Primary Care Strategy - Saanich Peninsula

Background: CBC All Points West had an interview with Karen Morgan (from the Saanich Peninsula Hospital Foundation) who has started a fundraiser for the approximately 15,000 people without a doctor on the South Island. She claims the South Island needs at least 60 more doctors. It is expected that the Green party will ask the minister about access to primary care services and the recent campaign by the Saanich Peninsula Hospital and Health Care Foundation to fundraise for a new primary care clinic. The Foundation has launched a \$2 million fundraising campaign to recruit physicians and open new clinics. Three GPs recently retired and a fourth has recently announced he will be retiring soon.

If asked about actions being taken to address primary care shortage in Saanich Peninsula ie. "Sidney, which has an aging population, and is the service centre for four first nations, continues to lose primary care providers. As the Minister knows, a walk in clinic closed in September. The Saanich Peninsula Hospital and Health Care Foundation has now launched a 2 million fundraising campaign to open an emergency walk in clinic and 2 team based primary care centres in Sidney and Brentwood Bay What is the minister doing to address the growing primary care shortage in this community?"

- 18.2% of British Columbians currently report not having a regular doctor, nurse practitioner or clinic for their every day health care needs.
- While in Saanich this situation is slightly better with only 14.9% of people lacking a regular provider, we know that people are struggling to get the care they need.
- I met with the local MLA at UBCM recently, where we discussed the situation in Sidney, which is part of this health district.
- Team based care is at the centre of our primary care strategy and how we will make sure more people are attached to regular care givers and that their care is coordinated, and continuous.
- Through team-based case we can use the full talents and expertise of our highly trained health professionals – from health sciences professionals, nurses, nurse practitioners and physicians – so patients benefit for the right type of help at the right time.

- The primary care network is one way these teams will be organized, and the work is underway as we speak for these particular teams to start delivering primary care
- Under our primary care strategy, 15 networks will be approved and underway by the end of March 2019.
- Specific to the members community, the South Island PCN Planning Committee – which involves the local health authority and the South Island division of family practice - submitted plans for two PCNs on October 1st, 2018, one which includes increasing attachment to primary care providers on the Saanich Peninsula, and enhanced primary care services
- Both plans are currently being reviewed by the ministry, and first nations health authority
- Community health centres, many which operate in the members riding, are also becoming formal partners in our primary care networks.
 Already, we have provided over 2 million in funding for several existing community health centres, such as the Gailano Health Care Centre and Pender Islands Health Care Society. Work is underway to develop a formal policy to enhance existing centres, and develop new ones.

If asked about the status of the 200/200 recruitment initiative

- By attaching people to consistent providers and clinics we know that we can help people have better overall health, reduce hospitalizations and improve outcomes for patients with chronic diseases or mental health and substance use issues.
- To make sure people are able see a regular care provider or get care at regular clinic we launched the first phase of our recruitment campaign for 200 GP and 200 NP positions.
- Already we are seeing great interest from providers in participating.
- As of Oct. 17 Health Match BC had received 446 expressions of interest
 - o 201 GP

- o 141 NP
- 104 Other

If asked about the challenge of finding doctors to take over retiring doctors practices due to factors like overhead, large student loans

- Our recruitment plan for 200 new GPs and 200 NPs to work in the primary care networks respond to these very issues. And that is being reflected in the high level of interest in these positions
 - I am happy to say that as of Oct 17, we have received nearly 450 expressions of interest in these posts, over 200 from GPs alone.
- New doctors will be retained under service contracts that will allow them to focus on building a practice in a team-based setting.
- We have a situation in B.C. where the current way of providing basic health care isn't working for patients or for family practitioners
 - Patients are frustrated that they can't get care where and when they need it. Doctors are frustrated by patient loads, increasing complexity of practice, administration and costs of overhead.
- We also know that not everyone who comes out of medical school wants to buy into a practice and take on all those responsibilities.
- Medical students are trained to deal with chronic and acute medical problems. They are not taught, however, to deal in business with negotiating leases, purchasing offices and hiring and firing staff.
- For some, they would prefer not to manage or be involved in the business side of clinics at all.
- Medical school training prepares physicians to work in a collegial environment in which trainees rely on and consult colleagues regularly.
 A solo practice is perceived as lonely and isolating.
- Mentoring plays an important role for new doctors as well. New doctors value an environment where colleagues and allied health practitioners can help them learn the ropes and this model supports new practitioners joining existing clinics where mentorship can take place.

- With this new model for GPs and NPs we will support team based practices that are focused on patient care and professional support.
- Team-based care has been shown to improve quality of care and to improve patient and provider experience.

We need to include a real update on primary care on the south island, specific focus on the Saanich peninsula. MLA Olsen may be asking a question on the doctors shortage. Need to refresh the expressions of interest numbers, the pcn planning with the Saanich group—how there are weekly meetings, need the latest update from Teds team, they need to also send us an updated note on the pcn planning process right now given they were to receive an updated service plan two weeks ago, actual details on the app proposal, expected date of ratification vote of the doctors deal

Physician Assistants

Background: The Green Party is expected to ask the minister about establishing physician assistants in B.C.

- I met with the Canadian Association of Physician Assistants last year.
- We know that physician assistants are being used in other provinces and we will continue to review how they may be potentially integrated in our primary health-care strategy.
- Previous governments looked at physician assistants in 2009, 2010 and 2014 – but did not advance beyond preliminary discussions and a concept paper.
- Right now, the focus of our primary health-care strategy is team-based care, and the roles nurse practitioners, occupational therapists and others can take in those.
- Eventually, we may look at how physician assistants can be used within our robust team-based care strategy – but our current focus is to maximize the effectiveness of the professions that we have right now in B.C.

If asked about team-based care:

 Our focus with team-based care is using all professions to the fullest extent of their professional capabilities to provide the best care for the people of this province.

- Government's new primary health-care strategy commits to building on the best practices and solutions that already exist within the healthcare system, but have yet to be fully leveraged throughout the province.
- Nurse Practitioners (NP) were first introduced into the system 13 years ago, and we are working to incorporate them for fully into our system. This year we made the largest investment in NPs in the province's history, and are substantially increasing the number of NPs for future years.
- The Ministry of Health is funding up to 200 new NP positions within Primary Care Networks throughout B.C.
- The positions are being supported by approximately \$115 million over three years, to secure NPs' employment in primary care settings throughout British Columbia.
- On Aug. 22, 2018, Health Match BC launched the initial recruitment campaign for the 200 general practitioner/family practitioner and 200 NPs
- As of Oct. 17, Health Match BC had received 446 expressions of interest from providers including 141 from nurse practitioners
- Government is also increasing the number of NP education seats adding 30 new nurse practitioner education seats in three B.C. postsecondary institutions (an increase of 66 per cent).
- There are 512 NPs in BC, 476 of which are practicing. There are 3 categories of NPs licensed in BC – Family, Adult, and Pediatric.
- As valuable members of the primary care team, increasing the numbers of NPs will contribute to the multi-faceted approach to close the primary care gap in B.C.

Secondary

- NPs, were introduced to BC in 2005 13 years ago, and are registered nurses with additional Masters level education.
- Other provinces rely and use these health professionals more extensively – something our team-base care approach is also aiming to achieve.
- Other provinces with nurse practitioners include:
 - o Ontario over 2,700 NPs.
 - Alberta over 440 NPs.
 - Saskatchewan over 200 NPs
- Per province, NPs/ per capita, 2016, according to CIHI
 - o NFLD: 28 /100,000
 - o PEI: 15/100,000
 - o Nova Scotia: 15/100,000
 - New Brunswick: 16/100,000
 - o Quebec: 5/100,000
 - o Ontario: 20/100,000
 - Manitoba: 13/100,000
 - Saskatchewan: 18/100,000
 - o Alberta: 11/100,000
 - o BC: 8/100,000
- NPs are authorized to perform the full range of nursing functions including – assessment, diagnosing, prescribing, ordering diagnostic tests, managing common acute/chronic illnesses, referring patients to specialists, and providing leadership, research, education and change management expertise.

- As independent practitioners, NPs do not require an order from a
 physician to act and may serve as a patient's regular primary care
 provider, responsible for the continuity and coordination of care. NPs
 see their own patient panel and work collaboratively with members of
 the health care team.
- Physician Assistants (PAs) practice medicine under the direction and supervision of a licenced physician. PAs act as physician extenders whose scope of practice is dependent on the scope of the supervising physician.
- Research demonstrates that, while the approach of the NP is different than that of GPs, outcomes are similar if not better in some domains such as patient satisfaction and coordination of care. NPs are also experts in working as part of teams and leading team based care implementation.
- The Ministry continues to connect with other jurisdictions to monitor and observe the use of PAs in their systems of care.
- The introduction of a new health provider role requires careful consideration and management in order to understand and address the inevitable team function issues that emerge from overlapping scopes of practice. The associated effort is likely to be far more extensive than suggested by advocates, and the presence of PAs may serve to undermine and confuse efforts to improve integration of existing health care professionals.
- At this time, health care needs are able to be addressed with the skill sets of existing health care professions in BC. There are no known care gaps that can only be addressed by PAs. The Ministry has an obligation to British Columbians to optimize the scopes of practice of existing health care professionals such as nurse practitioners.

