Section 19(3.1) actually has no specific powers in it to delegate.

The specific power it was supposed to be referring to is in Section 19(3.2)(a) which gives the Minister power to disallow a bylaw made by the College under the HPA.

This has happened twice and for the same college (before my time).

We do our best in this branch to work collaboratively with the colleges to avoid using this section of the HPA. I still feel that this power would be best to sit at the branch level as any delay in using this power (we have 60 days in legislation) could make it more difficult to disallow (we have those 60 days to file, to allow us time to review and if necessary disallow).

However I understand from a meeting with the Minister a few months ago that the Minister would like to retain this power.

Minister's Memorandum dated June 9, 2004.

BACKGROUND:

Section 4 (2) of the *Ministry of Health Act* provides that the Minister may, in writing, delegate any or all of the Minister's duties, powers and functions granted or imposed by any Act.

Section 19(3.1) of the *Health Professions Act* (the Act) provides that a bylaw made by the board of a health profession's college comes into force when it is filed with the Minister unless:

- the Minister disallows it for a number of reasons set out in the statute; or
- the board withdraws the bylaw.

In June 2004, then-Minister of Health Colin Hansen delegated the duties, powers, and functions of the Minister under these provisions to any Assistant Deputy Minister or the Executive Director of Legislation and Professional Regulation in the Ministry of Health by way of a letter.

DISCUSSION:

The authority to delegate these functions relating to professional college bylaws was based on the Minister's power under the *Ministry of Health Act*, s. 4(2), which is intended to alleviate the need for the Minister to review and make decisions in respect of a large volume of routine matters arising out of numerous legislative provisions.

While Ministry staff had proposed continuing the delegation of functions under section 19(3.1) of the Act on similar terms by means of a Ministerial order, on August 26, 2015, the Minister of Health decided against renewing the delegations of the Minister's duties, powers and functions.

The Minister has asked the Legislation and Intergovernmental Relations Branch to undertake a review of all delegations of Ministerial authority that have been made under Health legislation and regulations. This note provides background info and a request that you identify a contact person(s) in your divisions or branches for Legislation staff to connect with regarding this initiative and advise Ann Marr of same by Monday November 2.

As you will know, there are a number of delegations of Ministerial authority or statutory powers that have been made over time by former Ministers of Health. Authority to exercise some of these powers has been granted to Ministry staff holding particular offices, while the power to exercise certain other functions has been granted to persons or entities external to the Ministry. In recent years, some such delegations have been made by means of Ministerial orders, which are readily traceable. However, it is apparent that a number of delegations have been made through less formal means, such as by way of a letter. We have located some delegation letters that are over 20 years old, but with the passage of time, it is unclear if the powers delegated therein continue to be exercised as directed, or if the delegation was subsequently rescinded. We understand some delegations were sought and obtained by program area branches without knowledge or involvement of the Legislation Branch. It is unclear whether records have been retained by the branches that obtained delegations.

Over time, Ministry, divisional, and branch names have been changed, amendments to statutes have been made, and delegates have moved on to other roles. As delegated powers are exercised on behalf of the Minister and are in some cases exercised frequently, it is important to have a clear understanding of precisely who is authorized to act, and in what capacity. s.13

Speaking Notes - Health Professions Act (HPA) Delegation Request

Background

- Under s. 19(3) of the HPA, the Minister of Health (or delegate) must file all bylaw amendments submitted by the health profession Colleges in order for the amendments to take effect.
- Under the HPA, a bylaw will come into force 60 days after it is submitted by the college.
- Under s. 19(3.1), the Minister (or delegate) has the authority to declare an early-in-force date that is less than the 60 days. This is done by way of a Ministerial Order.
- Historically, there has been a high volume of minor bylaw amendments that require processing by the Ministry.
- In the past, the authority to accept and file bylaws and shorten notice and filing periods on behalf of the Minister has been delegated to the Director of Professional Regulation, to ensure that the bylaws can be processed and filed in an efficient and effective way, to enable the colleges to continue to meet operational requirements that are legislated under the HPA.
- As a result of internal re-organization and staffing changes, a change in delegation is requested at this time.
- The Professional Regulation and Oversight Branch is requesting delegation to give the new Director
 of Regulatory Initiatives, and the new Executive Director of Professional Regulation and Oversight
 the authority to file bylaws.

• Delegation would give the Assistant Deputy Minister, Health Sector Workforce Division, the authority to approve agreements under s. 20.4(2) promoting cooperation with governing bodies between BC health profession colleges, and health professions in other jurisdictions.

Use of Delegation Authority under the HPA in 2014

- In 2014, 44 bylaw amendments for health profession colleges were filed with the Minister.
- 21 of those amendments required a corresponding Ministerial Order. All Ministerial Orders issued in 2014 with respect to bylaws filed for health profession colleges were used to declare an early-in-force date for a filed bylaw change.
- Signed and filed bylaw amendments were traditionally completed by the previous Director of Professional Regulation, under the delegation of authority under Section 19 of the HPA.
- Delegated authority was not used to refuse to accept a bylaw for deposit under Section 19(3.1) of the HPA in 2014.
- Additionally, no delegated authority was exercised under Section 20.4(2) in 2014.
- A broad range of bylaw amendments were approved and filed last year. The following table describes the key reasons for bylaw amendments that were filed in 2014, and the corresponding number of amendments that were filed for each reason*:
