Please note that the ratification phase is highly sensitive and requires confidentiality around any details of the tentative agreement itself while the unions and employers communicate to respective members.

They will also issue a news release in early afternoon with same info. HEABC will provide an update to its board and member-employers early today. Government's information bulletin will be distributed later in the afternoon.

I wish to express my appreciation for your call this afternoon. I am grateful you took the time to discuss this issue in detail, and for your reaction to my suggestion to change the context in which health professions in the province deal with this issue.

I note that the pertussis vaccine was approved in Canada in 1943 so you are correct that I might have been born at the right time. My contracting pertussis in December is evidence that the protection provided weakens with age. This may be an issue for the BCCDC to address so messaging on the subject takes the 1943 date into consideration (or the date on which the pertussis vaccination was provided as a matter of routine to children in the province.) The new, expanded ED will be achieved through a combination of internal renovations to the existing ED, expansion into renovated adjacent space and construction of net new space.

In order to expedite the ED project, the renovations and new construction are planned to be delivered via two concurrent strategically-integrated scope packages (package #1 and package #2) that take advantage of the current Eagle Ridge Hospital configuration, which includes large overhanging areas. It is the intent of the project to infill these areas for the ED expansion, thereby reducing the cost of new construction and the construction schedule.

Pre-construction work is complete and many of the construction activities included in package #1 have completed and/or started. Package #1 includes procurement of the construction manager, design development, geotechnical drilling, construction demolition, communications closet construction and construction drawings. The hours of operation were intentionally adjusted and Fort St John is confident that they will meet their target. After reviewing their wait lists and some other considerations, they made these adjustments to the operating hours to maintain a sustainable access expectation. It should be noted that unlike MRI units in the Lower Mainland, Fort St John does not receive patient referrals outside their catchment areas and so there is not the same demand for this unit as others."

Smithers Mayor Bachrach has taken a position that NHA pay for off site municipal infrastructure improvements as part of the Smithers CT scanner project in accordance to a 2016 municipal bylaw that imposes a form of development charges.

-under this bylaw any building permit application with an estimated value of construction greater than \$100,000, the applicant is required to provide for off-site works and services. Off-site works and services are considered to be upgrades for items such as streets, curbs, sidewalks, and sewers that are contiguous with the owner's property lines.

Among other things, improving the sidewalk, exterior municipal infrastructure is not directly connected to the work involved in installing the CT scanner as this hospital improvement is isolated to the interior of the site. Moreover, NHA has noted that its experience to date is that development charges in other municipalities are only applied where the area of the building is increased in size or modifications are made to the exterior of the building or the site which may impact on Town services, neither of which is the case in this instance.

NHA had previously received approval for a variance from the bylaw for upgrades to the radiology room at the hospital in Smithers. On November 8, 2018, NHA applied for another variance from the bylaw for the installation of the CT scanner. While the overall project budget for the CT scanner and its installation is \$2.9 million, the Town recognizes that only \$350,000 can be considered building construction and applicable for consideration with regards to the bylaw.

NHA again applied for a variance to the bylaw but was unsuccessful this time. As a compromise of sorts, the council did vote to cut the off site works costs imposed via the bylaw on this project after the motion to exempt it did not pass by a 4-3 vote

There is now a stand off between NHA and the Smithers Council on the future of the CT scanner project.^{s.16}

The CT scanner project was made possible with \$1.75 million in donated funds, largely through the Bulkley Valley Health Care and Hospital Foundation and a \$1.6-million donation to the foundation by Telkwa's Fritz Pfeiffer.

Hi Lucy,

Thanks for taking my call today and for passing this information along to Ministry staff. As I recounted over the phone, we are trying to navigate a challenging situation involving renovations at the Bulkley Valley District Hospital. Here is the situation:

