Notice Of Community Meeting

City Property at 1240 Yates Street to be
used for Short-term Emergency Shelter

Community Meeting

Wednesday, December 30, 2015
at 7:00 p.m.
1240 Yates Street, Gymnasium

Please note that the City of Victoria plans to lease a vacant City property located at 1240 Yates Street to BC Housing and Our Place to operate an emergency winter shelter, for four months. Work is underway to open the shelter the first week of January.

Our Place will operate the shelter to offer 24/7 support services, storage, laundry and daily meals, to 40 people without homes, until April 30, 2016. BC Housing has allocated \$400,000 in funding for a new temporary shelter for the cold, winter months. In addition, the United Way of Greater Victoria is contributing \$25,000, and the City will invest up to \$45,000 to upgrade the facility for its temporary use.

The City expects the shelter operator to work closely with all neighboring properties, residents and the City, to listen to concerns, and mitigate impacts to the neighbourhood. This community meeting will provide an opportunity for residents and neighbours to learn more about the shelter operation and share thoughts or concerns so they can be addressed. Representatives from the City of Victoria, BC Housing, and Our Place will be present. A neighbourhood agreement and committee will be established based on the ideas and input of the neighbours and operators on how the temporary shelter can be provided while minimizing impacts to the neighbourhood.

Earlier in the fall, the City of Victoria consulted the community about how best to create shelter for those without homes. The majority of respondents to an online survey and attendees at a 'sheltering solutions' workshop supported expanding existing shelters, or using existing vacant buildings for temporary shelters, over expanding options for sheltering in City parks.

The shelter is temporary, for up to four months. The long term future of the property at 1240 Yates Street is actively being explored and is being considered as part of the City's real estate strategy moving forward.

1240 YATES STREET TEMPORARY MY PLACE TRANSITIONAL HOME NEIGHBOURHOOD AGREEMENT

VISION

Neighbours of the 1200 block of Yates Street, including existing residents, Central Middle school staff, student and parent community, fire fighters and other workers, and temporary transitional housing residents, will be welcome and may enjoy comfort and safety in their neighbourhood.

GOAL OF THE AGREEMENT

To provide a means for everyone to work effectively together to achieve the vision.

PRINCIPLES

- Communicate clearly and honestly,
- Work together to address concerns and solve problems in a positive and timely manner,
- Be respectful of all neighbours and engage them in resolving issues, and
- Commit to following through on agreed upon actions.

CONTEXT

The City, Province and Island Health have partnered to open a new temporary emergency facility at 1240 Yates Street from January to April 2016.

The facility will be operated by Our Place Society, a non-profit society, who will manage the building and provide 24/7 support services, accommodation, storage, daily meals and non-clinical supports to its residents, as well as connecting facility users to health and social services. It is not a traditional shelter. Instead, it will serve as a transitional home to connect residents to appropriate and long-term housing options.

In the past, concerns have been expressed with individuals drawn to the area gathering on sidewalks, boulevards and school grounds, openly using and selling drugs and engaging in vandalism and theft, thus, generally contributing to unhealthy and unsafe conditions in the 1200 block. These concerns have increased due to the perceived and real impacts in the neighbourhood as a result of the opening of this facility.

NEIGHBOURHOOD AGREEMENT
1240 Yates Street, My Place Transitional Home

Social issues are a reality and a shared community responsibility. Services such as those provided by Our Place Society are recognized as necessary and valuable in assisting vulnerable populations. Provision of such services may be accompanied by public disturbances, calling upon residents, social agencies, provincial agencies and the City to ensure negative impacts to public and private property are minimized or eliminated.

It is recognized that a Neighbourhood Agreement may help to manage social issues to reduce or eliminate their impacts on the immediate area, but will not address the root causes (poverty, addictions, mental illness, homelessness), nor will it address some of the law enforcement challenges related to illegal activities

NEIGHBOUR GROUP

This agreement is amongst neighbours in the 1200 block of Yates Street and nearby residents. This agreement also includes the City of Victoria, Victoria Police Department, Victoria Fire Department, Our Place Society, BC Housing, Island Health, Fernwood Community Association, Fernwood Neighbourhood Resource Group, Central Middle School, Greater Victoria School District 61, and transitional housing residents, who have agreed to attend Neighbour Group meetings and participate in initiatives to improve the safety and livability of the 1200 block.

