BACKGROUND

- The Minister's Office received an enquiry regarding wait times for access to the Epilepsy Investigation Unit (SIU).
- The SIU utilizes two beds at Vancouver General Hospital to perform Electroencephalography (EEG) tests to record the electrical brain activity that occurs with seizures. This information is combined with

clinical assessments, neuroimaging, and neuropsychological assessment evaluation to determine seizure management, including possible candidacy for epilepsy surgery. Basic evaluation involves an average hospital stay of 7 - 10 days.

FINDINGS

- At this time, two of the three physicians are on site. One additional physician remains on an undefined medical leave.
- Historically this clinic had two physicians, a third physician was added in 2012 to try and address the
 waits.
- The Head of Neurology is actively engaged in recruitment of an epileptologist; however, this will take time as recruitment of physicians is a complex process.
- It is acknowledged that there is a need to expand the SIU, together with adequate staffing, to meet the needs of epilepsy patients in the province.
- A business case has been developed to expand the SIU and establish a provincial epilepsy program (that includes transitional care).
- At present, the SIU will be open during the weeks that epileptologists are on and otherwise, service will be restricted to their clinics and to daytime EEG. This arrangement will be in place until January 2016 at a minimum.

SUGGESTED MLA RESPONSE

- Thank you for taking the time to bring to my attention your concerns about your wait to be seen at the Epilepsy Investigation Unit.
- I want to assure you that the Ministry of Health and the health authorities are aware that wait times can sometimes be lengthy to access specialized services, and they are working hard to resolve the problem.
- Specifically with regard to the Epilepsy Investigation Unit, I can advise that it is acknowledged that there is a need to expand the Unit to meet the needs of epilepsy patients in the province.
- Adequate staffing is essential to any efforts to expand, which is why the Head of Neurology within the Vancouver General Hospital is actively engaged in recruitment of an additional epileptologist for the Unit. However this will take time as recruitment of physicians is a complex process.
- I realize this does not address your immediate concern; however, I did want you to know that the
 Ministry and the health authorities are aware of the challenge of wait times, and are working hard to
 resolve it.

I believe I have not had the pleasure of reaching out to you for research assistance before, so I hope that this request is in line with what your services are set up for. Doug has been approached by a couple of citizens who have had less than satisfactory outcomes with their wait times for ambulance service. One gentleman had to wait with his wife, who suffered a massive stroke due to her primary medical condition (cancer), for 30 minutes. Fire arrived within 7 minutes, but they could not assist with the transport. He was informed by the paramedic that they had to come from Delta, as nothing in Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows, or closer, was available. The other gentleman had to wait in agonizing pain

for 9 minutes, as he suffered a pancreatic attack. He recognizes his case is not as bad, but through sharing his experience with other people, he is finding that many people have similar stories.

Both men want to have wait times for ambulance service shortened and want to achieve a greater degree of service for our community overall and want Doug to support their initiative. The one gentleman has been approached to go to the opposition, but he feels that the government, if understanding the facts, would address the issue.

Doug would like the following information:

What is our regions wait times and % of times that the target is met?

What is the overall provincial goal with paramedic response and service model?

Are there conversations regarding utilizing the fire departments at the paramedic level, via provincial funding model?

Understanding there was a pilot project in Prince George and Delta is also looking at it.

Are there conversations with UBCM in regards to this topic?

Is there anything else that you believe would be useful to this issue?

I am writing to you with a request for your urgent assistance regarding a potential cancer treatment using a drug called "parp inhibitor". The "parp inhibitor" drug is presently available in the USA for patients such as myself who have had more than four "lines" (treatments) of chemotherapy. I am requesting your intervention in order to facilitate the use and cost of obtaining this treatment.

The "parp inhibitor "trial has been completed in Canada but has not yet been approved. It is approved in the United States and Europe and has had great success. It targets DNA repair defect in the BRCA mutant genes. My oncologist has attempted to enroll me in the trials, but due to the number of chemotherapy treatments I have had, I have not been a qualified candidate.

Currently, Quebec and Ontario cover IVF for those affected by this disease. MLA Bing received an email from his constituent, s.22 , requesting information about MSP coverage policy for cataract lenses.

BACKGROUND

- After reviewing usage data and holding discussions with ophthalmologists, clinical experts and patients, the
 Province made monofocal lenses the standard of care for cataract surgeries. Previously, patients purchased
 lenses directly from their surgeons at a range of prices from \$210 to \$500; however, effective April 2012,
 cataract patients can receive monofocal intraocular lenses free of charge.
- In addition to covering foldable lenses, health authorities offer specialty lenses (Toric lenses), such as bifocals, multifocals or lenses to correct astigmatism, at a standard, reduced price. The price depends on the specific type of lens; however, patients who choose specialty lenses only pay the cost difference between the price of the specialty lenses and the MSP-insured (monofocal) lens.
- For patients who receive MSP-insured cataract surgery using an insured lens, no patient charges are allowed.
 Current fees cover all consultations, visits and testing, including any assessments required for the implantation of monofocal lenses, and review and discussion of all lens options with the patient.