Primary Care Strategy - Cowichan Valley PCN

Background: The Green Party is expected to ask the minister about the status of this PCN.

- The Cowichan Valley collaborative services committee a partnership table between the Division of Family Practice and Health Authority – submitted their Expression of Interest (EOI) to become a Primary Care Network on September 17th, 2018.
- The Cowichan Valley Expression of Interest demonstrates strong partnership between the Division of Family Practice and the Health Authority, as well as strong engagement with local First Nations bands, as well as FNHA.
- The Our Cowichan Community Health Network is also a member of the Primary Care Network.
- Specific areas of focus are:
 - Persons challenged with mental health and substance abuse issues
 - Frail older adults with complex chronic health conditions
 - The Cowichan Maternity Clinic, which serves approximately 150 patients per month, over one-third of which are First Nations
- Formal approvals have not yet been released for this round of Expressions of Interest; it is anticipated that they will be released in the next two weeks.

Secondary

- A primary care network is a partnership between the health authority, existing groups of family doctors, First Nations or other Indigenous groups providing primary care services, as well as other groups providing primary care services in a specified region.
- Within each community network, patients can easily be referred to the health professionals they need, accompanied by seamless communication between care providers that allows health-care professionals to collaboratively manage their patients' health care.

- We have an ambitious goal of having these networks available in approximately 70% of communities over the coming three years. With the first 15 to be underway this year.
- Ultimately, a properly functioning patient care network will support people's health so they aren't faced with coordinating multiple providers themselves and care providers aren't spending hours making calls trying to connect patients to the services they need. Rather, there is a local, central hub for people to turn to for health-care resources that easily and effectively meet their needs.

Salt Spring Island Maternity Coverage

Background: Green Party MLA Adam Olson wrote to the minister on Aug 22, 2018 regarding the issue of access to birthing services on Salt Spring Island requesting the minister consider the steps necessary to ensure residents of SSP have access to this medical service. The MLA is aware that a proposal from local providers and the health authority to sustain services on the Island has been has been submitted to the ministry.

- The ministry is aware of the concerns with Obstetrical care on Salt Spring Island and has been in active conversations with Island Health about options.
- Discussions are ongoing including looking at how to use existing resources on the Island, funding, services/coverage from the Peninsula and Cowichan area(s).
 - These discussions with the ministry were happening as recently as the week of Oct. 15, 2018.
- As well I would strongly encourage the community providers, local division, and health authority to put forward an expression of interest to become a primary care network.
- Communities who participate in PCNs may be able to access additional funding for obstetrics care.

If asked if the minister has seen and reviewed the proposal put forward by the RM/Division/Island Health

- I am aware of the proposal and I understand that the ministry is in discussions with those groups about the proposal as well as other options that are available.
- Again I would strongly encourage these groups to work together to put forward an expression of interest to become a primary care network.
- Through networks providers can access a team for support and additional funding for community priorities that support longitudinal care like maternity services.

Community Health Centre Funding

Background: In April 2017, the NDP committed to investing and expanding the community health centre (CHC) model via a letter to the BC Association of Community Health Centres (BCACHC). It is expected that the Green Party will raise the status of this in question period.

- For decades, community health centres in B.C. have been foundational in delivering primary health care to meet the unmet need in our communities, often focussing on our most vulnerable residents ... seniors with lower-income, newcomers, and those facing mental health and substance use challenges.
- Through B.C.'s new primary care strategy, community health centres
 will be vital in addressing the primary health care needs of vulnerable,
 hard-to-reach patients, and will have greater supports and
 opportunities to do so more effectively.
- Until now, community health centres in B.C. have not fully been integrated into the primary care infrastructure.
- But we are taking the next, important step to formally bring community health centres into the province's primary care strategy.
- Community health centres will be recognized as a partner within primary care networks, working collaboratively with area urgent primary care centres, health authorities and team-based practices, to achieve the common primary health-care goals of the larger community.
- As a first step, in March 2018, the Ministry of Health provided \$2.13 million in funding to address immediate primary care gaps within some of the community health centres across the province.
- Specifically here on Vancouver Island this includes over \$500,000 distributed to:

 - Cool-Aide Community Centre (\$131,548 for 0.5 OT/PT and 2.0 Outreach workers)
 - o Cortes Community Health Association (\$22,289 for 0.3 RN)
 - o Gailiano Health Care Society (\$37,149 for 0.5 RN)

- Hornby and Denman Community Health Care Society (\$47,297 for 1.0 RN)
- Pender Island Health Care Society (\$8,740 for 0.1 NP)
- This money will provide funding for nurses, outreach and social workers, counsellors, dietitians, occupational and physical therapists, and nurse practitioners in more than a dozen community health centres.
- As primary care networks are established throughout the province, community health centres are a partner in the planning process, as well as being included as an integral resource, and the connections to health services in a particular region will be solidified and streamlined.
- To do this we are developing new policy direction on community health centres.
- As part of that four stakeholder consultation sessions have been held with representatives from the Ministry of Health, BC Association of Community Health Centres, community health centre administrators, health authorities, Doctors of BC, nurse practitioners and patients between March and June of this year.
- This policy will outline the key attributes of community health centres, including community governance, team-based care, a focus on delivering services to address the social determinants of health and inequities in health status, and the integration of primary care with social services.

Physician Burnout - UPDATED

Background: Questions may come up in QP regarding physicians "burning out" for their work schedule.

- We know that the current way of providing basic health care isn't working for patients or for family practitioners.
 - Patients are frustrated that they can't get care where and when they need it.
 - Doctors are frustrated by patient loads, increasing complexity of practice, and costs of overhead.
 - This is not exclusive to B.C. according to the Canadian Medical Association Journal, a recent survey reports nearly half of family medicine physicians in the U.S. are experiencing burnout.
 - The report notes that a team-based model of care helps reduce burnout because it "affords physicians the time they need to listen, think deeply and develop relationships with patients".
 - It includes promoting a "patients before paperwork" strategy something that we are doing as part of our strategy with patient networks bringing in staff to take the burden of paperwork from physicians and allow them to focus on their patients.
- Team-based primary care has great potential to help more people access care and is one of our top priorities.
- By shifting to a focus on team-based care bringing together doctors, nurse practitioners, and other health-care professionals – we can create community networks of care to better meet the needs of people.
- We have announced the creation of up to 200 new positions for both nurse practitioners and family medicine physicians, as well as the inclusion of 50 pharmacists in team-based care practices.
- Recruitment for these positions began this summer, so that these health professionals can begin working in team-based practices in communities of need shortly.
- Team-based care has been shown to reduce hospitalizations and physician visits while improving outcomes for patients with chronic diseases.
- It also reduces duplication and streamlines care, increasing the efficiency and sustainability of the health system. And it enhances the care experience for both patients and providers.
- Team-based care will be foundational to our efforts to increase access to primary care services - including the introduction of urgent

- primary care centres, and other expanded primary care access options in British Columbia.
- Expanding hours of care will mean services will be available evenings, weekends and holidays so that people can get the care they need, when they need it.

Dear Mr. Olsen,

Thanks for your reply and feedback.

I apologize if I made an incorrect inductive leap regarding the IMGs' emails. You and I had a teleconference on December 21st. During that discussion you spoke of return-of-service physicians going to places where there was no perceived need, like Campbell River, whereas there was a major need in your riding. Three days later, Kathy MacNeil and I received emails from three separate IMGs. The first said he had been posted to Campbell River, "a community where there is no need for any more physicians". He went on to say that his "attention has been brought to just how dire the need for family physicians is in Sidney". The second one again referred to placement in Campbell River and felt the need was greater in the South Island. The third also spoke to no real need in the return-ofservice communities, whereas there is a real need in places like Saanich. Although coincidences happen, I'm sure you recognize that three emails on one day on the heels of our conversation seems like more than a coincidence. We also received an email from Shawna Walker, the Executive Director of the Saanich Peninsula Primary Health Care Society that same day, following up on my "recent discussion with Adam Olsen, our local MLA". I'm not sure how she knew about that conversation but, in any case, my discussion with you and the subsequent e-mails are all somehow connected.

In any case, the return-of service program is overseen by the Ministry of Health. As I understand it, Kevin Brown and Mark Armitage are directly involved. Since these programs were set up explicitly to meet rural needs, this year's IMG residents are already placed. As I said, there is a chance that at least one of the ROS programs may operate under different requirements for the next academic year. I am not in a position to make any assumptions or commitments about that program, but would be happy to try to attend a meeting with the appropriate MoH staff to discuss this further.

Please understand I am very sympathetic to the dilemma many of your constituents face, just as I'm concerned about unattached patients in Esquimalt, the West-Shore communities and Sooke, as well as numerous other communities on Vancouver Island. I look forward to meeting with you when a time can be arranged, hopefully in the near future.