The Neighbour Group will initially meet every week and adjust the frequency of ongoing meetings as needed to maintain regular communication and discuss emergent and ongoing issues.

The City of Victoria will provide coordination and facilitation services to the Neighbour Group.

COMMITMENTS OF THE NEIGHBOUR GROUP

Signatories agree to:

- Ensure that crime whether on public or private property is reported and that law enforcement is called promptly,
- Provide a representative to the Neighbour Group,
- Respond to concerns and participate in joint, cooperative initiatives as agreed to from time to time by the Neighbour Group,
- Address issues as and when they arise in a timely manner, and
- Communicate proactively on Neighbour Group matters.







- Take appropriate action to deal with any resident who causes disruption at the school and in the immediate neighbourhood,
- Support the school with respect to security and the well-being of students, parents, teachers and other staff,
- Keep their buildings and grounds clean and in good condition,
- Promptly make any repairs needed and remove graffiti,
- Consider modifications to the exterior of their buildings to discourage loitering and camping (e.g. enhanced exterior lighting), and
- Assist in engaging the transitional housing residents to participate in the activities and initiatives of the Neighbour Group.

The Victoria Police Department will:



- Provide a dedicated Community Resource Officer to the Neighbour Group meetings,

- Work collaboratively with the Neighbour Group to address issues that may arise, including instructions on how to access and interpret the VicPD Web Site Crime Mapping Program for statistical information,
- Provide crime prevention information and advice to any member of the Neighbour Group, and
- Work together to ensure that effective and appropriate police resources and activities are maintained in the neighborhood around the My Place Transitional Home.

VICTORIA COURTHOUSE HOMELESS CAMP

Topic: On Feb. 5, MTICS distributed a flyer to the campers asking them to leave the courthouse site by Feb. 25 and asking that they make arrangement for alternate shelter. This followed the announcement of housing options at Mt. Edwards and a new shelter in View Royal.

- The people at the courthouse site said they had no place to live and they wanted somebody to pay attention. We did pay attention, and they now have a place to go.
- We have provided 88 new units of housing to provide options for those people at the site who are genuinely homeless, including options for those who choose to camp outside.
- 40 rent supplements have been made available to help any campers in need of housing find a place to stay in the private market.
- Including the new shelter on Yates Street, we have provided about \$600,000 to help open 85 new winter shelter spaces in Victoria.
- There are also 145 extreme weather shelter spaces available across Greater Victoria to make sure everyone has access to a safe, warm place at night.
- These spaces are activated by the community depending on weather conditions. The average occupancy rate for extreme weather shelter spaces in Victoria has been 66% this winter.

Feb. 9, 2016

Background:

On Feb. 5, MTICS distributed a flyer to the campers asking them to leave the courthouse site by Feb. 25 and asking that they make arrangement for alternate shelter. This followed the announcement of housing options at Mt. Edwards and a new shelter in View Royal.

As of Feb. 5, there are about 100 campers at the site. Despite the new shelter opening on Yates Street, the camp continued to grow.

- 40 people have been moved into the shelter on Yates. St. and there's a waitlist of 50 people.
- Approximately 80 of the remaining 100 campers are believed to be homeless.
- 3 people have been housed and 2 other individuals have secured housing for mid-March

The Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens' Services (MTICS) will have to make a decision to apply to the courts for an injunction. This could be challenged and take anywhere from 4 to 6 weeks.

Court ruling:

Following a court ruling in 2009, homeless campers have been allowed to stay in Victoria parks as long as they pack up their tents and move every morning. In this case however, the courthouse lawn belongs to the province and that rule does not apply.

Additional Background on Courthouse Camp Situation

Victoria Courthouse Camp Site Management

- On April 14, 2016, the Province announced that it is working with the City of Victoria, and fire and police officials to develop a plan for safety standards to better protect people at the site and nearby residents.
- The focus is to improve safety at the courthouse lawn site – for those at the site and for those who live nearby.
- The Province is working with the Portland Hotel Society (PHS) to provide 24/7 outreach services at the site to assist the campers understand and comply with fire and safety requirements at the site, and connect campers to housing, health and other services.
- PHS has extensive experience working with the hardest to house – those individuals who are street entrenched and are further challenged with mental health and addiction issues.
- PHS intends to pay occupants a small fee to assist with site clean-up and safety.
- PHS is also working closely with the existing local non-profit societies who have been providing this assistance over the past several months.
- Shelter and housing options have been made available for those at the site who are genuinely in need.

