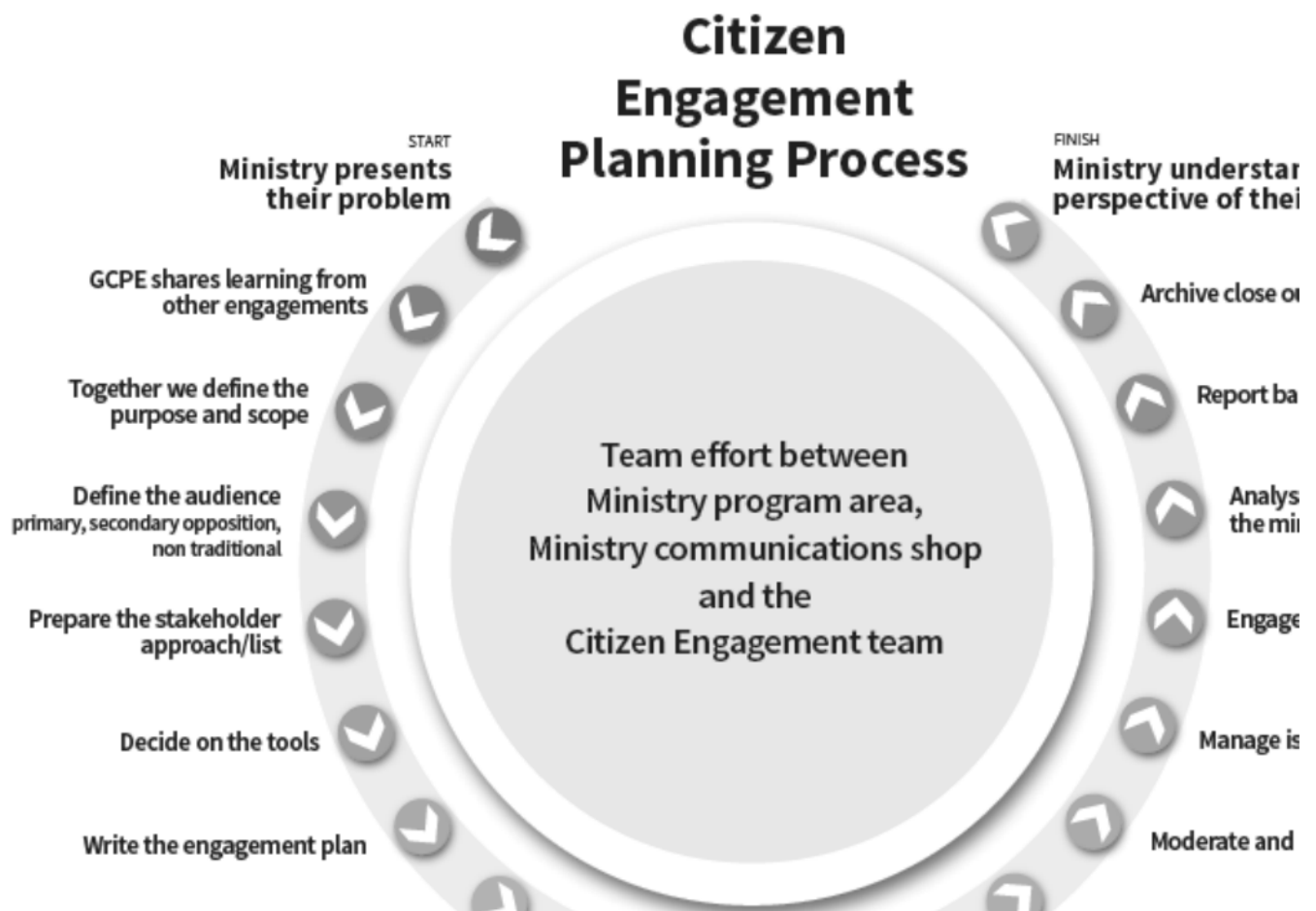

I grieve with those who are assembling today. Tomorrow, when the Legislature reconvenes we'll be lowering our flags to half mast in recognition of the loss of life in Saskatchewan.