- Northern Health is undertaking a renovation at BV District Hospital to accommodate a CT scanner that was generously donated by a community member. The entire project is valued at \$2.98 million and the renovation alone is costing \$970,000.
- Anytime a building permit for more than \$100,000 is issued, Smithers Bylaw 1800 (Subdivision Servicing and Development Standards) requires that property owners bring the off-site infrastructure along their property frontage up to the municipal standard. The hospital property is quite large, so complying with the bylaw for the entire property frontage would have cost an estimated \$500,000.
- Our town staff recommended that council waive the majority of the required work, and only require \$130,000 of upgrades to the property's frontage. This includes widening the paved surface of the street, installing curb and gutter, and installing storm drainage. Our staff see these works as important upgrades.
- On November 27, Town Council voted to support the staff recommendation and require the limited off-site work.
- In response to our vote, Northern Health has put the CT scanner project on hold, causing significant anxiety in the community. Because the original letter from Northern Health indicated it may cancel the CT project all together if required to comply with the bylaw, people are very concerned that years of community fundraising is now in jeopardy.
- Since November 27, I have been in daily contact with Northern Health staff, but they have not been able to provide me with an indication of whether they intend to comply with bylaw requirements or not. There has been no public communication to indicate they are willing to work with us towards a solution.
- Our next council meeting is tomorrow evening, December 11. A community protest is organized in opposition to town council's decision to uphold our bylaw requirements.

The Town of Smithers has worked hard over the past several years to build a positive relationship with Northern Health and the Ministry of Health. We would very much appreciate an indication of whether Northern Health intends to comply with our bylaw so we can decide on our next steps and give the community some assurance that the much-needed CT scanner is moving ahead.

"I have spoken to Mr. Warawa in person about MAID, as he well knows. He has expressed his views clearly and I understand them very well. The House of Commons of which he is a Member in fact dealt with the issue. In 2016, the federal government passed legislation making it legal for Canadians who meet very strict health criteria to have a doctor or nurse practitioner assist them with their death. The bill identified Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) as a service that all provinces provide to any individual who meets the stringent criteria. In B.C., patients access the service through our regional health authorities, their facilities, and their staff. As I understand it, he had every right to participate in that debate and did so.

Mr. Warawa seems to think that this issue is about him, his rights, his ideological views. He has expressed his views to me and has a platform in the House of Commons which I am sure he will continue to exercise. I wish him well.

My concern however is not Mr. Warawa but always about the people of BC.

British Columbia is a leader in taking on the difficult task of encouraging people to consider these significant end-of-life and healthcare issues, and allowing them to make choices in how they unfold. We are a leader in organ donation. And through B.C.'s Representation Agreement Act, we are a leader in how we set out in our wills our wishes and instructions for key parts of our end-of-life medical care. Ensuring that MAiD can be accessed by patients who meet the stringent criteria puts the onus on us — and our healthcare facilities — to ensure patients' move to this end-of-life choice is free of friction and the additional suffering it causes.

For all of us, there is more consideration of — and action towards — end of life choices and the health services to attend them. Medical assistance in dying is a complex issue but it is now part of that undertaking. In the short time since the federal legislation was passed, B.C. is fulfilling the commitment to provide medical assistance in dying to those who request it. Putting the patient first, guided by the rule of law and all that makes us a compassionate society, will continue to move us forward.

And by continuing to work together to perfect that balance, the end of a patient's life will be as compassionate and sympathetic to the individual as we would want the living of that life to be."

- Local government has asked Island Health to fund the sharps pick up program again, and we are exploring options with our community partners, including the FNHA, municipalities, service providers and the Community Action Team.
- Island Health has approached needle recovery as a shared responsibility between local governments, health authorities, community agencies, individuals and people who use needles.

Hi Lucy,

Thanks for taking my call today and for passing this information along to Ministry staff. As I recounted over the phone, we are trying to navigate a challenging situation involving renovations at the Bulkley Valley District Hospital. Here is the situation:

- Northern Health is undertaking a renovation at BV District Hospital to accommodate a CT scanner that was generously donated by a community member. The entire project is valued at \$2.98 million and the renovation alone is costing \$970,000.
- Anytime a building permit for more than \$100,000 is issued, Smithers Bylaw 1800 (Subdivision Servicing and Development Standards) requires that property owners bring the off-site infrastructure along their property frontage up to the municipal standard. The hospital property is quite large, so complying with the bylaw for the entire property frontage would have cost an estimated \$500,000.
- Our town staff recommended that council waive the majority of the required work, and only require \$130,000 of upgrades to the property's frontage. This includes widening the paved surface of the street, installing curb and gutter, and installing storm drainage. Our staff see these works as important upgrades.
- On November 27, Town Council voted to support the staff recommendation and require the limited off-site work.
- In response to our vote, Northern Health has put the CT scanner project on hold, causing significant anxiety in the community. Because the original letter from Northern Health indicated it may cancel the CT project all together if required to comply with the bylaw, people are very concerned that years of community fundraising is now in jeopardy.
- Since November 27, I have been in daily contact with Northern Health staff, but they have not been able to provide me with an indication of whether they intend to comply with bylaw requirements or not. There has been no public communication to indicate they are willing to work with us towards a solution.
- Our next council meeting is tomorrow evening, December 11. A community protest is organized in opposition to town council's decision to uphold our bylaw requirements.

