Caregivers for B.C.'s most vulnerable get first pay increase in a decade

VICTORIA - Foster parents, adoptive caregivers, extended family members caring for children and Community Living BC (CLBC) home-share providers will each receive a boost in support payments -- the first increase in 10 years -- to make life more affordable and provide more support to some of B.C.'s most-vulnerable children and adults.

"Caregivers open their homes and hearts to children and adults who need their support," said Premier John Horgan. "For 10 years, the cost of living has steadily increased while caregiver rates have stagnated. Our government is making different choices by increasing support rates for caregivers, to make life more affordable and build stronger, more inclusive communities."

Budget 2019 provides approximately \$64 million over three years to the Ministry of Children and Family Development and \$45 million over three years to the Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction to boost monthly caregiver rates.

"I have met with so many foster parents and family caregivers, especially grandmothers, who have been struggling to provide for the children in their care. Their stories resonated with me and I knew this was the right thing to do," said Katrine Conroy, Minister of Children and Family Development. "The most important thing is that children are raised in a safe, loving home, and I am proud to be part of a government that is addressing a long-standing inequity for extended families, especially Indigenous families, and investing in the well-being of all children when they need it most."

For family members caring for children through the Extended Family Program, support will nearly double and will be paid at the same rate as foster caregivers. This increase is part of government's commitment to meaningful reconciliation with Indigenous peoples and addresses recommendations by Grand Chief Ed John.

"I am pleased the B.C. government is taking steps to address this key recommendation of my report, which identified the disparity between the caregiver rates and extended family rates as being a clear barrier to permanency for many children in care," said Grand Chief Ed John. "Bringing these rates in line will undoubtedly lead to both an increase of permanent placements as well as an increased quality of care for children placed with extended family members. This is especially important for Indigenous children in care as it will result in greater opportunities for placements with extended family within their communities, thereby maintaining access to their culture and language."

Budget 2019 will provide foster parents with an additional \$179 each month to help cover basic necessities for children in their care, including food, shelter and clothing.

Eligible adoptive parents, many of them adding children with special needs and/or sibling groups to their families, will receive an additional \$105 to \$120 per month for post-adoption assistance to help meet increases in the costs of living.

"This announcement is a wonderful acknowledgement of the work that foster parents and other caregivers do to emotionally and financially support children and youth in B.C.," said Russell Pohl, a long-time foster and adoptive parent. "It's good to know that this government is looking out for us and valuing our contribution."

Community Living BC home-share provider rates are based on the individual needs of the person in care. The \$45 million in funding over three years is a 15% increase for the program. After 10 years without an increase in home-share provider funding, CLBC is updating the program rate structure to better align with the disability-related needs of each individual.

"Home-share promotes social inclusion and helps keep people with developmental disabilities connected to their communities," said Shane Simpson, Minister of Social Development and Poverty Reduction. "Over the last year, we have engaged with individuals with developmental disabilities and their families to look closely at CLBC supports and plot a new vision for the next 10 years. This increase recognizes the important work of home-share providers. It is long overdue, well deserved and one more step in the the work we are doing with the community to create a truly accessible and inclusive province."

CLBC will be working with home-share providers over the next few weeks to work through the details. The rate increases will vary under the new rate structure, but all home share providers will receive an increase over the next two years.

In 2018, CLBC engaged with home-share providers to find out how government can better support them in their vital work. The primary concern reported was low rates, which had not kept up with rising household costs and

growing demand for the program.

Rate increases for Ministry of Children and Family Development caregivers will come into effect April 1, 2019.

Caregiver rate increases

Caregivers caring for children and youth

- * Budget 2019 contains more than \$64 million in funding over three years for the Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD) to increase pay rates for:
- * foster caregivers;
- * caregivers of the Extended Family Program;
- * transfer of guardianship/custody caregivers; and
- * adoptive families who are eligible to receive post-adoption assistance.
- * The monthly rate paid to caregivers, the maintenance rate, has not increased since 2009, while inflation has risen approximately 15% between 2009 and 2018.
- * Maintenance rates are only one part of the financial model supporting the Province's overall system of care for children and youth who are unable to live with their families either permanently or temporarily.
- * Grand Chief Ed John's 2016 report, Indigenous Resilience, Connectedness, and Reunification From Root Causes to Root Solutions, called for changes to the financial model supporting the Province's system of care to address a lack of resources for care providers, particularly within Indigenous communities.
- * While MCFD is providing greater supports to keep families together when it is safe to do so, resulting in fewer children coming into care in the first place, there is still a need for skilled caregivers to care for children who cannot safely live with their parents. Static basic monthly payment rates have impacted the ministry's ability to recruit and retain caregivers at a time when costs of living continue to rise and long-term caregivers are aging and retiring.
- * The Budget 2019 rate increases are a result of an ongoing review of the sytem of care by MCFD.

