Sharing some additional QA's relating to Nanaimo. I don't think this will come up as this isn't a modular event. But wanted to flag with you anyways. We have two modular openings tomorrow. Again I don't think it will come up and we're not expecting much media.

Some additional QA's for tomorrow around Nanaimo and modulars.

Q: The RCMP in Nanaimo reported a dramatic increase in crime since the opening of the two modulars there. Should the community be worried about the same happening here?

A: The situation in Nanaimo was unique as the new housing had to be provided within a sixweek period, and increased calls for service were expected due to the rapid relocation of many vulnerable people.

A Community Advisory Committee is part of every supportive housing project and includes representation from BC Housing, the community and police - to make sure concerns are addressed quickly and that the neighbours are part of the problem-solving on issues as they arise.

Q: In light of the increase in crime in Nanaimo, will you consider different/better safety measures at this modular site?

A: The safety of residents, staff and the surrounding community is a priority in all of our supportive housing projects.

The situation in Nanaimo was unique as the new housing had to be provided within a six-week period, and increased calls for service were expected due to the rapid relocation of many vulnerable people.

This building, like all others, will have experienced staff present <u>24/7</u>. Residents will have proper IDs and will be buzzed in by staff at the reception.

A community advisory committee with representatives from staff, BC Housing, police and the neighbouring community will also ensure that everyone is part of problem-solving any issues as they arise.

Here are my answers to your questions. Please excuse my grammar or typos. I hope you enjoy my thoughts about Taiwanese food.

- 1. ≥ Why was Taiwan chosen as one of the culinary events this year in the programming of the festival? This is an application based event to Asian Heritage Month Society ExplorAsian 2019. It just so happens that Taipei Economic Cultural Office, in a timely coincidence, is bringing two famous Taiwanese Chef's to promote Taiwanese Culinary Art here in Vancouver, as well, provide an opportunity for people to enroll in their program. "find back", reminisce, or keep up to date with the latest trends of Taiwanese culinary trends.
- 2. > What are the misconceptions as well as little-known facts about Taiwanese cuisine (and that these events then try to address)? Taiwanese Culinary Art is in fact an art in itself. Not only are Taiwanese foods beautiful to look at, architecturally impressive, aesthetically pleasing, and can be thematic in colors and seasons of food. Some misconceptions of Taiwanese food is that there will always be white rice to every meal, that we all know how to make fried rice, that we eat gyoza (which is Japanese dumplings). Sweet and sour soup, which is one of my favorites, is popular and similar in Asian countries but most popular in Hong Kong style cuisine, but less in Taiwan. There are no fortune cookies in Taiwanese cuisine, nor can you purchase them in Taiwan. It was invented by a Hong Kong immigrant living in San Francisco at the time. Taiwanese cuisine is world famous for its night market food; and comes in a fantastic variety of choices from drinks, to skwers, to sweets and savories, to cookies and of course, the DEEP FRIED FOOD. The food at the night market are ridiculously cheap and delicious. I have gone back to Taiwan for short trips and found that I can spend less than \$10 for a huge buffet of food that would take me through several kilometers of food trucks.
 - 3. > How would you describe the Taiwanese cuisine in Vancouver versus the more known Asian cuisine of China or Japan (sushis)? When I eat Taiwanese food, I describe it to my friends who are trying it for the first time that it is like tasting "dance" or tasting "fireworks" in one's mouth. While Japanese food are delicious, they tend to give me the impression of fresh, healthy, and in comparison to Taiwanese food, much more subtle in taste. China is a huge country and continent. Each and every one of their regions have a different style of cuisine, use of spice, and depending on geographical region, would focus either on particular proteins, seafood or vegetables. Because Taiwan is a such a progressive culture, with chef travelling afar to be educated and bring back inspirations, one can taste the "traditional Taiwanese food or snacks" which we term go-za-bee; as well, the artistic fusion of international flavors with Taiwanese food. Hence, my suggestion of tasting "dance or fireworks" means that it is full of flavor, colors, spices, and tastes that are so original and out of this world. They can be in the form of desserts, appetizers, main dishes, and even soup! Also, important for young taste buds, Bubble Tea is a creation of Taiwan. The amazing Q-Q or chewy texture of the giant tapioca pearls are the creative innovations of Taiwanese chefs. Now, not only are there white sugary pearls, pearls now come in match, taro, black sugar, and so many other creative flavors.
 - 4. > Why are there less restaurants of that cuisine in Vancouver, when other Asian communities are more represented? There are many restaurants and cafes owned or operated by Taiwanese-Canadians, but not everyone wants to cook or create Taiwanese cuisine. For example one of many people's favorite Taiwanese restaurant is Kalvin's Szechuan Restaurant in Vancouver. It is owned by a Taiwanese Family, yet it is a fusion of Taiwanese food and Szechuan. Even the word, Taiwan is not in the name of the restaurant, but everyone who dines there know that it is the flavor of Taiwan. Vancouver is a place where the world comes together. I thoughts are that fusion food or inspired food have become a more common place than that of solely one ethnic food. For example, it is not uncommon in Burnaby to see Chinese Indian Restaurants. So, talk to your Taiwanese friends and ask them where to find their favorite Taiwanese restaurants.
 - 5. > How has the Taiwanese cuisine scene evolve over the years in Vancouver according to