The Town of Smithers has worked hard over the past several years to build a positive relationship with Northern Health and the Ministry of Health. We would very much appreciate an indication of whether Northern Health intends to comply with our bylaw so we can decide on our next steps and give the community some assurance that the much-needed CT scanner is moving ahead.

Summary:

- Overall there was an increase of 12.25 hours per week from November 2018 to December 2018.

- Majority of the operating hours remained the same except for two facilities, in which:

- 1.The second MRI at Vancouver General is now at 24/7 status as well (increase of 16 hours per week); and

- 2.Fort St John had a decrease of 3.75 hours per week.The hours of operation were intentionally adjusted and Fort St John is confident that they will meet their target. After reviewing their wait lists and some other considerations, they made these adjustments to the operating hours to maintain a sustainable access expectation. It should be noted that unlike MRI units in the Lower Mainland, Fort St John does not receive patient referrals outside their catchment areas and so there is not the same demand for this unit as others.

Hi Minister and Jas,

Yes – one of the recommendations in the report is to incrementally reduce the wait time for autism assessment to 3 months (12 weeks) – less than half the PHSA benchmark.

"That the Ministry of Health take steps to incrementally decrease the wait times to three months for completed assessments of autism and complex behavioural developmental conditions across the province.

"Wait times to be reduced to nine months by Sept. 30, 2019; to six months by Sept. 30, 2020; and to three months by Sept. 30, 2021."

This is the rationale for our tempered response to the recommendations – that we accept the intent of them, rather than that we accept them fully.

With respect to PHSA – yes, they have also been contacted by Catherine with the same questions. They are looking into whether or not one of their Children's representatives would be able to speak to the work being done to improve wait times provincially, in case that is the preference.

In October we responded to Catherine on wait times for autism assessment in BC – that they were 55.5 weeks. She is looking to get an update on those numbers, provincially and regionally. She would also like an interview with Minister Dix on this topic, tying to the RCY report which was released yesterday.

Background

The report followed the case of an Indigenous youth, "Charlie," who had critical injuries, waited over a year for an autism assessment and was also receiving MCFD and primary care services. Charlie's poor health outcomes were primarily due to his complex medical needs and that his primary caregivers struggled to effectively connect with the health care system, due in part to failures within the system to provide continuity of care.

The report also mentions a number of health system and physician-related issues that played a role in Charlie's deteriorating health:

- Long wait for autism assessment: it took over one year (68 weeks) for Charlie to have his first autism assessment after the original referral date.
- Physician prescribed medications without direct contact with Charlie on several occasions. Prescribing without direct patient contact is against the standard of medical practice and the College of Physicians and Surgeons' professional guidelines (<https://www.cpsbc.ca/files/pdf/PSG-Prescribing-Practices-Countersigning-Prescriptions-Internet-Prescribing.pdf>).
- Missed opportunity for intervention due to gaps in information sharing: the CPSU psychiatrist's report on the mother (mildly situationally depressed) and recommendations (for a case manager for Charlie's family, assistance with transportation to appointments and school, a dietitian for nutritional improvement, regular respite for the mother) never reached the MCFD child protection worker. The child protection worker's only note on file was that the mother was not depressed, and the services recommended by the psychiatrist were never provided.
- Failure of the various workers to physically observe Charlie on visits to the home.

If the Minister does this interview, it is likely that the reporter will ask:

What does the Minister have to say in response to this damning RCY report, and about the care that Charlie received?

I appreciate the work that the BC Representative for Children and Youth has done on this important report. What Charlie endured is horrifying and we hope no B.C. child or youth will have to go through similar experiences in the future. Charlie's story is a terrible illustration of how children in B.C. have been able to fall through the cracks – from his first referral for autism services in January 2008, until he finally received his assessment in July 2009, through to multiple other interactions with the health and social services system all the way up until 2016.