Community Living Home Share Providers

* Budget 2019 contains \$45 million in funding over three years for CLBC Home Share Providers, a 15% increase in

funding for the program.

- * The raise is the first home-share providers have received since 2009.
- * Home sharing is a residential service option through Community Living B.C. (CLBC), under the Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction, in which an adult with a developmental disability shares a home with someone who is contracted to provide ongoing support to promote independence and inclusion.
- * In 2018, Shane Simpson, Minister of Social Development and Poverty Reduction, directed CLBC to engage with home-share providers to identify needs and provide recommendations. Rates were the top concern highlighted in the final report: https://www.communitylivingbc.ca/wp-content/uploads/HSP-Engagement-Report-Final.pdf
- * More than 4,000 individuals with developmental disabilities in B.C. live with home-share providers.
- * Individuals with disabilities choose the home-share provider that best meets their goals and preferences. Support is flexible and evolves with the changing needs of the individual.
- * Home sharing now accounts for 61% of all residential settings for people with disabilities, compared to 51% in 2010.
- * Home-share providers' in-home support is integral to an inclusive province that supports the participation of people with disabilities in their community.

ERASE expands to protect students from bullying

VICTORIA - Government leaders joined together with students and education advocates to introduce new online safety sessions to help support and protect students against cyberbullying.

"We all have a responsibility to combat bullying, whether it's online, in our homes, workplaces or schools," said Premier John Horgan. "We need to support those being bullied and show them they're not alone, and that we will stand up with them. I'm so proud to see all the students here today taking a stand against bullying."

The Ministry of Education is investing \$160,000 to provide over 190 online safety sessions to more than 19,000 students in grades 3-12 throughout the province. The sessions will provide students with information on recognizing the importance of a positive digital reputation, protecting their privacy online and details on how to use the ERASE (Expect Respect and a Safe Education) anonymous-reporting tool in response to bullying and other concerns.

Premier Horgan and Rob Fleming, Minister of Education, hosted B.C.'s 12th-annual Pink Shirt Day event at the Parliament Buildings to proclaim Bullying Awareness Day. They were joined by local students, MLAs and Carol Todd, parent and founder of the Amanda Todd Legacy Society. The event included a spoken word presentation from

a Reynolds Secondary school student, a dance performance from Northridge Elementary school students and a choir performance by Central Middle school students.

"Bullying knows no boundaries - the technology our kids are using today has presented challenges that we could not have imagined years ago. The expansion of ERASE will provide our students with additional tools to help combat against bullying," said Fleming. "If we all stand together and say no to bullying, we can make a major difference in our schools and communities."

The new sessions are part of the ERASE strategy, which is being expanded this school year to be a more comprehensive resource to better represent the issues facing youth and their communities today. ERASE will now also focus on social media and online safety, mental health and wellness, substance use, gang prevention and supporting students of all sexual orientations and gender identities (SOGI). New ERASE resources and training for students, parents, educators and community partners are being launched during the current school year.

Since the 2018 Pink Shirt Day event, the ministry has made strides to combat bullying. A new ERASE website was launched in November 2018, as well as an updated online safety reporting tool, offering students an opportunity to notify an adult member of their school community about something that is worrying them.

The ministry also provided \$100,000 to the B.C. School Superintendents' Association to offer 80 social media education sessions to more than 3,500 parents in every school district, providing them with the tools they need to support their children and protect them against cyberbullying. The parent guide from the sessions is currently posted on the ERASE website and additional online resources for parents who were not able to attend the in-person sessions will be launched in fall 2019.

Last year, the ministry, along with the B.C. Confederation of Parent Advisory Councils and the ARC Foundation (Awareness/Respect/Capacity), developed a new set of SOGI resources for parents, including a brochure and online videos found on the SOGI 123 website: https://bc.sogieducation.org

Those in attendance at the Pink Shirt Day event in Victoria were encouraged to speak out against negative online posts, post Pink Shirt Day event photos and spread positivity, using the hashtags #ERASE and #PinkShirtDay.