Hello Dr. Etherington,

Thank you for your response. I should be clear, at no point have any IMG's contacted my office

I have never met an IMG about this or any other issue.

No IMG at any point has ever suggested to me that they want to renege on a contract.

While I have not ever met any IMG's I have had a number of meetings with many people working throughout the health care field (in my riding and beyond), to try to sort out the growing crisis on the Saanich Peninsula. From our phone conversation this past December I thought I understood this program. While it is a provincial program, it is an Island Health policy that determines where these doctors are contracted to work using the formula highlighted in the Island Health information sheet and the appendix with your point scoring system that you sent to me.

I have copied ADM Ted Patterson (as you referenced him in your last message) as well as my Chief of Staff Evan Pivnick. I require a briefing from the Ministry and would appreciate it if Island Health is also represent at that meeting. I hope that this can be arranged ASAP. I feel that we all need to be in the same room together to ensure we can clear up the confusion.

I would like to be brought up to speed from both IH and MoH perspective on this program and explore the idea you mentioned at the bottom of your initial email, "Within the last year the majority of high level needs in rural communities have stabilized somewhat (although there is still cyclical ebb and flow as ROS terms complete) and there may now be an opportunity to consider expanding placement of UBC IMG Family Medicine Residents in semi-urban and urban locations. We will work in concert with the Ministry of

Health, other Health Authorities and HealthMatch BC to ensure a common provincial approach to addressing this issue."

We have more than 10,000 unattached patients and several doctors preparing for retirement, so the attachment problem is only going to grow on the Saanich Peninsula. While this program does not solve the deep challenges facing doctor/patient attachment it is possible we could deal with a large part of the immediate need.

As the MLA for Saanich North and the Islands I need to continue to pursue every opportunity for my constituents.

My office will be in touch to arrange a briefing here in my legislative office.

The decision to change a provincial program does not rest with me. I will contact ADM Ted Patterson at the MoH to see how the Ministry may be able to assist you.

What I would share with you, though, is that the IMGs who have contacted your office were fully aware of the obligation to provide return-of-service in rural areas when they were accepted to the program. I believe this is a small price to pay for the opportunity to practice medicine in BC. I am personally surprised and disappointed that they would contemplate trying to renege on commitments made to obtain medical licensure.

Unfortunately the shortage of physicians in the South Island is not as severe as that in our rural communities, since practicing physicians tend to gravitate towards the larger centres. This is why the rural return-of-service program was established.

I'll let you know when I've heard back from Mr. Patterson.

Hello Dr. Etherington,

Thank you for providing me this information. I appreciate your quick response to my call

and for sharing a little more on the process Island Health uses to determine where the RoS contracts can be allocated.

If I understand it correctly the Ministry mandates doctors who are completing their residencies in Victoria/Strathcona to complete their RoS within the Island Health region. Further, Island Health has limited the communities who can apply for these RoS contracts to communities that are designated with a Rural Subsidiary Agreement (RSA). Forgive my ignorance, as I have not had the benefit of reading the RSA document, but I am assuming they are the communities that are on the list in Appendix A of the document you sent me.

I understand that Island Health has a responsibility to the whole region and that it is difficult to attract Family Physicians to more rural and remote communities. The process that is outlined in this document provides a level of assurance that rural and remote communities are served and that a new generation of Family Physicians are moving to those communities and practicing there.

As I mentioned in our phone call I think this ignores challenges elsewhere. As the weighting system is designed with points to boost more isolated communities you will always get more isolated communities rising to the top of your list. Even if there are other areas in your Island Health region that require attention they are not considered in this criteria because they are not rural/remote, or at least they are less isolated.

In my riding, the Saanich Peninsula has had a few young doctors move into the area but I am learning that a majority of practicing Family Physicians are getting close to retirement. If you instead had a criteria that determined the vulnerability of a population to retiring Family Physicians you would get another result.

Obviously, I am going to strongly advocate for my riding. We have a crisis in family medicine and primary care that is much bigger than this program. But, this program could help my riding in the short term attach patients and in the long term add new, graduating (young) doctors to a roster of soon-to-be retiring doctors to our area.

I think Island Health is achieving the desired result recruiting and retaining doctors to more rural and remote communities through this criteria. But, is Island Health recruiting and retaining doctors to where they are most needed? I think that requires a more sophisticated algorithm.

It is my understanding that there are practices on the Saanich Peninsula that are ready to commit to RoS agreements with these IMG physicians. It is my understanding that these doctors are imminently going to sign 2-year agreements with practices in communities that place high on this list, but again, is this list comprehensive enough? Does it account for the complex challenges that you and I discussed yesterday?

I recognize these are difficult questions to answer. But, my communities need access to these doctors. There is increasing fatigue, angry outbursts, people are choosing early retirement, and MOA's are quitting. The stress out here on the peninsula, as you know, is growing to a crisis situation. You mentioned on the phone and in your email that your team is considering "expanding placement of UBC IMG Family Medicine Residents in semi-urban and urban locations" but there is no suggestion as to when that consideration will become a decision. And finally, I am assuming this consideration is on the table because the need has been recognized and the current criteria used to determine IMG physician placement has been deemed insufficient. I hope we don't miss this opportunity and that something can be done for this round of contracts.

Thank you for hearing me out on this. I appreciate your time and attention to my concerns so close to the holiday. Please let me know if any of the assumptions I have made in this email are incorrect or if I have the wrong information/understanding. I look

forward to working with you to find solutions to these difficult challenges.

Thank you for taking the time to speak with me today about the urgent shortage of primary care physicians and the negative impact this is having on your constituents. I appreciated the opportunity to answer your questions on the International-Medical-Graduate Return-of-Service (ROS) agreements.

As promised, attached please find a document outlining the two ROS programs in BC, together with the weighting factors we discussed and the relative weightings of communities in Island Health; the higher the weighting number, the higher the need.

Within the last year the majority of high level needs in rural communities have stabilized somewhat (although there is still cyclical ebb and flow as ROS terms complete) and there may now be an opportunity to consider expanding placement of UBC IMG Family Medicine Residents in semi-urban and urban locations. We will work in concert with the Ministry of Health, other Health Authorities and HealthMatch BC to ensure a common provincial approach to addressing this issue.

Urgent and primary-care centre coming to Nanaimo

NANAIMO – The Province, together with local partners, is establishing the Medical Arts Urgent and Primary Care Centre in Nanaimo to give people in the region increased access to team-based primary care.

"This urgent and primary-care centre is a real solution that will increase and improve access to care including on evenings and weekends, using a team-based care solution and supporting attachment of patients who need a primary-care provider," said Adrian Dix, Minister of Health. "We know that many people in Nanaimo find it difficult to receive the adequate, quality health-care services they need. In fact, more than 15,500 people in the region do not have a primary-care provider and for those that do, same-day access is often impossible to get." [NOT

APPROVED]

In collaboration with the Nanaimo Division of Family Practice, Island Health and the Medical Arts Centre, the Province is expanding on the existing Medical Arts Centre clinic to provide wrap-around team-based care to people of Nanaimo and surrounding communities. This will include adding to the current staffing complement, which consists of doctors and a nurse practitioner, around 14.2 FTEs health-care providers like doctors, registered nurses, licensed practice nurses, mental health and substance use clinicians, social workers and a pharmacist, in addition to medical office staff. The annual operating cost of the centre is approximately \$2.7 million.

Using this team-based approach, the urgent and primary-care centre will offer additional same day appointments, extended hours of operation, and will provide focused rapid access and coordinated services for frail seniors and people in need of mild to moderate mental health and substance use treatment. The centre will also work with the Nanaimo Division of Family Practice and Island Health to facilitate attachment for residents seeking a patient-centred primary-care provider. The centre is expected to offer the full range of services in early June 2019.

"Team-based care that addresses the needs of the community will soon become the pillar of our new primary-care system and it will be how everyone in Nanaimo and across the province access the everyday health care they need. The urgent and primary-care centre in Nanaimo is a first step for the community, and we have the vision to expand and transform this centre into a full primary-care network in the future," said Dix [NOT APPROVED]

Located on South Terminal Avenue in the Port Place mall, the Medical Arts Urgent and Primary Care Centre will be open seven days a week to support up to 25,000 additional patient visits per year.

This is the seventh urgent and primary-care centre to be announced in British Columbia under the government's primary-care strategy and the second one to open on Vancouver Island. The Westshore Urgent and Primary Care Centre in Langford opened in November 2018.

BACKGROUNDER

Medical Arts Urgent and Primary Care Centre

The new urgent and primary-care centre in Nanaimo is a partnership between the Ministry of Health, Island Health, the Nanaimo Division of Family Practice, Doctors of BC and the Medical Arts Centre, which will host the urgent and primary-care centre on behalf of the community.

