- The Associate Physician class allows practitioners with specialty medical training, acceptable to the CPSBC, to work under physician direction and supervision to increase capacity and service delivery.
- The Associate Physician classification will support IMGs in BC, who are not eligible for licensure as
  independent medical practitioners, to find employment opportunities that meet priority health-system gaps.
- Associate Physicians will be integrated into acute and specialty care settings in health authorities across BC throughout 2023. The Ministry is also working with CPSBC to expand the new class, so Associate Physicians can work in community-based primary care settings.

### Recommendation

- The Ministry recognizes the contributions that Physician Assistants (PAs) can make to health care delivery as physician extenders, and we continue to monitor their implementation in other provinces.
- The introduction of a new health profession requires careful consideration and management, and significant resources in order to properly understand and address the inevitable team function issues that emerge from overlapping scopes of practice.
- The Ministry of Health (the Ministry) is committed to optimizing the scopes of practice of health care
  professionals to enable efficient and effective use of resources. This is reflected in the recently published BC

- There are approximately 800 PAs across Canada.
- Ontario, Alberta, Manitoba, New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia have introduced PAs into their health workforces.
- BC does not currently have a PA training program. There are only three PA training programs in Canada (two
  in Ontario and one in Manitoba).

#### Port Hardy staffing supports Jan. 27, 2023

#### Q1. What are you announcing today?

- People in Port Hardy and surrounding areas will continue to have access to emergency
  care as the Province takes several immediate actions to stabilize health care on northern
  Vancouver Island.
- As part of the stabilization, emergency department services will be available from 7 a.m.
  to 5 p.m. in Port Hardy and 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Cormorant Island with 24/7 emergency
  department services in Port McNeil. These temporary hours are intended to bring
  certainty to the community, so patients and families know where and when emergency
  services are available.

#### Q2. What are the details of the supports and incentives?

- To address the ongoing challenges in accessing health care for residents of the North Island region we are taking immediate high-priority action.
- Immediate strategies include:
  - o Implementing temporary staff recruitment and retention strategies, such as:
    - Retentioncruitment incentives for existing staff
    - Travel wage supplement
    - Referral bonus for staff members who help secure new recruits
    - Travel Resource Pool coverage to fill nursing shifts
    - Extend the physician guaranteed income for emergency room and inpatient services at one of the acute care sites.
  - Offering more supports to staff who work in the North Island region, for example:
    - Upgrade accommodation for travelling staff with renovations and improved furnishings.
    - Establish dedicated daily transport shuttle service between Port Hardy and Port McNeil Hospitals as well as daily shuttle to Campbell River and Comox which will serve both staff and patients.
    - Enhancing safety for staff and patients by hiring contracted protection service officers.
  - Continuing our efforts to expand the core staffing at Port Hardy to decrease dependence on contract and agency staff over time.

- Enhancing local 24/7 mental health and substance use services by adding additional capacity to sobering and assessment centre to increase access to appropriate supportive care and reduce ED admissions.
- o Increasing long-term care capacity at Port Hardy Hospital.
- o Modernizing and upgrading the Port McNeill and Port Hardy hospitals. For example:
  - Modernizing and renovating existing spaces including the maternity spaces
  - Emergency department modernization and expansion
  - Upgrading nurse call, staff duress, medical gases
  - Increasing trauma room space
- Gradually increasing home health, home support and mental health and substance use services.
- Implementing mobile CT diagnostic services
- Adding additional modern short/medium term staff housing options in Port McNeil and Port Hardy and Cormorant Island communities

#### Q3. How much will this cost?

 These initiatives will be funded with approximately \$30 million in onetime, capital, and ongoing operating funding provided from the Ministry of Health.

#### Q4. Why are you doing this now?


- Efforts to improve health-care services in the North Island region have been ongoing.
- With staffing shortages at critical levels, we are implementing various solutions to stabilize staffing in the North Island.

#### Q5. Where is the Province at in terms of introducing physician assistants?

- We recognize the contributions physician assistants can make to health-care delivery.
- We continue to monitor the implementation of physician assistants in other
  provinces and are actively exploring the potential to add them as a new classification of
  health-care worker in British Columbia.
- Introducing a new health profession requires careful consideration and management and significant resources to properly understand and address the inevitable team function issues that emerge from overlapping scopes of practice.