My Place Transitional Home – 1240 Yates Street

- This facility opened on January 5, 2016 and will remain open until the end of September. It is operated by Our Place Society.
- The facility is open 24/7, and provides meals and other supports.
- In 2015/16, the Province provided \$325,000 dollars for this 40 bed temporary winter shelter. The 2016/17 operating budget is estimated ^{s.13,s.17}
- Community members near the shelter initially raised concerns regarding its location next to a school, but a neighborhood agreement has been put in place and there have been no reported issues.
- The students and staff of Central Middle School have been working on several projects to welcome residents to the community.

Choices (Former Victoria Youth Custody Centre) – 94 Talcott Road

- A total of 50 shelter spaces are being provided for an initial six months. This will include 20 outdoor camping spaces for those who choose to remain outside.
- 2016/17 operating budget estimated at almost ^{s.13,s.17}
- 42 of the 50 people that have moved to Choices are from the Courthouse camp site.
- The shelter operates 24/7 offering daily meals and a gateway into housing and support services.

- This shelter will likely be extended beyond six months pending a community meeting in June.
- The Victoria Youth Custody Centre continues to operate a temporary overnight holding unit at the site. This unit was only utilized approximately three times per month during the last six months of 2015 and is empty and closed the majority of the time.
- This temporary overnight holding unit is fully self-contained with its own entrance and exit, and will not be affected by the addition of shelter tenants to the site.
- The City of View Royal has been informed of the Province's purchase of the Youth Custody Centre and BC Housing is working with the City's team to ensure zoning and community issues are dealt with.
- As for a long-term plan for the Centre, BC Housing is in the process of forming a steering committee with key stakeholders to draft a vision for the site.

Mt. Edwards Court Care Home – 1002 Vancouver Street

- Formerly a seniors' home, BC Housing presented an offer to purchase the vacant building from the Baptist Housing Society for \$3.65 million dollars on January 27, 2016. The 2016/17 operating budget is estimated at s.13,s.17
- The building's first floor was converted into 38 transitional housing units for use for approximately 12 months. The monthly rent for each unit is \$375 dollars.
- Of the 38 people that have moved into the Mt. Edwards facility, 28 are from the courthouse site.
- The Victoria Cool Aid Society manages and is responsible for day-to-day operations. The Portland Hotel Society provides assistance to the Society because of their experience with hardest to house clientele. The operating budget is estimated at s.13,s.17
- Island Health provides supports to the site.
- The building is adjacent to Cathedral School (a private school). Parents formed the Families and Citizen Coalition to campaign against this project and hired a lawyer.
- To mitigate these concerns, the operator will have support staff on site 24/7. Additional security staff also supervise the area between the school and the Mt. Edwards building. There are security cameras indoors and outdoors along Rockland Avenue across from the school.
- The temporary use of this building for transitional housing will not be subject to rezoning. For future longer-term use, discussion with the City, neighbors, the Cool Aid Society and other stakeholders may be required, depending on the ultimate use of the building, and the Province will fully comply with that zoning process. The Victoria Mayor and Council are fully supportive of this action.

First Metropolitan Church Temporary Shelter

- A 45 unit shelter facility has been extended until the end of June.
- \$200,000 provided in 2015/16 for this 40 bed shelter. The 2016/17 operating budget is estimated s.13,s.17

Courthouse Camp Timeline

Date	Action
November 2015	Occupation of the Courthouse Green Space begins.
November 26, 2015	On November 26, 2015, Victoria City Council unanimously passed a motion presented by Pacifica Housing requesting \$75,000 dollars to go towards 40 new rent supplements.
January 5, 2016	My Place transitional housing facility opens.
January 8, 2016	Provincial representatives read aloud, distributed, and posted a notice requesting campers to leave Courthouse property.
January 27, 2016	BC Housing presented an offer to purchase Mt. Edwards Care Home from the Baptist Housing Society for \$3.65 million.
February 4, 2016	Provincial representatives read aloud, distributed, and posted a notice under s.4 of the <i>Trespass Act</i> requiring all camping to cease and all tents and other personal property to be removed no later than February 25, 2016.
February 23, 2016	Mount Edwards Court and Choices transitional housing facilities are officially opened.
February 26, 2016	50 of the campers left the Courthouse Space with their belongings, while approximately 60 to 70 structures remained on site. Some of the individuals choosing to remain on site threaten and intend to continue to trespass unless restrained from doing so.

