There are now 9 lab-confirmed cases of COVID-19 among BC residents who were exposed at the Kearl Lake Imperial Oil worksite; 8 from IHA and 1 from NHA. In addition, IHA has reported 1 epi-linked case in a symptomatic worker and 4 symptomatic HH contacts, 1 of which has tested positive, showing evidence of secondary spread.

Self-isolation has been discontinued per the criteria outlined in the BC guidelines for public health management of COVID-19: (1) resolution of fever without use of fever-reducing medications; AND (2) improvement of symptoms (respiratory, gastrointestinal and systemic); AND (3) either two negative nasopharyngeal swabs collected at least 24 hours apart, or at least 10 days have passed since onset of symptoms. 

Imperial Oil Kearl Lake Camp in northern Alberta has been experiencing a COVID outbreak among workers. The outbreak is being managed by the employer. Workers who had a private vehicle were allowed to return home; those who did not are being quarantined on site. IHA has identified at least 8 confirmed cases among returned workers and NHA has identified 1.

At BC's request, BCCDC received from Alberta Health a list of BC workers who were at the Camp between March 10 and April 21. The list of 757 names came without addresses and we are in the process of assigning these to their HA of residence. AH recommendation is that anyone who was at the camp between March 29 and April 16 (between onset of first case in AB and implementation of control measures) be quarantined and monitored for symptoms. In BC, the onset of the first case was Mar 23 so I recommend we use **Mar 23-Apr 16** as the at-risk period.

Once these lists are ready later today, we will be sending them to each HA for your assessment/management. I am aware that IHA will be contacting each of these returned workers to assess their symptoms and determine management. If a coordinated approach to manage these is desired, I encourage you to discuss this at the CMHO mtg tonight.

AHS

I spoke to Marcia Johnson (780-819-9453) at AHS about getting more information about the workers. Good to see colleagues ^{\$.22}

It sounded like there was considerable back and forth with AHS and IOC to get the names. AHS sent what they felt the P/T seemed anxious to get the names.

She suggests BCCDC contact her again on Monday - phone # above. She can connect us with a staff member who listens into the daily camp updates and there is an OHS physician.

They may be able to help us get more information. I suggested could also be messaging to the men to inform their household members to be aware and be vigilant.

Kearl Lake is a huge work site

There is a plane owned by the company that flies men into the camp from Calgary

To date 49 cases have been identified in workers

Cases include 4 who were asymptomatic and identified through testing about 1,600 workers. Those who were asymptomatic and tested positive were isolated for 10 days after the test results reported.

I asked about measures taken to identify and prevent new cases at the camp since April 16. Marcia seemed fairly confident the camp is being effective and doing what they can

- The men are screened every day for symptoms and have daily temperatures taken.
- Communal areas are closed- no gym, no dining room, no socialising allowed
- The men pick up their meal and take to their room and watch TV.
- When working they stay 2 metres apart; if they are closer then they wear masks.
- Lots of hand washing facilities

I mentioned we had concerns re some of the men had gone home without any instructions re selfmonitoring

The company is keen to prevent cases and transmission as it is very disruptive for the company and the men

Returning to site with symptoms then would be in isolation imediately in own room

I spoke to Heather Amos (BCCDC Coms) who will continue to push out messaging on social media through BCCDC and PHSA.

Hello all,

Imperial Oil Kearl Lake Camp in northern Alberta has been experiencing a COVID outbreak among workers. The outbreak is being managed by the employer. Workers who had a private vehicle were allowed to return home; those who did not are being quarantined on site. IHA has identified at least 8 confirmed cases among returned workers and NHA has identified 1.

At BC's request, BCCDC received from Alberta Health a list of BC workers who were at the Camp between March 10 and April 21. The list of 757 names came without addresses and we are in the process of assigning these to their HA of residence. AH recommendation is that anyone who was at the camp between March 29 and April 16 (between onset of first case in AB and implementation of control measures) be quarantined and monitored for symptoms. In BC, the onset of the first case was Mar 23 so I recommend we use **Mar 23-Apr 16** as the at-risk period.

