I know that you are well familiar with Nanaimo Regional General Hospital (NRGH) and its importance to the hundreds of thousands of central and northern Vancouver Island residents who depend on its services.

I am writing today with respect to the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) which I understand is the oldest and in the greatest need of an upgrade in British Columbia.

The proposal is for a new building which will be constructed to house the ICU, and a transition floor. It will be located directly across from the Emergency Department, next to the Imaging Department. Patient care would not be affected during the construction of a new ICU, which is estimated to take from design to doors open, approximately two years.

My understanding is that the proposed cost of the building is in the range of \$28 M. As you are aware 40% would come from the Nanaimo Regional Hospital District. As well, the Nanaimo & District Hospital Foundation, an amazing charity, has agreed to provide \$5 M towards the purchase of all the medical equipment and its infrastructure in the new ICU building. 

RE: Exit HEABC

January 30, 2018

Background

The New Vista Society Board of Directors has unanimously voted on January 25, 2018 to support the Senior. Leadership team to leave the Health Employers Association of BC, HEABC.

What is the Plan?

- Apply to HEABC to leave the Master Agreement in Feb. 2018.
- Advise stakeholders in advance to reduce concerns and rumours.
- Once approved, start the agreement negotiation process in Summer/Fall 2019, with a local agreement to start April 2019.
- New Vista would bring in a consultant to assist with negotiations.
- Subject to negotiation, we desire to maintain the wage scales and pension plan that are in place now.
- Potentially move to one collective agreement or certification.

Why?

- We feel it is in the long term interests of our employees and the Society to have more innovation and flexibility in negotiating agreements than the Master Agreement offers.
- New Vista is the last large Care Home in the province to remain under the Master Agreement and it is time for us to change.
- There is longstanding trend in the care industry to have localized agreements as the Master Agreement is more suited to the large Health Authorities than a one site operation.
- We feel a local agreement allows us to negotiate terms, conditions and benefits that are most important to the staff that work here, as HEABC affiliate issues get lost in the negotiation process.
- Annual funding has not kept up to the negotiated terms and conditions of the Master Agreement, and hasn't for decades.
- The application of the Master Agreement in the workplace is increasingly complex and more suited to a large HR department, not a unit of 1.4 people as New Vista has.
- While we expect the question to arise, we have no current plans to "contract-out".

I have read keeping the elderly in their own homes is the preferred model, but there really is no support (other than private) that can actually facilitate this as it stands now. I read and hear of programs, yet when my family tries to access these programs, it turns out in reality, that there are very limited resources. Seems good on paper or on a nice web page on the internet, but these programs are really just a facade.

Why is there no home support for cognitive decline/geriatric mental health? Why is geriatric mental health/dementia community support not a separate entity from mental health? These two very different needs.

s.22 Hospitals need geriatric beds/specialty areas. Dementia patients display very unique and challenging symptoms of in and out of rationality within minutes sometimes. The denial/lack of insight of having dementia or mental illness is so strong, called anosognosia, there is no convincing the person to seek help. Psych wards in urban hospitals are chaotic band-aid solutions that are housing the most vulnerable-psychotic and or suicide attempt clients. Where does one go if these two criteria are not met but other serious illnesses are present? They are simply turned away at the ER and told to contact their family doctor.

For the elderly, help must go to them...this is the nature of the illnesses involved with mental illness and the elderly, \$.22 s.22