- We recently announced a new associate physician class of restricted registration with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC to help meet urgent and emergent patient care needs.
- The associate physician classification allows international medical graduates who are not otherwise eligible for licensure to care for patients under physician direction and supervision to increase health system capacity and service delivery.
- Associate physicians have a similar scope of practice as physician assistants.
- **Q6.** Port Hardy ER doctor Dr. Alex Nataros said the fact that the Province hasn't approved his physician assistant amounts to "systemic racism." What is your response to that?
  - The Ministry of Health is committed to ensuring that Indigenous people and First Nations communities have equitable access to health care.
  - We are working with the First Nations Health Authority and local First Nations to improve primary care services on the north Island.
  - Through our primary care strategy, we have been rolling out primary care networks that
    include budgets for Elders, traditional healers and mental health professionals across
    the province as well as opening First Nations-specific primary care clinics.
- Q7. What is the timeline for implementing these changes and improvements?
  - We are implementing solutions immediately to address the ongoing staffing challenges in the North Island region.
- **Q8.** The Hospital Employees Union is currently grieving the retention incentives, as these incentives are not available to all HEU members. How will you address this?
  - Answer needed.
- **Q9.** You're adding a lot of incentives to the Mt. Waddington catchment area. What about other health centres in rural areas?
  - For now, the incentives announced today apply to the Port Hardy and Port McNeill hospitals only as this is where the greatest need has been identified.

- We remain committed to ensuring that people living in remote and rural communities can access the health care they need and will work with health authorities on any future initiatives.
- Q10. How long has the Port Hardy Hospital has been closed overnight now?
  - Answer needed.
- **Q11.** How long will the hospitals be closed overnight? When can residents expect to see the hospital return to 24/7 service?
  - We are working hard on multiple approaches to stabilize staffing in the region.
  - Once staffing can be maintained consistently, regular hours will resume as soon as possible across the North Island region.
  - These temporary hours are intended to bring certainty to the community, so patients and families know where and when emergency services are available.
- Q12. Why aren't you hiring back the unvaccinated health-care workers? That's 2,500 workers that could join our health workforce and help address the shortages.
  - In order to protect the province's most vulnerable and the overall health-care system,
     COVID-19 vaccination requirements for health-care system workers remains in place.
  - Consistent with current provincial health officer orders, health-care system workers will
    continue to be required to be vaccinated with a primary COVID-19 vaccine series, unless
    they have obtained an exemption from the provincial health officer.
  - In B.C. and globally, measures taken to combat the ongoing public-health emergency remain important. The trajectory of the pandemic over the next few months is uncertain as there is still significant spread of the COVID-19 virus in the province and around the world.
  - Vaccine mandates protect vulnerable populations, including older and immunocompromised patients in hospitals, residents in long-term care facilities, as well as health-care workers and the overall health-care system. It is critically important to maintain this layer of protection for all of them.
  - All health professionals are encouraged to get vaccinated, including getting their booster.



I believe that the Canadian Armed Forces previously had a PA training program, however, upon quick review of the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) website, it appears that there are two entry options:

- Direct Entry Option the recruit already has completed 1) Bachelors or Masters degree in an accredited PA program, 2) are a certified PA and 3) have current registration to practice as PA in a Canadian province or territory. CAF may place the recruit directly into on-the-job training following basic training.
- 2. **Paid Education Option** CAF will pay successful recruits to complete a recognized Canadian University Physician Assistant program. Students already enrolled in a recognized Canadian University Bachelors of Science Physician Assistant program may also be eligible for this training plan.

# Surgical Workforce Report: FY2022/23 Q3 (P7 - P9)

Health Workforce Planning and Strategic Initiatives Branch; January 17, 2023

In "A Commitment to Surgical Renewal" (the Renewal Plan), the Ministry of Health established a plan for completing surgeries postponed in March and April 2020 due to the COVID-19 surgical shutdown and to significantly increase the number of surgeries performed beyond pre-COVID levels.

