Recommendation - on background from Ministry:

- The Ministry of Health is aware of instances of people attempting to obtain BC vaccine cards fraudulently by paying vulnerable people in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside to be vaccinated while falsely using their name and information.
- This behavior is deplorable and we're disappointed that anyone would take advantage of vulnerable people in this way in an attempt to circumvent the process for receiving a BC Vaccine Card.
- VCH has successfully put in measures to thwart these attempts, and to ensure anyone seeking a COVID-19 vaccine in the community is eligible and their identification is confirmed.
- Fraudulent vaccination records are being removed from the Provincial Immunization Registry and B.C. vaccine cards are being revoked.
- Future instances of fraud may be forwarded to local police authorities for follow-up.

Recommendation - on background from Ministry

With the current rise in cases we are seeing due to the Omicron variant, it is important that we remain diligent with health and safety measures to keep ourselves, our loved ones and our communities safe. To address this, the Province recently announced guidance for the K-12 system to reduce the risk of spread and transmission of COVID-19 in school settings which includes guidance on mask wearing.

Please see Dr. Henry's comments from the Jan 7 media conference:

"As I don't need to say today, SARS-CoV-2, or what causes COVID-19, continues to persist, to evolve and, of course, to surprise us in many ways. We cannot predict with certainty exactly what is going to happen, and we've seen that as things have evolved over this last two years. But we can, and we must, make educated or informed guesses or decisions based on the imperfect information we do have.

It's not mathematical certainty, but it is based on the best information that we have, best information from what we know from history around different coronaviruses and other infections, around immunology and around what we're seeing around the world. It is the best information we have, but it is by necessity imperfect. And in that context, that is where we are moving ahead now with how we are going to manage to get through this next wave, the omicron wave here, of the pandemic.

We have all seen that the virus continues to spread, that omicron is spreading very rapidly. And I said last time that where we had one or two generations of separation, now everybody, I believe, knows somebody or has somebody in their close social circle who's been affected by COVID-19.

That means this is going to be a challenging month, but it doesn't mean that we need to stop everything. We know that the basics of foundations of what we have in place, the things that we have learned to do and the measures that we have in place currently are going to help us get through this month."

And as Minister Whiteside said at the same conference:

"As we experience the omicron variant move through our communities, we're focused on protecting students and education workers. What we know is that since the pandemic began, we have seen that schools are a reflection of what happens in the community, and so we know that students and staff in our schools will be affected by this latest variant. That's why we want to ensure health and safety measures are in place so children and youth can learn in school to the best extent possible, and that has been the basis of the work this week by school districts, schools, the steering committee, and the ministry, and, of course, public health."

B.C.'s public health team worked closely with the Ministry of Education to put measures in place to ensure students, teachers, school staff and parents stay safe through the school year, including the wearing of masks. This adds to other important layers of protection in our K-12 health and safety guidelines, like daily health checks, hand washing, staying home when sick and improved ventilation systems. In addition, the guidelines include strategies for schools to help create space between people through staggered recess, lunch breaks and class transition times, managing the flow of people in common areas, and using available space to spread people out.

All K to 12 students, staff and visitors are required to wear masks in all indoor areas, including:

- At desks
- On school buses

Exceptions to the mask policy include:

- A person who cannot tolerate wearing a mask for health or behavioural reasons
- A person unable to put on or remove a mask without the assistance of another person
- If the mask is removed temporarily for the purposes of identifying the person wearing it
- If the mask is removed temporarily to engage in an educational activity that cannot be performed while wearing a mask. For example:
 - Playing a wind instrument
 - Engaging in high-intensity physical activity
 - If a person is eating or drinking
 - If a person is behind a barrier
 - While providing a service to a person with a disability or diverse ability (for example, a hearing impairment), where visual cues, facial expressions and/or lip reading/movements are important

School districts and individual schools have the responsibility to address mask exceptions for students. School staff will work with parents and families if a child is unable to wear a mask at school.

When working with students where seeing facial expressions and/or lip movement is important, and the service cannot be provided from behind a barrier, options include having the staff member wear a mask with a transparent section to enable visualization of the mouth. Recommendation - on background from Ministry

Timing and availability are dependent on the availability of rapid tests provided by the federal government. There is no confirmation from the federal government about when they will arrive. We are not experiencing delays as such as the situation is fluid and evolving – delivery schedules often fluctuate by a day or two, particularly when shipments are coming by land from Ontario. Between weather, available transport vendors and staff, coordinating with vendors etc. – we're all working to ensure delivery as quickly as possible.