My ministry will be working closely with the Ministry of Children and Family Development to ensure that we are able to better serve children like Charlie in the future. We are both committed to addressing the failings outlined in this report and ensuring that our children are protected and cared for.

How does the Ministry respond to the recommendations in the report for Health?

I join with my colleague Minister Conroy in accepting the intent of all of the representative's recommendations. We will be working with the Ministry of Children and Family Development to develop a plan for early identification, timely assessment and accessible supports for children with signs of developmental delay.

One of RCY's suggestions for our ministry is to embed health services within communities and strengthen relationships between health practitioners and community agencies. We agree with the RCY that better integrated healthcare services in communities is very important, and it is exactly what we want to achieve through team-based care.

The Ministry of Mental Health and Addictions is working to develop and implement the Health and Addictions Strategy, and a key focus of their strategy will be to: improve access to services including early intervention, prevent problems before they occur, improve and protect the mental health and well-being of children, youth and Indigenous peoples.

While not a focus of the recommendations in the report, it is possible that the reporter will ask about the physician outlined in the report who repeatedly prescribed medication for Charlie, without actually seeing him.:

Prescribing medication is a medical act. Under the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC's "Prescribing Practices, Countersigning Prescriptions and Internet Prescribing Professional Guidelines for Physicians", prescribing should not take place without an evaluation which 'should be based on a face-to-face encounter with the patient which includes the usual elements of clinical assessment such as the taking of a history'.

We and the College expect all B.C. Physicians and Surgeons to adhere to the standards of medical practice and the College's professional guidelines. Members of the public who believe that a physician has not met a care standard,

including prescribing without direct patient contact, can submit a complaint to the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC.

If a complaint is submitted to the College, the College will collect the relevant information including a review of medical records, written statements and refer it to the Inquiry Committee.

Hi Minister and Jas,

Yes – one of the recommendations in the report is to incrementally reduce the wait time for autism assessment to 3 months (12 weeks) – less than half the PHSA benchmark.

“That the Ministry of Health take steps to incrementally decrease the wait times to three months for completed assessments of autism and complex behavioural developmental conditions across the province.

“Wait times to be reduced to nine months by Sept. 30, 2019; to six months by Sept. 30, 2020; and to three months by Sept. 30, 2021.”

This is the rationale for our tempered response to the recommendations – that we accept the intent of them, rather than that we accept them fully.

With respect to PHSA – yes, they have also been contacted by Catherine with the same questions. They are looking into whether or not one of their Children's representatives would be able to speak to the work being done to improve wait times provincially, in case that is the preference.

Request

In October we responded to Catherine on wait times for autism assessment in BC – that they were 55.5 weeks. She is looking to get an update on those numbers, provincially and regionally. She would also like an interview with Minister Dix on this topic, tying to the RCY report which was released yesterday.

Background

The report followed the case of an Indigenous youth, "Charlie," who had critical injuries, waited over a year for an autism assessment and was also receiving MCFD and primary care services. Charlie's poor health outcomes were

primarily due to his complex medical needs and that his primary caregivers struggled to effectively connect with the health care system, due in part to failures within the system to provide continuity of care.

The report also mentions a number of health system and physician-related issues that played a role in Charlie's deteriorating health:

- Long wait for autism assessment: it took over one year (68 weeks) for Charlie to have his first autism assessment after the original referral date.
- Physician prescribed medications without direct contact with Charlie on several occasions. Prescribing without direct patient contact is against the standard of medical practice and the College of Physicians and Surgeons' professional guidelines (<https://www.cpsbc.ca/files/pdf/PSG-Prescribing-Practices-Countersigning-Prescriptions-Internet-Prescribing.pdf>).
- Missed opportunity for intervention due to gaps in information sharing: the CPSU psychiatrist's report on the mother (mildly situationally depressed) and recommendations (for a case manager for Charlie's family, assistance with transportation to appointments and school, a dietitian for nutritional improvement, regular respite for the mother) never reached the MCFD child protection worker. The child protection worker's only note on file was that the mother was not depressed, and the services recommended by the psychiatrist were never provided.
- Failure of the various workers to physically observe Charlie on visits to the home.

If the Minister does this interview, it is likely that the reporter will ask:

What does the Minister have to say in response to this damning RCY report, and about the care that Charlie received?

