#### B.C. files NEB argument on Trans Mountain expansion project

- A diluted bitumen spill would present a threat to our coast and the tens of thousands of jobs that rely
  on the coast. We are committed to fully defending the interests of British Columbians and protecting
  our environment, our economy and our coast.
- The Government of British Columbia has filed its final argument to ensure the interests of British Columbians are represented in the National Energy Board's (NEB) reconsideration of the Trans Mountain Pipeline Expansion Project

#### New service transforms how business, government share information

- Small businesses, companies, and entrepreneurs play a big role in strengthening our economy and
  creating good jobs for people in their communities. We are helping our job creators spend less time on
  paperwork and more time growing their companies.
- The Province launched OrgBook BC, a new service that will make it easier for companies to quickly and securely share verifiable business information online. OrgBook BC will allow businesses to digitally share trusted information with other levels of government, suppliers, banks and other partners, significantly reducing time and energy for entrepreneurs.
- "OrgBook BC has unlimited potential to improve the way companies interact with the Province, whether they are a small, family-owned business or a large credit union," said Jinny Sims, Minister of Citizens' Services.

#### Work starts on new emergency department at Eagle Ridge Hospital

- For too long, overcrowding and lack of beds has been an issue in Eagle Ridge Hospital's emergency department. The NDP government is making emergency care in the region a priority so that people in the community can access quality care when they need it.
- The Province is investing \$22.6 million through the regional health authority in the emergency department expansion. The expansion will more than double the number of patient treatment spaces in the emergency department from 19 to 39. Construction is expected to be complete in late 2020.
- "Our government is making the investment for an expanded emergency department at Eagle Ridge
  Hospital that will meet the needs of the growing Tri-Cities population," said Adrian Dix, Minister of
  Health.

#### Improving residential care in Burnaby

 After years of neglect, our government is taking the action needed to better support care homes and ensure seniors get the highest quality care.

- The province is investing over \$4 million to increase staffing levels and ensure that seniors in Burnaby get the care they need in residential care homes. Approximately 556,000 more direct-care hours are to be provided in Fraser Health homes this fiscal year alone.
- "Throughout the province, residential care homes have been waiting a long time for the help that they
  need to improve care for people. More direct care hours mean seniors will receive more day-to-day
  care and staff will have the support they need," said Adrian Dix, Minister of Health.

#### More housing will meet urgent need in Kelowna

- For years, the BC Liberals refused to take action on affordability, housing and poverty. Our government
  is taking bold steps to address homelessness across our province, including investing in supportive
  housing units.
- Earlier today, the Province and the City of Kelowna celebrated the opening of the Heath House; a building with 40 newly renovated homes that provide around-the-clock services for residents. The Province provided approximately \$7.35 million to purchase and renovate the building.
- "With the opening of this building, we've now built 86 homes with supports to help people
  experiencing homelessness in Kelowna, with a further 100 underway," said Selina Robinson, Minister
  of Municipal Affairs and Housing.

#### Dirty money tip portal extended, includes co-operation with Crime Stoppers

- British Columbians now have additional time to provide input into a fact-finding review of potential money laundering.
- The deadline to share information through a secure and anonymous online tip portal has been extended from Jan. 31 until Feb. 28, 2019.
- People with information about money laundering can also contact Crime Stoppers, which will forward relevant tips to German or the appropriate authorities, without identifying the source.

- "Through the forest policy reforms I'm announcing today, we will see more logs and fibre processed in B.C., supporting B.C. workers, their families and communities," said Premier John Horgan.

### 150+ additional seniors care beds coming to the Comox Valley

- On Wednesday, Minister Dix announced that a new long-term care facility will be built in Courtenay.
   The facility will have 126 publicly funded beds, including 120 residential care beds, two new hospice beds, and four already publicly funded hospice beds that will move to the new facility from The Views residential care home in Comox.
- In addition, the Providence Residential and Community Care Society is taking ownership of The Views and is working with Island Health on a proposed redevelopment that would add up to 31 new permanent care beds.
- "With the construction of a new care home and creation of campus of care, the local health-care
  system will be able to provide care that is flexible and responsive for those living with dementia and
  complex health issues, including options for a range of end-of-life care and services," said Adrian Dix,
  Minister of Health.

#### Improving residential care in the Fraser Valley

- After years of neglect, our government is taking the action needed to better support care homes and ensure seniors get the highest quality care.
- The province is investing over \$4 million to increase staffing levels and ensure that seniors in the Fraser Valley get the care they need in residential care homes. Approximately 100,000 more directcare hours are to be provided in Abbotsford, Agassiz and Chilliwack residential care homes this fiscal year.
- "For more than 10 years, the goal of improving care in residential care homes had not been achieved.
   Under the plan that Premier John Horgan announced in 2018, our government is taking clear actions to meet the target of 3.36 care hours per-resident day, on average, by health authority," said Adrian Dix, Minister of Health.

