Re: “Proof of Vaccination” program in B.C.

Dear Premier Horgan,

As British Columbia has navigated the pandemic over the past 17 months, businesses in every region of the province have been negatively impacted, particularly those in the tourism and hospitality sectors. It has taken both an emotional and financial toll on businesses and their employees, with some owners having incurred significant debt to keep operating – debt that will take years to repay.

We recognize the work your government and provincial public health officials have done to manage this global health crisis in B.C., and appreciate the financial assistance made available by the governments of B.C. and Canada.

We are now at a critical juncture. Businesses need certainty and predictability to recover and thrive, especially at a time when they need to keep employees, customers, and patrons safe while rebuilding consumer confidence and restoring business.

While we applaud B.C.’s vaccination success to date, we are concerned that the recent surge in daily case counts and hospitalizations risks derailing B.C.’s Restart Plan, which is scheduled to enter its final step in less than a month. There is also growing concern about the number of people (albeit a minority) who, for medical reasons or through personal choice, will not be vaccinated and, by default, may be conduits for transmission, potentially putting vaccinated populations and recovery efforts at risk.

We need to return certainty and predictability to the business environment by leveraging all the tools available to us to keep employees, customers and patrons safe and businesses operating.

Targeted vaccination campaigns and the roll-out of the Safe Screen BC program will play a key role in helping to keep businesses open. However, businesses and their employees need more support, especially those that would be forced to close, if there was an outbreak or public health restrictions are reinstated. For that reason, we are requesting that the government introduce a “Proof of Vaccination” program for situations that attract large groups with prolonged exposure where physical distancing is

difficult to maintain e.g. at concerts and sporting events, to help mitigate transmission, rebuild consumer confidence and drive economic recovery.

As a precondition, the situations need to be clearly identified and mandated by government and public health officials, so that the onus of enforcing the program does not fall on businesses, to protect businesses from potential rights-based concerns or risks and to rebuild confidence of employees and the public.

For it to be effective, the program must be led by your government and be defined by a clear scope and specific rules. The program must be reliable, secure and leverage technology that is simple to use and results in no cost to the user. And although B.C.-centric, the program must be designed with future conversations with other jurisdictions and the federal government in mind and so be interoperable. The program must also be fair and sensitive to those who cannot be vaccinated for medical reasons. This is not a privacy issue, but rather a public health issue inclusive of the health not only of the population but of the economy and the businesses and families that contribute to that health.

As we've seen over the past 17 months, British Columbians have looked to government to lead them through the pandemic. Burdening businesses and frontline employees with the implementation and enforcement of public health related initiatives is not appropriate, will not work and will not achieve the overall goal of keeping British Columbians safe and getting our economy back on track.

The introduction of a "Proof of Vaccination" program, while bold, is understandably fraught with complexities that include legal and labour code ramifications. These challenges must be identified upfront and addressed in a methodical and thoughtful manner. We are keen to help and would be pleased to offer our collective insights on developing such a program so that it is set up to succeed and will be supported by business.

Dear Premier Horgan;

I am writing on behalf of the Fort Nelson & District Chamber of Commerce to express our concerns over the recent announcement regarding "Proof of Vaccination" requirements proposed to start September 13, 2021.

The Fort Nelson & District Chamber of Commerce does NOT support a proof of vaccination program that places the burden and cost of administering it on back of our already struggling business community. This places an untenable burden on business, particularly small and medium sized enterprises. As you are well aware the pandemic has pushed our businesses to the breaking point. This could well be the final blow for many of them.

Expecting business to police customer's vaccination status is not practical. You are asking business to require customers provide personal health information and are expecting them to deny entry without that proof. We have seen instances of violence erupt over mask requirements across the province in the past 18 months and now you expect business to put their employees on the front line regarding vaccinations.

Our members are very concerned about potential consequences including:

- Workforce – employers are struggling to find workers as it is, primarily due to the continued benefit programs. This affects all business although we know it is a significant issue in our hospitality industry which is further targeted by this order;
- Worker Safety – we are putting frontline employees, often our youngest workers, those working for minimum wage and our least experienced workers in a position to police customers. This is unfair to both the business and employee.
- Human Rights – expecting business to access personal health information violates the Human Rights Act and the BC Human Rights Code. Are businesses expected to question vaccination status in private to protect customer's information? How will businesses be protected from human rights complaints regarding discrimination?
- Cost to Business – Companies will need extra staff, incur training costs, potentially see increased WorksafeBC premiums and fines if employees are injured in an altercation with a customer. Some businesses may need to renovate in order to accommodate checking for vaccinations if privacy is a concern. In addition to the potential loss of existing customers and damage to client relationships.