- For patients who choose specialty lenses, the surgeon is allowed to charge the patient for any extra medical services provided (for example, measuring and positioning of the lens, or patient education).
- Any patient charges for insured services are considered to be extra-billing under the Medicare Protection Act.

SUGGESTED MLA RESPONSE

- Thank you for bringing this concern to my attention. I contacted the Ministry of Health and I have been assured
 that monofocal lenses continue to be provided by health authorities at no cost to the patient and are the
 standard of care for cataract surgery in this province. These clear lenses do not correct vision but replace the
 cataract within the eye.
- Specialty lenses, that do correct vision, may be provided as the personal choice of the patient. If a patient
 chooses vision correcting lenses, they are available on a patient-pay basis, at a standard, reduced price. The
 price depends on the specific type of lens, and the patient only pays the cost difference between the price of
 the specialty lenses and the MSP-insured (monofocal) lenses.
- Ophthalmologists are allowed to charge for any extra medical services associated with specialty lenses. This
 includes testing, measurement and positioning fees, and patient education about the lenses (which can cost
 \$250 to \$350 depending on the tests required).
- Having said that, should you have any concerns about the charges for medical or surgical services provided by your ophthalmologist, you are encouraged to bring this matter to the attention of the Ministry of Health's Medical Services Branch in writing, supported by detailed receipts. In regards to the lenses there are three basic sight problems: near sighted, far sighted and astigmatism and apparently the province pays approximately \$400 for a basic lens that will allow near and far sighted people to see clearly at a distance but still need glasses for reading.

- BCEHS is undertaking a deployment and demand review across the Lower Mainland and Victoria, including Abbotsford, Maple Ridge and Mission.
- The review is looking at call locations, increases in call rates, and population increases. Results from that review are expected shortly.
- This review will help BCEHS plan strategically where it needs to adjust service levels and make future investments.
- The Ministry of Health and BCEHS will continue to monitor response times and call volumes, so people throughout British Columbia continue to receive high quality and timely service.

If asked whether response times have been effected by RAP changes:

- As a provincial system, the closest and most appropriate resource available is dispatched to calls on a priority basis.

Proposed Response:

Under the Health Professions Act, colleges are given the authority to govern the practice of their members in the public interest. This includes setting and enforcing the standards and rules of their professions. The Ministry of Health's role is to ensure that the professional colleges have a patient relations program in place.

Neither the Health Professions Act nor the regulations explicitly forbid treating spouses, only that a patient relations program must be in place to prevent professional misconduct of a sexual nature. It is the duty of a college "to establish...a patient relations program to seek to prevent professional misconduct of a sexual nature."

The Ministry supports the role of the colleges in ensuring public safety and delivering high quality services. All Canadian provinces and many jurisdictions around the world use peer-based regulation models as part of a larger oversight system for health care workers.

BACKGROUND

- The Minister's Office received an enquiry regarding wait times for access to the Epilepsy Investigation Unit (SIU).
- The SIU utilizes two beds at Vancouver General Hospital to perform Electroencephalography (EEG)
 tests to record the electrical brain activity that occurs with seizures. This information is combined with
 clinical assessments, neuroimaging, and neuropsychological assessment evaluation to determine seizure
 management, including possible candidacy for epilepsy surgery. Basic evaluation involves an average
 hospital stay of 7 10 days.

FINDINGS

- At this time, two of the three physicians are on site. One additional physician remains on an undefined medical leave.
- Historically this clinic had two physicians, a third physician was added in 2012 to try and address the waits.
- The Head of Neurology is actively engaged in recruitment of an epileptologist; however, this will take time as recruitment of physicians is a complex process.
- It is acknowledged that there is a need to expand the SIU, together with adequate staffing, to meet the needs of epilepsy patients in the province.
- A business case has been developed to expand the SIU and establish a provincial epilepsy program (that includes transitional care).
- At present, the SIU will be open during the weeks that epileptologists are on and otherwise, service will be restricted to their clinics and to daytime EEG. This arrangement will be in place until January 2016 at a minimum.

SUGGESTED MLA RESPONSE

- Thank you for taking the time to bring to my attention your concerns about your wait to be seen at the Epilepsy Investigation Unit.
- I want to assure you that the Ministry of Health and the health authorities are aware that wait times can sometimes be lengthy to access specialized services, and they are working hard to resolve the problem.
- Specifically with regard to the Epilepsy Investigation Unit, I can advise that it is acknowledged that there is a need to expand the Unit to meet the needs of epilepsy patients in the province.
- Adequate staffing is essential to any efforts to expand, which is why the Head of Neurology within the Vancouver General Hospital is actively engaged in recruitment of an additional epileptologist for the Unit. However this will take time as recruitment of physicians is a complex process.
- I realize this does not address your immediate concern; however, I did want you to know that the
 Ministry and the health authorities are aware of the challenge of wait times, and are working hard to
 resolve it.

I strongly support BC's registered midwives in their negotiations with the Ministry of Health. I urge the provincial government to start delivering for women and families and reach a sensible agreement that will properly support midwifery and increase access to maternity care, improve health outcomes, and reduce costs.

