Recommendation

Young parents who do not have access to a Young Parent Program in their community may still benefit from several affordability measures under *Childcare BC*. The fee reduction initiative, launched in April 2018, is providing savings of up to \$350 for parents who have

children in approved licensed child-care providers. In addition, if their family income is less than \$45,000, young parents may be eligible for the Child Care Subsidy. In September, this will be replaced by the Affordable Child Care Benefit, which will deliver increased financial supports to more families.

Young Parent Programs are usually offered by the school district, through child care facilities located on, or near secondary schools that the parents attend. To become a designated YPP facility, providers must:

- Provide a copy of their licence, identifying that they provide child care for infants and toddlers (up to age three)
- Be located in close proximity to a secondary school facility
- And confirm that they provide a parent education program