In the Renewal Plan, the Ministry sets out five steps to meet these ambitious targets:

- 1. Increasing surgeries
- 2. Increasing essential personnel
- 3. Focusing on patients
- 4. Adding more resources
- 5. Reporting on progress

This report focuses on progress towards increasing essential personnel (step 2) with a focus on nurses, medical device reprocessing technicians (MDRT), surgeons, anesthesiologists, and FP/GP-anesthesiologists.

This report contains data from surgical workforce reporting submitted by the regional health authorities and PHSA in FY20, FY21, and FY22 including data up to and including **Period 9 of FY22** (ending December 8, 2022).

### Analysis of Payroll Data

Data in Figure 1 indicate that staffing, productive hours, and overtime all briefly stabilized after the COVID-19 shutdown in March and April 2020 (Q4 2019 and Q1 2020) but have since shifted. Current trends reveal:

- Lower productive hours per employee and lower total productive hours, despite more total employees.
- Higher overtime per employee and higher overtime in total.
- Fluctuations in the payroll data are larger than before the pandemic.

Figure 1. Surgical Nurse (Perioperative and Post Anesthetic Recovery RN) Payroll Data<sup>1</sup>




Figure 1 plots standard deviations from the mean over the fiscal year for Surgical RNs.

- When the line is below 0, the value for that quarter is below average (e.g., overtime in Q1 2020).
- When the line is above 0, the value for that quarter is above average (e.g., overtime in Q2 2021).
- Distance from 0 indicates the magnitude of the difference from the average. When the line is far below 0, the value for that period is far below the average of all periods.

### Table 2. Change in Active Employees

The number of active employees in surgical has increased since this quarter last year as well as since April 2020. There is typically normal seasonal variation in the number of active employees from quarter to quarter. For example, more people take vacation in the summer, so the number of active employees drops from quarter 1 to quarter 2. Examining the change from the same quarter last year accounts for this seasonal variation, and more accurately shows that the workforce has changed.

These increased personnel have **increased surgical capacity** across the province. Surgical specialty nurse productive hours were **4% higher** than this time last year, with an increase of 6800 hours of surgical nursing in Quarter 3 of 2022 when compared to Quarter 3 of 2021.

### Insights on Surgical Occupations and Risks to Surgical Targets

Risk assessments by occupation have remained the same since last quarter. Health authorities assess most professions as posing a low or moderate risk to service delivery, except Interior and Northern Health who continue to assess most surgical occupations as posing a high risk to service delivery.

Vancouver Coastal has also noted that physicians required to meet surgical targets are not just surgeons, anesthesiologists, and FP/GP-anesthesiologists, and our templates are missing key physician specialties which impact the gap and risk assessment.<sup>s.13</sup> s.13

s.17 and training opportunities are widely available leading to fewer applicants for each program.

New strategies in action:

- Vancouver Coastal has developed a preceptorship program to recruit new graduates to the perioperative RN training program and is launching a standardized onboarding and internal movement program.
- Interior Health is developing a virtual option of their regional preceptor workshop to allow employees at smaller sites to attend without travelling and has found that their preceptor support position was effective in retaining preceptors new to teaching.

### Medical Device Reprocessing Technicians

As previously reported, baseline staffing and training are both challenging, with associated risks from sick leave, overtime, stress, and fatigue. Smaller sites and rural and remote locations are having **difficulty recruiting and housing MDRTs**. Additionally, some MDRT staff only want to work daytime and weekday hours or remain as casual employees (because of their ability to take shifts in private industry), impacting coverage.

MDRT education cohorts were successfully increased in 2020/21 and into 2021/2022,s.17 s.17

In Vancouver Coastal, the high cost of living is impacting recruitment and training cohorts.

### Surgeons

Specialty areas and rural and remote sites remain a concern, but **overall risk remains moderate** as surgical positions have not historically been difficult to fill.

### Appendix A: Additonal Insights from Surgical Data

We've had an opportunity to take deeper dives into the surgical data; a summary of the results is below, and full reports will follow separately.

#### Casualization

Question: How do casual workers contribute to the surgical workforce?

**Method**: Casualization was assessed by calculating the proportion of total productive surgical hours contributed by casual workers.