Additional Background on Courthouse Camp Situation

Victoria Courthouse Camp Site Management

- On April 14, 2016, the Province announced that it is working with the City of Victoria, and fire and police officials to develop a plan for safety standards to better protect people at the site and nearby residents.
- The focus is to improve safety at the courthouse lawn site – for those at the site and for those who live nearby.
- The Province is working with the Portland Hotel Society (PHS) to provide 24/7 outreach services at the site to assist the campers understand and comply with fire and safety requirements at the site, and connect campers to housing, health and other services.
- PHS has extensive experience working with the hardest to house – those individuals who are street entrenched and are further challenged with mental health and addiction issues.
- PHS intends to pay occupants a small fee to assist with site clean-up and safety.
- PHS is also working closely with the existing local non-profit societies who have been providing this assistance over the past several months.
- Shelter and housing options have been made available for those at the site who are genuinely in need.

My Place Transitional Home – 1240 Yates Street

- This facility opened on January 5, 2016 and will remain open until the end of September. It is operated by Our Place Society.
- The facility is open 24/7, and provides meals and other supports.
- In 2015/16, the Province provided \$325,000 dollars for this 40 bed temporary winter shelter. The 2016/17 operating budget is estimated at ^{s.13,s.17}
- Community members near the shelter initially raised concerns regarding its location next to a school, but a neighborhood agreement has been put in place and there have been no reported issues.
- The students and staff of Central Middle School have been working on several projects to welcome residents to the community.

Choices (Former Victoria Youth Custody Centre) – 94 Talcott Road

- A total of 50 shelter spaces are being provided for an initial six months. This will include 20 outdoor camping spaces for those who choose to remain outside.
- 2016/17 operating budget estimated at ^{s.13,s.17}
- 42 of the 50 people that have moved to Choices are from the Courthouse camp site.
- The shelter operates 24/7 offering daily meals and a gateway into housing and support services.

- This shelter will likely be extended beyond six months pending a community meeting in June.
- The Victoria Youth Custody Centre continues to operate a temporary overnight holding unit at the site. This unit was only utilized approximately three times per month during the last six months of 2015 and is empty and closed the majority of the time.
- This temporary overnight holding unit is fully self-contained with its own entrance and exit, and will not be affected by the addition of shelter tenants to the site.
- The City of View Royal has been informed of the Province's purchase of the Youth Custody Centre and BC Housing is working with the City's team to ensure zoning and community issues are dealt with.
- As for a long-term plan for the Centre, BC Housing is in the process of forming a steering committee with key stakeholders to draft a vision for the site.

Mt. Edwards Court Care Home – 1002 Vancouver Street

- Formerly a seniors' home, BC Housing presented an offer to purchase the vacant building from the Baptist Housing Society for \$3.65 million dollars on January 27, 2016. The 2016/17 operating budget is estimated at s.13,s.17
- The building's first floor was converted into 38 transitional housing units for use for approximately 12 months. The monthly rent for each unit is \$375 dollars.
- Of the 38 people that have moved into the Mt. Edwards facility, 28 are from the courthouse site.
- The Victoria Cool Aid Society manages and is responsible for day-to-day operations. The Portland Hotel Society provides assistance to the Society because of their experience with hardest to house clientele. The operating budget is estimated at \$1.29 million dollars.
- Island Health provides supports to the site.
- The building is adjacent to Cathedral School (a private school). Parents formed the Families and Citizen Coalition to campaign against this project and hired a lawyer.
- To mitigate these concerns, the operator will have support staff on site 24/7. Additional security staff also supervise the area between the school and the Mt. Edwards building. There are security cameras indoors and outdoors along Rockland Avenue across from the school.
- The temporary use of this building for transitional housing will not be subject to rezoning. For future longer-term use, discussion with the City, neighbors, the Cool Aid Society and other stakeholders may be required, depending on the ultimate use of the building, and the Province will fully comply with that zoning process. The Victoria Mayor and Council are fully supportive of this action.