- Located in the Medical Arts Centre on South Terminal Avenue, the Medical Arts Urgent and Primary Care Centre will be open seven days a week from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. on weekdays, and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on weekends and most statutory holidays.
- People can self-refer for their urgent and primary-care needs. The most urgent patients will be treated first.
- The centre will gradually expand to include a full-service team-based and same-day primary-care services, including mental health and substance use. It is expected to reach full capacity in early June.
- A pharmacist will join the care team to work alongside the centre's doctors and clinicians from Monday to Friday.
- Social worker services will be available on weekdays to assist the care team and patients.
- Additional registered nurses will provide triage, and navigation support as well as patient care.
- Currently, 30 doctors are working at the Medical Arts Centre in four-hour shifts. Around four FTE doctors will be added to the urgent and primary-care centre.
- With the partnership of the Nanaimo Division of Family Practice and other resources, the urgent and primary care centre will facilitate attachment for Nanaimo residents seeking a patient-centre primary-care provider.
- On weekdays mental health and substance use urgent services will be enhanced at Island Health's existing Brooks Landing site from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. for walk-in care.
- The urgent and primary-care centre at Medical Arts will offer these mental health and substance use urgent services on site from 3 p.m. to 9 p.m. weekdays and all day on weekends, which will offer walk-in services on a first come first served basis.
- The centre expects to support over 3,300 mental health and substance use patient visits annually.
- The Medical Arts Centre has been delivering primary health care in Nanaimo since 1921.

Details: <u>Nova Scotia announced this morning</u> that their province will be the first in North America to pass legislation on presumed consent for organ donation. CKNW requested an interview with BC Transplant spokesperson to comment.

Action: Interview declined. BC Transplant has drafted the following key messages:

 The announcement by Nova Scotia this morning to move towards a presumed consent model for organ donation just happened and we look forward to learning more.

- We have yet to have the opportunity to analyze the new proposed legislation in detail. In the coming
 weeks, we will be taking time to examine the proposed legislation and discuss with our counterparts
 across the country.
- However, even Nova Scotia's proposed legislation includes at least a year of public education and planning to ensure the right infrastructure is in place, including training for front-line care providers.
- BC already has a robust systems-wide approach to organ donation and transplantation. With strong
 partnerships across all health authorities and with multiple stakeholders, BC Transplant has previously
 implemented strategies such as in-hospital transplant coordinators and donation physicians, education
 and training for medical professionals and public education.
- BC continues to be a leader in Canada for deceased organ donation and living donation. In 2018, we
 maintained our donor rate per million population at 24.9, the highest in the country for the second year
 in a row.
- 502 lives in BC were saved in 2018 by 122 deceased organ donors and 100 living donors.
- In 2018, there were more than 512 referrals to the BC Transplant 24/7 hotline from hospitals in our province. As the number of referrals continues to grow each year, this shows how the culture in BC is shifting to include organ donation as normal end-of-life care.
- In Spain, for example, the world-leader in deceased donation, officials attribute their success primarily to its use of transplant coordinators, donation physicians and a robust education program for health care professionals.
- There is considerable evidence to suggest that the major reason for variation in donor rates between countries is due to varying practices in the identification of potential donors rather than different legislation governing organ donation and presumed consent.
- For now, our focus in BC is to continue investing in these foundational elements to support and increase donation. This includes donation physicians, education of health care professionals, and implementation of donation after cardiac death. Without these foundational system elements in place, changing the consent legislation alone will not bring about the desired level of increase in donation.

Urgent and primary-care centre coming to Nanaimo

NANAIMO - The Province, together with local partners, is establishing the Medical Arts Urgent and Primary Care Centre in Nanaimo to give people in the region increased access to team-based primary care.

"This urgent and primary-care centre is a real solution that will increase and improve access to care including on evenings and weekends, using a team-based care solution and supporting attachment of patients who need a primary-care provider," said Adrian Dix, Minister of Health. "We know that many people in Nanaimo find it difficult to receive the adequate, quality health-care services they need. More than 15,500 people in the region do not have a primary-care provider and for those who do, same-day access is often impossible to get."

In collaboration with Island Health and the Medical Arts Centre, the Province is expanding the existing Medical Arts Centre clinic to provide wraparound team-based care to people of Nanaimo and surrounding communities. This will include adding to the current staffing complement, which consists of doctors, licensed practical nurses and a nurse practitioner.

It is expected that there will be more than 14 new full-time equivalent health-care providers, including four doctors, in addition to registered nurses, mental-health and substance-use clinicians, social workers, a pharmacist and medical office staff. The annual incremental operating cost of the centre will be approximately \$2.7 million.

Using this team-based approach, the urgent and primary-care centre will offer additional same-day appointments and extended hours of operation, and will provide focused rapid access and co-ordinated services for frail seniors and people in need of mild to moderate mental-health and substance-use treatment. The centre will work with the Nanaimo Division of Family Practice and Island Health to facilitate attachment for residents seeking a patient-centred primary-care provider. The centre is expected to offer the full range of services in early June 2019.

"Team-based care that addresses the needs of the community will soon become the pillar of our new primary-care system, and it will be how everyone in Nanaimo and across the province access the everyday health care they need," said Dix. "The urgent and primary-care centre in Nanaimo is a first step for the community, and we have the vision to expand and transform this centre into

a full primary-care network in the future."

Located on South Terminal Avenue in the Port Place mall, the Medical Arts Urgent and Primary Care Centre will be open seven days a week to support up to 25,000 additional patient visits per year.

This is the seventh urgent and primary-care centre (UPCC) to be announced in British Columbia under the government's primary-care strategy and the second one to open on Vancouver Island. The Westshore Urgent and Primary Care Centre in Langford opened in November 2018.

Medical Arts Urgent and Primary Care Centre

The new urgent and primary-care centre in Nanaimo is a partnership between the Ministry of Health, Island Health, the Nanaimo Division of Family Practice, Doctors of BC and the Medical Arts Centre, which will host the urgent and primary-care centre on behalf of the community.

- * Located in the Medical Arts Centre on South Terminal Avenue, the Medical Arts Urgent and Primary Care Centre will be open seven days a week from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. on weekdays, and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on weekends and most statutory holidays.
- * People can self-refer for their urgent and primary-care needs. The most urgent patients will be treated first.
- * The centre will gradually expand to include a full-service team-based and same-day primary-care services, including mental health and substance use. It is expected to reach full capacity in early June 2019.
- * A pharmacist will join the care team to work alongside the centre's doctors and clinicians from Monday to Friday.
- * Social worker services will be available on weekdays to assist the care team and patients.
- * Additional registered nurses will provide triage and navigation support, as well as patient care.
- * Currently, 30 doctors are working at the Medical Arts Centre in four-hour shifts. Four full-time equivalent doctors will be added to the urgent and primary-care centre.
- * With the partnership of the Nanaimo Division of Family Practice and other resources, the urgent and primary-care centre will facilitate attachment for Nanaimo residents seeking a patient-centred primary-care provider.
- * On weekdays, mental-health and substance-use urgent services will be enhanced at Island Health's existing Brooks Landing site from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. for walk-in care.
- * The urgent and primary-care centre at Medical Arts will offer these mental-health and substance-use urgent services on-site from 3 p.m. to 9 p.m. weekdays and all day on weekends, offering walk-in services on a first-come, first-served basis.
- * The centre expects to support over 3,300 mental-health and substance-use patient visits annually.
- * The Medical Arts Centre has been delivering primary health care in Nanaimo since 1921.

There's a good description of the history of health insurance in BC from the <u>Encyclopedia of British Columbia</u> (published in 2000):

Origins of Public Health Insurance

The history of health policy in BC begins in 1888 with the first Health Act. It dealt with general issues of public health, including the collection of morbidity and mortality statistics, the investigation of diseases and epidemics and the monitoring of conditions likely to affect people's health. It also regulated food inspection and handling. Although physicians were regulated under a separate Medical Act, it was not until 9 years later that the first Hospital Act was legislated. Following WWI health care became an important topic of debate. In 1919 the provincial government appointed a Royal Commission on Health Insurance. Two years later it recommended a plan of limited health insurance but no action was taken. In 1929 another provincial Royal Commission was appointed to report on health insurance. As a result of this commission a medical insurance plan was almost put into place in 1937, but because of opposition from physicians the government did not implement it. In its place a non-profit society, the Medical Services Assoc (MSA), was created in 1938 with the support of the doctors. MSA was a voluntary plan involving contributions collected by employers. Public medical insurance for those not covered by a private plan was introduced in 1965 as the BC Medical Plan. In 1967 all medical insurance plans were brought under a single Medical Services Commission and the following year universal public medical insurance was introduced in BC. MSA (the private society) continued in areas such as dental insurance until 1996, when it merged with the other nonprofit dental insurer, CU&C, to form Pacific Blue Cross.

In 1948 BC introduced provincial hospital insurance. The plan was originally financed with premiums heavily weighted against single people. Financial difficulties were quick to appear as premiums were not paid. In 1954 the premium system was eliminated for provincial hospital insurance and universality was introduced, funded in part by a 2% increase in the sales tax. When medical insurance was introduced in BC, it too was financed in part with a premium system.

Depending on whether you're only interested in the *medical* premiums or whether you count hospital insurance as the same, the first instance of premiums could be either the hospital insurance in 1948 or the medical insurance in 1965.