I appreciate the work that the BC Representative for Children and Youth has done on this important report. What Charlie endured is horrifying and we hope no B.C. child or youth will have to go through similar experiences in the

future. Charlie's story is a terrible illustration of how children in B.C. have been able to fall through the cracks – from his first referral for autism services in January 2008, until he finally received his assessment in July 2009, through to multiple other interactions with the health and social services system all the way up until 2016.

My ministry will be working closely with the Ministry of Children and Family Development to ensure that we are able to better serve children like Charlie in the future. We are both committed to addressing the failings outlined in this report and ensuring that our children are protected and cared for.

How does the Ministry respond to the recommendations in the report for Health?

I join with my colleague Minister Conroy in accepting the intent of all of the representative's recommendations. We will be working with the Ministry of Children and Family Development to develop a plan for early identification, timely assessment and accessible supports for children with signs of developmental delay.

One of RCY's suggestions for our ministry is to embed health services within communities and strengthen relationships between health practitioners and community agencies. We agree with the RCY that better integrated healthcare services in communities is very important, and it is exactly what we want to achieve through team-based care.

The Ministry of Mental Health and Addictions is working to develop and implement the Health and Addictions Strategy, and a key focus of their strategy will be to: improve access to services including early intervention, prevent problems before they occur, improve and protect the mental health and well-being of children, youth and Indigenous peoples.

While not a focus of the recommendations in the report, it is possible that the reporter will ask about the physician outlined in the report who repeatedly prescribed medication for Charlie, without actually seeing him.:

Prescribing medication is a medical act. Under the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC's "Prescribing Practices, Countersigning Prescriptions and Internet Prescribing Professional Guidelines for Physicians", prescribing should not take place without an evaluation which 'should be based on a face-to-face encounter with the patient which includes the usual elements of clinical assessment such as the taking of a history'.

We and the College expect all B.C. Physicians and Surgeons to adhere to the standards of medical practice and the College's professional guidelines. Members of the public who believe that a physician has not met a care standard, including prescribing without direct patient contact, can submit a complaint to the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC.

If a complaint is submitted to the College, the College will collect the relevant information including a review of medical records, written statements and refer it to the Inquiry Committee.

Below are program area responses to the three action items:

1/ In the wake of Isobel moving positions, is there a new dedicated MOH point person on these applications?

Isobel continues to be the point person. She is in the same job and has the same email and phone number.

2/ Training of HIBC staff regarding applications of BC newborns whose parents are 'non residents'.

Requested HIBC remind adjudication staff of eligibility and wait period requirements for BC born children born to parents with legal status of visitor. Are there specific cases requiring attention at this time?

3/ The revision of the msp enrollment form to allay parents fears that the MOH will contact immigration authorities if they enroll their children, and to provide the revised forms to advocates for feedback. Specifically the point under part 4 of the form that reads " the Ministry of Health and/or Health Insurance BC may verify this information with immigration authorities, law enforcement authorities, and other public authorities, agencies and persons as appropriate" is identified by advocates as deterring parents from enrolling their bc born children. Former ADM Walman gave assurances information collected via MSP enrollment is not shared with the Canadian Border Agency, and to look at fixing the form if that is the underlying problem to registration, or its adjudication (and I will extrapolate if it is both, then both issues would be addressed).

MSP does not share information with CBSA. The Eligibility and Compliance Unit (ECEU) may, with signed permission of the beneficiary, submit a request for border crossing information on beneficiaries actively enrolled in MSP who choose to provide evidence to ECEU to complement other information they provide to support their residency information.

MSP also verifies annual net income with CRA for beneficiaries who apply for Premium Assistance and Supplementary Benefits. The application form includes a line for written authorization for MSP to do so. Applications for these income based programs are optional for beneficiaries.

Program area have also confirmed that they will be setting up a meeting with all parties. I will let you know that the date of that is once it is scheduled.

Improving residential care on Vancouver Island

NANAIMO – Seniors on Vancouver Island are benefitting from a more than \$6.4 million investment in 2018-19 to increase staffing levels and ensure that seniors get the care they need in residential care homes.

This is in year one of a three-year plan to increase direct care seniors receive in residential care on Vancouver Island and across the province to reach 3.36 care hours per-resident-day, on average across health authorities by 2021.