Respectfully we are asking you to reconsider the proof of vaccination order as announced and engage with the business community on how to move forward. We certainly want to see British Columbia on the road to recovery while keeping people safe however managing and monitoring vaccinations is not the role of small business. If we continue to burden business our economies and communities will not survive.

Re: Consultation with business groups to facilitate implementation of vaccine passport

Dear Premier,

The Greater Victoria Chamber of Commerce supports all efforts to allow businesses to stay open and operational. We continue to champion the importance of BC's immunization campaign and our members are vocal that the health and safety of their staff and customers is paramount.

While we fully support initiatives that will increase immunization and reduce the spread of COVID-19 and its variants, we ask that the provincial government ensure the planned vaccine passport does not further burden businesses as they work to recover from the pandemic. Employers in the hospitality and retail sectors are facing extreme difficulties finding and keeping employees. They will need financial support for supplemental workers to ensure any additional demands on capacity can be adequately addressed. It would also be helpful to offer suggested or recommended language to be used when managing a potentially confrontational customer or client.

Enforcement of provincial health mandates is also an ongoing concern. Employers need clear guidance on how the province will ensure compliance with the vaccine passport system. And any fines or penalties that result from the actions of members of the public cannot be borne by businesses. Enforcement and penalties must be focused on the small percentage of individuals who choose to be non-compliant with provincial orders.

Finally, businesses need time to adjust to changes in regulations. It's not reasonable to require them to pivot substantially without due notice. As this process moves forward, we urge government to consult with businesses groups such as regional chambers of commerce to ensure a successful and positive implementation of this proposal.