I'm looking for numbers regarding how many long-term care residents have at least one essential visitor designated.

Recommendation - on background from Ministry

While the Ministry of Health does not have a consolidated list of how many people have an essential visitor assigned province wide available, we can provide some context on essential visitors for LTC residents.

Under current direction from the PHO (January 4, 2021), visitation in LTC is restricted to essential visits as well as a single designated social visitor for each resident. Single designated social visitors will be permitted to visit residents once rapid testing for visitors is in place at facilities.

Essential visits are necessarily linked with an **essential need** that could not be met in the absence of the essential visit..

An essential visit includes:

- Visits for compassionate reasons including critical illness, palliative care, hospice care, end of life and medical assistance in dying;
- Visits paramount to the resident's physical care and mental well-being (e.g., assistance with feeding, mobility, personal care or communication, assistance by designated representatives for persons with disabilities);
- Visits for supported decision-making;

A resident may have more than one person designated as an essential visitor. Essential visits shall be limited to one visitor per resident within the facility at a time (except in the case of palliative/end-of-life care).

To ensure fair and consistent decision making, the Ministry put in place in February 2021 a visitor appeals process. Visitors can request an immediate review of any decisions made related to visitor status and shall be provided the ability to speak with an administrator or administrator-on-call or request a further review of a decision through, or facilitated by, the health authority Patient Care Quality Office. Should a visitor remain unsatisfied with their visitor status, they can request a formal review of their concerns through the PHO.

B.C. identified its first case of the COVID-19 Omicron variant on Nov. 30, 2021.

As of Thursday, Jan. 13, 2022, 88.9% (4,433,294) of eligible people five and older in B.C. have received their first dose of COVID-19 vaccine and 83.3% (4,150,713) have received their second dose.

In addition, 92.3% (4,277,097) of eligible people 12 and older in B.C. have received their first dose of COVID-19 vaccine, 89.5% (4,150,305) received their second dose and 29.2% (1,352,152) have received a third dose.

Also, 92.6% (4,006,935) of all eligible adults in B.C. have received their first dose, 90.0% (3,893,147) received their second dose and 31.2% (1,351,017) have received a third dose.

Recommendation – Vancouver Coastal to send:

- As of Jan. 14, 2022, there are 20 COVID-19 patients at Lions Gate Hospital (LGH), and two in the ICU.

- Much like other hospitals across the province, LGH continues to see a mix of patients who have COVID-19, including some seeking care specifically for their COVID-19 symptoms.

Vancouver Sun contacted Public Affairs about vaccination rates in CHSAs around B.C. for kids aged 5-11. The reporter says that according to the latest CDC data there are several regions in Surrey where the per cent of kids that have received their first dose are among the lowest in the Lower Mainland. The reporter wants to know if we are seeing some of the same challenges in getting kids vaccinated now as the initial vaccine rollout faced last year. What are some of the issues that contribute to lower vaccination rates in these neighbourhoods. Lastly, what additional measures are being considered to boost vaccinations rates in these areas (vaccinations in schools).

Recommendation – *Fraser Health to send:*

- Since the start of B.C.'s COVID-19 Immunization Plan we have learned a lot about our processes and been able to implement additional supports that allow for us to vaccinate more people per day. Our immunization efforts have led us to increase the number of vaccine clinics across the Fraser Health region to 16 sites.
- We are pleased with the great response from our communities in getting children in the 5-11 years old age group vaccinated against COVID-19. We continue to see appointments being booked for children at all our COVID-19 vaccine clinics.
- We acknowledge the concerns many parents are feeling right now and while children are at a
 lower risk of severe disease from COVID-19, the pediatric COVID-19 vaccine has been proven to
 be effective in protecting children from severe illness, hospitalization or having long-term
 impacts. At this time, there have not been any reports of adverse events in the 5 to 11 year old
 age group in B.C.
- Our priority is ensuring children get vaccinated and have the best immunization experience
 possible. Many of our vaccine clinics hours of operation are extended to provide additional
 options for parents and guardians. Additionally, we have several child friendly vaccine clinics
 that offer a quieter space for children to get vaccinated.
- If a child or youth requires additional support or accommodations in getting their vaccine, please visit our <u>youth outreach process page</u> for more information, including how to request inclinic appointment needs.
- We continue to monitor our vaccine uptake and are looking at all options to support increased uptake within our current vaccine delivery capacity. At this time we are not currently looking at in school COVID-19 vaccine clinics for children ages 5 to 11.
- We urge everyone who hasn't yet attended a clinic and is eligible to receive their vaccine to register now so they can then book an appointment as soon as possible. The approved vaccines

provide immunity against COVID-19 and are very effective at preventing hospitalization and death from COVID-19.