And I'd like to now move if I could to discuss a press release that was issued today by Kinder Morgan Canada. I've had the opportunity to speak with Ian Anderson, the CEO of KM, as well as the Prime Minister. And I will be speaking with AB Premier Rachel Notley later on today. Ian Anderson told me that he believes that the project KM has been undertaking has been unnecessarily harassed by BC, and I told him that I disagreed.

We campaigned in April of last year with a view to protect and defend our coast, with a view to have economic development take place in a balanced way within BC. But we were consistent from the time that the campaign started until it completed, and right up to this day that our job, we believe, as the Government of BC, is to defend our water, our land, and, most importantly, our coast.

When I spoke with the PM, he reiterated the position that he has held for some time that he believes that this project is in the national interest, and I respectfully disagree, as I have consistently. It is our view that provincial jurisdiction should prevail in many areas that are affected by this process. We said from the beginning that the National Energy process was flawed. We are in court. In fact, a court case that started well before we formed government. We felt that the NEB did not adequately take into consideration the risks to BC, and most importantly the risk to our coast. We have been consistent in that regard.

We also, in January, began a consultation to ask BCers how they felt we should respond, should there be a catastrophic event affecting our lands, our waters, or, most importantly, our coast. Before we could get that consultation underway, we heard from Ottawa and Edmonton, the federal government and the Government of AB, that they believe we didn't have the jurisdiction to do so. Again, we disagreed.

At that time, I asked both the federal government and the Government of AB to join with us in a reference to the Supreme Court. They declined to do so. We're going to carry on with that reference. Again, I believe it's appropriate for BCers to have access to decision makers and to help shape what types of policies we want to put in place to protect the interests of all BCers.

I believe there are a number of factors at play here that I think all BCers need to understand. Firstly, the Energy East Pipeline was stopped and there was no consequence from that. The Keystone XL Pipeline was stopped and now may well begin again, and there was no adverse consequence as a result of that. And it's my view that BC should have an equal say to other jurisdictions when these projects come forward. It's been said that we are somehow compromising the Climate Action Plan for the country, and I profoundly disagree with that.

Canada is embarking on what they should; a comprehensive national plan to fight climate change and I support that. In fact, BCers have been supporting that for the past decade. We have \$35 a tonne levied on carbon pricing in BC, the only province in the country to do so. So I reject the notion that somehow our opposition to risk to our coast and to our economy is somehow tied to the national climate plan.

In closing, I want to say to all Canadians that I profoundly believe in the rights of BCers to stand up and make sure that we're doing everything we can to protect the interests of our province. I don't want to do that in a provocative way. I don't want any threats. I don't want any ultimatums. And I believe other governments should follow suit.

In a cooperative federation, we should all be able to work together in the best interests of the Canadian fabric. That's been my intention from the moment I was sworn in, and it will continue to be my intention as long as I'm Premier of BC. But I will not, I will not, give up the right and responsibility of the Government of BC to defend the interests of BC. That's what I'm going to do and that's all I've got to say about that. Bad ending. Next question.

Reporter: So Jim Carr, the Natural Resources minister, put a strongly worded statement saying the pipeline's in the national interest and the government will do whatever it takes to have this thing built. And talking to some senior government officials there this afternoon, talking about potentially using various levers at their disposal to put pressure on your government. Are you concerned you may be paying an economic price, in terms of what you can look forward to from (inaudible)?

Horgan: I didn't hear all of Mr Carr's statements. I did have a conversation with the PM and there was no threats, there was no intimidation. It was just a reasonable discussion between two people who have a different point of view. It's obviously the responsibility of the federal government to assert jurisdiction where it believes it has it, and it's the responsibility of the province to push back when we believe our jurisdiction has been tampered. This is not new. This is something that's been going on in Canada for a long, long, time. I think that's the strength of our federation and will continue to be in the future.

Reporter: And AB Premier Rachel Notley just tweeted that AB's willing to be the investor in this pipeline, build the pipeline herself. Did that come up in your conversation with her?