Delivering one-in-five babies in BC, registered midwives play an increasingly important role in providing maternity care in our province. Demand for their services is growing as more women exercise their right to choose their maternity care provider. Unfortunately, the Ministry if Heath is being inflexible and is unwilling to negotiate a sensible deal.

- Under the Canada Health Act, insured health care benefits are available to all beneficiaries of provincial health insurance plans, on a portable basis, within Canada.
- Should you choose to pursue this route, your son's family physician or specialist in BC would need to make
 a referral to the specialist in Alberta, and the specialist in Alberta would then need to accept your son as a
 patient.
- I would encourage you to discuss this option with your son's physician as he or she can provide you with further details on the referral process.
- It is important to be aware, however, that travel and accommodation costs are not eligible for coverage outof-province and there maybe additional charges that are not insured services under the reciprocal

BACKGROUND

 The Minister's Office received an enquiry regarding wait times for access to the Epilepsy Investigation Unit (SIU). The SIU utilizes two beds at Vancouver General Hospital to perform Electroencephalography (EEG)
tests to record the electrical brain activity that occurs with seizures. This information is combined with
clinical assessments, neuroimaging, and neuropsychological assessment evaluation to determine seizure
management, including possible candidacy for epilepsy surgery. Basic evaluation involves an average
hospital stay of 7 - 10 days.

FINDINGS

- At this time, two of the three physicians are on site. One additional physician remains on an undefined medical leave.
- Historically this clinic had two physicians, a third physician was added in 2012 to try and address the
 waits.
- The Head of Neurology is actively engaged in recruitment of an epileptologist; however, this will take time as recruitment of physicians is a complex process.
- It is acknowledged that there is a need to expand the SIU, together with adequate staffing, to meet the needs of epilepsy patients in the province.
- A business case has been developed to expand the SIU and establish a provincial epilepsy program (that includes transitional care).
- At present, the SIU will be open during the weeks that epileptologists are on and otherwise, service will be restricted to their clinics and to daytime EEG. This arrangement will be in place until January 2016 at a minimum.

SUGGESTED MLA RESPONSE

- Thank you for taking the time to bring to my attention your concerns about your wait to be seen at the Epilepsy Investigation Unit.
- I want to assure you that the Ministry of Health and the health authorities are aware that wait times can sometimes be lengthy to access specialized services, and they are working hard to resolve the problem.
- Specifically with regard to the Epilepsy Investigation Unit, I can advise that it is acknowledged that there is a need to expand the Unit to meet the needs of epilepsy patients in the province.
- Adequate staffing is essential to any efforts to expand, which is why the Head of Neurology within the Vancouver General Hospital is actively engaged in recruitment of an additional epileptologist for the Unit. However this will take time as recruitment of physicians is a complex process.
- I realize this does not address your immediate concern; however, I did want you to know that the
 Ministry and the health authorities are aware of the challenge of wait times, and are working hard to
 resolve it.

Dear Fellow Caucus Members

There is a strong consensus to reorganize legislative sitting times so that the Thursday session ends at 4:00 PM for the reasons:

- Most rural Caucus Members would like to get home before 10:00 PM. This is not just an issue of convenience as some are required to drive on dark and icy roads after midnight and these kinds of hours on a regular basis can stress relationships;
- Caucus Members want to be able to attend events in the Lower Mainland on Thursday evening;
- We could reduce Leave Requests to the Whip so that the five Members who would not benefit from the time change would be more likely to get leave early enough to get home before 10:00 PM;
- · All Members would like to serve their constituents better by having more time in their ridings.

Please consider the following three options with attached graphs and reply with your preference:

- 1. Fifteen Minute Increments. This involves making small incremental changes to the start and end times of sittings. For example, meetings would start at 9:45 AM instead of 10:00 AM. They would end at 6:45 PM rather than 6:30 PM[Wednesday would end at 6:45 PM rather than 7:00 PM]. Lunches would be 15 minutes shorter.
- 2. Monday/Tuesday Private Members Statements. Private Member Statements are Monday mornings from 10:00 AM to 12:00 Noon. There can be no votes during this time. This option would see Statements move to 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM each Monday and Tuesday morning. Quorum is 11 and there would already be eight Members in The House. We might not need a full team as no votes could be called. Everything would remain the same for most Members other than the few that are presenting.
- 3. Wednesday Morning Private Members Statements. Wednesday from 10:00 AM to 12:00 Noon would be used for Statements.

One problem with moving the Private Members Statements is that Monday is used by some for announcements or other duties. Wednesday would affect outreach programs and some committee meetings. The incremental approach will leave less time for lunch activities and will present a problem for some of the diplomatic lunches hosted by the Speaker.

Cliff#: 1040810 – Mr. Marc Dalton, MI.A, Maple Ridge-Mission, is enquiring regarding and Medical Service Plan (MSP) coverage for her back surgery.

REQUEST

is questioning why L4-5 Interlaminar decompression with diam (spacers) surgery is not covered by MSP when done by her current physician, Dr. Heran, under Fraser Health. It is s.22 understanding that the same surgery is covered when done by Dr. Padilla under Coastal Health. She is also questioning why spacer surgery is not covered but fusion extension surgery, which is more expensive and has a longer recovery, is covered.