For MSP premium rates from 2001 – 2017, I was able to source the full tables with adjusted premiums for income levels for 2015-2018, but only the unadjusted, full rates for the years earlier. If you need the adjusted levels I can find them, but it will take several hours. Let me know if that's something you'd be interested in. You might also be interested in this article, which provides some analysis of the change in premiums between 2001 and 2015.

Ms. Marlatt received a letter from the Brain Services Division indicating that she must be present 24/7 while her daughter is under seizure studies, but Ms. Marlatt could not take more time off work. After conversing with the Brain Services Division she was told yesterday, the day before the studies, that she will no longer need to be present the entire time of the studies. Ms. Marlatt had already booked the time off work and is currently with her daughter at the Vancouver General Hospital. I understand that the patient is being discharged from Vancouver General Hospital today as her planned assessment is now complete and that staff with Vancouver Coastal Health have been talking to the patient and her mother about her discharge. She will be returning to the community support provided by Fraser Health prior to her stay in hospital. The supports that Fraser Health had offered the family will continue, and Fraser Health is continuing discussions with the family regarding how to provide the best possible care for this person. Recommendations for care are best made by clinicians – doctors and other experts who work to provide the best care possible for patients.

The priority for health authorities is to ensure clients with Acquired Brain Injuries are able to achieve their rehabilitation goals. There are currently no Acquired Brain Injury clients who are being cared for in their own home by family members who are compensated by Fraser Health. Those who require additional support are offered placement in a Community Support Home, which provide trained caregivers and is restricted to a maximum of two clients at a time.

Recommendations for care are best made by clinicians – doctors and other experts who work to provide the best care possible for patients, not elected officials.

Health authorities look for care options that allow patients to live at home where possible. In the case of patients with acquired brain injuries, they support options that are in the best interest of the patient, helping them achieve their rehabilitation goals. There are currently no Acquired Brain Injury clients who are being cared for in their own home by family members who are compensated by Fraser Health. Those who require additional support are offered placement in a Community Support Home, which provide trained caregivers and is restricted to a maximum of two clients at a time.

Registered Nurses

- The partners' plan was to have 5 nurses in practice hired to begin <u>June 1</u>, and they advise they are on track for meeting that timeline:
 - The job descriptions (JD) for the nurses are in development with a target completion of the end of this week. This 'Nurse in Practice' position is new, and will have PCN nurses working in (physician) primary care practices, so the JD will be reviewed in the next few days by the Division.

What HAs are doing

Island Health has:

- o In the past 4 weeks Island Health has administered a total of 2,966 measles vaccinations which is more than double than the previous year.
- In addition to this, Island Health is offering to catch up all vaccines that the client is behind on at the appointment. Public Health continues to offer extra clinics to meet increased requests for immunization appointments.

Fraser Health has:

- Doubled the number of MMR/MMRV vaccines administered by public health units to 5,768 since mid-February of this year, compared to 2,882 over the same period in 2018.
- Increased the number of measles containing vaccine clinics offered by public health by 300 per cent over the same time period. We have offered 309 clinics this year versus 74 in 2018.
- o They are also moving forward with the measles catch-up campaign announced last month by the Ministry of Health.
- The records for school-aged kids continue to be reviewed, and those that are not up-to-date are being contacted with information about when and where they can get their measles containing vaccine. The first set of letters

with this information were sent this week (letter attached). To date, approximately 1,200 letters have been sent to parents

 They are also working closely with pharmacies and community health care providers to support us in this work.

Vancouver Coastal Health has:

- Ordered 16,600 vaccines during February 2019 compared to 2,030 in February 2018.
- Offered additional immunization clinics, identified locations with guaranteed vaccine and pointed people to those locations (pharmacies and medical clinics) particularly on weekends.
- They are launching the measles catch-up campaign by offering in-school immunization clinics to grades K-12 with emphasis on second dose of measles for kindergarten, grades 1 and 2.
- They are also planning enhanced clinics (increased hours and weekends) at community health centres and public-health units.

Catch up campaign:

FH is:

- Sending letters to parents of under and un-immunized children, as of Apr. 4, approximately 1,200 letters have been sent to parents
- Scheduling immunization clinics for the campaign
- Distributing MMR/MMRV vaccines to physicians' offices and pharmacies, and
- Has updated their website to include dates and times of all immunization clinics.

VCH is:

- Sending letters to school principals and parents to inform them about the catch-up campaign
- Sending personalized letters to parents of under and un-immunized children
- Expanding immunization clinics in public health units, including evenings and weekend hours
- Scheduling school immunization clinics

- · Notifying VCH physicians offices and pharmacies, and
- Has updated their website with immunization locations

VIHA is:

- Sending letters to superintendents and principals including messages for school newsletters
- Sending consent packages to schools
- Reviewing immunization records of students and sending personalized consent packages to parents of under and un-immunized children
- Continuing to offer extra immunization clinics at public health units, including evenings and weekend clinics for children who are under/unimmunized for measles
- Scheduling school immunization clinics
- Increasing staffing (public health unit registered nurses and clerical staff) to support the campaign

Latest HA immunization rates

- Vancouver Coastal Health:
 - ordered 16,600 vaccines during the month of February 2019, compared to 2,030 in February 2018.
- Island Health:
 - Public health units provided 995 doses of measles containing vaccine from February 25 through March 4, compared to 331 in the same week last year – a 200 percent increase.
 - From March 18 to 24, 566 doses vs 344 last year for same week a 65 percent increase
- Fraser Health:
 - 1,129 doses of MMR/MMRV were administered from February 24 March 2, 2019 compared to 436 doses MMR/MMRV from the same week in 2018 – a 159 percent increase
 - From March 24 to 30, 843 doses compared to 457 for the same time in 2018 – a 84 percent increase.

• Interior Health:

- Between January 1, 2019 to March 31, Interior Health administered
 5,818 doses of the vaccine, compared to 3,056 in the same period in
 2018 a 90 percent increase.
- From March 25 to 31, 569 doses administered vs 288 last year for the same week – a 98 percent increase.

Northern Health:

- From March 25 to 31, 193 doses were administered at public health units compared to 69 for the same time in 2018 – a 180 percent increase.
- In the past, once outbreaks were over they were out of mind we tend to see
 a decline in immunization rates. For example, as the number of new cases
 has started to subside over the past week, demand for immunization in VCH,
 where the recent outbreak has been concentrated, is also starting to subside.
- This catch up campaign will keep the importance of immunization front and centre in the minds of families, and make it easier for busy parents to make sure their children have the immunizations they need so they and the broader public are protected against the next case and outbreak – because in BC one case counts as an outbreak.

FYI PHSA interview in Kamloops on first responder/BCEHS issue.

Neil Lilley, Senior Provincial Executive Director for Patient Care, will provide an interview at 11:30 a.m. this morning. CRM messages:

- We are getting to the most life-threatening and urgent calls faster in many communities, with the help of firefighters, who are part of our first responder program.
- We do not notify firefighters of every call if they are responding to a patient with a non-urgent condition, they could be tied up when we need them to respond to a life-threatening call.
- We continue to notify them of all life-threatening and serious, time-critical calls (purple and red calls)
- We are also notifying them of all moderately-urgent calls (*known as Orange calls*) that they normally attend, unless we have an ambulance nearby that would arrive at roughly the same time
- Fire departments are also notified of all vehicle crashes, hazardous materials sites, fire related calls, drowning / near drowning incidents and other calls where their assistance is needed.

Details: A firefighter has contacted Kamloops This Week to say since the CRM changes, firefighters are no longer being called to certain calls, including when his son was injured during a hockey game and the paramedics "took their time" to get there. Reporter wants to know details of the changes and how it's impacted fire fighters.

Action: BCEHS asked the reporter for specific details on the incident so we can gather response details.

In the meantime, BCEHS will provide reporter with our general KMs on when first responders are notified: Messaging on First Responders:

The role of First Responders and 9-1-1 emergency calls:

- Under the First Responder Program in BC, fire departments can provide basic first aid and emergency health services, such as CPR and defibrillation while paramedics are en route.
- The program is voluntary, with each local government decides the level to which their department will participate in the program. Some municipalities only wish to provide assistance to paramedics when required while others wish to provide more comprehensive first aid services for their communities.
- BCEHS partners with FR Agencies including fire departments, Search-and-Rescue groups, First Responder societies and First Nations communities through First Responder Agreements.
- Each First Responder agency determines the level of service that first responder agencies can provide.
- BCEHS regularly meets with fire departments, to review the types of calls they are attending.

When Fire First Responders are notified of medical emergencies:

- Fire First Responders are notified for all time-critical calls (purple, red); calls where minutes and even seconds count.
- BCEHS is also notifying fire departments of moderately-urgent calls in the "Orange" category, where the ambulance response is likely to take more than 10 minutes to arrive at scene.
- BCEHS also notifies fire departments of any calls that require their technical expertise and equipment. This includes all motor vehicle incidents and hazmat scenes, etc.
- BCEHS does not notify firefighters of every less-urgent call if they are responding to a patient with a non-urgent condition, they could be tied up when we need them to respond to a life-threatening call.
- Each first responder partner agency (the vast majority are local fire departments) determines which types of medical emergencies they are able to respond to and when.
- In addition, if a response is delayed, BCEHS may request the assistance of local first responders to help care for the patient.