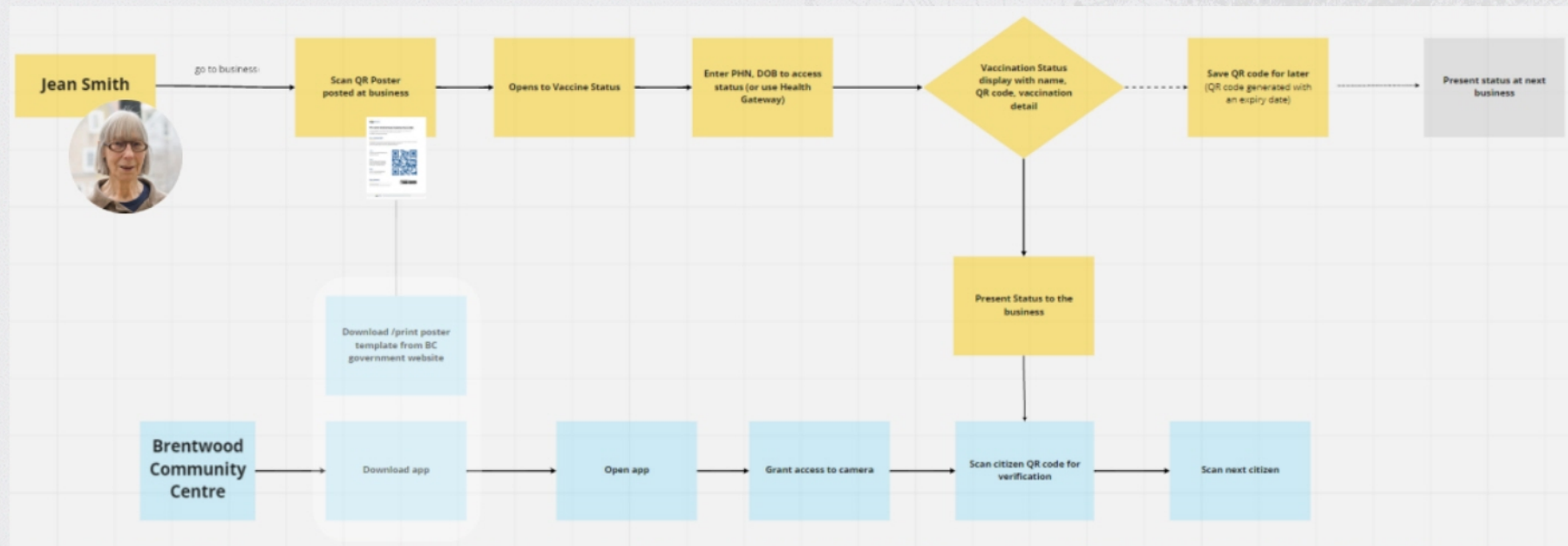

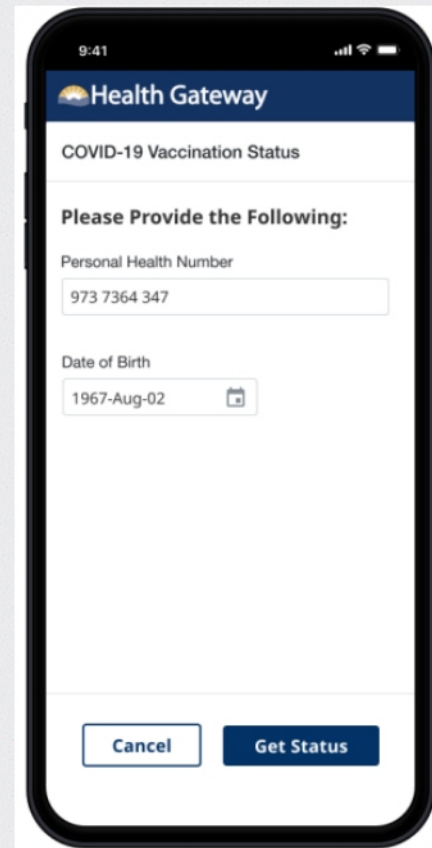

- Option 1: uses trust, and visual verification, of the presented proof (digital or paper); or
 - Option 2: using the BC verifier app, which they had already downloaded, to scan the QR code and verify the proof
- With the verification complete Mark is off to his table and the Restaurant is onto their next customer

