- 3 BC residents treated out of province are excluded. Non-BC residents treated in BC are included.
- 4 Riverview Hospital cases with length of stay greater than 180 days are excluded.
- 5 Riverview Hospital did not report project #325-Mental Health Involuntary Admissions before 2008/09. Contact with Riverview reveals that almost all the admissions are involuntary. Therefore any admission to this hospital will be regarded as involuntary.
- 6 If a patient is admitted to the hospital several times and if one is involuntary, then this patient is regarded as involuntary in the unique patient table and the hospital of the first hospitalization of the involuntary admission will be recorded.
- 7 Each unknown phn will be regarded as a unique patient.
- 8 Please note that unique patient counts may have changed from previous reporting due to better patient documentation and data verification.
- 9 Involuntary is defined as having one or more of any Mental Health Act form that classifies a person as involuntary (Form 4, 20, 21). Involuntary status can occur at any point within the hospital stay.
- 10 No data is collected on which sections of the Mental Health Act are relevant to an involuntary admission.
- 11 If the involuntary flag of mental health admission is 'Y', then the case is counted as involuntary. Mental health patients who were not admitted involuntarily under the Mental Health Act are termed "Other Admissions. Information is not collected on Mental Health Act forms 1, 2, and 3 that record requests and consent for treatment or admission by patients or their parent/guardian. Therefore, it is not possible to say that patients were admitted voluntarily under the MHA, admitted for medical reasons, or under other acts.

12 Due to changes in reporting in 2018/2019, data on involuntary admissions for that year is incomplete and cannot be included in this report. Future years will use the new methodology. This includes extended leave and recall from extended leave data.

13 Definitions for Restraint Type:

Mechanical restraint — A device used to restrict free movement that is attached to, adjacent to or worn by the client/patient to prevent an immediate risk of serious bodily harm to self or others.

Includes: Handcuffs once “order to admit” is given and patient is handed off to hospital personnel or “order to admit” is given and RCMP/Police remain with the patient while waiting for an inpatient bed.

Excludes: Device that triggers an alarm (e.g. bed, chair Wanderguard® bracelet), side rails/bed rails. Handcuffs where the patient is restrained by RCMP/Police prior to the “order to admit” (patient in police custody).

Chair — Any device applied to a chair restricting a person’s voluntary movement such as: a fixed lap table or lap belt that cannot be opened by the person; this would include some reclining chairs from which a person cannot exit freely.

Excludes: Do not record when the patient does not have the physical ability or cognitive capacity to rise from any chair.

Physical or manual restraint — A manual procedure used to physically limit a person's freedom of movement, physical activity, or normal access to his or her body that prevents the immediate risk of serious bodily harm to self or others.

Excludes: Does not apply to holding a person in order to apply a mechanical restraint.

Seclusion room — The involuntary confinement of a person alone in a room from which the person is physically prevented from leaving (room is usually locked). Can be referred to as a Secure room.

Includes: Security guard posted outside of a locked room.

14 Definitions for Restraint Frequency:

Constant: use of restraint for any continuous period exceeding 24 hours

Day or Night only: use of restraint during the day or night for a continuous period of 12 hours and less than 24 hours

Intermittent: used occasionally for any period of time that is less than 12 hours

Unknown: Frequency of use unknown/not documented

None: No restraints used (i.e. none were documented)