My name is David Lao. I am a researcher with Global News. We are publishing a series of stories surrounding vaccinations, focusing on gaps in the tracking of who receives vaccinations, and the debate over whether to make vaccinations mandatory. In the context of this coverage, we would like to pose the following two questions. We are hoping to receive a response by the end of today today.

- 1. Would you or your provincial government consider making vaccinations mandatory?
- 2. Is your government considering any changes in how it tracks or administers vaccinations.

I wanted to ask if Minister Dix was able to receive my email below? If so, would be able to receive a response by today?

Background

Recommendation: From Minister's scrums:

"Immunization is not mandatory in any jurisdiction in Canada and it is not required in B.C. What some provinces do however, is have mandatory reporting of immunization status as part of the requirements for children and adolescents to attend school. This is seen in Ontario and New Brunswick.

We are following the advice of our Provincial Health Officer who agrees with the advice the former PHO offered to the previous government. Mandatory immunization is not what where we're going to be proceeding in September. It's going to be a mandatory registration system similar to what you see in other provinces.

Very few people in B.C. are against all immunization. Parents lead busy lives, which may lead to missed doses of the two needed doses for children to be immunized against measles. A key way to boost immunization rates is to increase the opportunity for children to complete the series of measles immunization. We are taking action now to raise the overall level of immunization. That's why, as part of protecting against further transmission of the disease, we are launching a catchup measles immunization program. The program will run from April through June 2019, starting after spring break, throughout BC, to help families ensure their children are protected against measles (news release: https://news.gov.bc.ca/releases/2019HLTH0046-000442)

The goal of the program, of course, is to immunize as many people as possible, from kindergarten to grade 12, who have not previously been immunized against measles, and to provide a second dose for those who may not have received both doses. The catch-up program is the first step in government's two-phase plan to educate people about the importance of immunization and help them become aware of their immunization status. Offering the measles immunization catch-up program now will also help prepare parents for the mandatory reporting of vaccination status, which is planned for the fall of 2019."

We are working with Fraser Health on a transition plan for the patient. As for the patient's care at VGH:

Due to confidentiality, we cannot discuss specifics of this case. Patients are admitted to the VGH Seizure Investigation Unit for approximately a week in order to determine which, if any, medical treatments can offer them further benefits. This is a specialized unit for assessment only. The results of the assessment are shared with the patient/family.

The Seizure Investigation Unit serves patients from across the province and is the only program of its kind in British Columbia. Patients who have completed their assessments are discharged back into the community in order that other patients can utilize services and programs at the unit in a timely fashion.

Occupancy of these beds is always close to 100%, so it's important that patients are discharged once their assessment is complete. Other patients may have been waiting a considerable amount of time for access to this highly specialized program.

No patient will be discharged from hospital unless it is medically safe to do so. That determination will be made by the patient's care team. The level of home supports provided to a client is a decision made by the health authority in which the client resides.

We are publishing a series of stories surrounding vaccinations, focusing on gaps in the tracking of who receives vaccinations, and the debate over whether to make vaccinations mandatory. Background

Recommendation: From Minister's scrums:

"Immunization is not mandatory in any jurisdiction in Canada and it is not required in B.C. What some provinces do however, is have mandatory reporting of immunization status as part of the requirements for children and adolescents to attend school. This is seen in Ontario and New Brunswick.

We are following the advice of our Provincial Health Officer who agrees with the advice the former PHO offered to the previous government. Mandatory immunization is not what where we're going to be proceeding in September. It's going to be a mandatory registration system similar to what you see in other provinces.

Very few people in B.C. are against all immunization. Parents lead busy lives, which may lead to missed doses of the two needed doses for children to be immunized against measles. A key way to boost immunization rates is to increase the opportunity for children to complete the series of measles immunization. We are taking action now to raise the overall level of immunization. That's why, as part of protecting against further transmission of the disease, we are launching a catchup measles immunization program. The program will run from April through June 2019, starting after spring break, throughout BC, to help families ensure their children are protected against measles (news release:

https://news.gov.bc.ca/releases/2019HLTH0046-000442)

The goal of the program, of course, is to immunize as many people as possible, from kindergarten to grade 12, who have not previously been immunized against measles, and to provide a second dose for those who may not have received both doses. The catch-up program is the first step in government's two-phase plan to educate people about the importance of immunization and help them become aware of their immunization status. Offering the measles immunization catch-up program now will also help prepare parents for the mandatory reporting of vaccination status, which is planned for the fall of 2019."

Good morning Jasmyn,

I am reaching out to you again to discuss the issue of bariatric surgery funding. I applaud your administration's recent efforts at wait list reduction. However, the wait list for bariatric surgery from GP referral to surgery remains at 34 months. This now has the dubious distinction as the longest wait list in the province and the only one that has not received any boost in funding. Our patient advocate groups have attempted to meet with the Ministry of Health, but have not received responses. There is a growing feeling among patient groups that the reason they are left behind is the presence of systemic weight bias and discrimination.

For my part, I have pushed back on this sentiment. I feel that your administration has provided support to some of the most marginalized populations in the province. This is the one that still requires your urgent attention.

Our annual BC Obesity Summit takes place this Saturday with 140+ attendees registered (including patient advocates). This is a forum where we discuss access to care among other topics. I would love to tell them that you and I have talked and that care of patients suffering from obesity in the province is a priority for the Ministry of Health.

In 2015 Island Health issued an RFP for 40 LTC beds in Campbell and encouraged proponents to build additional capacity that would allow Island Health to purchase an additional 20 beds at a future date, prior to 2020. And the successful proponent was Park Place Seniors Living, who provided the 40 beds and built an additional 18 bed unit planned for future use either as private pay beds or to make available to Island health. Because of the provision in the RFP Island health was able to purchase these beds without going to RFP again. Island Health only has short term agreement with Evergreen as they have not been successful to an RFP process.

Can you please find out for me why these beds were situated at the Discovery Harbour Seniors community? (as opposed to the Evergreen Seniors Home?) In meeting material produced for 30 Oct 2018 there are beds listed as "purchasable". Does this mean that at Evergreen there were no purchasable beds? And what makes a bed purchasable – is it simply the willingness of the operator to convert a private bed?

- On October 25, 2018, the Vancouver Island Health Authority (VIHA) reported the following:
- o There were 26 patients in hospital waiting for residential care placements and 44 in the community (70 in total).
- o Wait times across Vancouver Island communities vary and the number of very long waits is small. Wait times are generally longer for patients living in the community setting.
- o There were 12 patients waiting for Assisted Living (AL) and the average wait time is very long; 296 days.

o There were 18 purchasable beds at Discovery Harbour Seniors Community.

We may want to look at some small edits to the NR depending on your response. DHSC is not seen by the community as a favourable institution and this will not necessarily be received as good news. We may want to emphasize that these beds were available (and none elsewhere) and that it is good to have additional public beds (regardless of location).

Dear Minister,

I am writing because I still have concerns regarding persons offering the bogus homeopathic "Complete Elimination of Autistic Spectrum Expression" CEASE therapy in BC. I have previously written to you regarding this matter but feel I have to write again.

The problem with CEASE therapy should be well understood but, in short -

- Views symptoms of potentially serious conditions as "detoxification" and to be "celebrated", not treated.
- States autistic children should not be vaccinated.
- States vaccination is major cause of autism.
- Seeks to eliminate a protected characteristic autistic adults feel threatened by the name. qv gay conversion therapy.
- Practitioners generally have no autism or child protection training.
- · Name is misleading.
- Problem of false hope/financial exploitation of parents.

Also, the homeopathic products made from vaccines that are used are not registered with Health Canada. Commercial importation/supply is highly restricted.

Whilst the College of Naturopathic Physicians of British Columbia has outlawed it's members from offering CEASE therapy, there are still a considerable number of unqualified lay persons offering CEASE therapy. I have attached a list of them. It should be self explanatory.

They belong to homeopathic associations such as the <u>BC Association of Homeopaths</u>, <u>West Coast Homeopathic Society</u>, <u>Canadian Society of Homeopaths</u> and <u>North American Society of Homeopaths</u>. I have written to these organisations pointing out that offering CEASE therapy is unethical, treating autism is beyond limits of competence of their members and the legal issues surrounding the products used. My concerns have been ignored.

(It is understood that the BC Association of Homeopaths have at various points wanted to become a College - I can not see that ever happening.)

I have had difficulties with Health Canada recognising that CEASE therapy is a child protection issue and that by investigating and halting the supply the supply of the homeopathic products made from vaccines, they would be helping to protect children. In frustration, I have written to Federal Minister Petitpas Taylor. CEASE therapy is anti-vaccination. Its practitioners often belong to groups that are anti-vaccination (such as the Weston A Price Foundation and Vaccine Choice Canada). These practitioners often are much more openly anti-vaccination on social media, especially Facebook.

