Supplies:

- N95 masks – based on recent usage rates, there are at least 2 weeks worth of masks available across Health Authorities, with large shipments of additional masks on their way (for example, 400,000 masks arriving March 27). We have also included these and other protective supplies in our request to the Federal government (bulk procurement) and are pursuing all opportunities to procure additional N95s and other protective equipment.
- Swabs – 15,000 swabs are arriving today, with 35,000 more coming next week.
- PHSA is managing the distribution of supplies across Health Authorities to ensure that any staff member who requires protective equipment has access to it.
- We are also helping direct private physicians to vendors that have supply available.

Community Testing Sites:

- All Regional Health Authorities have established Community Testing Sites
- Some are using UPCC sites, others have found alternate arrangements based on local or regional need
- Hours for each site vary and most sites require referral and/or calling ahead for appointment

B.C. Covid19 Symptom Self-Assessment Tool:

- A soft launch of the Tool occurred on March 16 (available through the BCCDC website)
- Since its launch, some 400,000 people have used the Tracker; 94% from British Columbia.
- While it is too soon to say how many calls to 811 or visits to walk-in clinics, doctors offices, urgent primary care centres or EDs may be avoided through use of this tool, based on initial feedback from users.
- It is clear that British Columbians want to help one another. In a survey on the Tool's tracking page, almost as many people were looking for ways to help others as to assess their own symptoms.

811 – volume of calls/trends:

- 811 continues to experience high call volumes, and those staffing the phone lines are working hard to answer calls and address the concerns of those reaching out for answers.
- Some 5,095 calls were received on March 16, 2020.

- To increase acute care hospital bed capacity in VIHA, LTC residents scheduled to move in April to the new Summit at Quadra Village facility will remain at their current LTC and their move to the new facility is postponed.
- Summit at Quadra Village facility has 320 beds.
- Patients in VIHA acute care hospitals that are in ALC beds will be moved to the new Summit at Quadra Village facility, freeing up acute care beds.
- Legislative options are being explored to designate Summit at Quadra Village as a hospital under the Hospital Act and the Hospital Insurance Act.

PHO Guides and Orders to Date (as of Mar 21.20 10:00)

March 21, 2020: PHO to issue an order to clarify the restrictions for bars and clubs.

March 20, 2020: PHO issued an order under the Public Health Act to restricts restaurants to take-out/delivery only.

March 18, 2020: Mike Farnworth, the Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General declared a Provincial State of Emergency under the Emergency Program Act.

March 17, 2020: The PHO ordered to close all bars and clubs in B.C. effective immediately.

March 17, 2020: B.C. Premier John Horgan has announced the province's schools from Kindergarten to Grade 12 are closed, with no indication of when classes will resume.

March 17, 2020: British Columbia announced a Public Health Emergency under the Public Health Act due to the novel coronavirus pandemic.

March 16, 2020: the PHO issued an order under the Public Health Act prohibiting the gatherings of more than 50 people.

March 16, 2020: PHO directed all hospitals in BC to adopt Outbreak Response Phase 2: Hospitals are to undertake only urgent and emergency procedures and postpone all non-urgent scheduled surgeries.

March 16, 2020: PHO directed Lions Gate Hospital in North Vancouver to adopt Outbreak Response Phase 3: The hospital will only accept emergency patients.

March 13, 2020: PHO recommended residents of British Columbia practice social distancing.

March 12, 2020:

- PHO recommended that mass gatherings be limited to 250 people or more.
- PHO issued an order with various restrictions on activities for both "essential workers" and "non-essential workers" to follow.

March 11, 2020: Health Emergency Coordination Center (HECC) activated to a Level 3.

Supplies and Equipment (as of Mar.20/10:00):

- Sanitizer - Lower Mainland and Interior health is out of stock of some hand sanitizers. They are due to receive shipments this afternoon and Friday.

Hospital/Acute Care Capacity (as of Mar.20/10:00):

March 16th non- urgent scheduled surgeries cancelled:

- Health authorities directed to immediately move all hospitals in the province to Outbreak Response Phase 2. Hospitals will undertake only urgent and emergency procedures and will postpone all non-urgent scheduled surgeries. Hospitals will review operating-room capacity daily to prioritize urgent and emergency cases.
- Lions Gate Hospital in the Vancouver Coastal Health directed to move to Outbreak Response Phase 3. The hospital will accept only emergency patients.

March 18th Long Term Care policy changes have been communicated to HA's:

- Directing HAs to temporarily suspend interfacility transfers (Interior health to Lower Mainland offers) to enable health care staff to focus on increased surveillance and infection prevention protocols and prevent the possible spread of Covid-19 between care homes.
- Directing health authorities to prioritize admissions from acute care over those from community, except in cases of intolerable risk.

- To prevent the introduction of Covid-19 from the community to Long Term Care (LTC) (e.g., restricting visitors) and recognizing the need to free up capacity in LTC, the Ministry directed Has to temporarily suspend the provision of in-facility respite, except in circumstances of intolerable risk, as defined under current policy.
- Directed all health authority operated/funded adult day programs will be temporarily cancelled.

March 20th Designating new Summit at Quadra Village facility in Victoria as a Hospital

- To increase acute care hospital bed capacity in VIHA, LTC residents scheduled to move in April to the new Summit at Quadra Village facility will remain at their current LTC and their move to the new facility is postponed.
- Summit at Quadra Village facility has 320 beds.
- Patients in VIHA acute care hospitals that are in ALC beds will be moved to the new Summit at Quadra Village facility, freeing up acute care beds.
- Legislative options are being explored to designate Summit at Quadra Village as a hospital under the Hospital Act and the Hospital Insurance Act.

Status Update on Key Issues:

Supplies and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) (as of Mar.25/11:00):

- Like other jurisdictions (internationally), BC is closely monitoring its supply of PPE to ensure there is adequate and appropriate access for health care workers.
- BC is working with suppliers and the Federal government to ensure that we're prepared and that we have the right PPE where we need it and when we need it.
- BC is receiving shipments of key supplies, including N95 masks, on a day to day basis. For example:
 - we expect to receive over 12,000 N95 masks tomorrow from one of our suppliers;
 - we have received some supply from the Federal government's bulk procurement efforts and expect more to arrive on Monday (March 30);
 - we have leads on credible and reliable sources for masks that we're expecting will lead to a significant influx of masks;
 - we are reaching out to other sectors to ensure that PPE that is not being used in light of various business closures is redirected to the health system in case we need it; and
 - there are several innovative approaches being explored both locally and internationally around ways to safely sanitize and reuse masks and other PPE if that approach is required.