- * ERASE, launched by the Ministry of Education in 2012, is a comprehensive prevention and intervention strategy designed to foster school connectedness, address bullying, prevent violence, and provide support to school districts during critical incidents.
- * ERASE has received national and international recognition for its work in keeping students safer.
- * Pink Shirt Day started in 2007 with two Nova Scotia high school students, Travis Price and David Shepherd. The students organized a protest at their high school, which involved participants wearing pink t-shirts in support of a Grade 9 boy who had been bullied for wearing a pink shirt. The protest was successful, and the student was not bullied again.
- * 19% of Canadian children have experienced cyberbullying or cyberstalking.
- * Research suggests vulnerable youth are at a greater risk of mental-health challenges and may be more susceptible to bullying and cyberbullying behaviour.

SEATTLE, WASH. - As part of ongoing work to improve connectivity and strengthen ties between British Columbia and Washington state, B.C. Premier John Horgan has joined Washington Gov. Jay Inslee to announce that B.C. will help fund the next proposed phase of a study of a potential ultra-high-speed corridor service linking British Columbia, Washington state and Oregon.

"Gov. Inslee and I recognize the enormous potential for growth in our region to deliver strong, sustainable economic development, create good jobs and a better future for people on both sides of the border," said Premier Horgan. "Improving transportation connectivity is a critically important part of the path forward, and we're going to keep working together to seize opportunities and strengthen the relationship between Washington state and B.C."

The two leaders have been working jointly to grow the region's innovation and tech economy, combat climate change, protect the environment, promote trade and improve transportation connectivity. Collaboration on the corridor study is another step toward realizing these shared goals.

"I want to thank Premier Horgan for his generous contributions to the ultra-high-speed corridor project," said Gov. Inslee. "Our Cascadia region has the critical mass of a growing population, the muscle mass of a strong economy and the traffic problems to justify ultra-high-speed connections, and this investment will help move the project to the next level."

In March 2018, B.C. contributed \$300,000 for a business case analysis to explore ridership levels, project delivery methods, cost and financing. The full results of this analysis are expected in summer 2019.

B.C. has announced the contribution of an additional \$300,000 for the proposed next phase of the project that will explore models for a multi-jurisdictional authority to lead a community engagement process and preliminary environmental review.

On Dec. 10, 2018, Gov. Inslee announced that he is including USD\$3.25 million in his budget for the development of a new ultra-high-speed corridor authority for Washington, British Columbia and Oregon. It's part of his broader clean energy strategy, which advances electric transportation and helps achieve Washington state's climate action goals.

Premier Horgan is in Washington state on Feb. 7-8, 2019. The two-day trip with Gov. Inslee includes speaking engagements and meetings with government and business leaders in Seattle and Olympia, including Microsoft and the Seattle Chamber of Commerce. Premier Horgan will give a formal address to the Washington state legislature on Friday, Feb. 8.

Quick Facts:

- * On Oct. 10, 2018, Premier Horgan and Gov. Inslee signed a memorandum of understanding to act jointly to grow the region's innovation economy, protect the environment and combat climate change, promote trade and improve transportation connectivity.
- * Funding partners have contributed a total of USD\$1.5 million toward the current study [Washington state (\$750,000), British Columbia (CDN \$300,000), Oregon (\$200,000) and Microsoft (\$300,000)].
- * Washington state released an economic analysis in 2018 that estimated a high-speed corridor link could create up to 200,000 jobs for people in B.C. and the U.S. and generate billions of dollars in economic benefits for the Cascadia corridor between B.C., Washington and Oregon. The analysis also estimated that within a few years of operation, ridership could reach 1.8 million annually.
- * A high-speed transportation corridor could reduce the travel time between Vancouver, B.C. and Seattle to about one hour from three hours. High-speed trains travel up to 400 kilometres per hour.
- * Total Canada-Washington goods trade is valued at approximately \$26.4 billion.

TERRACE - Government is investing in success for northwest communities by addressing long-standing infrastructure needs that are holding back the region.

A \$100-million Northern Capital and Planning Grant will go to four regional districts (Fraser Fort George, Bulkley Nechako, Kitimat Stikine and North Coast) and their 22 municipalities.

"The rich resources and hard-working people of the Northwest have long contributed more than their fair share to the prosperity of our province," said Premier John Horgan. "Unfortunately the benefits of success have been slow to flow back to the region, leaving communities with aging infrastructure that does not meet their needs or the needs of industry."

"We're reversing this legacy of neglect with a new Northern Capital and Planning Grant that will help people and communities make the most of new opportunities, so that the benefits of resource development are felt for years to come," Premier Horgan said.