Once these lists are ready later today, we will be sending them to each HA for your assessment/management. I am aware that IHA will be contacting each of these returned workers to assess their symptoms and determine management. If a coordinated approach to manage these is desired, I encourage you to discuss this at the CMHO mtg tonight.

He did not have a list of names of the returning workers.

Hi all,

As promised, here is a summary from the 2nd national call on the Kearl Lake outbreak which occurred this morning (also see report from AHS attached).

In summary: The outbreak at Kearl Lake is still active (last onset Apr 26). Increased controls have been implemented as of Apr 16. Cases and contacts who are onsite are being managed onsite. Management of contacts offsite is unclear. Communication/advice to other workers is unclear. BC has not received a list of workers who are considered close contacts; the list we received is not considered a list of close contacts although it may include close contacts. We are still awaiting phone numbers for this list.

I don't feel this outbreak is yet under control and I am not confident that close contacts of cases who have left the worksite have been identified and managed. BCCDC will continue to work with AHS and PHAC to obtain further info on this. In the interim, I recommend we re-iterate our public messaging for returned workers to self-monitor and be particularly vigilant if they live with high risk individuals or who individuals who are HCW and report to BC PH if they develop symptoms. If desired, we can setup a mtg to discuss this approach today or tomorrow.



Site description

Kearl Lake is a large oil sands worksite ~70 km north of Fort McMurray. Numerous companies have workers on the site, with Imperial Oil being the largest. The site also has a work camp for employees – accommodations provided by Civeo Corporation. There is a camp located onsite (North Sands Lodge), as well as one that is ~20 km away (Civeo Wapasu). The work camps function as a residence for workers, most of whom fly in for typically 7-day on, 7-day off shifts. All clients each have a separate room with their own bathroom/shower.

Imperial Oil, which is owned by ExxonMobil, hires aviation company Canadian North to provide flights for their workers from two hubs (Edmonton and Calgary) to a private landing strip. Upon arrival, workers are bussed onto the site. Employees are expected to find their own way to either Edmonton or Calgary. The majority of workers live in Alberta, but a proportion of the workforce consists of residents from other provinces/territories. Employees in Fort McMurray are bussed to the site by a contracted company (Diversified Transportation).




Epidemiological curve:



Mass Testing

Voluntary mass testing was conducted on site at Kearl Lake from April 19th to 23rd:



- 1,888 total specimens received for 1,860 unique individuals tested
- 1,874 tests completed and 14 results still pending
- 29 positive results/1,874 completed tests (1.5% positivity) 28 unique individuals found to test
 positive. These individuals were all asymptomatic at time of testing some have recalled
 symptoms retrospectively upon interview, some have remained asymptomatic, and some have
 developed symptoms following testing.

Timeline of actions taken/control strategies implemented since outbreak declared:

April 16

- AHS Public Health became involved in control measures on site.
- All kitchen staff masked
- Dining room closed. All clients line up at 2 meters for served food, which they take to their rooms to eat.
- Company-wide memo sent from VP of Production at Imperial Oil, outlining measures being taken to protect workers.

April 19-23

- Mass voluntary testing undertaken for all individuals on site (1,888 tests completed).
- As of April 30th, 29 positive test results have been received from this mass testing (refer to Mass Testing section for further details).

April 27

- Updated messaging from AHS CD to cases they contact:
 - Teams are doing advance phone calls to briefly inform people they tested positive and to instruct them to self-isolate and if they have house hold contact they need to selfisolate too.

- They will receive a phone call from an investigator within 48 hours to do a full case investigation. Some of the employees would have been called and messages left asking them to call back a 1-888 number
- Our standard messaging is to provide disease course information, educate as to what to
 do if symptoms become worse, and discuss with them the things they can do to prevent
 spread: maintain isolation for 10 days from onset or until symptoms resolve, or for
 contacts maintain the 14 day quarantine. We also review how capable they are to
 isolate within their current environment and strategies that might help depending on
 that situation, and stress no traveling/flying while in the isolation or quarantine time
 frame.
- Close contacts identified on site are being followed by the company and must remain in isolation on site for the 14-day quarantine period.