Some practitioners also offer homeoprohylaxis. I'm sure that you are aware of the <u>media reporting</u>. The article states that those BC practitioners offering it are under investigation by Health Canada. I have suggested to Minister Petitpas Taylor as some of those being investigated also offer CEASE therapy that this could be investigated too.

I appreciate that BC is a common law jurisdiction and that the practice of homeopathy, whilst not recognised, is permitted. I understand that because of the way that BC legislation is written, especially the *Health Professions Act*, authorities have few if any means at their disposal to curtail CEASE therapy and homeoprophylaxis. Health Canada do though.

It is my understanding that that the practice of medicine without a license is an offence in BC. Whilst the *HPA* does not contain an explicit definition of what "medicine" is, it can be argued that the offer to "cure" or "treat" certain conditions might fall under it.

Dear Minister James.

In January you received a letter from Cystic Fibrosis Canada requesting your advice in allocating \$160,000 in this year's upcoming budget to complete an important mental health project which supports British Columbians who have Cystic Fibrosis (CF). Significant work has already been accomplished thanks to a \$100,000 grant provided by the previous government at the end of 2016/2017. Unfortunately, the Ministry of Mental Health and Addictions has said that there are no funds available. As a new member of the CF community in BC I am compelled to add my voice in requesting your help in securing this critical funding. CF is the most common fatal genetic disease affecting Canadians. One is every 15 Canadians carry the gene. Every week in Canada one baby is diagnosed with CF through newborn screening. Not so rare for a 'rare disease'.

Like many people I had nothing but vague knowledge of CF. s.22

Newborn screening for CF only began in our province seven years ago. It is in place because families of people with CF worked with CF Canada to lobby for it. CF does not allow for smooth bodily mucous flow; this clogs the lungs and blocks digestive enzymes. Prior to routine newborn screening babies would suffer with chronic respiratory infections and/or failure to thrive before they were diagnosed, often with much damage already

Dear Minister Dix,

Canadians should be able to meaningfully express their preferences for end-of-life care through advance medical directives (AMDs). More values-based, collaborative approaches to AMDs offer a path forward for Quebec and other provinces, says a new publication from the Institute for Research on Public Policy.

Since 2015, Quebecers over the age of 18 have had the option to indicate on a legally binding form their wish to accept or refuse specific medical interventions in cases where they become incapable of giving consent. In *Improving Advance Medical Directives: Lessons from Quebec*, authors Louise Bernier and Catherine Régis say the current process has several shortcomings. It limits individuals' expression of their wishes to a simple checklist, and it relies on people to self-inform. More importantly, it does not provide them with an opportunity to meaningfully discuss their true preferences for end-of-life care.

The authors conclude that to be robust, the AMD process should include informed conversations with health care providers, individuals and their families to help people articulate their wishes for end-of-life care. A regime that requires and supports a deeper discussion of the concerns and constraints that influence a person's choices can ensure they get the consideration they deserve.

Thank you for taking the time to respond to my letter about vaccine exemptions for school admission. I understand a similar program has been in place in Ontario since 2017, which requires parents to attend an information session and sign a personal exemption waver in order to keep their children free from vaccines. According to a recent article in the Observer, the new process has resulted in "zero" people changing their minds about vaccination. This seems like a waste of time and resources.

Obviously of paramount importance is the health of our children and our communities. Since you mentioned "herd immunity," I decided to do some research on what that term means. Here is what I learned; The term "herd immunity" came into use in 1933, when researcher, AW Hedrich observed that measles outbreaks among at risk populations were subdued when just 68% of children contracted the virus naturally. The basis of this idea is that once a person contracts measles naturally they have immunity to measles for life and once a certain percentage of people has had measles (68% exactly), everyone else will be protected through "herd immunity." Natural herd immunity does require individuals to contract the diseases which are usually considered mild and can be treated at home. Complications are rare and usually only occur in the immune compromised and those deficient in Vitamin A.

The trouble with translating this idea to vaccines is that vaccination does not provide lifelong immunity to diseases such as measles, pertussis, mumps, varicella, etc. One problem is that not every person is able to mount the same antibody response to the vaccines no matter how many times they are vaccinated and that person will never become immune through vaccination. It is important to note that vaccination is not the same as immunization.

Another issue is that the effectiveness of vaccines wanes over time. For example, with MMR, it is known that the vaccine wears off after between 5-10 years; thus many people who may have been vaccinated as children may again be susceptible to the disease after an unknown time frame and every person would have to be regularly tested for antigens to ensure the percentage of vaccination needed for "herd immunity." Further, there have been many cases of vaccinated individuals contracting the diseases they are vaccinated against from others or from the vaccine itself indicating that vaccines are not entirely effective and can lead to disease transmission.

According to this recent study in the Journal of Clinical Microbiology, around 38% of measles cases are caused by the MMR vaccine. https://jcm.asm.org/content/55/3/735

Considering a portion of the population is immune compromised and can not be vaccinated, some will not mount a typical immune response, many will have lost vaccine provided protection over time and including infants who are too young to be vaccinated; even if every person who could be was vaccinated, it would be impossible for a community to reach the target rate of vaccination (97-99%) that is expected to provide "herd immunity."

Taking in to account each of these factors, requiring an exemption or reeducation process for families who choose not to vaccinate seems erroneous, expensive, and ineffective. People who choose not to vaccinate for religious, health, ethical or philosophical reasons are already well educated on the subject. Industry sponsored education and easy access for people who already object to the practice will not increase vaccination rates and could even contribute to drops in school enrollment. Couldn't tax dollars be better spent improving health care facilities and access to families who need medical treatment, enhancing nutrition and exercise programs, or improving educational opportunities for children?

Thank you for your email on mandatory vaccine reporting.

As you know, We are implementing mandatory registration for students in our schools – which we hope to have in place by fall. People who did not vaccinate their children based on religious or philosophical grounds will be required to attend a course designed to educate them on vaccinations. This list will also help the government notify parents who are unaware their children are not vaccinated or who have not had access to vaccines. This way, we can help these parents gain access to vaccines for their children to maintain herd immunity – as even one case of measles indicates that herd immunity has been compromised.

While we are not enforcing mandatory vaccination, we are helping to educate parents on the harms which can occur if their children are not vaccinated.

Thank you once again for raising your concerns with me. I will be sure to pass them on to the Minister of Health Adrian Dix as well.

To the Honourable MLA, Ronna Rae Leonard,

I am writing to express my concern over the legislation to require exemption forms for vaccines and school reporting mandates.

Families should be empowered to make educated medical choices along with their health care provider. This decision and information is not the responsibility of the education professionals and the management of this sensitive information is too large a burden to foist on to an already overburdened sector. Requiring families to share private medical information with the school system is a violation of privacy and could lead to discrimination.

Vaccine reporting for school entry raises the possibility of individual children being singled out or shamed for their parent's religious or philosophical choices. Reporting also creates stigma around already marginalized persons, ie. those who cannot be vaccinated for medical reasons and/or have already sustained vaccine injury.

During an outbreak of any virus, bacteria or bug (including head lice) a notification system is already in place for parents, allowing the families to opt out of sending their at risk students to school. The existing system is completely sufficient to stop the spread of disease, as was evidenced by the measles outbreak in Vancouver which did not progress past 1 or two schools after it was diagnosed, treated and tracked.

Increased reporting requirements is not likely to result in increased vaccine uptake, but it will be expensive and time consuming for the province, the health department and the department of education. Further, requiring vaccine reporting for schools will not increase the numbers of vaccinated adults and as the MMR, DTaP and other vaccines wear off over time, increased vaccination of school aged children is unlikely to affect overall "herd immunity."

Background

Recommendation: From Minister's scrums:

"Immunization is not mandatory in any jurisdiction in Canada and it is not required in B.C. What some provinces do however, is have mandatory reporting of immunization status as part of the requirements for children and adolescents to attend school. This is seen in Ontario and New Brunswick.

We are following the advice of our Provincial Health Officer who agrees with the advice the former PHO offered to the previous government. Mandatory immunization is not what where we're going to be proceeding in September. It's going to be a mandatory registration system similar to what you see in other provinces.

Very few people in B.C. are against all immunization. Parents lead busy lives, which may lead to missed doses of the two needed doses for children to be immunized against measles. A key way to boost immunization rates is to increase the opportunity for children to complete the series of measles immunization. We are taking action now to raise the overall level of immunization. That's why, as part of protecting against further transmission of the disease, we are launching a catchup measles immunization program. The program will run from April through June 2019, starting after spring break, throughout BC, to help families ensure their children are protected against measles (news release:

https://news.gov.bc.ca/releases/2019HLTH0046-000442)

The goal of the program, of course, is to immunize as many people as possible, from kindergarten to grade 12, who have not previously been immunized against measles, and to provide a second dose for those who may not have received both doses. The catch-up program is the first step in government's two-phase plan to educate people about the importance of immunization and help them become aware of their immunization status. Offering the measles immunization catch-up program now will also help prepare parents for the mandatory reporting of vaccination status, which is planned for the fall of 2019."