Horgan: I have not talked to Rachel Notley yet, but I'm sure that will come up. We have talked in the past about the importance of perhaps seeing investments, national investments, provincial investments, in more refining capacity in Canada, so that we can keep our natural resources here to the benefit of Canadians, and create more jobs in the long-term, by making sure that these resources that we have in abundance are used to the best interest of BCers and Canadians right across the board.

Reporter: You said you don't think it's appropriate to have more threats and ultimatums, but the Premier of AB is talking about some serious economic consequences, planning to bring some law in next week. What are your thoughts on that and are we going to be right back into that trade war?

Horgan: Again, it was our view that the actions of the AB government when we proposed a consultation with our citizens was over the top. They disagreed with our jurisdiction in the matter. We asked them to join us going to the court and they declined. Again, the Government of AB can do and should do whatever it feels necessary. I am going to get up tomorrow morning, the House will be reconvened, and we're going to talk about things that matter to BCers; making life more affordable; ensuring that the services that they depend are there for them when they need it. We have the fastest growing economy in the country. Unemployment is below 5%. We have a balanced budget this year, next year, and the year after that, and we're going to continue to grow our economy and focus on the things that matter to the people of BC. That's my preoccupation. What other governments do is up to them.

Reporter: But if they are bringing in a law that imposes some kind of economic sanctions on BC, will BC respond in kind?

Horgan: I have no intention of escalating controversy across the country. I have every expectation that people will respect BC's right to defend our interest and to defend our coast. That's what I will do. But my preoccupation is the people of BC, and their focus is on the things that I just talked about; affordability, services, and ensuring that we can continue to have a prosperous dynamic economy that's very mindful of the environment. Again, \$35 a tonne carbon price, the highest in the country, a commitment to a climate action plan that will reduce our emissions in the future. These are the things that BCers voted on a year ago this month and that's the agenda that I'm going to follow through on.

Reporter: Premier, so you've been wanting to stop this project all along. With the suspension, do you take this as a victory? Are you happy about this development today?

Horgan: No, I wouldn't.... In my discussions with Mr Anderson, the suspension that is talked about in the press release, I believe, is for the markets... Kinder Morgan has put a deadline in their submission of May 31st. I have every expectation that they're going to continue to pursue a conclusion that's in their interest. But the interests of Texas boardrooms are not the interests of BCers, and I understand Mr Anderson's view, as the head of a company, that is mandated with pushing through a pipeline. But I hope that he understands also that we were absolutely clear with he and his investors during the election campaign what our view was on the matter, and the risk is too great. We have not seen, in my opinion, sufficient evidence from other jurisdictions that they're prepared to listen to our concerns and to work cooperatively to realize an outcome that benefits everybody.

Reporter: So is there any way, if the federal government were to call on you for talks, do you see any way that those talks would result in KM being satisfied with the outcome that BC would drop some of these (inaudible)?

Horgan: My views on this have been consistent for the past year. We believe the risk is too great. There's been no evidence to demonstrate that that risk has been diminished. There's the view of the Government of AB, there's the view of the federal government, and there's the view of the shareholders in Texas. I'm here to defend BCers. And I have to say that I'm certain, although it did not come up in the conversation, that investors at KM have to be moved by the passion of BCers that are emerging in many dozens to be arrested on a daily basis, the determination of indigenous leaders here in BC to protect the Burrard Inlet and the Salish Sea, and the economy that depends on that. Those are the issues that matter to me and I'll allow shareholders in KM to deal with their issues.

Reporter: Talking to government officials back east again, they again raised the point they're worried this sets a precedent from their point of view that a province would be allowed to get away with basically stopping a federally-approved project and that could send a signal to other provinces, particularly, Quebec, that they can behave in a likewise manner and enjoy success. Do you think this could lead to a constitutional real serious problem?

Horgan: There was no constitutional crisis when Energy East was cancelled abruptly. I don't see why this would be a constitutional crisis as well. Again, we're a cooperative federation, where on occasion, the federal government asserts its paramountcy and often times provinces push back. This is not something that's unique in Canada. In fact, it's often been characterized as [inaudible]. The Constitution is something that people often bring up when there's nothing else to talk about at a dinner party. For us, jurisdiction is critically important.