Because of the continuous masking protocols and the overall measures that have been applied at the site, in the camps and during chartered transportation, we believe that the company has taken all necessary measures to stop ongoing transmission to those on site or at the camps.

At the Civeo-run lodges on the Kearl site:

1. What is the camp capacity for accommodation?

Wapasu Main/East is a normally combined total of 4,062; however, this has been reduced to 2,892 in order to provide a private washroom to each person. Wapasu West is normally 1,184; however, this has been reduced to 843 in order to provide a private washroom for each person. This does not factor in rooms removed from service for those in isolation or quarantine. North Sands Lodge has 450 rooms.

2. How many people are currently residing there?

This changes daily, and is reducing slightly. As of April 29th, there are 1,056 guests, 124 employees, and 37 contractors at Wapasu East/Main. 54 in isolation or quarantine at Wapasu West (this is fluid). 324 guests and 22 employees in North Sands Lodge.

3. How are confirmed/probable cases being separated from the general population within the accommodation setting?

Wapasu currently includes 3 buildings: Wapasu East, Wapasu West, and Wapasu Main. Currently, only Wapasu East and Wapasu Main are open for most guests. The isolation dorms are in Wapasu West, which is otherwise empty. The fourth building, Henday, has since been decommissioned and the remaining portion is not useable at the moment. We are also operating North Sands Lodge, which is on the Kearl site and is owned by IOL.

We have several different isolation/quarantine dorms set up in Wapasu West that are for anyone at the Kearl project. Several dorms are stand-alone dorms that are not attached, while a few dorms are attached but at the end of the building. All isolation/quarantine dorms have outside access so people do not have to go through the building in order to access them. Demarcated fresh air/smoking areas are identified for each dorm.

- a. <u>Confirmed positive people are in a separate isolation dorm.</u> We are currently using dorms 51, 52, and part of 53 for those who are positive. These are three-storey dorms so we are able to put different people on different floors.
- b. Those in isolation who have not been confirmed positive are in another separate dorm. Air conditioning units use a shared system however, the systems have been turned off. The focus has been to put people in the bottom floor, east side, and with portable fans in order to keep it cool. We are using dorms 55 & 56 for this.
- c. Those in quarantine due to contact tracing, who have not yet been tested positive, are being consolidated into dorm 51 (different floor than positives).

4. On what day did individuals start being isolated?

We have been isolating people since early March (March 7th) when the traveler quarantines from China were expanded to include other countries. The isolation wings were established and started to receive workers needing isolation as far back as March 18/19, 2020.

5. Are close contacts of confirmed cases being quarantined on site?

Yes, please see the comments above about the quarantine dorm.

As promised, here is a summary from the 2nd national call on the Kearl Lake outbreak which occurred this morning (also see report from AHS attached).

In summary: The outbreak at Kearl Lake is still active (last onset Apr 26). Increased controls have been implemented as of Apr 16. Cases and contacts who are onsite are being managed onsite. Management of contacts offsite is unclear. Communication/advice to other workers is unclear. BC has not received a list of workers who are considered close contacts; the list we received is not considered a list of close contacts although it may include close contacts. We are still awaiting phone numbers for this list.



Just got off the CMHO call where this was discussed. Chiefs were in agreement that we need to take this seriously to avoid further spread in BC. Specifically:

- Bonnie will add messaging in her press briefing tomorrow to clarify that, in BC, returning workers must self-isolate for 14d regardless of what message they got from AB or from their employer. They can return to work at Kearl Lake during this period but when they come back the must self-isolate again. This is a PHO order. (If further public comms are required, BCCDC can address early next week.)
- Agreement that BC will attempt to conduct contact tracing of all returned workers, regardless of whether AB believes they were a close contact or not. BCCDC will continue to try to get this information from AB Health.