#### Results:

- s.17 Rates routinely peaked in Quarter 2, implying workers' preference for flexibility in the summer months.
- MDRTs, and RNs with both PACU and Perioperative training had high casual rates, with averages of 18.7% and 24.8% respectively. This is consistent with research suggesting multi-skilled nurses are more likely to turn to casual work, as they report elevated workloads and burnout more often than nurses working in a singular role.
- Health authorities with more rural areas (Fraser, Interior, and Northern) are consistently more reliant on casual workers than the other HAs, suggesting that rural areas may require more support.

### Physician FTEs

Question: How do physician Full Time Equivalents (FTEs) compare to physician headcount?

**Method**: Physician FTEs were assessed against physician headcount among surgeons, anesthesiologists, and FP/GP-anesthesiologists.

### Results:

- Most physicians are working at less than 1 FTE across the province,s.13
   s.13
- Since April 1, 2020, the ratio of FTE to headcount has decreased slightly for all surgical professions even
  as active headcount and FTEs have increased, which may suggest that physicians were previously
  working to capacity.
- Surgeons decreased their hours the least out of the three occupations (0.85 FTE/head to 0.84 FTE/head) and anesthesiologists have decreased their hours the most (0.84 FTE/head to 0.78 FTE/head).
- Northern Health specifically had significantly lower FTE/headcount ratios for Anesthesiologists compared to the other Health Authorities. s.13

### Training Completions and Net New Capacity

**Question**: Have larger training cohorts for MDRTs, Perioperative RNs and LPNs, and PACU RNs impacted the surgical workforce?

**Method**: Training completion data (provided by the health authorities) was assessed against active employee numbers (from payroll data).

#### Results:

- 1008 surgical employees (MDRTs, perioperative RNs and LPNs, and post-anesthetic recovery RNs) completed their training between April 1, 2020, and December 22, 2022.

### QP Summary Thursday February 7: Health related topics / no MMHA related topics

- Leader of the Official Opposition Kevin Falcon spoke about our Mental health care system. Over 11,000 lives lost. A broken system that is costly, and impossible to navigate for desperate families. The NDP don't even track the funded beds available or the outcomes from the investments they're making. Will the government admit that the status quo of the last 6 years has utterly failed? Minister of Mental Health and Addictions Jennifer Whiteside said that many of us have been impacted by the MHSU crisis in our province, that is experienced in all jurisdictions of the country and province. The approach is articulated in the pathway to hope, that the vision unites investments in Indigenous led solutions, Child and youth services, etc. There is no question that the progress in 2019 we saw was impacted by the covid 19 pandemic and impacted the ground that was made at that time. Leader of the Official Opposition Kevin Falcon asked a supplemental question – things are getting markedly worse and yet the Minister continues to defend the status quo. It has become a hallmark of this government, there has to be a dramatic shift away from the current approach. We need to focus on helping people recover from their addictions, to get better. We also have an obligation where necessary to take involuntary care when necessary to be put into proper care. Your own Premier paid lip service to this idea and now nobody knows where government's position is on this issue. Will somebody clarify, do you support involuntary treatment for adults and youth who are at risk to themselves or others? Minister of Mental Health and Addictions Jennifer Whiteside responded that the work is focused on the continuum of care. We invested 500 million in 2021 to build out an integrated system. We have worked to increase detox beds, after care supports, etc. There are tools that physicians have access to and that they use when it comes to involuntary care. Leader of the Official Opposition Kevin Falcon – second supplemental question - not getting us to where we need to go which is improved outcomes. Every day, there is no body who thinks the system we have now is working. Every day desperate parents are not getting the help they need. The number of children and youth who have died from an OD has more than doubled in the last 2 years to 65 deaths. Minister of Mental Health and Addictions Jennifer Whiteside responded.
- Surrey South MLA Elenore Sturko asked a question about a constituent who admitted his daughter to Peace Arch hospital for substance use issues. What is this governments position on involuntary treatment and will the government commit to reintroducing legislation? Minister of Mental Health and Addictions Jennifer Whiteside responded that there have been more than 28,000 children and youth received mental health and substance use services. Surrey south MLA Elenore Sturko asked a supplemental question about her constituents daughter getting treatment and said they were told there was a 6 month wait. Minister of Mental Health and Addictions Jennifer Whiteside responded that they need to do more work on seamless process for individuals when it comes to accessing treatment. That is work that our Premier has committed to, and first talked about that seamless approach in the safer communities action plan. We agree that there is more work that needs to be done and are thankful for the cooperation across all parties of this house, that's important collaborative work we need to do together in our communities to face this crisis.
- Leader of the third party Sonia Furstenau asked a question about the CBC's townhall where people shared stories while a senior health official sat at the back shaking her head. A leaked employee satisfaction survey said less than half of staff felt satisfied with their management in Island Health. The 2022 DOBC report said Island Health physicians have the lowest satisfaction. Doctors speaking out about patient safety are