I'm working on a "news you can use" type file on rapid testing for our audience. We've seen a few posts online where people got rapid tests that were expired, but Health Canada changed it's shelf-life on some of the RAT tests late last year to expand them past the original date of expiry

(https://www.canada.ca/en/health-canada/services/drugs-health-products/covid19-industry/medical-devices/authorized/expanded-use.html). I'm just curious why expired tests are being handed out in the first place and if someone gets one, how do they know they can still use it? I can't seem to find anything on the FH website or the BCCDC website. I realize it's on the Health Canada website, but the average person might now know how to track down that information. I'm hoping to write this up for digital and do it for radio. Hoping someone might be free to clip quickly!

Recommendation – *Fraser Health to send:*

- Fraser Health ensures every rapid test kit distributed at our COVID-19 testing sites is safe for use, and effective in detecting COVID-19.
- When Fraser Health receives rapid tests kits from the Province, they include a revised expiration
 date label on each kit to reassure the public that the kit is safe, as determined by Health Canada,
 and not past expiration. On each kit, Fraser Health staff attach an instruction sheet to provide
 additional information about its contents.
- Sometimes when preparing kits for distribution, these kits are broken down and re-packaged for individual use. Fraser Health is aware of a limited number of kits that may not have had the revised expiration dates affixed to them, and apologizes for any confusion or concerns this may have caused.
- We can confirm that all rapid testing kits being distributed at our sites are now properly labelled, with the revised expiration dates, and are no longer re-packaged for individual use.

Reporter would like to know how successful past pilots have been and how many people have been involved.

Recommendation

BC Cancer/PHSA to provide the following statement:

- Dr. Gina Ogilvie's research team has been conducting self-collection projects in various regions around BC since early 2019. This includes research conducted in the Fraser Health Region with BC Women's and the Fraser Health Authority, and in the North with Carrier Sekani Family Services, First Nations Health Authority and Métis Nation British Columbia. Both these pilots are conducted in partnership with BC Cancer and the Provincial Laboratory system.
- These pilot projects are currently all ongoing but at various stages of progress. All projects involve self-collection for screening but have different approaches for engagement, kit distribution and collection location to allow for evaluation of different approaches in different settings.
- As part of the pilot, participants are offered the opportunity to complete evaluation surveys, helping feedback on all aspects of the project. No results are yet available as all projects are ongoing.

<u>The at-home cervical screening pilot</u> launched by BC Cancer last month will help BC Cancer fine-tune patient communications, provider engagement and internal processes to better serve BC Cancer patients.

Here's a statement from the Ministry:

Gyms and fitness centres are included in the definition of "inside event" in the provincial health officer's order. Inside events include a gathering of participants for the purpose of adult exercise or fitness activity or class. During this higher risk period, gyms and fitness centres have been ordered to close to help prevent people from getting sick from COVID-19, including the Omicron variant, and to protect our health care system. COVID-19, including the Omicron variant, is spread by the respiratory droplets an infected person produces when they breathe, cough, or talk. Fitness activities generate these aerosols and can lead to rapid transmission. Gyms and fitness centres can continue to operate virtually if they choose.

The Provincial Health Officer (PHO) regularly reviews all orders and restrictions based on the data and evidence. When restrictions are set to be lifted or adjusted, this will be widely communicated. The PHO and Ministry of Health meet regularly with the fitness industry and have since the beginning of the pandemic, including weekly for the past month.

We know that exercise is important for physical and mental well-being, and since the start of the pandemic have encouraged people to stay active in a safe manner, for example exercising outdoors or away from others. The gym community has been doing its part to keep clients and the public safe. We expect all businesses to follow the provincial health orders.

- The Ministry of Health is aware of instances of people attempting to obtain BC vaccine cards fraudulently by paying vulnerable people in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside to be vaccinated while falsely using their name and information.
- This behavior is deplorable and we're disappointed that anyone would take advantage of vulnerable people in this way in an attempt to circumvent the process for receiving a BC Vaccine Card.
- VCH has successfully put in measures to thwart these attempts, and to ensure anyone seeking a COVID-19 vaccine in the community is eligible and their identification is confirmed.

- Fraudulent vaccination records are being removed from the Provincial Immunization Registry and B.C. vaccine cards are being revoked.
- Future instances of fraud may be forwarded to local police authorities for follow-up.