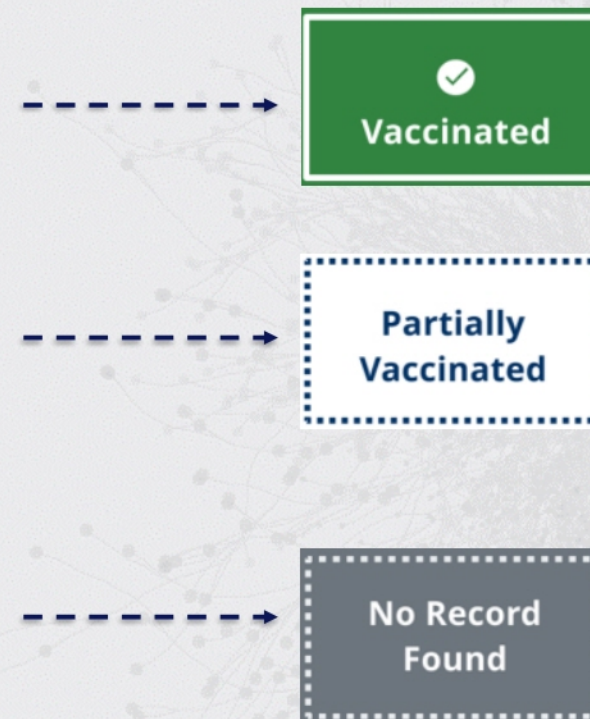
Another Example User Journey

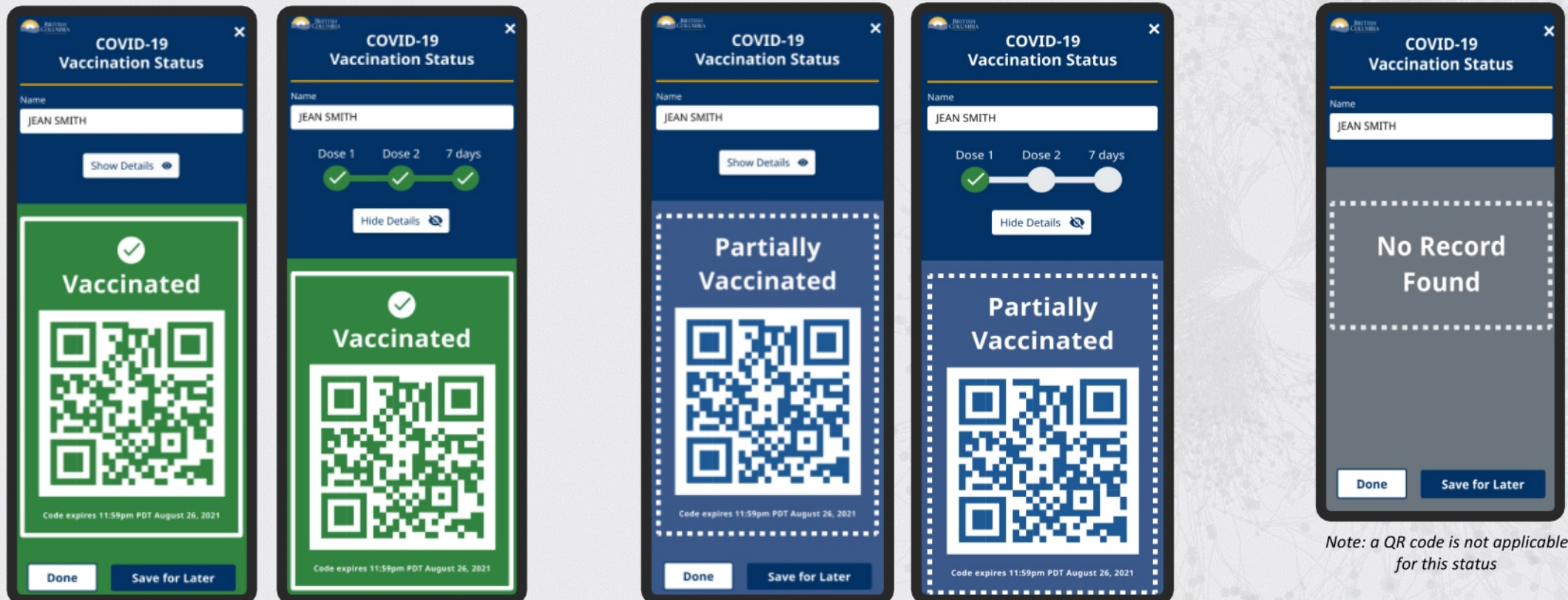

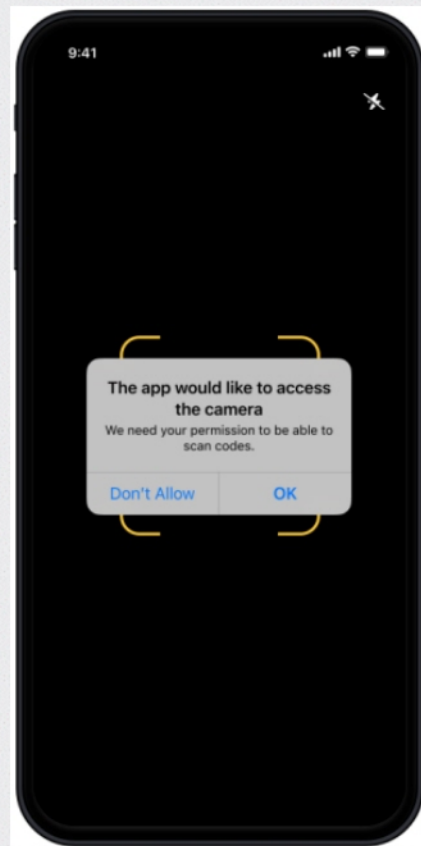
- For two dose vaccines:

(Vaccine Status – 3 outcomes)