We believe we have a right to talk to BCers about we could best protect their interests. And that's what we intended to do in January, and it led to a significant response from Alberta. And also from the federal government. We tried to find a way forward and the way forward was to refer the matter to the courts. We believe in the rule of law. Canadians believe in the rule of law. And that's the course we're on. Not threats. Not intimidation. Not provocation. But the rule of law.

Reporter: At this point, do you not think perhaps a face-to-face meeting between you and the Prime Minister and perhaps Rachel Notley is required here?

Horgan: I'll leave that up to them. I've had two very good conversations with the PM in the past week. I expect to talk to Premier Notley tonight or tomorrow and we'll see how that goes.

Reporter: So, Premier, there's a lot been made about the potential for this type of action to scare off investors for other projects. How concerned are you by that?

Horgan: I was in Prince George for the Council of Forest Industries' annual general meeting last week, talking to 560 forest executives, logging operators in BC who are very excited about the prospects going forward. Lumber prices are high. We have challenges with the end of the beetle kill and the amount of wood available. We need to make sure we work together to ensure that our forest sector, foundational to our economy, continues to prosper. But there's optimism in that regard.

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Again, there was no crisis when Energy East decided to terminate its proposals. I believe that we should carry on and focus on all of the opportunities we have in BC and in Canada to grow a sustainable economy that benefits all BCers and all Canadians. VICTORIA – In total, there are 1,187 provincial permits required for the Trans Mountain Expansion Project, with many involving First Nations consultation.

To date:

- 587 permit applications have been submitted to permitting agencies
- Of these 201 have been approved and permits issued
- The remaining 386 are being reviewed
- Approximately another 600 need to be submitted

All permits submitted must align with the 37 conditions outlined in the provincial environmental certificate, as well as the 157 conditions detailed in the National Energy Board's approval.

Multiple ministries are involved, including the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development, the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy (including B.C. Parks), the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, and the BC Oil and Gas Commission. The Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources along with the Ministry of Agriculture have a dedicated project office supporting these ministries and their permitting requirements.

To date:

- 587 permit applications have been submitted to permitting agencies;
- Of these 201 applications have been approved and permits issued;

Horgan - TMP Ottawa summit

By Horgan - Charles Lynch Room - Ottawa

Horgan: I had a very frank conversation in with the prime minister and the premier of Alberta. The good news was we recognized and re-affirmed the many values we share -- our common view of Canada as a dynamic and diverse country with many component parts all working together to give us the strength that we see from coast to coast to coast.

However, despite all of the commonality between the three of us, we continue to disagree on the question of moving diluted bitumen from Alberta to the Port of Vancouver.

We had a discussion about options. The federal government laid out their plans over the next number of days. I'll leave that to the prime minister and the minister of Finance to tell you about.

And we had a discussion about what role BC could continue to play when it comes to protecting and defending our coast. It has been my view that it's the responsibility of the Premier of BC to be vigilant to ensure that we're not just protecting our environment but we're maintaining a positive and diverse and competitive economy.

Our marine economy is considerable. Wild salmon stocks are depleting, but yet there is considerable economic activity when it comes to our oceans, when it comes to our majesty -- as you all know, it's a beautiful place to visit. Our tourism industry would be severely compromised with an adverse diluted-bitumen spill

So at the end of the day, we agreed that there may well be an opportunity for us to have officials address some of the gaps that we perceive to be in the Ocean Protection Plan.

However, we remain committed to ensuring that we're protecting our jurisdiction in this regard, and although we agree today, the prime minister and I, that we'll do everything in our power, he and me, to ensure that we are protecting our coast, I and he will not be in power forever, and that's why the jurisdictional question is so critically important.

Q&A

Reporter: Premier Horgan, you just said that [inaudible] actions that BC is prepared to take, so what exactly are those?