punished and silenced. The patients going without care are the ones the minister needs to be accountable to. Does the minister have confidence in island health? Minister of Health Adrian Dix responded that he does have confidence in Island health because they have delivered over the last 3 years, and that means that island health's doctors, workers, etc. have delivered an extraordinary response to a pandemic that has faced the entire world. There is a new practice contract to bring doctors in, working to increase diagnostics and surgery. We are working hard to deliver care everywhere. Rejects idea that when people raise concerns they are not heard. We always have to do better and work harder with staffing and teams but has confidence in Island health to do so. Leader of the third party Sonia Furstenau asked a supplemental question — when the island health employee survey comes out and shows that fewer than half are satisfied with management she would hope that the Minister would be concerned about that and as the representative for people that they would demonstrate some concern about this. There used to be 4 doctors for Port hardy, come this summer there is one. Dr. Alex Nataros has suggested that hiring physician assistants would be a solution to help people who are deeply undeserved but his solutions are being rejected. Will the minister agree to meet with the representatives for Island health in the next two weeks? Minister Adrian Dix responded that they are increasing supports to that region and those came because they did listen to communities.

- Member for Prince George Valemount Shirley Bond spoke about decriminalization of drugs and the list of requirements, specifically the requirement that says they must insure that individuals that desire treatment can access treatment when needed. Does the MMHA satisfied that this very specific requirement has been met? And that people right across BC can access treatment when they need it? Minister of Mental Health and Addictions Jennifer Whiteside responded. Member for Price George Valemount said families do not have the access requirement that is required before decriminalization can happen. The situation that families across this province are facing, she hears from families that are desperate and there are no services or treatment options. The letter of requirement also specifically says that this gov must meet the unique needs of people living in rural communities. How can the Minister stand here and pretend that families that live in rural BC have access to treatment when they need it because they simply do not. Minister of Mental Health and Addictions Jennifer Whiteside responded that we all know there are gaps in the system and we have work to do that we have been doing since 2017 to build an integrated system of care out of fragmented services. When we talk about introducing complex care in rural communities, that is part of the answer to this. Also expanding sobering beds in prince George and the North Island.
- West Vancouver Capilano MLA Karin Kirkpatrick said this is a two term government that has had 6 years to put services in place and they have failed to do this work. No wonder there was no mention of decriminalization in yesterdays' throne speech. Data collection will need to start immediately to establish a baseline. Is the Minister satisfied that this very specific requirement from the Federal government that this has been met to move forward and will she explain to us what the baseline metrics actually are? Government house leader Ravi Kahlon responded that there is a commitment to support decriminalization. Appreciates leader of opposition that this important work will require investments.

Further to my last email, forwarding over some materials we have on Associate Physicians and Physician Assistants from a regulatory/bylaws perspective.

#### **Associate Physicians**

• On May 29, 2020, the College of Physicians and Surgeons amended their bylaws to create a registration category for Associate Physicians.

- Upon creation, this license category was limited to physicians in certain acute care settings. This class of
  restricted registration allows a pathway to practice of certain individuals (typically International Medical
  Graduates), who have a medical degree, passed Part 1 of the Medical Council of Canada's qualifying exam
  and met other qualifications required by College, but who do not meet the requirements for full licensure in
  BC.
- On January 13, 2023, the CPSBC amended their bylaws to expand the Associate Physician class of registration
  to include community physicians. Additionally, on the same day the CPSBC amended its bylaws to create a
  new restricted class of registration for certain USA certified physicians in the specialties of pediatrics,
  internal medicine and emergency medicine. Both of these restricted classes of registration are intended as
  expedited pathways to restricted licensure for individuals who do not meet the requirements for full
  licensure in BC.