So this is what I have from Social Development. See below. Island also provides funding and are getting me info – I think they give 50K annually but helped them out last year with more (12K- one time). Island is seeing what they are providing this year.

So for the MLA....hmmmm....maybe she sends a statement along the lines that the clinic offers a valuable service and glad to see doors re-opening....not sure though what we say re: long term funding and support.

CODE Dental clinic in Nanaimo (operated by the John Howard Society) is the only non-profit dental location north of the Malahat. It is currently closed and has been shut down for roughly a month due to a lack of operating funds. They believe the \$20K may allow them to re-open for an interim basis, but they need roughly \$80K-\$100K to ensure annual operations. Will the government commit any further funding for the Nanaimo location?

- The Ministry provides an equal amount to each-for-profit dental clinic and the increased funding over the next three years will help offset operating costs.
- There are other dental supports available through the province:
 - People on income assistance have access to basic dental coverage that includes exams, cleanings, and fillings. People on disability assistance have basic coverage as well as broader coverage that includes dentures and crowns.

- Through the Healthy Kids Program, children of low-income families can get help with the costs of basic dental care, prescription eyewear, hearing instruments and alternative hearing assistance.
- These programs support around 145,000 people each year at a cost of \$63 million per year.
- This \$3.6 million grant to the BC Dental Association to support dental clinics that
 provide free or reduced cost dental services throughout the province is part of
 TogetherBC, the province's first poverty reduction strategy.
- Government will be looking into what else can be done to make dental care more affordable in B.C.

Is there an idea when this \$20K funding will be made available for CODE and other clinics?

 The BC Dental Association will distribute the funding. They anticipate it will go out to not-for-profit clinics after May 2019.

Will the new funding stream announced on Wednesday have an impact on existing funding which may have indirectly come from the province? (From CODE's perspective the new SDPR funding is hopefully not going to mean a reduction in Island Health funding, which will still be needed to allow CODE to operate on a 2-3 days a week basis.)

 The \$20,000 grant will not have an impact on any other provincial funding that is provided to the clinics. For information on Island funding for CODE Dental clinic, please contact Island Health.

Can you clarify the definition of doubling the grant funding? What part of the funding is being doubled and what is that meant to mean at the ground level? Will individual clinics be receiving double what they have in previous years or is it simply a doubling in the amount of money going to the BC Dental Association?

- Over the next three years each non-profit clinic will receive an annual operating grant of \$20,000 a year. This is double the amount the clinics received in previous years. (They received \$10,000 in 2017).
- The funding will be used to help offset the costs of materials and dental lab fees required to provide services to financially vulnerable people.
- The \$20,000 grant is available to existing non-profit clinics as well as any that open within the three years of the funding to help offset rising operating costs.
- In addition to operating funds, approximately \$2 million will support clinics with capital funding to support needs such as equipment like X-ray machines, dental chairs, pediatric equipment and computer software for the electronic submission of dental forms.

From program area:

Currently, the PRA-BC program only places individuals in rural communities because the program is funded by the Joint Standing Committee on Rural Issues. This means, that we do not currently have an IMG placed in Saanich through the PRA-BC program. Attached is the table of PRA placements over the past number of years. Flexibility for placement exists with the UBC IMG program. Below are bullets that explain the process for the UBC

IMG program with regards to ROS placement opportunities on Vancouver Island

IMG BC

- Traditionally the Ministry of Health (MoH) and health authorities have used IMG ROS positions as a means to address physician vacancies across the province.
- Every year in late Spring the Ministry of Health's Return of Service Program informs each health authority how many IMGs they will need to place into ROS communities
- Health authority representatives discuss their high priority needs and come up with a list of ROS
 communities which is then distilled further to determine which vacancy postings are most appropriate for a
 ROS placement (i.e. group practice, not solo; plus other criteria)
- The list of ROS opportunities must be greater than the number of placements needed to ensure choice and account for uncertainties
- It is expected that Island Health will have 12 IMGs starting in summer 2019; so, 15 ROS opportunities were identified (Duncan 3; Mill Bay 1; Courtenay 4; Campbell River 6; Port Hardy 1).
- Until recently, all ROS placements were to be rural or semi-rural.
- ROS Policy changed in 2014 due to the UBC expansion of distributed sites; the IMG's ROS became linked to
 the health authority in which their distributed site was located. This has proven to be successful as IMGs are
 staying in the community longer than expected and some of the rural communities are not experiencing the
 turnover that they did in the past.
- UBC IMG ROS opportunities now include some urban ROS opportunities which are much smaller in number but do exist (i.e. this year IHA offered 3 non-rural ROS options (Kelowna 1; Kamloops 1; Penticton 1) out of their 12 placement opportunities.
- The success of the PRA-BC program has also reduced the number of rural vacancies.
- Island Health has the opportunity to add a few urban options to the list of ROS opportunities but to date Island Health has focussed on their rural needs.
- Victoria site IMGs want the opportunity to do their ROS in Victoria, Sidney, Sooke, etc. because they have been integrated into the community while doing their residency clinical rotations; often the clinic they are working in would like them to do their ROS after graduation.
- Island Health (Dr Etherington and his team) are aware that some of the high level needs in rural communities have stabilized somewhat and there may be an opportunity to consider expanding the ROS opportunities in semi urban and urban locations.
- MoH, the health authorities, and Health Match BC will work in concert to ensure a common provincial approach to addressing this issue.
- The ROS Program does not need to update or change any ROS policy the policy indicates non rural communities are a ROS option.
- Every health authority already knows they have the option to include a few urban ROS options- VCHA, FHA and IHA already do this; NHA is all rural, but they often include one Prince George placement.
- VIHA has had the option for the last two years to include a few urban communities such as Victoria, Saanich, Sooke, Nanaimo etc but they are still working out a process to short list potential clinics.
- It is the health authorities' job to determine their highest priority vacancies; the MoH takes a stewardship role, so MoH gives them parameters- such as 75% rural, 25% urban ROS placements.
- VIHA recruiters have informed MoH they are working on the urban selection process, and have created a working group.

• The process: (1) Every year in late Spring MoH informs each health authority how many IMGs they need to place into ROS positions; (2) they put the call out to VIHA physicians asking who wants a ROS IMG; (3) they short list the clinics based on specific criteria (the position must be posted on HMBC website; position must be full time; must be part of group practice, etc); (4) the create their list of options and send it to the MoH; in July all final year residents receive the list of options; in July/August seven separate IMG ROS Information Nights are held across the province to give IMGs detailed information about the ROS opportunities- this evening includes MoH, health authority recruiters, health authority medical directors and/or program directors linked to the ROS program; in the months of July and August health authorities ask IMGs to apply for the communities of interest on the list, based on distributed site parameters and send in their CV; interviews occur in July/August/ September depending on the health authority; IMGs can start signing their Addendums with the health authorities starting in September at the earliest. IMGs have until the end of their final year to match to a ROS community- but the best sites are filled quickly.

Paramedics staffing concerns - NEW

Background: CUPE Local 873 – which represent Ambulance paramedics put out a press release on March 19 suggesting that there are staffing shortage across the province which are affecting service levels. The story received secondary media coverage over the weekend and into Monday. The news release stated that During the week of March 11- during the night shift – anywhere from 25 to 40 paramedic units were out of service at any given time across the Sea to Sky, Lower Mainland and Fraser Valley areas. The release also suggested that BC paramedics have some of the highest workloads in Canada.

Top Messages

- We know how dedicated paramedics are to providing front-line emergency health care support – their work is strongly appreciated. Our government has made significant investments in support of paramedics and the patients they care for.
- As of January 2019, a total of 119 full-time and part-time paramedic positions (111 full-time and 8 part-time, for a total of 115 FTES) have been added

following our demand and deployment analysis. BCEHS is targeting the areas of highest demand and greatest need. They are also making scheduling changes as needed to better meet peak demand.

Staffing added

- o Vancouver 10 full-time and 8 part-time positions, for a total of 14 FTEs
- Nanaimo and area 30 full-time positions (24 in Nanaimo, 2 in Ladysmith, 2 in Qualicum Beach and 2 in Parksville)
- o Williams Lake 4 full-time paramedic positions
- 100 Mile House 6 full-time paramedic positions
- o Fort St. John 8 full-time paramedic positions
- Dawson Creek 4 full-time paramedic positions
- Castlegar 3 full-time paramedic positions
- Trail 3 full-time paramedic positions
- Kelowna 16 new permanent full-time paramedic positions in Kelowna,
 4 in West Kelowna and 2 in Lake Country (total of 22 positions)
- Kamloops 18 full-time paramedic positions
- Chase 3 full-time paramedic positions

Vehicles added:

- Since 2017, 45 additional transport-capable ambulances have been added to the BCEHS fleet. This includes regular ambulances, and vehicles for community paramedics and paramedic specialists.
 - 10 ambulances:
 - 1 in Fort St. John;
 - 1 in Dawson Creek;
 - 1 in Williams Lake;
 - 1 in 100 Mile House (an on-call "Juliet" car);
 - 3 in Vancouver;