you? There has been few new traditional Taiwanese restaurants in Vancouver over the years, in comparison to Chinese regional restaurants or Japanese restaurants. Taiwan was under the influence (occupation) of Japan during the WWII. Since then, Taiwanese people love Japanese food and many Taiwanese restaurant owners operate Japanese Cuisine.

6. > What are the specific culinary skills Chefs of Taiwanese cuisine must have? (this is too technical for me)

- 7. > What is the Taiwanese dish that makes your heart beat in particular and why? I am from the city Chang-Hua, and I love Chang-Hua meatballs. Taiwanese meatballs comes in various styles. It has a glutenous outer wrap with meet and bamboo shoots, usually fatty pork, and green onions. The meat ball various in the inside of how it is compacted according to the regional taste (in Taiwan) The most popular one, of course is from Chang-Hua, middle regional city of Taiwan. Taiwanese meatball can be steamed, boiled in high heat oil, or deep fried in hot hot oil until the glutinous rice outer layer is crisp, yet still chewy. What makes my heart beat is the crispy yet chewy outer layer, the bamboo shoots mixed with fatty pork, and last of never the least is the Taiwanese sweat and sour sauce that is pour on top of the Taiwanese meatball.
- 8. > Anything you would like to add for people who are considering joining the event this year? I would encourage everyone to check out this event because Taiwan is such a small, but beautiful island. Though small in geography, it is big on taste. The passion of the Taiwanese people to eat and enjoy food is something for everyone to discover for themselves.

In total, over \$6 million in grants and more than 170 local organizations and projects – led by community not-for-profits, and school districts – will receive funding through this grant program in 2018-19. Since 2006, the Crime Prevention and Remediation grant program has provided more than \$39 million to help organizations throughout B.C. to further their crime prevention efforts.