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

We have been receiving improved contact information for Kearl Lake workers from the companies involved, and are working to get these improved lists out to the jurisdictions as soon as possible. To clarify, these requested lists are of ALL individuals who were on site at Kearl Lake from March 10 to April 21 inclusive – the names on these lists are not all individuals who have necessarily been identified to be a case or a close contact. These lists are being provided to the jurisdictions for what they consider to be necessary follow-up, at their discretion. We hope to be able to send these out to the jurisdictions by the end of the day tomorrow.

As of today at 12pm, April 27th was our latest symptom onset date.

I just took a look in CDOM though, and I see one new lab-confirmed case with an onset date of May 1st

I usually wait for Angela Jacobs at AHS to confirm the investigation is complete before adding it to my reporting. She will likely give an update on this case in the morning.

From CDOM, looks like he arrived at Kearl Lake on either April 15 or April 17 (currently has two different dates in different places – will ask Angela to confirm). AHS was involved on site and outbreak control measures put in place on April 16th (though on some internal calls, I have also heard AHS say that April 16th was when they began implementing their control measures, but April 19th or so was when everything was really well established).

In any case, the status of the outbreak is ongoing.

I watched yesterday's video again and transcribed the verbal order section:

I am ordering anybody who has been in the Kearl Lake project since March 15th and has returned to British Columbia that they must self-isolate for 14 days after their return. For many people this will mean their return was over 14 days ago. If they had symptoms during that period of time, or they continue to have symptoms, we want you to connect with 8-1-1 and tell us about that. As well, anyone who has returned in the past 2 weeks must continue to self-isolate until the incubation period has passed. And if you do develop any symptoms, then again to call 8-1-1, to call your healthcare provider or your local public health office, so that we can have you assessed and tested if need be. We recognize as well that some people who were in Alberta and have returned and had some illness, may have family members who are now suffering from some illness related to COVID-19. If that is the case, then we again would like you to call 8-1-1 so that we can assist you in being assessed and understanding if this indeed is COVID-19.

I am following up regarding the Kearl Lake Oil camp xls lists that were sent to each of the HAs yesterday, as there seems to be some confusion and we can come to a mutual understanding of the next steps.

The list we received is of workers for the Imperial Oil Kearl Lake Camp in northern Alberta who were there between March 10 and April 21

 AB recommendation is that anyone was at the camp between March 29 and April 16 be quarantined and monitor for symptoms, and if symptomatic, reach out to their local 811 for further information.

On April 16 Imperial Oil told workers with own vehicles told to leave and to self-quarantine on return home. Those unable to leave were quarantined at the camp Bonnie reinforced the message re self-quarantine in a news briefing

- The lists include dates prior to March 29 to cover the incubation period of the individual diagnosed in Alberta.
- Full contact information was not provided by the company and will not be sought by Alberta.
- Full information on a number of individuals (including municipality in which they live) is not available as some
 work as outside contractors and would have to be approached separately for confidential individual
 information.
- Some discrepancies between town and province have been noted and highlighted (further discrepancies may exist).

My (Jane's) understanding is as cases were identified in Interior- these individuals were in self quarantine and some 2nd spread to household cases

Kamaran requested names of all who had worked at Kearl Lake as IH wished to follow up.

The list was received at BCCDC and staff reviewed the client registry to identify HA of residence which is as follows.

Subject: BC residents exposed to AB Kearl Lake outbreak

Hello all,

Imperial Oil Kearl Lake Camp in northern Alberta has been experiencing a COVID outbreak among workers. The outbreak is being managed by the employer. Workers who had a private vehicle were allowed to return home; those who did not are being quarantined on site. IHA has identified at least 8 confirmed cases among returned workers and NHA has identified 1.

At BC's request, BCCDC received from Alberta Health a list of BC workers who were at the Camp between March 10 and April 21. The list of 757 names came without addresses and we are in the process of assigning these to their HA of residence. AH recommendation is that anyone who was at the camp between March 29 and April 16 (between onset of first case in AB and implementation of control measures) be quarantined and monitored for symptoms. In BC, the onset of the first case was Mar 23 so I recommend we use Mar 23-Apr 16 as the at-risk period.