This grant fulfils Premier Horgan's commitment to northwest mayors to make sure local workers and communities are able to reap the full benefits of resource development in their region.

"We've been hearing from local governments in northern B.C. about the challenges they face funding much-needed upgrades to their aging infrastructure, and how it makes it difficult for them to make the most of growth opportunities and holds them back from diversifying their economies," said Selina Robinson, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "We know this grant will not only help northern communities meet their infrastructure needs today, but it will also set them up to benefit from development opportunities in the future."

Small communities within the catchment area will receive a larger proportional share of the grant to compensate for their reduced commercial and industrial tax base.

Local governments may use the grant to meet an immediate infrastructure need for their community, save it for a future opportunity or leverage it to secure other sources of funding, including borrowing, reserves and other grant programs, to cover major infrastructure and long-term planning.

The grant was informed by recent discussions between the Province and the Northwest B.C. Resource Benefits Alliance. The Province consulted with the Union of British Columbia Municipalities, as a change to the Local Governments Grant Regulation is required before the Northern Capital and Planning Grant can be implemented.

OLYMPIA, WASH. - Washington Gov. Jay Inslee and B.C. Premier John Horgan have advanced work together to rise to the challenge of climate change while investing in a sustainable, low-carbon economy.

"We are honoured to have Premier Horgan visit Washington state. This meeting will build on the important work

we've done together over the past few years," Gov. Inslee said. "Washington and British Columbia share so much, from our natural beauty to our innovative economies. This visit is a great opportunity to for us to come together to advance substantive and concrete proposals to advance our common interests."

Gov. Inslee joined Premier Horgan as he signed on to the Statement on Stepping Up Climate Ambition. The states of Washington and California, the Government of Canada and other governments, as well as agencies from around the globe, have supported the statement, which emphasizes the need to increase ambition and strengthen efforts to tackle climate change.

"B.C. and Washington state are taking important steps forward together to fight climate change, grow the innovation economy and build a sustainable future," said Premier Horgan. "I'm very optimistic about what we can achieve to make life better for the people who live in the Pacific Northwest."

Both B.C. and Washington state introduced climate action plans in December 2018.

Gov. Inslee has proposed a plan to the state legislature that would accelerate innovation and efforts already underway across the economy to transition to 100% clean energy, construct ultra-efficient buildings, establish a clean fuel standard, electrify the state's transportation system and phase down super-pollutants in certain products.

The CleanBC climate action plan is designed to help B.C. reduce climate pollution while creating more jobs and economic opportunities for people, businesses and communities.

On Oct. 10, 2018, Premier Horgan and Gov. Inslee signed a memorandum of understanding to act jointly to grow the region's innovation economy, protect the environment and combat climate change, promote trade and improve transportation connectivity.

Premier Horgan and Gov. Inslee are also working with West Coast partners to create opportunity and grow prosperity in the region while fighting climate change through the Cascadia Innovation Corridor and the Pacific Coast Collaborative.

- * The U.S. Climate Alliance includes 20 governors, representing 47% of U.S. population, and is committed to taking action that urgently addresses the climate challenge.
- * CleanBC was launched by the B.C. government on Dec. 5, 2018. The plan is designed to help B.C. lower greenhouse gas emissions and seize new, clean-economy opportunities. - * The governments of British Columbia and Washington state are part of the Pacific Coast Collaborative with Oregon and California. Statement on reconciliation process between Province and Office of the Wet'suwet'en

VICTORIA - The Wet'suwet'en Hereditary Chiefs and Scott Fraser, Minister of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation have issued the following statement to mark the start of a new reconciliation process:

"The Office of the Wet'suwet'en and Province of British Columbia have agreed to explore a path forward together, government-to-government, that seeks to build trust over time and meaningfully advance reconciliation. This process has emerged from decades of denial of Wet'suwet'en rights and title. Both parties believe that the time has come to engage in meaningful nation-to-nation discussions with the goal of B.C. affirming Wet'suwet'en rights and title.

"The Office of the Wet'suwet'en and Province are undertaking a process focused on Wet'suwet'en title, rights, laws and traditional governance throughout the Wet'suwet'en Yintah, or territory.

"Our discussions will be guided by Wet'suwet'en law, the principles of the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action and Canadian jurisprudence, including the Supreme Court of Canada's Delgamuukw Gisday' Wa decision. We stress that our commitment to lasting reconciliation is not connected to any specific project. These discussions are not transactional, but a real commitment to reconciliation.