First Metropolitan Church Temporary Shelter

- A 45 unit shelter facility has been extended until the end of June.

Victoria Shelter Frequently Asked Questions January 2016

1. Why is BC Housing purchasing the two buildings?

The Province recognizes the increased need for safe and secure shelter spaces in Victoria. By directly purchasing the buildings we are able to provide the necessary capacity to help transition the campers at the Victoria courthouse into housing and provide shelter spaces.

In addition, BC Housing has allocated 40 rent supplements.

2. How much are the buildings being purchased for?

BC Housing purchased the Youth Custody Centre for \$15M and Mt. Edwards Court Care Home was purchased for \$3.65M.

3. How much funding will the Province provide to operate the new shelters?

The operating budget for Mt. Edwards is an estimated \$1.29M for 12 months.

The operating budget for Youth Custody Centre is currently being finalized.

The operating funding will allow each provider to hire the necessary staff, equipment, furniture and supports needed.

4. Where will the new shelters be located?

The Youth Custody Centre is located at 94 Talcott Road. It will be a 24/7 shelter and provide individuals with three meals a day.

Mt. Edwards Court Care Home is located at 1002 Vancouver Street. It will be transitional housing and individuals will pay \$375 monthly rent.

5. When will the shelters open?

The Youth Custody Centre shelter will open mid-March.

Mt. Edward Court Care Home which provides transitional housing will open February 15.

6. How many spaces will be available?

The Youth Custody Centre shelter will provide 40 spaces and outdoor camping facilities for at least 20 campers; 40 units of transitional housing will be provided at Mt. Edwards Court Care Home.

7. Who is eligible to stay at the Youth Custody Centre shelter?

The shelter will serve individuals at the camp and others who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. Shelters like the Youth Custody Centre have low barriers to entry in an effort to serve the most vulnerable and those who do not have access to other services.

8. Who is eligible to stay at Mt. Edwards Court Care Home?

???

9. What type of support services will be available at the Youth Custody Centre shelter?

The shelter will provide essential services to meet clients' immediate needs for accommodation, nutritious meals, security and basic hygiene. It will also provide gateway services to help break the cycle of homelessness by connecting clients to community and health services, as well as appropriate housing.

10. Who will operate the different facilities?

The Youth Custody Centre shelter will be operated by Our Place Society and the Mt. Edwards shelter will be operated by Victoria Cool Aid Society. The Portland Hotel Society (PHS) may provide assistance as needed (given their expertise with homeless populations; specifically the hardest to house). All rent supplements will be administered by Pacifica Housing.

11. How long will the facilities be open for?

Both shelters are temporary: the Youth Custody Centre will be open until to the end of September and the Mt. Edwards shelter will be open for at least one year.

12. It's been reported that the Victoria Cool Aid Society was to purchase Mt. Edwards. Is that still an option?

BC Housing received permission from the Victoria Cool Aid Society to take over their purchase of sale agreement from Mt. Edwards. The Society will operate the temporary shelter and may have an option to purchase the facility in the future.

13. How much has BC Housing invested in Victoria this winter on temporary shelters? Why is the city receiving so much funding compared to other municipalities in need?

This winter, the Province has provided \$425,000 for a 40-bed temporary winter shelter at the Boys and Girls Club on Yates Street and \$184,000 for a 40-bed temporary winter shelter at the First Metropolitan United Church. These shelters are in addition to 147 year-round homeless shelters spaces and 125 extreme weather shelter spaces available in Victoria.

The Province's approach has always been to work closely with individual municipalities to identify their specific needs, and funding will vary. In this case, the Province understands the concerns raised by the people at the Victoria courthouse campsite, and recognizes the need for immediate housing solutions in the region.

14. What happens to the current youth that are housed at the Youth Custody Centre?

The Custody Centre is only minimally functional at this time. Currently the holding cells for young offenders in the basement are used up to twice a week for overnight detention. There will be no impact on the youth, as the campers will be housed in the gym and court yard.

15. Were there no other options other than to purchase the Youth Custody Centre?

The Province is taking measures to house the homeless campers as soon as possible; we are also looking at longer-term options for stable housing solutions for vulnerable individuals.

16. What is BC Housing doing to ensure the safety and security of the neighbors at both sites?

The Non-Profit Housing Providers and BC Housing will be holding information sessions in both communities to answer questions and address their concerns.