BACKGROUND

- Bob Hart, Director, Compensation Policy and Programs Branch, spoke with ^{s.22} by phone on October 2, 2015, and advised ^{s.22} that the procedure is "investigational" and not considered the standard of care in British Columbia. Further, Mr. Hart advised, at a high level, the process for procedures to be covered under MSP, i.e., the section responsible for the fee submits a proposal to fund it to the Doctors of BC Tariff Committee.
- MSP is governed by the *Medicare Protection Act* and Regulations. This is provincial legislation and is applied to all health authorities and physicians equally.
- The Medical Services Commission (MSC) Payment Schedule is the list of approved fees payable to physicians for insured medical services provided to beneficiaries enrolled with MSP. The MSC Payment Schedule is for the Province of BC and applied to all health authorities and physicians equally.
- Interlaminar decompression with diam (spacers) is not a benefit of MSP.
- There is no record of this device being reviewed by Health Canada on its website. Additionally, the Food and Drug Administration in the USA has not approved this kind of device. Various journal and articles refer

to them as investigational, and did not recommend coverage or reimbursement by publicly funded medical plans at this time.

FINDINGS:

- s.22 regular surgeon, Dr. Heran, works out of Royal Columbian in Fraser Health and does not bill MSP for other approved stabilization procedures.
- At this time, it is unclear whether or not this is due to Dr. Heran not having privileges at Royal Columbian to do these procedures.
- Dr. Padilla works out of Lions Gate Hospital in Vancouver Coastal Health and bills for other approved stabilization procedures at Lions Gate Hospital, which would indicate that he would have privileges at that hospital to do these procedures.

- explained in her conversation with Mr. Hart, that a friend's husband had the interlaminar decompression surgery covered when performed by Dr. Padilla. Some procedures are reviewed on a case-by-case basis by a Medical Advisor and exceptions for MSP coverage may be granted.
- We will also be contacting the relevant sections of DoBC to see if they have any information with respect to these new kinds of procedures.
- If a physician performed this procedure and billed a fee for another procedure without prior approval, this may be considered misbilling.

Our Client, s.22 needs back surgery, she sent a letter (dated September 25th, 2015) to Minister Lake regarding this. She received a phone call from Bob Hart, Director of Payment Schedules who told her the "spacer" surgery she is requesting is "investigative surgery" and that's why it's not covered. However, Dr. Heran has been performing this surgery for four years and it is covered by Coastal Health. The question is, why is it not covered by Fraser Health? The spacer surgery is far less invasive, is a day surgery and the recovery time is almost immediate – compare this with a fusion extension with a 3-4 day hospital stay, 2-3 months of pain and another 3-6 months of recuperation.

I have attached her letter and a Certificate of Authority. It would be much appreciated if you can follow up on this for us.

Legislation and Policy

- Section 8(1)(I) of the Provincial Sales Tax Exemption and Refund Regulation provides an exemption for "lift chairs
 designed to facilitate standing to sitting or sitting to standing, or both."
- This exemption is listed on page 9 of Ministry Bulletin PST 207, Medical Supplies and Equipment.
- Ministry Bulletin PST 200, PST Exemptions and Documentation Requirements, states at page 4 that no
 documentation is required from the customer in order to receive the exemption.
- The Ministry cannot provide advice on the application of the Goods and Services Tax, as that is a federal sales tax which is administered by the Canada Revenue Agency.

Result

- A lift chair designed to facilitate standing to sitting or sitting to standing, or both, is exempt from PST.
- This exemption is available to all customers, and no documentation is required to qualify for it.
- The Ministry cannot confirm whether or not the purchase of a lift chair is subject to GST.

BACKGROUND

- MLA Dalton's office contacted the Ministry of Health on behalf of constituents.
- s.22 reported that she was advised by a specialist with the Vancouver Spine Program that her spinal surgery cannot take place for 18 months because of the number of patients needing surgery.
- She feels 18-month waiting lists are unacceptable and unnecessary, and inhumane in a country that is one of the wealthiest in the world.
- Wait times as reported on the BC Surgical Wait Time website (swt.hlth.gov.bc.ca) represent the time between when a patient's booking card is received by the hospital and the completion of the patient's surgery. The wait times reported do not include the wait to see a surgeon for a consultation.
- Between July 1 and September 30, 2015, 50 percent of patients who received spine surgery in the Vancouver Coastal region received surgery within 5.7 weeks of their booking, and 90 percent received surgery within 24.9 weeks of their booking. This is better than the provincial average of 50 percent having received their surgery within
 - 8.9 weeks of their surgical consultation, and 90 percent within 31.0 weeks.

FINDINGS

- The patient has been seen by the spine clinic medical physician since 2010 and has been treated conservatively with medical interventions. This physician is not convinced that size is a surgical candidate. In addition to recommending she see a surgeon at the spine clinic at VGH (date yet to be determined), the physician has also encouraged the patient to speak with her general practitioner about obtaining a second opinion referral to the spine service at Lion's Gate Hospital.
- Because^{s,22} has not been seen by a surgeon, Vancouver General Hospital (VGH) has not yet received a booking card.
- The spine clinic is currently trying to find an appointment date with one of the newer spine surgeons who has a shorter wait list. If, once the consultation is complete,
 - is determined to be a surgical candidate, the surgeon will submit a booking card.