Horgan: We have been talking to federal officials for some time about what we perceive to be gaps in the ocean protection plan. We want to make sure that we have the resources federal and provincial in play to ensure that we can protect our economic activity on the water and also inland.

Reporter: As followup, I've heard you say that several times in the last few months, I'm specifically wondering what action and what gaps you want to address? What action are you taking to address what gaps?

Horgan: We have asked officials to work. our officials in British Columbia to work with the federal government to ensure that for example when they're applying more resources to the ocean protection plan that they focus on the gaps that we see up the coast. It's a large coast. I've made reference recently to my visit to Bella Bella last 2016 when a diesel spill, a hundred thousand litres ever diesel was released into the marine environment. It took over a month to address that -- and that's a federal responsibility. I don't think we can wait a month if there was a diluted bitumen spill so there's an example that we're working on.

Reporter: Will you be preceding with your reference?

Horgan: Yes.

Reporter: And what is the point of that? What do you hope to active with that?

Horgan: Well, you will recall, if I could lay it out for you that we came to. we formed a government in July of 2017. We joined two court cases already under way with respect to the Kinder Morgan pipeline, and in January we issued a press release saying that we were going to discuss with British Columbians what further tools we would use or need to ensure that we were defending our coast. The response from Alberta was provocative. The response from the federal government was similar. They said we don't have a jurisdiction, we believe we do. So as when there is a dispute in Canada we decided to go to court.

Reporter: [inaudible]?

Horgan: Shortly.

Reporter: Can you tell us more about the gaps in the ocean protection plan?

Horgan: Well we will leave it to our officials to address that and there will be more to say about that in the days ahead.

Question: The prime minister told you he's going to be taking over this file and that Ottawa is going to become the lead on the pipeline now, including legislative options. Is that what Justin Trudeau told you in that meeting?

Horgan: I give the Prime Minister full credit for bringing Premier Notley and I together as I said all three of us have common values on a whole range of issues. Premier Notley and I, of course, are from the same political party and so it was a useful meeting for all three of us, candid discussions but also a genuine sense of optimism and confidence in Canada for sure, I don't believe that the crisis that has emerged here is one that should be trivialized but I also believe that there is so much that brings us together from coast to coast to coast that we need to focus on those issues more often than we focus on these disputes.

Reporter: Did the Prime Minister make it clear to you that he is now prepared to take explicit specific steps to push this project through over your objections?

Horgan: He said the federal government will be moving with legislative and financial measures in the days ahead and again it would be best to have him explain that to you. He didn't go into the detail with me. He laid out in broad strokes what their plans were and I will leave it to him.

Reporter: How do you feel about that? How do you feel about him telling you that this is going to happen over your objections.

Horgan: My concerns are for the people of British Columbia, and we have been focused on balancing the budget which we have done not just this year but over the next two years focused on delivering services for people. These are the paramount issues for folks day-to-day-to-day. Although there are passions about this pipeline, and passions about the environment of British Columbia absolutely. On a daily basis people are concerned about with the same thing people are concerned about in PEI and New Brunswick. They are concerned about making sure that they have adequate resources to meet their family's needs and the services they depend on health care and education and in British Columbia surplus budget so we're able to invest in the first significant social program in a generation by having affordable, accessible and quality child care in BC. Those are the issues people are focused on back home and that is what I am going to go back to do later today.

Reporter: The government of Quebec has come out in support of your objection. Did you talk to Mr Couillard [inaudible] this week? What kind of consequences do you envision?

Horgan: Firstly, I felt no threats or intimidation. It was a collegial meeting among peers. I am grateful to have had that opportunity. I have no objections whatsoever to the tone or the content of our discussions. I did have a very positive conversation with the premier of Quebec earlier in the week and our interactions in the time I've been premier we have struck an accord I would say. We have a similar world view and I have a great degree of respect for him so I was welcoming his advice on how I should proceed and this is the first meeting I've had of this nature in my life. These are not things you normally do on a daily basis so I sought his advice and he gave it to me and I was grateful for that and, of course, I know as you do Quebec takes provincial jurisdiction very seriously as to British Columbians and so we have a common interest in that regard. But I believe at this point in the proceeding we had a fair and frank discussion. The premier of Alberta speaks very passionately for her provincial and her people as she should and I'm obliged to do the same and I believe I gave as good as I got not that that was the tone of the conversation but my obligation is the people of BC and I am going to defend that until I am no longer the Premier.