#### Coastal communities buoyed by new VIU fish-health lab

- Many communities on Vancouver Island depend on healthy fish stocks for their economic, social and cultural well-being. Our government is investing in fish and shellfish research to protect B.C's fish stock and coastal ecosystem.
- The new provincially funded Innovation Centre in Fish Health at Vancouver Island University will allow researchers to study the impacts of climate change on fish and shellfish populations in the province's coastal waters. The province provided \$215,000 towards the new laboratory.
- "For too long, the necessary investments and protections required to ensure the long-term viability of
  this precious resource have been neglected. The new Centre for Innovation in Fish Health at VIU is
  going to help make sure our fisheries are viable and prosperous for generations to come," said
  Melanie Mark, Minister of Advanced Education, Skills and Training.

# Province partners with Nicola bands to improve on-reserve affordable housing

- Our government is committed to working with Indigenous peoples to build and improve housing that will help grow healthy communities, families and people.
- On Tuesday, BC Housing and five Nicola bands signed a three-year partnership agreement to improve
  the quality of on-reserve housing in the Nicola Valley near Merritt. BC Housing will provide training
  opportunities for community members and help them move forward on a path to housing selfsufficiency. The five Nicola bands have also committed to work together to maintain housing that
  meets or exceeds industry standards, and secure third party capital funding for new on-reserve
  housing.
- "This partnership agreement will lead to knowledge sharing and action on best practices to make homes and housing on reserve better for all members of the Nicola Bands in the Merritt area," said Spencer Chandra Herbert, MLA for Vancouver-West End.

# **New HR Investigations & Discipline Course**

As a supervisor or manager you play an important part of our ongoing efforts to strengthen a culture of ethics and integrity in the BC Public Service. To further support you in that role, we are introducing a new training course intended to help you respond effectively to allegations of workplace misconduct and understand the steps involved in disciplinary decision-making.

As a supervisor or manager, there may come a time in your public service career when you receive an allegation of misconduct against an employee and you need to determine whether they engaged in misconduct. In such instances, it's very important that you understand your role, your ministry's role and the role of the BC Public Service Agency.

#### Why is this important?

It is essential that representatives of the employer respond promptly and appropriately to allegations of misconduct. This will ensure an employee's rights are protected and they are treated fairly throughout the investigation and decision-making processes.

# What's happening?

A new learning course – <u>HR Investigations & Discipline</u> – is now available for all supervisors and managers to help you better understand the investigation and discipline processes. The course is available online through the Learning Centre and takes approximately 30-60 minutes to complete.

The new course provides clarity on roles and responsibilities, the investigation process and the steps taken during the disciplinary decision-making phase that follows the completion of an investigation.

#### More information

There is also a wealth of information on MyHR on this topic. To learn more about the steps to follow when you receive allegations of misconduct, including the process for conducting human resource investigations, and disciplinary decision-making, visit the MyHR website. Please also contact MyHR if you have questions about the course or related information.

#### Highlights of the Labour Market Performance Report (December 2018)

#### December 2018 review

- Year-over-year to December 2018, BC employment gained by 44,000 (or +1.8%) to 2.535 million. There were strong employment gains in the second half of the year.
- After two consecutive months of losses in full-time work, full-time employment increased by 22,700 in December, mostly among the core working age of 25 to 54 years.
- Over the year, employment was up for both the core working-age and the people aged 55 years and over, but
  employment fell among the young people aged 15 to 24 years. Older workers and men of core-age gained
  mostly in full-time work, while women of core working-age gained mostly in part-time work.
- After two consecutive years of strong employment growth (3.2% in 2016 and 3.7% in 2017), average annual employment increased by 1.1% in 2018. Growth was held back because of limited labour supply growth of 0.6%. Labour demand was still strong in 2018, as demonstrated by a decrease in the number of unemployed (-8.2%) and rising vacancies (up 23% year-over-year in Q2 2018). In December the unemployment rate held steady at 4.4%, the lowest in Canada for the 16th month in a row.

#### Sector

Month-over-month

• From November to December, the **services sector** was little changed. Professional, scientific and technical services increased remarkably this month (+9,100 or +4.3%), but the gains were offset by the employment losses in health sector, and wholesale and retail trade. The **goods sector** made gains in construction (+5,500 or +2.3%), and forestry, fishing, mining, quarrying, oil and gas (+1,500, or +3.1%)

YTD basis

- The three major sectoral contributors are health care and social assistance (+20,400), construction (+10,300), and professional, scientific and technical services (+11,000).
- The four major job sectors in decline over the year were: information, culture and recreation (-9,100), finance sector (-5,500), and wholesale and retail trade (-4,300), and transportation and warehousing (-3,900).