- s.22 also reported an incident at RMH in which she waited nine hours for treatment for blood clots after a nurse became angry when she pointed out that she had been given the wrong identity bracelet.
- s.22 has attempted to speak to staff at RMH regarding her concerns, but stated that no one has returned her calls.
- Fraser Health is legally bound by the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (FIPPA) to protect patient privacy. Health authority staff members are ethically committed to ensuring personal information is treated confidentially, only used and shared for authorized purposes, and securely stored.

FINDINGS:

- As of October 27, 2015, the Patient Care Quality Office (PCQO) at Fraser Health had not received a complaint from staff at RMH.

- BCEHS is undertaking a deployment and demand review across the Lower Mainland and Victoria, including Abbotsford, Maple Ridge and Mission.
- The review is looking at call locations, increases in call rates, and population increases. Results from that review are expected shortly.
- This review will help BCEHS plan strategically where it needs to adjust service levels and make future investments.
- The Ministry of Health and BCEHS will continue to monitor response times and call volumes, so people throughout British Columbia continue to receive high quality and timely service.

If asked whether response times have been effected by RAP changes:

- As a provincial system, the closest and most appropriate resource available is dispatched to calls on a priority basis.
- Ambulances and paramedics are dispatched based on their current location at the time of a call, not their home ambulance station.
- In 2013, BC Emergency Health Services adjusted the types of calls it responds to most urgently as part of its Resource Allocation Plan.

Proposed Response:

Under the Health Professions Act, colleges are given the authority to govern the practice of their members in the public interest. This includes setting and enforcing the standards and rules of their

professions. The Ministry of Health's role is to ensure that the professional colleges have a patient relations program in place.

Neither the Health Professions Act nor the regulations explicitly forbid treating spouses, only that a patient relations program must be in place to prevent professional misconduct of a sexual nature. It is the duty of a college "to establish...a patient relations program to seek to prevent professional misconduct of a sexual nature."

The Ministry supports the role of the colleges in ensuring public safety and delivering high quality services. All Canadian provinces and many jurisdictions around the world use peer-based regulation models as part of a larger oversight system for health care workers.

BC Emergency Health Services

- BC Emergency Health Services (BCEHS) provides emergency patient care and inter-facility patient transfer services.
- BCEHS responds to the emergency medical needs of over 4.4 million British Columbians and attends calls across the five regional health authorities, covering nearly 950,000 square kilometres.
- An ambulance crew is dispatched to a medical call nearly every minute of every day in BC.
- In 2014/15 BCEHS dispatched units to over 545,000 events and patient transfers.
- From 2001/02 to 2014/15, BCEHS ambulance pre-hospital event volume has risen by approximately 63 per cent, from 274,214 to 446,083.
- BCEHS is committed to providing timely and appropriate emergency patient care throughout B.C
- We are committed to improving out of hospital patient care through programs such as community paramedicine, where paramedics can provide primary care services (within their scope of practice) in non-urgent settings, in partnership with local health care providers.

BC Emergency Health Services

- We are committed to providing timely and appropriate emergency patient care throughout B.C.
- While ambulance fees are not covered by the Canada Health Act, the B.C. government still covers almost 90 per cent of the cost of an ambulance trip.
- Compared to 10 years ago, we have more ambulances, more paramedics, more support vehicles, and more aircraft to

provide patients with emergency medical care and transportation.

Financial:

- Since 2001/02, the budget of BC Emergency Health Services (BCEHS) rose 117% – from \$148 million to \$322 million in 2015/16.
- From 2001/02 to 2015/16, the budget for air ambulance services has increased by \$35 million, or over 162%.

Paramedics:

- Between 2001/02 and 2014/15, the number of full and part-time paramedics and dispatchers employed by BCEHS has grown by 25% – from 3,157 to 3,945.
- The majority of full-time paramedics and dispatchers received a 21 per cent pay increase between 2001/02 and 2014/15 – an average increase of 1.8 per cent per year.

Fleet:

- Since 2001/02, BCEHS has added 73 ambulances and 49 support vehicles to the service. The BCEHS fleet currently consists of 508 ambulances and 77 support vehicles throughout the province.
- A dedicated helicopter located in Kamloops was added in 2011/12 and a transfer airplane located in Kelowna was added in 2007/08.

BC Patient Transfer Network:

- The BC Patient Transfer Network is a 24/7 provincial service that works with hospital physicians and efficient transfer of acute care patients between health care facilities.
- In 2014/15 the patient transfer network coordinated 77,879 inter-facility patient transfers.
- By using alternative service providers for low acuity transfers,
 the number of patient transfers done province-wide by BCEHS

has fallen by 25 per cent, from 128,413 in 2006/07 to 96,736 in 2014/15.

• Reducing the number of these transfers allows paramedics to focus on transfers that require paramedic care.