Reporter: What do you think of the Prime Minister, yesterday in Peru he made a point of mentioning in Peru that he felt and he decided he said a duly elected government of BC has given legislative approval to the Kinder Morgan project. What do you make of that point? How do you respond to that point?

Horgan: That didn't come up in the conversation. But governments change in British Columbia -- in Canada, that's the beauty of our democracy. And although in many instances new governments come to power and disagree with the government they just defeated and this is certainly the case when it comes to this project. But one of the example that we were talking about this morning was the Meech Lake accord. Again, I'm not inclined to bring up constitutional issues but the government of Manitoba supported it until it didn't. And, again, we're still here. That's the good news. I believe passionately in Canada and we can get through these issues as they emerge. In fact, it is issues like this that strengthen our confederation and we have been successful for 150 years, Canada. British Columbia since 1871 and I believe we'll continue to be successful.

Reporter: You told an interviewer on Saturday that you would abide by whatever -- if this is referred to the courts -- that you would abide by whatever the court decides. If the court decides due environmental study, all processes have been respected, the pipeline should go ahead. Will you abide by the decision ever the courts?

Horgan: I absolutely believe in the rule of law. All Canadians do. It's my view that should the courts render a decision that's counter to our position then that's the way it should be. At the same time we also have we're enjoying -- we've joined a case that has other parties and what the other parties do is entirely up to them but in the federal court that we're involved in right now that decision we're expecting within a number of weeks the reference which has taken more time than any of us would have hoped, our legal team had to clear their calendars. Again, I don't know if any of you have ever launched a constitutional reference, it takes a little bit of time. You can't do it over a weekend. And I would have preferred it was done a month ago and I'm hopeful it will be done in the next number of days.

Reporter: Citing whatever legislation the federal government brings into parliament, you think that there were no threats and it was a fair discussion at the same time you're going to fight tooth and nail for your province. Are you going to appeal whatever decision they bring in?

Horgan: The Prime Minister made it abundantly clear that he has no intention of punishing British Columbians in any way at all. And I'm absolutely confident that that is the case. What the federal parliament does is up to the parliament. There are MPs from BC of all political parties, in fact, all political parties and they will debate that legislation as they should. My responsibility is to defend our coast, to defend the interests of British Columbians and I'm going to do that until I'm no longer the Premier.

Reporter: That doesn't sound like a yes.

Horgan: Federal legislation is the responsibility of the federal parliament. [sss, zpz, pjhh, empr, env, jtst]

John Horgan: So I want to speak to you today about our continued efforts to stand up for our interests in BC when it comes to our coast, our economy, and our environment. People of BC look to their government to make sure that a diluted bitumen spill will not adversely affect our economy, our environment, or our future. Recently we announced our intention to speak to BCers about what safeguards should be in place to protect our environment, our economy, and our coast. George can speak to the details of that but we intended to

include in that discussion spill response times, geographic response plans, the loss of public and cultural land use, as well as the application of regulations on marine spills, and we will be moving forward with those consultations in the days ahead. An intentions paper will be ready by the end of the month, as we said at the beginning of the month.

Today I want to address the fifth area of consultation. That's regarding the restriction of additional bitumen flows pending further scientific study and our ability to respond to those spills. This point has generated disproportionate and unlawful reactions from the government of Alberta. Actions that threaten an entire industry and the livelihoods of the people who depend on it. We will be taking steps to protect our wine industry through the Canadian Free Trade Agreement and I understand that the wine institute is also seeking injunctions to protect our interests in that market. We believe it is our right to take appropriate measures to protect the interests of BC from the drastic consequences of a diluted bitumen spill, and we're prepared to confirm that right in the courts.