Once these lists are ready later today, we will be sending them to each HA for your assessment/management. I am aware that IHA will be contacting each of these returned workers to assess their symptoms and determine management. If a coordinated approach to manage these is desired, I encourage you to discuss this at the CMHO mtg tonight.

AH is also working to obtain a list of Imperial Oil employees who may reside in BC but have been quarantined at Kearl Lake during this same period. We will share this when we get it.

CMHO COVID-19 Public Health Measures call – May 1 2020 5:15-6:43 pm Record of Discussion and Decisions

1. Roundtable

Reka asked whether HAs have seen an increase in the number of children coming forward for testing now that the testing guidelines have expanded. She has been asked to write a clarification on the besting criteria for children. She said she did not think that our criteria were meant to imply that all children with runny noses should be tested, and suggested the following criteria: if there is an adult case in the household, or part of cluster, or if ill enough to seek medical care. Additional suggestions: if going to daycare or school. Shannon reported that out of 277 First Nations people tested, 2% were kids and none were positive. Reka also indicated that in 27 pediatric cases in a household only in 4 children may have transmitted in the household, but in the remaining such transmission could not be identified.

ACTION: Reka will draft an update to the testing guidelines applicable to children, obtain input from pediatrics, and circulate to members for approval

Reka reported that she had been on a call with the federal seroepidemiology group. Health care workers, testing of vulnerable unstably housed populations, remote and indigenous communities, serial testing in schools for 'monitoring' are all considerations of relevance to public health.

ACTION: Members to consider seroepidemiologic research that would inform public health practice and bring their thoughts to the Monday agenda

2. Surveillance Update

Eleni presented on the precirculated slide set. Discussion: that causes of deaths are still to come that may clarify contributions including potentially unintended consequences such as cancelled surgeries. DPIC slide showing increased exposure to household cleaners largely because of using higher than recommended concentrations of bleach, or mixing with other cleaners. Sustained increase in MSP billings for asthma starting in February and ongoing to present, coincidental with increase in sale of salbutamol; hypotheses discussed were the late peak of influenza, high levels of pollen, more concern about wheezing than usual which may or may not be COVID-19 related. Increase in numbers of cases reported since April 21 thought to be due to expanded testing. Larger number of outbreaks detected recently and testing of all of those in these settings (poultry processing plants and prison); in recent period 2/3 community cases and 1/3 outbreak cases. It was noted that we need to look at improving processes of reporting on cases without a recognized source; currently it's a smaller proportion than it used to be. The number of prevalent

cases has been quite stable, with cases leaving this pool as they complete their period of isolation. Dynamic departmental model slide was commented on as the combination of considerations about reducing contacts along with mitigating measures to reduce transmission such as physical distancing shown by proportional increases and in relation to impact on new hospitalizations. This information can be produced to inform regional discussions. Excellent contact tracing is considered important in prevention of 2nd wave; completeness and effectiveness of contact tracing more important than timeliness although details of this were not shown; more information to be presented on Monday.

Richard is hearing that there are significant shifts in people moving their primary care from a physician to systems like Babylon Health. Sarah Henderson and her team are very aware of this and it will be examined using Telehealth billing codes to understand how this has grown, and to capture related visits such as for acute respiratory illness, asthma, etc. Bonnie mentioned that she has worked with the College on 'your physician knows you best' messaging and they've seen a dramatic difference since this has been issued. Patty raised concern that family doctors who usually attend on their patients within long term care are not coming in to see them. Some physicians are using the single site order to indicate why they cannot visit, but this does not apply to them. VCH EOC has asked for support to be able to provide direction on this. Trevor has been in conversation with Heidi Oetter at CPSBC around bringing less essential services back on line; there will be messaging from the College next week; are trying to tie in the PPE requirements as well. This is being done for all regulated health professions and are having a mixed response, with some concerned about transmission risk. Patty indicated that there is sufficient PPE in VCH to support return to clinical care; Trevor indicated this is not universal across the whole province and are looking to have this improved by next week. Trevor is also trying to frame that digital care should not be the only modality in which way services are delivered.