... the issue raised is not part of the responsibilities assigned to the Ministry of Health. The Ministry of Social Development and Social Innovation (SDSI) is responsible for providing funding to income assistance clients who require a special diet for a specific medical diagnosis or medical condition.

Regarding coverage for high-protein foods under the Ministry of Health's PharmaCare program, PharmaCare is responsible for providing financial assistance for eligible prescription drugs and designated medical supplies. Nutritional supplements are not provided under this program.

Drug Intelligence and Optimization branch has confirmed that the answer for a PWD on Diabetes, requesting provisions for food supplements, would be the same.

This strategy has been very successful and a number of family physicians have been recruited in the last year who have taken on new patients.

"Our community recognizes that the recruitment and retention of physicians is everyone's responsibility," says Dr Ursula Eultingh, Board Chair for the Ridge Meadows Division of Family. "The success of our recruitment efforts is in large part due our warm, welcoming and friendly community members and physicians who contribute to our recruitment and retention program."

Work is also ongoing to help doctors increase their capacity to take on new patients by delegating administrative and non-essential clinical functions to appropriate staff members in their practices.

The BC Emergency Health Services (BCEHS) provided the following responses to the questions posed by Dr. Bing.

1. What are our region's wait times and the percentage of times the target is met?

As a provincial system, the BCEHS aims to send the closest and most appropriate resources to a medical emergency, regardless of regional boundaries. In 2014/15, BCEHS paramedics responded to 1,509 9-1-1 calls in Pitt Meadows and 6,775 9-1-1 calls in Maple Ridge. The average emergency lights and sirens response times in Maple Ridge have improved marginally, from 12 minutes in 2013/14 to 11 minutes and 56 seconds in 2014/15. The average emergency lights and siren response in Pitt Meadows increased from 12 minutes, 38 seconds in 2013/14 to 13 minutes, 11 seconds in 2014/15.

2. What is the overall provincial goal with paramedic response and service model?

There is no overall provincial response time goal due to the vast and diverse geography of BC. However, in urban and metro areas (areas with a population over 15,000), BCEHS sets itself a target to arrive on scene to events that require an emergency lights and siren response within 9 minutes, 90 per cent of the time. Some examples of events that require an emergency lights and siren response include heart attacks, strokes, air way obstructions, and significant injury or illness to children or vulnerable adults.

In 2014/15, BCEHS met this target 54.7 per cent of the time, compared to 53.6 per cent in 2013/14. However, response time is not the only factor in determining patient outcomes. Ensuring the most appropriate resource(s) are dispatched based on the patient's acuity, location, and the proximity of suitable, receiving health care facilities, are also key factors in improving patient outcomes.

3. Are there conversations regarding utilizing the fire departments at the paramedic level, via provincial funding model? I understand there was a pilot project in Prince George, and Delta is also looking at it.

First responders play a vital role in pre-hospital care. BCEHS has participated in first responder pilot projects sporadically over the past few years; however, in order to ensure consistency and avoid duplicating services with taxpayer resources, BCEHS established a Lower Mainland first responders working group to develop a plan for improving patient care that includes greater participation from municipal first responders.

4. Are there conversations with UBCM in regards to this topic?

Yes, response times and the Resource Allocation Plan (RAP) are topics that BCEHS have addressed at previous UBCM conventions.

5. Is there anything else that you believe would be useful to this issue?

With the help of Operational Research in Health Ltd., BCEHS is conducting a comprehensive review of current resources, deployment models, call locations, increases in call rates, response times, demographics, and population needs with input from municipalities, first responder agencies and health authorities. This is the first time BCEHS has conducted such a thorough review of its services. This review will help BCEHS forecast demand and decision-making in regards to setting service delivery standards, and outline the reasonable system costs to achieve those standards.

• BCEHS would encourage the families who had unsatisfactory experiences with ambulance service to contact the Provincial Services Health Authority's Patient Care Quality Office (PCQO) so that these events can be reviewed. I believe I have not had the pleasure of reaching out to you for research assistance before, so I hope that this request is in line with what your services are set up for. Doug has been approached by a couple of citizens who have had less than satisfactory outcomes with their wait times for ambulance service. One gentleman had to wait with his wife, who suffered a massive stroke due to her primary medical condition (cancer), for 30 minutes. Fire arrived within 7 minutes, but they could not assist with the transport. He was informed by the paramedic that they had to come from Delta, as nothing in Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows, or closer, was available. The other gentleman had to wait in agonizing pain for 9 minutes, as he suffered a pancreatic attack. He recognizes his case is not as bad, but through sharing his experience with other people, he is finding that many people have similar stories.

Both men want to have wait times for ambulance service shortened and want to achieve a greater degree of service for our community overall and want Doug to support their initiative. The one gentleman has been approached to go to the opposition, but he feels that the government, if understanding the facts, would address the issue.

BACKGROUND

waited over a year to receive surgery to remove skin cancer s.22. She was told by her surgeon that, due to regulations, there is limited access to the surgery. Mr. Bing's office contacted the Ministry of Health on July 30, 2015, to seek clarification as to why the procedure would be limited to the point of a year-long wait for cancer treatment.