### **Physician Assistants**

- Currently do not practice in BC. Are only trained and practice in specific regions of Canada and the US (i.e. they do not exist internationally)
- Have limited training (2 year program) and work as physician extenders, working under the direction and supervision of the attending physician via delegation/authorization of services from the attending physician only.
- Only three public training programs in Canada (located in Manitoba and Ontario)
- In Canada, currently are only authorized to practice in some regions of Canada including New Brunswick, Manitoba, Alberta, Ontario and with the Canadian Forces. <a href="https://capa-acam.ca/about-pas/pa-fact-sheet/">https://capa-acam.ca/about-pas/pa-fact-sheet/</a>

### QP Summary Thursday February 7: Health related topics / MMHA related topics

- Surrey South MLA Elenore Sturko spoke about the requirements from the federal government that this government hasn't met including timely access to treatment. The province is supposed to ensure that individuals can assess treatment when they need it. Why is the government proceeding with the decriminalization of dangerous drugs without first ensuring timely access to treatments as promised? Premier Eby responded that the toxic drug crisis is top of mind for all members. The goal of these initiatives is to keep people alive so that they are then able to get treatment. When we meet with families who have lost loved ones they wished that person was still with them so they could get treatment and the first step is keeping them alive. It is vital that we have a public network of treatment and that is what we're building and we are following the recommendations of the all-party committee on that. Early intervention is key here and I am encouraged that the opposition is embracing this idea and supports this. We all need to work together on these important issues. Supplemental from MLA Elenore Sturko. The Premier acknowledges that this is work is underway and that they didn't have the work completed prior to decriminalization. British Columbians have good reason to be skeptical when it comes to decriminalization. High school students are now accessing addictive hard drugs via vending machines through a process called diversion. The NDP has failed to provide oversight to ensure that addictive drugs don't get diverted to teenagers. How can families ensure their children and youth are safe? Premier Eby responded that everyone came together through the all-party committee and that it is best to put a healthcare worker between kids and predatory drug dealers. These healthcare workers help remove the stigma and have conversations and deal with the addiction, and this helps to keep people alive and have conversations about treatment. We support Foundry Youth Services and have opened 24 of these. We have doubled beds for youth treatment. People can go direct to treatment after leaving the emergency department so that we don't lose people after they've been seen in emergency. There are new treatments and stabilizations beds in Interior Health and we still have more to do but we are working together to support folks struggling with addiction.
- West Vancouver Capilano MLA Karin Kirkpatrick spoke about the federal letter of requirements that says there is an obligation to have beds and treatment available at the same time as decimalization which we are not seeing. Instead of an awareness campaign the NDP are letting allies do that education. Pivot Legal and a Vancouver area network of drug users are working to discourage people from seeking treatment. To the Premier, why is it that the only information about decriminalization and its harm coming from Pivot Legal instead of public safety information coming from this government? Minister of Mental Health and Addictions Jennifer Whiteside responded that the supposition in the question is simply wrong. The requirements from the federal government and the application we made in collaboration with providers and public health officials with respect to how we communicate this has been discussed with multiple groups. We are working with youth groups, such as Foundry and groups that work directly with kids. There is a robust curriculum in our K-12 system and those are the primary mechanism were using to communicate with children and youth. Supplemental from MLA Karin Kirkpatrick .The province has committed to ensure that individuals who desire treatment can access it when needed but what we're hearing is that it's in process when it should be

happening at the same time as decriminalization. The letter also calls for comprehensive consultation with communities, but communities are being forced to act on their own. Campbell Rives has passed a bylaw to give enforcement tools to address the use of hard drugs. To the Premier, why are communities being left on their own to manage the impact of open drug use in their parks and public areas? Minister of Mental Health and Addictions Jennifer Whiteside responded that the core planning table that met for years leading up to the exemption included BC Union of Municipalities and we've been working closely with respect to impacts in their communities. I understand that some communities are taking preventative measures to look at what they think may be problems down the road. Our conversations with municipalities have been to pull together to support individuals who need access to care and supports. We are working with 9000 frontline police offers to have training and education as to what decriminalization means and to reduce stigma, which is what we hear is most valuable from loved ones who have lost family members to drugs. We are working with municipalities to be there for problems that arise for them and we will continue to work with them.