"To support this work, the Province has appointed Murray Rankin as B.C.'s representative to help guide and design the process between the Province and the Office of the Wet'suwet'en. Mr. Rankin, a lawyer and mediator, has an understanding of the Supreme Court's historic Delgamuukw Gisday' Wa decision and an abiding commitment to better understand the history and current reality of

the Wet'suwet'en people.

"As a key step in creating this new foundation for reconciliation, the Wet'suwet'en Hereditary Chiefs will host a bahtlats (potlatch or feast) in March 2019 to share information and initiate discussion with the Wet'suwet'en Clans and House groups. The goal is to involve all in this dialogue. The bahtlats is an established governance and decision-making process under Wet'suwet'en hereditary leadership protocols. This work builds on discussions that have been ongoing since the Premier and minister visited the territory last August. A public announcement will follow after the official commencement of our discussions.

"We all recognize that the path forward will involve challenges. It will take a willingness to innovate and take bold steps together. This engagement is a historic opportunity to advance Wet'suwet'en self-determination and self-governance, and for the Province and Wet'suwet'en Nation to establish a deeper relationship based on respect and recognition of rights."

"Today, we are safeguarding these life-saving services by taking action to build a brand new St. Paul's Hospital that will serve more people and offer better access to the specialized care people need."

Doors of the new \$1.9-billion St. Paul's are expected to open in 2026 and will be located at 1002 Station St.

"British Columbians have always expressed great confidence, and taken great comfort, in the care delivered by St. Paul's. After more than a decade and a half of stalling, it is exciting to give the green light to a new, state-of-the-art St. Paul's Hospital that will continue this legacy for many years to come," said Adrian Dix, Minister of Health. referral centres, including for heart and lung care, renal, eating disorders and specialty surgeries and transplants.

The hospital will also offer a diverse and long list of general and specialized care, including HIV/AIDS, chronic disease management services, emergency and critical care, mental health and addictions beds and programs, ambulatory services and outpatient clinics, end-of-life care, Indigenous health, maternity, colorectal and gastrointestinal services, and community care and community outreach programs.

Health-care workers, researchers and students will harness the medical tools of the future in the new hospital, with medical projects like immunotherapy, precision medicine, virtual reality, robotics and 3-D printing. The St. Paul's Foundation campaign fundraising goal for Providence Health Care is anticipated to be in the hundreds of millions of dollars with a portion allocated to the new core hospital. Jim Pattison, chairman and CEO of the Jim Pattison Group, has already donated \$75 million to the future of St. Paul's, a historic contribution in Canadian health-care philanthropy. The current St. Paul's Hospital land at 1081 Burrard Street will be sold with funds going toward the project.

STATEMENT

Statement on reconciliation process between Province and Office of the Wet'suwet'en

VICTORIA - The Wet'suwet'en Hereditary Chiefs and Scott Fraser, Minister of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation have issued the following statement to mark the start of a new reconciliation process:

"The Office of the Wet'suwet'en and Province of British Columbia have agreed to explore a path forward together, government-to-government, that seeks to build trust over time and meaningfully advance reconciliation. This process has emerged from decades of denial of Wet'suwet'en rights and title. Both parties believe that the time has come to engage in meaningful nation-to-nation discussions with the goal of B.C. affirming Wet'suwet'en rights and title.

"The Office of the Wet'suwet'en and Province are undertaking a process focused on Wet'suwet'en title, rights, laws and traditional governance throughout the Wet'suwet'en Yintah, or territory.

"Our discussions will be guided by Wet'suwet'en law, the principles of the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action and Canadian jurisprudence, including the Supreme Court of Canada's Delgamuukw Gisday' Wa decision. We stress that our commitment to lasting reconciliation is not connected to any specific project. These discussions are not transactional, but a real commitment to reconciliation.

"To support this work, the Province has appointed Murray Rankin as B.C.'s representative to help guide and design the process between the Province and the Office of the Wet'suwet'en. Mr. Rankin, a lawyer and mediator, has an understanding of the Supreme Court's historic Delgamuukw Gisday' Wa decision and an abiding commitment to better understand the history and current reality of the Wet'suwet'en people.

"As a key step in creating this new foundation for reconciliation, the Wet'suwet'en Hereditary Chiefs will host a bahtlats (potlatch or feast) in March 2019 to share information and initiate discussion with the Wet'suwet'en Clans and House groups. The goal is to involve all in this dialogue. The bahtlats is an established governance and decision-making process under Wet'suwet'en hereditary leadership protocols. This work builds on discussions that have been ongoing since the Premier and minister visited the territory last August. A public announcement will follow after the official commencement of our discussions.