FINDINGS

- Mohs surgery is a specialized micrographic surgical procedure that involves removing a skin cancer tumour layer by layer until no cancer remains. It is often used in areas where it is essential to remove as little tissue as possible, such as on the face.
- Mohs surgery requires specialized training and ability. There are currently only
 17 practitioners in Canada certified to perform Mohs surgery by the worldwide regulatory body, the American College of Mohs Surgery.
- In British Columbia, Mohs surgery is available only at the UBC Skin Care Centre in Vancouver. An additional Mohs surgeon has recently joined the practice, which may improve future wait times.
- Referrals for Mohs surgery are triaged based on the severity of cancer, the typical rate of cancer growth, and the risk of metastatic spread. The location of the cancer may also play a lesser role in prioritizing cases.
- Requests for removal of basal cell cancers, which are typically slow-growing, non-metastatic cancers, may
 wait longer than requests involving faster-moving or metastatic cancers. In the case of basal cell cancers,
 this wait time usually has little effect on the size of the cancer, the complexity of the surgery, and final
 patient outcomes.

- The College of Physicians and Surgeons of British Columbia is responsible for regulating the practice of

SUGGESTED MLA RESPONSE

 Thank you for contacting my office about the wait time for Mohs surgery in British Columbia. I am glad you received your surgery and hope you are recovering well.

- As you may be aware, Mohs surgery requires specialized training and ability. There are currently only 17 practitioners in Canada who are certified by the American College of Mohs Surgery, which is the worldwide regulatory body for the procedure. In British Columbia, Mohs surgery is only performed at the UBC Skin Care Centre in Vancouver. These limitations have led to longer wait times for some people seeking the procedure within the province.
- However, I am pleased to share that another Mohs surgeon has recently joined the UBC Skin Care Centre, which is a positive step towards improving wait times.
- I have also been assured that cases are triaged based on information from patients' referring physicans regarding the severity of their cancer, the typical rate of cancer growth, and the risk of metastatic spread. This helps ensure that those in need of immediate surgery receive it. Requests for the removal of basal cell cancers, which are usually slow-growing and non-metastatic, may wait longer for treatment but, in most cases, this delay has little effect on final patient outcomes. However, I can appreciate the impact waiting for a procedure can have on patients.

Below is an update from staff in regards to your questions about unregulated counselling therapy.

- In December 2014, the Ministry learned that FACT BC's membership did not include several key groups, including the Professional Association of Christian Counsellors and Psychotherapists (PACCP) and the Spiritual Health Advisory Council (the SH Council), and subsequently encouraged the groups to meet together to identify common interests.
- In February 2015, PACCP and the SH Council met with FACT BC for the first time, and they continue to work together to explore various regulatory options.
- In April 2015, the Ministry informed FACT BC that, due to competing priorities, further work on exploring the various regulatory options for counselling therapists would not resume until Spring 2016
- To date, no specific regulatory determination for counselling therapists has been made.

has contacted the office of Marc Dalton, MLA for Maple Ridge-Mission, on behalf of his grandson, s.22 and a Type 1 Diabetic patient who requires a continuous glucose monitor. The cost of this monitor is a significant burden for his family and they would like to know if there is any funding assistance/coverage available from the Ministry of Health (the Ministry) via PharmaCare or Medical Services Plan (MSP).

Background:

- Blood glucose monitoring is a way of testing the concentration of sugar in the blood. Blood glucose monitoring
 reveals individual patterns of blood glucose changes, and helps in the planning of meals, activities, and at what
 time of day to take medications.
- A blood glucose test is performed by piercing the skin (typically, on the finger) to draw blood, then applying
 the blood to a chemically active disposable "test-strip." Patients should test their blood sugar levels only when
 they have a reason to test.
- A continuous glucose monitor determines glucose levels on a continuous basis (every few minutes). A typical system consists of:
 - a disposable glucose sensor placed just under the skin, which is worn for a few days until replacement
 - a link from the sensor to a non-implanted transmitter which communicates to a radio receiver
 - an electronic receiver worn like a pager (or insulin pump) that displays glucose levels with nearly continuous updates, as well as monitors rising and falling trends.

Bullets for MLA:

- MSP is the provincial insurance program that pays for required medical services.
- PharmaCare is the Ministry program that provides assistance to residents with the cost of eligible prescription drugs and a limited selection of designated medical supplies.
- PharmaCare is unable to provide reimbursement for all supplies and devices available to assist
 individuals with their health needs, including continuous glucose monitoring systems and the
 supplies associated with them.

- As a publicly funded insurance program, PharmaCare is responsible for careful stewardship of funds. Given the fiscal pressures affecting PharmaCare and the broader health system, the program has limited capacity to expand coverage for new benefits and must be very selective in that regard.
- Please be aware that the decision not to provide coverage for continuous glucose monitoring systems is not a comment on the therapeutic value of this product, but rather a reflection of the limits of PharmaCare's available funding.
- Having the appropriate supports and coverage in place for children like s.2 who suffer chronic disease, such as diabetes, is very important. Overall, PharmaCare provides one of the most generous diabetes coverage programs in Canada, spending over \$75 million on diabetes medications and supplies in 2013/14.
- Diabetes is the only disease for which PharmaCare covers non-drug supplies, like blood glucose
 test strips, needles, syringes, and insulin pump infusion sets. PharmaCare also covers the cost of
 insulin pump reservoirs/cartridges for patients of all ages who use insulin pumps to manage
- · their diabetes.

