FPT Ministers' of Health Teleconference: January 24, 2020

Wuhan Coronavirus (2019-nCoV)

#### Potential Key Messages/Speaking Points for Minister Consideration

- Since December 2019, there has been a marked increase in the number of confirmed cases of Wuhan Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) internationally.
- As of January 22<sup>nd</sup>, there have been 552 confirmed cases and 17 deaths associated with 2019-nCoV worldwide.
- The ease and extent of human-to-human transmission of this virus is still being determined. Complete information about the clinical nature and spread of 2019-nCoV will emerge in the coming weeks and months.
- The PHO, BC Centre for Disease Control (BCCDC), provincial and federal authorities are monitoring the situation closely.
- PHAC has implemented additional measures at international airports in Toronto, Montreal
  and Vancouver to detect 2019-nCoV. This includes messaging on arrival screens for
  travelers experiencing flu-like symptoms and an additional health screening question at
  electronic kiosks about travel to Wuhan.
- The Ministry of Health and the Office of the Provincial Health Officer have initiated weekly provincial calls with health authority operational leads, BC Emergency Health Service, BC Centre for Disease Control (BCCDC), HealthLink, Provincial Health Services Authority Supply Chain, Medical Health Officers and others to ensure there is coordinated provincial planning, communication is provided in a timely manner on situational updates, emerging issues are addressed, and health system preparedness activities for 2019-nCoV occurs.
- BCCDC is actively preparing for a large (3 to 10 fold) increase of lab testing relating to suspected 2019-nCoV cases.

## Position of Other Jurisdictions World Health Organization (WHO)

- The WHO is actively engaged in global preparedness, data collection, reporting, communication and coordination related to 2019-nCoV.
- On January 23, 2020, the WHO will be making a determination whether or not the 2019-nCoV is considered a global public health emergency.
- The WHO advises against any travel or trade restrictions for China at this time.

FPT Ministers' of Health Teleconference January 24, 2020

#### Analysis and BC Implications

- The overall risk of 2010-nCoV to British Columbians and Canadians is low.
- To date, there have been no cases of 2019-nCoV in BC or elsewhere in Canada.
- To date, the spectrum of illness for 2019-nCoV has been milder than was experienced with SARS however the spectrum of illness is still being determined,
- Most cases of 2019-nCoV reported so far have been 'mild' or 'moderate' in severity. There
  had been a smaller number of individuals experiencing severe symptoms; in particular
  older individuals with underlying health conditions.
- The ease and extent of human-to-human transmission of this virus is still being determined. Complete information about the clinical nature and spread of 2019-nCoV will emerge in the coming weeks and months.
- BCCDC's Public Health Laboratory is actively working with Canada's National Microbiology Laboratory to validate and implement a definitive lab test for the 2019-nCoV virus.
- BCCDC's laboratory currently has the ability to rule out the presence of 'common' or 'routine' coronaviruses through existing testing methods.
- BCCDC is developing a clinically-appropriate lab testing strategy for suspected cases based on the known risks of 2019-nCoV.
- At this time, BCCDC is actively preparing for a large (3 to 10 fold) increase of lab testing relating to suspected 2019-nCoV cases. Preparatory work by the BCCDC to support this increased volume of testing includes:
  - Ordering extra lab supplies, swabs and sample collection kits needed for 2019nCoV testing;
  - Ensuring there is an appropriate number of fully trained staff are available;
  - Establishing laboratory coding specific to 2019-nCoV; and
  - Identifying an outbreak coordinator for laboratory services.
- Clinicians and health care workers are being advised to use appropriate contact and droplet precautions (including eye protection) when dealing with suspected or confirmed 2019-nCoV cases. Additional precautions, including use of N95 respirators, should be used for all aerosol-generating procedures, such as certain specimen collection.
- Public messaging has been sent to BC schools via the Ministry of Education encouraging regular hand washing, encouraging respiratory etiquette (coughing into an elbow, disposing of tissues in appropriate bins, and washing hands afterwards), and asking students to stay home if they have signs of infection - particularly a fever or cough.

#### BC Background

- A cluster of respiratory infections relating to a new coronavirus (2019-nCoV) emerging from Wuhan, China, was identified in December 2019.
- Since December 2019, there has been a marked increase in the number of confirmed cases of Wuhan Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) internationally.
- As of January 22<sup>nd</sup>, there have been 552 confirmed cases and 17 deaths associated with 2019-nCoV worldwide.
- The majority of confirmed 2019-nCoV cases to-date have been in Wuhan. Additional cases have been confirmed elsewhere in China, as well as in Hong Kong, Japan, South Korea, Thailand, Macau and the United States.
- The Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) is in close contact with the World Health Organization and other international partners to assess the situation and to identify potential risks to Canadians.
- The PHO is leading weekly calls with the Chief Medical Health Officers in other provinces and territories and the PHAC to establish standardized case definitions and plan health system response.
- There are ~2,000 passengers arriving from China to Vancouver each day, however much fewer from Wuhan area, the epicentre of the ouitbreak. Chinese New Year officially begins on January 25, 2020. During this time, the number of travelers to and from China is expected to increase significantly.
- PHAC has implemented additional measures at international airports in Toronto, Montreal
  and Vancouver to detect 2019-nCoV. This includes messaging on arrival screens for
  travelers experiencing flu-like symptoms and an additional health screening question at
  electronic kiosks about travel to Wuhan.
- There are no direct flights from Wuhan to Canada. Based on historic travel patterns, any travelers coming to Canada indirectly from Wuhan are expected to enter Canada through one of these three international airports.
- As of January 22, 2020, PHAC recommends that travelers to China practice 'Level 2' special
  precautions. These include limiting time in large crowds, washing hands regularly, avoiding
  contact with animals and farms, and seeking medical attention if they become sick.
- The Ministry of Health and the Office of the Provincial Health Officer have initiated weekly provincial calls with health authority operational leads, BC Emergency Health Service, BC Centre for Disease Control (BCCDC), HealthLink, Provincial Health Services Authority Supply Chain, Medical Health Officers and others to ensure there is coordinated provincial