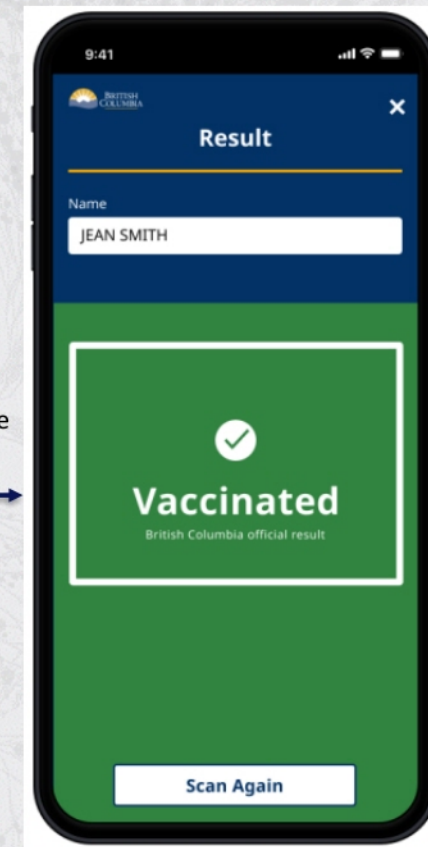

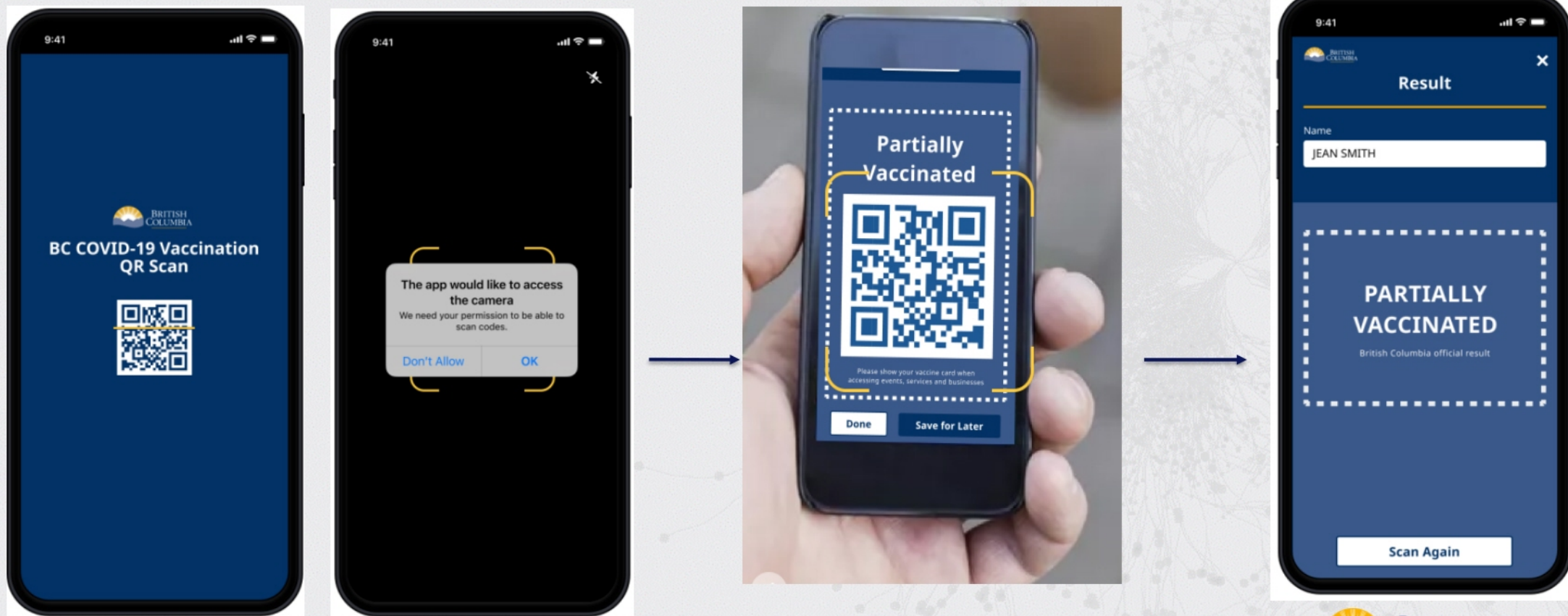

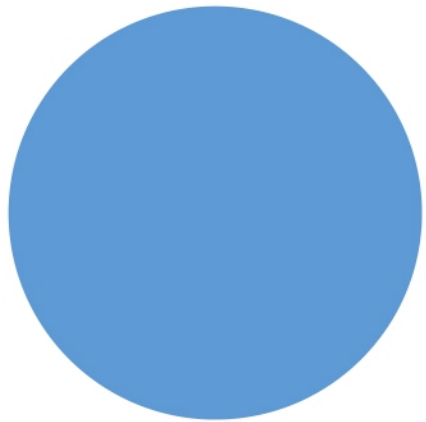

Key Features

- Citizen experience:
 - Supported by online and offline options
 - Privacy protecting as only name and status are visible with additional dose details available as an optional reveal by the citizen
- Business experience:
 - Privacy protecting as BC app (for scanning QR code) only reveals Name and Vaccine Status to support verification
 - Supports disconnected/offline use where Internet connectivity may be an issue (and to minimize dependency on provincial infrastructure performance)
 - No citizen information is saved/retained by the business through our app
- QR Code:
 - Includes QR code expiry to address loss, mis-use
 - Aligns to federal QR code work for international travel (meaning our QR code can also be re-used for international travel)