- 1. > Why was Taiwan chosen as one of the culinary events this year in the programming of the festival? This is an application based event to Asian Heritage Month Society ExplorAsian 2019. It just so happens that Taipei Economic Cultural Office, in a timely coincidence, is bringing two famous Taiwanese Chef's to promote Taiwanese Culinary Art here in Vancouver, as well, provide an opportunity for people to enroll in their program. "find back", reminisce, or keep up to date with the latest trends of Taiwanese culinary trends.
- 2. > What are the misconceptions as well as little-known facts about Taiwanese cuisine (and that these events then try to address)? Taiwanese Culinary Art is in fact an art in itself. Not only are Taiwanese foods beautiful to look at, architecturally impressive, aesthetically pleasing, and can be thematic in colors and seasons of food. Some misconceptions of Taiwanese food is that there will always be white rice to every meal, that we all know how to make fried rice, that we eat gyoza (which is Japanese dumplings). Sweet and sour soup, which is one of my favorites, is popular and similar in Asian countries but most popular in Hong Kong style cuisine, but less in Taiwan. There are no fortune cookies in Taiwanese cuisine, nor can you purchase them in Taiwan. It was invented by a Hong Kong immigrant living in San Francisco at the time. Taiwanese cuisine is world famous for its night market food; and comes in a fantastic variety of choices from drinks, to skwers, to sweets and savories, to cookies and of course, the DEEP FRIED FOOD. The food at the night market are ridiculously cheap and delicious. I have gone back to Taiwan for short trips and found that I can spend less than \$10 for a huge buffet of food that would take me through several kilometers of food trucks.
 - 3. > How would you describe the Taiwanese cuisine in Vancouver versus the more known Asian cuisine of China or Japan (sushis)? When I eat Taiwanese food, I describe it to my friends who are trying it for the first time that it is like tasting "dance" or tasting "fireworks" in one's mouth. While Japanese food are delicious, they tend to give me the impression of fresh, healthy, and in comparison to Taiwanese food, much more subtle in taste. China is a huge country and continent. Each and every one of their regions have a different style of cuisine, use of spice, and depending on geographical region, would focus either on particular proteins, seafood or vegetables. Because Taiwan is a such a progressive culture, with chef travelling afar to be educated and bring back inspirations, one can taste the "traditional Taiwanese food or snacks" which we term go-za-bee; as well, the artistic fusion of international flavors with Taiwanese food. Hence, my suggestion of tasting "dance or fireworks" means that it is full of flavor, colors, spices, and tastes that are so original and out of this world. They can be in the form of desserts, appetizers, main dishes, and even soup! Also, important for young taste buds, Bubble Tea is a creation of Taiwan. The amazing Q-Q or chewy texture of the giant tapioca pearls are the creative innovations of Taiwanese chefs. Now, not only are there white sugary pearls, pearls now come in match, taro, black sugar, and so many other creative flavors.
 - 4. > Why are there less restaurants of that cuisine in Vancouver, when other Asian communities are more represented? There are many restaurants and cafes owned or operated by Taiwanese-Canadians, but not everyone wants to cook or create Taiwanese cuisine. For example one of many people's favorite Taiwanese restaurant is Kalvin's Szechuan Restaurant in Vancouver. It is owned by a Taiwanese Family, yet it is a fusion of Taiwanese food and Szechuan. Even the word, Taiwan is not in the name of the restaurant, but everyone who dines there know that it is the flavor of Taiwan. Vancouver is a place where the world comes together. I thoughts are that fusion food or inspired food have become a more common place than that of solely one ethnic food. For example, it is not uncommon in Burnaby to see Chinese Indian Restaurants. So, talk to your Taiwanese friends and ask them where to find their favorite Taiwanese restaurants.
 - 5. > How has the Taiwanese cuisine scene evolve over the years in Vancouver according to you? There has been few new traditional Taiwanese restaurants in Vancouver over the years, in comparison to Chinese regional restaurants or Japanese restaurants. Taiwan was under the influence (occupation) of Japan during the WWII. Since then, Taiwanese people love Japanese food and many Taiwanese restaurant owners operate Japanese Cuisine.

- 6. > What are the specific culinary skills Chefs of Taiwanese cuisine must have? (this is too technical for me)
- 7. > What is the Taiwanese dish that makes your heart beat in particular and why? I am from the city Chang-Hua, and I love Chang-Hua meatballs. Taiwanese meatballs comes in various styles. It has a glutenous outer wrap with meet and bamboo shoots, usually fatty pork, and green onions. The meat ball various in the inside of how it is compacted according to the regional taste (in Taiwan) The most popular one, of course is from Chang-Hua, middle regional city of Taiwan. Taiwanese meatball can be steamed, boiled in high heat oil, or deep fried in hot hot oil until the glutinous rice outer layer is crisp, yet still chewy. What makes my heart beat is the crispy yet chewy outer layer, the bamboo shoots mixed with fatty pork, and last of never the least is the Taiwanese sweat and sour sauce that is pour on top of the Taiwanese meatball.
- 8. > Anything you would like to add for people who are considering joining the event this year? I would encourage everyone to check out this event because Taiwan is such a small, but beautiful island. Though small in geography, it is big on taste. The passion of the Taiwanese people to eat and enjoy food is something for everyone to discover for themselves.