- Saanich North and the Islands MLA Adam Olsen asked the Minister of Environment and Climate Change
  Strategy, does the Minister characterize the enforcement of environmental fractions of energy projects in
  BC? Minister of Environment and Climate Change Strategy George Heyman responded that there are district
  and outlined responsibilities for enforcement of regulations and conditions on permits. There are
  administrative procedures and administrative fairness in each regime. There's an escalating patterns of
  warning of penalties of orders that precede penalties and they are applied in an escalating process. One
  supplemental.
- Surrey White Rock MLA Trevor Halford spoke about the delays in our healthcare system. Last October the leader of the Opposition raised a case from White Rock about Farad who faced delay after delay and her cancer was missed. Now she's been undergoing radiation and she know needs a feeding tube. She was told she faced a 4-week delay to get her feeding tube. IF her weight continues to drop she will be forced to stop radiation which is affecting her ability to live. The Health minister has known about this case and it requires immediate action. Will this Minister give Farad and her family a chance and ensure that no other family has to go through something like this? Minister of Health Adrian Dix responded that anyone who is struggling with cancer deserves care and gets care in BC. In this case and others, we all care including all the healthcare workers, so of course I will look into the issue. This reminds us of our continuing need to invest in our healthcare system and provide more supports for people. That is what we will continue to do. When cases are brought to my attention I look into them and these very difficult situations have our compassion and support.
- Prince George MLA Shirley Bond said the situation MLA Trevor Halford raised was brought to the Ministers attention months ago. It is unbelievable that the Minister of Health thinks that we can keep bringing these individual cases to his attention. It's a symptom of the problems with our healthcare system. There are reports of toxic work places where doctors and nurses face retaliation for speaking out and healthcare workers are resigning and there are critical staffing levels. There is a proposal on the Minister's desk to get help in Port Hardy Hospital and has support from the Government members. Physician assistants can't currently work here in BC and could start almost immediately. Will the Premier take what is a seemingly immediate step and direct the Health Minister to approve the proposal that will provide desperately needed help? Minister of Health Adrian Dix responded that the government has taken unprecedented action to build out healthcare teams. We have more than doubled the number of nurse practitioners and have built out teams with addictions specialists. Physician assistants have not been approved in past because the previous government repeatedly rejected it. This is a training issue. Their scope of practice has to be regulated and is being looked at by the College but when it comes to be team based care we have made unprecedented progress.
- Kamloops—South Thompson MLA Todd Stone spoke about how doctors should be practicing medicine instead of being muzzled by the NDP. Dr. Nataros can't get a physician assistant and instead has been suspended. He called for the Kamloops North Thompson MLA Peter Milobar spoke about the toxic work environments in healthcare facilites. The Minister brushes those concerns off. We've heard about how people who are raising issues are threatened with muzzling and suspensions. Why do they feel that this is happening? What happens if you're in the administrative side of government? The former Chief Medical Officer for Interior Health was just convicted of sexual interference and sexual assault and it is disturbing to learn that after he was accused there was no suspension. A vile criminal was simply reassigned to other duties and continued to receive pay. To the Premier, why does the Ministry of Health continue to foster a toxic healthcare workplace by muzzling doctors, nurses and healthcare professionals while protecting the employment of someone convicted of the sexual assault of children? Minister of Health Adrian Dix responded that the opposition have put into question the ethics of one of our senior doctors and to attempt

to juxtapose those two issues is disgraceful. Dr de Villiers is rightfully gone as he should be. People do have the right and always have the right to speak up and that is ensured by the legislative action in this chamber. The member is wrong as to the facts and to make such serious allegations when you're wrong speaks of the opposition and not of the government. We expect our public health officials to act with the highest standards and they do and we support people in their efforts to protect public safety, such as Dr Ben Williams.