3. Kearl Lake Update

Eleni reported that PHAC are now coordinating the outbreak response; there are 90 cases associated including 13 in BC; Silvina indicated that they have 22 cases in total in IHA and the data provided to BCCDC may be incomplete. The outbreak spans March 18-April 26. Imperial Oil is the main employer but there are a number of subcontractors, with about 2500 people at the worksite at any given time. April 14th the outbreak was declared and April 16th Alberta Health Services visited and implemented further control measures although cases have been reported 10 days after this time period. It's not clear whether there have been risk transmission settings/ activities as the epidemiologic data presented has not examined whether the cases can be circumscribed by any common elements. There is recognition that there are gaps in the process to date and Eleni and others are not confident that the outbreak is controlled. Alberta Health (AH) has indicated that not all those at the worksite are considered 'at risk' and only contacts of cases are being handled as at risk and being reported to other provinces, but BC has not received any such 'contact' reports from AH. Bonnie indicated that during a public health emergency, her giving a verbal order in her media briefing is sufficient. Issue is that messaging from Imperial Oil and AH has been different than the one from BC PHO. Bonnie asked whether messaging using social media can be done; Heather Amos has already done this but the suggestion that a press release be issued. IHA is supportive of that as they have the majority of the individuals and two outbreaks have been related to these workers. There is an additional call on Monday with Alberta at which time we will know what information they have been able to obtain from Imperial Oil as additional contact information has been requested which was missing from the file provided last Friday, to enable follow-up of workers. Imperial Oil has implemented extensive measures on site, detailed here: https://www.imperialoil.ca/en-CA/Updates/COVID-19/Protecting-our-Kearl-workforce-from-COVID-19

ACTION: Eleni will ask Alberta Health for BC to continue to receive information about all Kearl Lake workers who are traveling to BC/ travel back and forth from BC with full contact information to enable follow-up by BC public health until this outbreak is over

ACTION: Bonnie will reinforce her recommendations in the Saturday media briefing; will highlight that messaging in AB may not have been as stringent but that in BC we need workers from Kearl Lake to self-isolate for 14 days after leaving the site

4. COVID-19 survivors cohort

The provincial Strategic Research Advisory Committee (SRAC) is interested in developing a proposal to create a provincial cohort of all COVID-19 survivors for follow up for both antibody/immunologic and clinical outcomes. Perry is involved with the SRAC in BC. The group is interested in a range of long term effects including renal, cardiac, and pulmonary. A wide range of clinicians are interested in following these individuals to understand the consequences. Interested in pooling resources for a coherent proposal for MSF and/ or federal funding. The ask to this group is whether they would support and facilitate this work. Patty has been talking to Rob McMaster at UBC; UBC Dean of Medicine has put together a consortium; David Patrick and Mel Krajden are members. VCH has been starting to get consent routinely from new positives for participation in research. Suggested that this UBC group needs to have a discussion with the CMHOs. Bonnie asked why there are these two separate committees; she had discussed with the funders early on to have a single strategic committee and Rob McMaster is on it. Bonnie indicated that there is a strategic research plan and that it's to be a single process.

ACTION: Reka will invite David Patrick to speak to this group about the research enterprise next week

5. Unintended consequences update

Jason reported that there have been two calls of the working group; have been working on TOR and governance model; report to public health operations of HECC. Will bring in ad hoc task groups of First Nations HA, BCCDC, regions, and others as required. Table lists 4 domains: health, social, economic and environmental. Speaking to the stakeholders to identify indicators. Intention is to identify indicators that can priorize actions. Collecting input and feedback. Brian reported that at the next meeting will priorize. Have a sense of what some of these are. Happy to hear top of mind priorities from this group. Next report will be on where they land with some priorities. Still building the membership to ensure that the clinical consequences are also reflected. Reka indicated that the provincial clinical group is already engaged and that the regional EOCs also have lots of ideas for these and what has been happening. Jason asked are

these members that the working group should engage with, or should they have membership on the working group?
