Measure: Percent of Population Attached to a GP Practice

Percent of Population Attached to a Specific General Practitioner

Years: 2010/2011 - 2014/2015

Measure Specification: 1 Numerator: There are two attachment measures - 1) attached to a GP practice, and

2) attached to a specific GP within that GP practice. A "practice" is a group of GPs working together or a GP (working alone).

First determine attachment at the **GP practice** level, then determine attachment at the **individual GP** level within visits at that practice.

To be attached to a <u>GP practice</u>, requires <u>more than</u> 50% of visits to be at a single practice. A patient's visit history is examined as described below. If a patient had:

- five or greater visits in the most recent fiscal year, all visits in the most recent fiscal year are considered
- fewer than five visits in the most recent fiscal year, go back up to 10 years to find exactly five visits
- only 3 or 4 visits in total looking back up to 10 years, and all three visits were at the same practice (or three out of four visits), this is considered to indicate attachment. This is similar to a majority within 5 visits.
- o <u>an even number of visits (6 or greater) in the most recent fiscal year</u>, also include the next prior visit if possible, to arrive at an odd visit count.

To be attached to an <u>individual GP</u> within that practice requires more than 50% of visits at that practice to be to a single GP (in the practice), where the same rules as above apply (to visits within the practice).

Practices were defined for each of the five fiscal years based on payee and Teleplan number. A payee may represent a solo or group practice, or a group practice may be represented by more than one payee number where an address (postal code) is shared. Teleplan numbers (a.k.a. data centres) with names that appear to indicate data processing centres (or have type other than Practitioner or Clinic) are not used to group payees

Not Attached refers to patients who had sufficient visits for the Attachment algorithm (as described above), but who were not identified as attached. For these patients, no practice provided the clear majority of visits (more than 50%).

Unknown refers to patients who did **not** have sufficient visits for the Attachment algorithm (i.e. fewer than 3 within 10 years).

2 Denominator for percentages: For all percentages (attached, unattached, unknown), the denominator is the count of people in the Mnistry of Health Healthideas Client Roster for the year.



- 3 These rates measure GP attachment across the whole BC Population (people in Ministry of Health Health*ideas* Client Roster), including people for whom no MSP claims information was found in the last 10 years. Please note that the Attachment Algorithm applies to patients who had at least 3 GP visits within the past 10 years. As a result, it misses about 8% of British Columbians (who had fewer than 3 GP visits within the past 10 years): this cohort is categorized as "Unknown".
- 4 Data source: MSP Claims for the fiscal year 2014/2015 <u>and the nine preceding</u> years.

 The same rule applied to each other fiscal year shown.

 Claims must meet the following rules:
 - o All visits to GPs by BC residents are included, except for:
 - o Third party (ICBC, WorkSafeBC, etc)
 - o Claims for newborns under the mother's PHN
 - o Lab, diagnostic, surcharge & no charge items, and tray fees
 - o Services in hospital, identified by service location
 - o Encounter fees (\$0) provided by APP and PBF physicians are included, where submitted
 - o Encounter fees (\$0) provided by Nurse Practitioners are not included
 - One visit is defined as the unique combination of provider (at practice or GP level), patient, and service date. Non face-to-face encounters are included in the definition of visit.
- 5 MSP claims for the 10 fiscal years of services (used to apply the algorithm to each year) are all paid up to September 30 of the last fiscal year. Please see Notes below.
- 6 HA is based on the address (postal code) of each patient as stored in the Ministry of Health Healthideas Client Roster for the fiscal year.

2014/2015 data, 10 years ending March 31, 2015, paid to September 30, 2015; 2013/2014 data, 10 years ending March 31, 2014, paid to September 30, 2014; 2012/2013 data, 10 years ending March 31, 2013, paid to September 30, 2013; 2011/2012 data, 10 years ending March 31, 2012, paid to September 30, 2012; 2010/2011 data, 10 years ending March 31, 2011, paid to September 30, 2011;