"We are taking action towards meeting the goal of 3.36 care hours-per-resident-day," said Adrian Dix, Minister of Health. "This standard of care for long term care was set over a decade ago, and was not achieved. It is now, under the plan Premier John Horgan announced earlier this year, clear action is being taken to meet this target.

"Our government is delivering on our commitment to improve seniors care, and have increased staffing for seniors' care on Vancouver Island, with 50,000 more direct care hours to be provided in this region in this fiscal year alone. For seniors, this means they are getting the help they need with day-to-day care and the quality of care they deserve," said Dix.

The more than \$6.4 million investment in care hours on Vancouver Island is part of the \$48 million being allocated to health authorities in 2018-19 to fund over one million more hours of direct care. This increased funding for residential care is the first allocation in the three year investment of \$240 million to increase direct care seniors receive to 3.36 per resident day announced by Premier John Horgan in September 2018. In 2016, the average direct care hours in British Columbia was just 3.11 per resident-day.

Nanaimo and Parksville are among the Island communities benefiting under this plan. Almost \$1.9 million is being invested in more direct care hours at eight residential care facilities in these communities.. Already more than 21,000 additional care hours have been provided in the region.

Increasing the staff hours in residential care homes in Nanaimo and Parksville is just one of a number of health-care improvements in the region. These include:

- \$75 million over the three years announced in June 2018 to expand respite care and adult day programs.
- As part of this, nine new respite beds with 24-hour nursing support to eligible community members have been added to Kiwanis Village Lodge in Nanaimo.
- A new intensive care unit at Nanaimo Regional Hospital, announced in November 2018 will offer improved care for critically ill patients and better meet the needs of a growing and aging population. Work on the building is expected to start in early 2020 and be ready for patients in late 2021.
- In addition, 30 new permanent full-time paramedic positions and three additional ambulances are being added to better support people living in Nanaimo, Parksville, Qualicum Beach and Ladysmith.


Terese Marie Mailout, *Heart Berries: A Memoir*


Kim Thuy, *Vi*

Esi Eduyon, *Washington Black*

I didn't read these two books back-to-back but I recommend doing so. Thuy lives in Montreal, Eduyon in Victoria, and they have written books that have captivated readers well beyond Canada's borders.



The story follows its lead character, Washington Black, from Barbados to Virginia, to the Arctic, Nova Scotia, London, Amsterdam, and Morocco, with bounty hunters in pursuit. It is a meditation on freedom—its form and limitation—on terror which has no limitations, and just a great read.

Ken Dryden, *Game Change: The Life and Death of Steve Montador and the Future of Hockey*

Dryden's love of the game continues but he is calling for a "game change" here, and the need to stop putting safety and player's health at risk to play the game they and we love. It is hard to watch hockey or football (or MMA or boxing) in the same way again after reading this and knowing what we now know about the health effects of impact sports on the people that play them. ISLAND HEALTH– NANAIMO UPCC

SELECTION PROCESS

-A Community GP think tank was initiated to bring together local practitioners from all Nanaimo Family Practice clinics. The group is led by a Community Medical Director and met three times to discuss the Urgent Primary Care Centre initiative with goal on gaining consensus on a site location for March 2019 operations.

-At the December 11 meeting the group came to the decision that the Medical Arts Clinic was the preferred site based on readiness early on. The clinic has expressed interest and their GP representative will take the decision back to the clinic for a final vote by all clinic GPs.

-The Medical Arts Clinic is located in the South end of Nanaimo which has the largest attachment gap and poorest socioeconomic status.

-Final Clinical services model will be submitted to the Ministry for mid-January.

PROPOSED MODEL

-Service Objective: To provide consistent same-day access to primary care for patients with care needs that need to be attended to within 12-24 hours.

-Service Availability

oProposed hours of operation based on discussions with Medical Arts are 8am-9pm, 7 days/week. Weekend extended hours may require a phased approach pending recruitment.

-Model

oPrimary care services provided using team-based care that would include GPs, nursing, MHSU, and MOAs.

oCompensation model under development. Proposed model includes Physicians on FFS for direct patient care with sessional funding for team based and indirect care. Physicians with established primary care practices will be given first priority to work in the UPCC.

oNursing staff will be on service contract with the Health Authority for UPCC, hired and managed by clinic.

-Budget and Resources

- oAdditional team-based care to include MHSU and MOAs.

- oAnticipate Minor Equipment Needs and tenant improvements.

- oBasic in office urgent primary care