Victoria Shelter Frequently Asked Questions January 2016

1. Why is BC Housing purchasing the two buildings?

The Province recognizes the increased need for safe and secure shelter spaces in Victoria. By directly purchasing the buildings we are able to provide the necessary capacity to help transition the campers at the Victoria courthouse into housing and provide shelter spaces.

In addition, BC Housing has allocated 40 rent supplements.

2. How much are the buildings being purchased for?

BC Housing purchased the Youth Custody Centre for \$15M and Mt. Edwards Court Care Home was purchased for \$3.65M.

3. How much funding will the Province provide to operate the new shelters?

The operating budget for Mt. Edwards is an estimated \$1.29M for 12 months.

The operating budget for Youth Custody Centre is currently being finalized.

The operating funding will allow each provider to hire the necessary staff, equipment, furniture and supports needed.

4. Where will the new shelters be located?

The Youth Custody Centre is located at 94 Talcott Road. It will be a 24/7 shelter and provide individuals with three meals a day.

Mt. Edwards Court Care Home is located at 1002 Vancouver Street. It will be transitional housing and individuals will pay \$375 monthly rent.

5. When will the shelters open?

The Youth Custody Centre shelter will open mid-March.

Mt. Edward Court Care Home which provides transitional housing will open February 15.

6. How many spaces will be available?

The Youth Custody Centre shelter will provide 40 spaces and outdoor camping facilities for at least 20 campers; 40 units of transitional housing will be provided at Mt. Edwards Court Care Home.

7. Who is eligible to stay at the Youth Custody Centre shelter?

The shelter will serve individuals at the camp and others who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. Shelters like the Youth Custody Centre have low barriers to entry in an effort to serve the most vulnerable and those who do not have access to other services.

8. Who is eligible to stay at Mt. Edwards Court Care Home?

???

9. What type of support services will be available at the Youth Custody Centre shelter?

The shelter will provide essential services to meet clients' immediate needs for accommodation, nutritious meals, security and basic hygiene. It will also provide gateway services to help break the cycle of homelessness by connecting clients to community and health services, as well as appropriate housing.

10. Who will operate the different facilities?

The Youth Custody Centre shelter will be operated by Our Place Society and the Mt. Edwards shelter will be operated by Victoria Cool Aid Society. The Portland Hotel Society (PHS) may provide assistance as needed (given their expertise with homeless populations; specifically the hardest to house). All rent supplements will be administered by Pacifica Housing.

11. How long will the facilities be open for?

Both shelters are temporary: the Youth Custody Centre will be open until to the end of September and the Mt. Edwards shelter will be open for at least one year.

12. It's been reported that the Victoria Cool Aid Society was to purchase Mt. Edwards. Is that still an option?

BC Housing received permission from the Victoria Cool Aid Society to take over their purchase of sale agreement from Mt. Edwards. The Society will operate the temporary shelter and may have an option to purchase the facility in the future.

13. How much has BC Housing invested in Victoria this winter on temporary shelters? Why is the city receiving so much funding compared to other municipalities in need?

This winter, the Province has provided \$425,000 for a 40-bed temporary winter shelter at the Boys and Girls Club on Yates Street and \$184,000 for a 40-bed temporary winter shelter at the First Metropolitan United Church. These shelters are in addition to 147 year-round homeless shelters spaces and 125 extreme weather shelter spaces available in Victoria.

The Province's approach has always been to work closely with individual municipalities to identify their specific needs, and funding will vary. In this case, the Province understands the concerns raised by the people at the Victoria courthouse campsite, and recognizes the need for immediate housing solutions in the region.

14. What happens to the current youth that are housed at the Youth Custody Centre?

The Custody Centre is only minimally functional at this time. Currently the holding cells for young offenders in the basement are used up to twice a week for overnight detention. There will be no impact on the youth, as the campers will be housed in the gym and court yard.

15. Were there no other options other than to purchase the Youth Custody Centre?

The Province is taking measures to house the homeless campers as soon as possible; we are also looking at longer-term options for stable housing solutions for vulnerable individuals.

16. What is BC Housing doing to ensure the safety and security of the neighbors at both sites?

The Non-Profit Housing Providers and BC Housing will be holding information sessions in both communities to answer questions and address their concerns.