"We all recognize that the path forward will involve challenges. It will take a willingness to innovate and take bold steps together. This engagement is a historic opportunity to advance Wet'suwet'en self-determination and self-governance, and for the Province and Wet'suwet'en Nation to establish a deeper relationship based on respect and recognition of rights."

New primary-care networks will deliver faster, better health care for you and your family

Good health is the foundation for a good life. But for too long, too many B.C. patients have been struggling to access the services they need. People can't find a family doctor, are waiting too long for surgeries and diagnostics, and worry about caring for their aging loved ones.

That's why our government launched primary-care networks in the Fraser northwest region to deliver team-based care that connects people to the health care they need faster and closer to home.

At the heart of the primary-care strategy is a new focus on team-based care to recruit more doctors, nurse practitioners and other health professionals, and put patients back at the centre of health-care delivery.

Over the next three years, across the four networks in the Fraser northwest region, up to 65 new health-care providers will be recruited. As part of our overarching primary care strategy, provincewide, we're recruiting 200 more family practice physicians, 200 nurse practitioners, and 50 clinical pharmacists.

Primary-care networks are part of our work to deliver faster, better health care for you and your family, in every part of the province.

It will take time and work to address the health-care challenges people are facing throughout the province, but we're taking action to fix problems and deliver the services people count on.

Budget 2019 invests more than \$1.3 billion in total health spending over three years, which means more doctors and nurses, and shorter wait times for you and your family.

Our surgical and diagnostics strategy, launched less than a year ago, has added 1,110 more MRI hours per week compared to August 2017, with 10 public MRIs now operating 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

From Terrace to Cowichan to Dawson Creek to Richmond, we are building, renovating, and expanding hospitals to meet health care needs today and for future generations. And after more than a decade and half, rebuilding St. Paul's, one of the most important hospitals in B.C., is moving forward.

Urgent Primary Care Centres have been opened in Surrey, Langford, Kamloops, Quesnel and Vancouver to help people who have conditions that are not lifethreatening, but need to be addressed within 12-24 hours.

Our government is boosting funding for BC Cancer, increasing the number of cancerrelated surgeries, diagnostic imaging, expanding PET and CT scans and increased chemotherapy demands. We're increasing supports for the BC Children's and Women's hospitals to provide services for women, children, newborns and families.

And through Fair PharmaCare we're making prescription drugs more affordable to people when they need them. More than 240,000 B.C. families' prescription medication became more affordable this January thanks to an investment of \$105 million in the Fair PharmaCare program.

In every community I visit, patients, doctors, nurses and other health-care professionals all say the same thing: Health care delivery must become more patient-centred. We're going to keep working hard to deliver better, faster health care that you and your family need.

VANCOUVER - Improved access to life-saving health care is on the way to downtown Vancouver with the approval of the business plan for a new St. Paul's Hospital.

"For over 125 years, people in Vancouver and across British Columbia have benefited from the health care provided by St. Paul's Hospital," said Premier John Horgan. "Today, we are safeguarding these life-saving services by taking action to build a brand new St. Paul's Hospital that will serve more people and offer better access to the specialized care people need."

Doors of the new \$1.9-billion St. Paul's are expected to open in 2026 and will be located at 1002 Station St.

"British Columbians have always expressed great confidence, and taken great comfort, in the care delivered by St. Paul's. After more than a decade and a half of stalling, it is exciting to give the green light to a new, state-of-the-art St. Paul's Hospital that will continue this legacy for many years to come," said Adrian Dix, Minister of Health. "Our government has made it a priority to see this project move forward, so that St. Paul's continues to serve people around the province now and in the future."

The new St. Paul's will continue to serve the people of Vancouver and all of B.C. as an internationally renowned, full-service, acute-care hospital and integrated health campus. It will have capacity for up to 548 beds, which includes 115 net new beds. The site will be the home of several leading provincial programs and referral centres, including for heart and lung care, renal, eating disorders and specialty surgeries and transplants.

The hospital will also offer a diverse and long list of general and specialized care, including HIV/AIDS, chronic disease management services, emergency and critical care, mental health and addictions beds and programs, ambulatory services and outpatient clinics, end-of-life care, Indigenous health, maternity, colorectal and gastrointestinal services, and community care and community outreach programs.