Here are a few notable things our government announced this week:

# Under John Horgan and the NDP, BC has the strongest economy in Canada

- New job numbers released on Monday show that 18 months after John Horgan was sworn in, BC's economy is leading the country:
  - Jobs: 43,700 new jobs in the past year, the vast majority full time.
  - o GDP: 2.4% growth expected for 2019 leading growth projection in Canada.
  - O Unemployment: 4.4% the lowest in Canada for the 16th month in a row.
  - Wage growth: wages continue to grow for BC workers.
  - Investing in people: BC's debt-to-GDP ratio is at its lowest point since 2008, while the BC NDP government continues to make record-level capital investments in affordable housing, schools and hospitals.

### Lower income families benefiting from Fair PharmaCare investment

- Many families in BC struggle to afford prescriptions because of costly deductibles. The BC NDP is taking action to make our healthcare system work for all British Columbians.
- As of January 1<sup>st</sup>, our government has eliminated Fair Pharmacare deductibles for households earning less than \$30,000 and reduced deductibles for households earning less than \$45,000.
- "These are the first ever changes to Fair PharmaCare deductibles and co-payments since the program was created 15 years ago a long overdue step forward in improving the health and lives of thousands of British Columbians," said Adrian Dix, Minister of Health.

#### Improving residential care in Delta, Langley and Surrey

- Our government is delivering on our commitment to improve seniors' care and have increased staffing for seniors' care in the Lower Mainland.
- Seniors in Delta, Langley and Surrey are now benefiting from more than \$12.8 million in 2018-19 funding to increase staffing levels and ensure that seniors get the care they need in residential care homes.
- "This standard of care for long-term care residents was set over a decade ago and was not being achieved. Under the plan that Premier John Horgan announced earlier this year, we are taking clear action towards meeting the target of 3.36 care hours per-resident day," said Adrian Dix, Minister of Health.

#### Province launches southern Vancouver Island transportation strategy

 Southern Vancouver Island is one of the fastest-growing regions in the province, yet the infrastructure needs of its communities have long been ignored. Yesterday, the Ministry of Transportation unveiled a new transportation strategy to improve traffic flow on southern Vancouver Island.

- The strategy will explore all modes of transportation, including cycling, ferry, and rail, and will consider projects from Duncan to Sooke. As part of this work, the ministry is also exploring emergency detour routes that could be activated in the event of a Malahat road closure.
- "It is time we start investing in long-term, innovative, multi-modal solutions to address congestion, while respecting and honouring the wishes and rights of local First Nations," said Claire Trevena, Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure.

#### All 12 community transportation services running along Highway 16

- For over a decade, the BC Liberals refused to develop safe transportation options along Highway 16, also known as the "Highway of Tears". Our government has made addressing the transportation needs of rural communities a priority, and because of our actions First Nation communities and women have access to safe and reliable transportation options along Highway 16.
- All 12 community transportation services are now operating successfully in northern B.C. communities
  along the Highway 16 corridor. These services are helping thousands of people who live in small,
  remote and Indigenous communities travel safely around their communities and to neighbouring
  communities.
- "I am very happy to see that all of the community vehicles are now providing this vital transportation connection for remote and Indigenous communities in the North. This is a service these communities fought hard for, and now we can see the positive results," said Claire Trevena, Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure.

# UVic researchers, students ride waves of success with new science facility

- The Province marked the opening of UVic's new \$9.5 million Ocean-Climate Building. This new 30,000 sq. ft. facility is home to over 300 scientists conducting vital research to fight and adapt to climate change, and to protect our oceans.
- \$3.5 million in funding was provided by the Government of Canada's Post-Secondary Institutions Strategic Investment Fund and \$850,000 was provided by the Province. The remaining \$5.15 million was provided by the University of Victoria.
- "The new Ocean-Climate Building is preparing for 21st-century careers in a diverse, strong, sustainable 21st-century economy. By working together, students, researchers and businesses, along with Indigenous nations play a vital role in protecting our environment," said Melanie Mark, Minister of Advanced Education, Skills and Training.

#### New skills training, employment supports for survivors of violence and older workers

- Survivors of violence and abuse, as well as older workers, will have access to skills training and employment supports so they can participate in British Columbia's thriving economy, thanks to two new Skills Training for Employment Programs.
- The \$3.2-million Survivors of Violence and Abuse program will provide supports to over 300 people per year, while the \$3.2-million Older Workers 55+ program will help 400 people update their skills.
- "Survivors of violence and abuse, and older workers, face multiple barriers to finding steady, good-paying jobs. I'm proud that our government is expanding programs that help break down those barriers," said Melanie Mark, Minister of Advanced Education, Skills and Training.