So today I'm announcing that we're preparing a reference to the constitutional questions at play here to the courts and that we will retain expert legal counsel to guide us in this regard. The outcome of that reference will also be used to inform any next steps BC intends to use to defend our interests. This is not about politics, it's not about trade. It's about the right of BCers to be heard, it's about the right of BCers to have a government that will stand up for its interests. BC expects nothing less than having a government that will defend us against adverse consequences to our people, our province, and our future.

Reporter: Why this move now? Obviously it looks like it's a backdown in response to the economic measures that Alberta has imposed on British Columbia. Is that what this is?

Horgan: No, not at all, Gary. This is intended to have cooler heads prevail. We believe that the rule of law is important in this country. We believe the rule of law is paramount to the people of British Columbia. We have had other jurisdictions question our authority in this area. We've tried to work with the federal government to do a joint reference. They're not interested in that, so we're going it alone.

Reporter: [Inaudible].

Horgan: We'll take advice from our expert legal counsel on that question in the days ahead.

Reporter: Is it going to be as simple as: do you have the authority over the bitumen that flows through pipelines [inaudible] BC?

Horgan: We're going to take advice from our legal counsel on the frame and the courts which will take that question.

Reporter: Premier, does that mean that point 5 is put back on the shelf until the court case is sorted out? You're not saying you will regulate increased flow of bitumen through the province pending a scientific review?

Horgan: I welcome detailed questions, two detailed questions on the substance of the reference, but we're going to leave that up to legal counsel to advise us on the best course of action. What we're announcing today is that we're going to proceed with the four points that were not contentious.

George, we can talk about that.

And on the fifth question, where jurisdiction has been drawn into doubt by a province and the federal government, we asked to work together on that. We didn't get a positive response, so we're going to take the action that we believe we need to protect the interests of British Columbia and defend our coast.

Reporter: But point 5 is on hold until the court case is sorted out?

Horgan: Point 5 is at play, and we're taking legal advice on how to proceed from there.

Reporter: Point 5 is basically [inaudible] regulatory restrictions on bitumen while your scientific panel studies bitumen. When do you envision that restriction happening, or does it now depend on the courts?

Horgan: Our intention today is to proceed with the consultation that Minister Heyman announced on January 30. The contentious point that has drawn the ire of the province of Alberta and some consternation from the federal government will be put to the courts.

We want to make sure that British Columbians have a government that's focused on the things that matter to them. We tabled a budget this week that answers many of the questions they have had about where we need to go as a province to address affordability, to deal with the housing crisis and to ensure that there are child care opportunities for families and a whole range of other issues. That's our preoccupation.

To have the government of Alberta using these issues as tactics is not of any interest to me. I believe in the rule of law. I believe we have the jurisdiction to proceed in all five areas, and we're going to test that fifth area. Again, I expect there will be others that will enjoin that effort, but that's entirely up to them.

Reporter: What if the court says you can't do it?

Horgan: Well, we'll wait to hear from the courts. That's what the rule of law is supposed to be all about. We have one province and the federal government making suggestions that they know best. We have seen numerous precedents that suggest that we're in the right, and that's why we're going this route.

Reporter: Did I hear you correctly saying that you've [inaudible] Ottawa's sort of joint partnership in [inaudible] this case?

Horgan: We made overtures to the federal government. They were disinclined to join us.

Reporter: Is there any reason they decided not to?

Horgan: You'll have to ask them.

Reporter: I just want to be absolutely clear on Vaughn's question. You said the regulation is now, in your words, in play. [Inaudible].

Horgan: We are proceeding with the four points that are not contentious, and the fifth point has been passed to legal counsel, and we'll take advice on how we will proceed in the days ahead.

Reporter: Is there any timeline for how long you think this is going to take to reach the courts, frame your question? Are we talking a year or.?

Horgan: No. Well, on framing the question, certainly not. Again, the courts.. In deference to the courts, I don't want to predict how they will proceed. We will be framing the question and proceeding to court in short order.