I was just in speaking with you on behalf of my Grandson, who suffers from Type I diabetes, with a request for funding to cover this Glucose monitor along with replacement sensors which on their own cost about \$340 per month.

To recap. s.22 At that time they wen^{s.22} and he was rushed to Prince George Hospital to be stabilized. Living in the north has it's challenges as they had to make trips to Children's Hospital in Vancouver every 3 months for support. s.22 had to be rushed to Prince George hospital by ambulance because of extremely low reading.

This just tears away at our heart strings to see this little guy being poked many times a day to test his insulin levels. This is why the glucose monitor has been developed as it will assist by sending an alarm to Mum that his levels are going high or low. Adding to that it will assist especially at night and when he goes to school in September.

Ministry of Health staff and Fraser Health have reviewed the following concern and have prepared the following information and suggested response.

BACKGROUND

- Mr. Dalton's office first contacted the Ministry of Health (the Ministry) on June 8, 2015, on behalf of s.22 whose father, s.22 had been left uncared for over the weekend by home support staff due to scheduling issues. Ministry staff spoke tc s.22 on June 9, 2015, (see 1035590) and confirmed that she felt her concerns were acknowledged and would be addressed by Ms. s.22 her father's case manager.
- Mr. Dalton's office contacted the Ministry a second time on August 4, 2015, in response to a July 30, 2015, complaint from s.22 stating that her father was left in bed in 30-degree heat due to only one of two scheduled care workers arriving for his visit.
- s.22 has contacted the Fraser Health Patient Care Quality Office (PCQO) and has spoken with multiple home support staff, who have confirmed that a scheduling error was the cause of the issue.

FINDINGS

- A scheduler supervisor at Fraser Health will be following up with the schedulers involved to ensure that complex clients requiring two health workers are scheduled as a priority. The team leader involved with s.22 case will notify the home support manager and scheduler supervisor to discuss s.22 care and create a plan to ensure his two health workers are consistently scheduled.
- Mr. John Tully, Clinical Services Manager at Fraser Health, will be looking to streamline communications between clients/clients' families and home support staff. s.22 has agreed to attend a staff meeting to share her experiences, and will be working in partnership with Fraser Health on these process changes.
- When s.22 spoke with Fraser Health PCQO staff on August 12, 2015, she indicated that her conversations with Mr. Tully had resolved her concerns.

SUGGESTED MLA RESPONSE

- Thank you for making me aware of the service issue your father experienced with Fraser Health home support on July 30, 2015. I know this must have been a distressing situation for him, as well as for you and your mother.
- Having spoken with staff at the Ministry of Health, I understand you have been in communication with the
 Patient Care Quality Office at Fraser Health, as well as with Mr. John Tully, the Clinical Services Manager.
 I was advised that scheduling staff will be working to ensure that complex clients, like your father, who
 require two health workers will be scheduled as a priority. I also understand that Mr. Tully will be working

with you to streamline communications between clients' families and home support staff, and that you will be attending a staff meeting to share your experiences.

- I hope these first steps will lead to a resolution of your concerns, and for improved service for your father and other clients in the community. If you have further questions or concerns about your father's care, or about communication with Fraser Health staff, I encourage you to continue speaking with staff at the Patient Care Quality Office, as they are in the best position to investigate formal complaints and connect clients and their families with up-to-date information and resources.
- Your advocacy on behalf of your father is admirable, and I hope your future conversations with Fraser Health staff are fruitful. Thank you again for bringing your family's experiences to my attention. I appreciate the opportunity to respond.

There is supposed to be a formal announcement as to the re purpose of this room today. The rumors within Fraser Health staff is that they are looking to have that room run as a general day operation patient area...now I have some huge concerns with this.

- 1. As we all know 3rd floor is death and general population do not belong on the 3rd floor while people are dealing with their grief and death.
- 2. This room is located right beside the elevators where the dead bodies are taken, can you image a person waiting and seeing this...further to this there is a procession that happens after the person dies and that is the area it is done in.
- 3. I feel if we allow Fraser health to start added non end of life care services on the 3rd floor then we are opening our flood gates for them to close a section of the Hospice once Holmberg house opens.

I know in the past they have tried to do something similar and it was stopped and I am asking you to please help us keep our 10 bed Hospice residence just that Hospice care only. I know it is not in the Government's plan to have any Hospice beds close, however I feel that Fraser Health is not being up front with you or us on the use of this room on the Hospice floor. If it is not Hospice related then no other services should be done on this floor. We have worked too hard in this community at maintaining such a high quality Hospice care let's not give that up now.

Please allow people to die with dignity...don't have any other services on this floor. I look forward to hearing back from you and working together to clear this matter up.