That's when I think, Vaughn, directly to your question.. I don't want to hamper legal counsel by making determinations on where to proceed from here. What we're doing today is proceeding.. Minister Heyman will be proceeding with the intentions paper on points 1 through 4, and on point 5, we're handing that over to our legal team, and we're proceeding to court.

Reporter: Would you hope that this will be enough of a measure for Alberta to drop its boycott on BC wine?

Horgan: I am absolutely hopeful that we can get back to a place where British Columbians and Albertans can share our common heritage, which is our coast and which is our mountains and our streams. Although I am not a fan of the Oilers or the Eskimos, I am a Lions and Canucks fan, there are commonalities between our two provinces, and I would think all of us would want to get back to a place where we can enjoy the absolute privilege of being Canadians and making sure that we all benefit from the distinctiveness of our individual provinces. That is my objective. That's been my objective from the beginning.

I believe that the federal government and the government of Alberta do not understand the depth of feeling that the transport of diluted bitumen has in British Columbia. I have been quite clear about that. It's not about me, it's not

about Rachel Notley, it's not about Justin Trudeau, it's about the people of British Columbia, and as the leader of the government, I want to make sure I'm representing their interests. [sss, empr, env, agg, mjag, jtst, pjjh, tmp]

This morning the Province will introduce legislation to provide for legal, controlled access to non-medical cannabis in British Columbia:

- The *Cannabis Distribution Act* (CDA) will establish the Province's exclusive jurisdiction over wholesale distribution of cannabis and provide authority for public retail sales.
- The *Cannabis Control and Licensing Act* (CCLA) will establish provincial control over the sale, supply and possession of non-medical cannabis and establishes licensing of private cannabis retailers.
- Amendments to the *Motor Vehicle Act* (MVA) will address drug-affected driving in British Columbia.

Please find attached copy of the news release and backgrounder, which provides more detailed information. The news release will be made public when the legislation is introduced in the House, which was anticipated to occur at approximately 10:00 a.m. this morning.

Cannabis legalization represents a significant change in public policy and there is still much work to be done on this priority file. Thank you for your ongoing commitment to this work.

Subject: pls tell Interior folks of pipeline dangers

Hon. John and Hon. Andrew, greetings from Fairfield, Victoria.

You've no doubt heard of some shifting in British Columbians' general attitude toward the proposed Trans Mountain pipeline. Media have reported that B.C.ers feel more supportive of Kinder Morgan's pipeline than some months ago. This quite concerns many of us. It suggests that your basic job of educating B.C.ers about pipeline dangers is not being done well — especially communicating with people in the Interior.

A bitumen spill into a watershed, especially near a river or lake, invariably has catastrophic effects. The Husky crude spill in Saskatchewan took over a year to clean up. It cost the company \$107 million, and they now face ten charges under that province's legislation. The Enbridge bitumen spill into the Kalamazoo River in 2010 closed off 35 miles of the river, and some sections are still restricted. Cleanup costs now exceed \$1.21 billion (US). Meanwhile, Trans Mountain has already reported "approximately" 82 land-based spills to Canada's National Energy Board since 1961.

The Trans Mountain proposed route enters B.C. at Hargreaves and would run through Rearguard, Albreda, Chappel, Blue River, Finn, McMurphy, Blackpool, Darfield, Black Pines, Kamloops, Stump, Kingsvale, Hope and Wahleach. Then it would reach the terminals at Sumas and Westridge in Burnaby.

Every person along that route should know about the dangers of a bitumen spill — but it seems they don't. Yes, minimal public communications have been made about a possible water-based spill at the terminals, along the tanker route from Burnaby past the Second Narrows Bridge and Stanley Park, and in the Georgia and Juan de Fuca Straits. But potential land-based spills have drawn very little ink or air-time.

Please ensure that B.C.'s public — indeed, Canada's public — better understand the harm that a bitumen spill can have, especially near or into our waterways. It hurts just to imagine a bitumen spill into Kamloops Lake or the Thompson or Fraser Rivers, for example. Bye-bye salmon, bye-bye drinking water. We need to hear much more honest and fair communications about these real dangers to British Columbians.