#### New Pathways

- USA Certified On January 13, 2023, the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC (CPSBC) amended their bylaws to create a new 'USA certified' class of registration for eligible US-trained physicians who have completed three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training and who hold American Board of Medical Specialists (ABMS) certification in emergency medicine, internal medicine, or pediatrics to practice medicine with limits and conditions granted by the CPSBC.
  - Prior to this bylaw change, these ABMS-certified physicians did not have a route to licensure in BC as their training is not substantially equivalent to Canadian specialty training as determined by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC). As such, USAcertified registrants must comply with scope of practice requirements and cannot hold themselves out as RCPSC-certified specialists.
  - A registrant in the USA certified class is responsible and accountable for their medical practice and can practice independently within their scope of practice.
  - It is anticipated that USA certified physicians will work in community-based or in emergency room/urgent care settings.
  - Since USA certified physicians are not recognized by the CPSBC as RCPSC-certified specialists, it is anticipated that USA certified physicians will be compensated consistent with existing GP-eligible categories (APP) or family medicine fee codes (FFS).

## Associate Physician: Acute Care

- The 'associate physician acute care' class of restricted registration provides a pathway for practitioners with specialty medical training, acceptable to the CPSBC, to work under physician supervision in acute care settings to increase capacity and service delivery.
- This class of registration supports international medical graduates (IMGs), who are not eligible for licensure as independent medical practitioners, to find employment opportunities that meet priority health-system gaps.
- This category of restricted licensure provides a pathway for eligible practitioners who have a medical degree, passed Part 1 of the Medical Council of Canada's qualifying exam (or CPSBC approved equivalent), complete a minimum of two years accredited training as a medical or surgical specialist, HA-sponsorship, and meet all other qualifications required by the CPSBC, but who do not meet the criteria for full or provisional licensure in BC.

## Associate • Physician: Community **Primary Care**

- On January 13, 2023, the CPSBC amended their bylaws to expand the associate physician class of registration to include community primary care.



Hi Calvin,

There are lot of nuances to the question, but here are some of the general differences.

Further to Ryan's comment Associate Physicians have medical degrees (from outside Canada), though have not met all of the qualifications required to become full physician registrants in BC (examinations, residency, etc.). The scope of practice for each of them would vary depending on the parameters of the sponsorship letter that they have with the Health Authority and their competency/previous experience. There is no one scope of practice for all associate physicians. As is outlined in the College of Physicians bylaws they may work in acute settings and community primary care settings, but scope of practice would vary depend the sponsorship letter and established supervision requirements.

Physician assistants <u>do not</u> have a medical degree (much more limited training), but take a typically take a 2 year program (three in Canada, more the US) in addition to some undergrad training that allows them to work as physicians assistants/extenders. The services they provide are delegated from and under the direction of the attending physician (i.e. they are physician extenders), they are not independent practitioners.

There are lot of nuances to the question, but here are some of the general differences.

Further to Ryan's comment Associate Physicians have medical degrees (from outside Canada), though have not met all of the qualifications required to become full physician registrants in BC (examinations, residency, etc.). The scope of practice for each of them would vary depending on the parameters of the sponsorship letter that they have with the Health Authority and their competency/previous experience. There is no one scope of practice for all associate physicians. As is outlined in the College of Physicians bylaws they may work in acute settings and community primary care settings, but scope of practice would vary depend the sponsorship letter and established supervision requirements.

Physician assistants <u>do not</u> have a medical degree (much more limited training), but take a typically take a 2 year program (three in Canada, more the US) in addition to some undergrad training that allows them to work as physicians assistants/extenders. The services they provide are delegated from and under the direction of the attending physician (i.e. they are physician extenders), they are not independent practitioners.

Wonder how many physicians would share the following views stated in this article:

- Physician assistants -- who have so far not been licensed to practise in B.C. -- would be roughly 30 to 40 per cent cheaper for the health- care system than physicians, Sun and Moran said, yet the patient receives "physician-quality care."
- They can typically tend to about 80 per cent of the daily patient load for family doctors, said Sun.
- Moran, a UBC associate clinical professor in the Faculty of Medicine, likens a physician assistant to a chief
  resident who has trained with a physician for five years and is ready to work independently. "A physician
  assistant is a chief resident who never leaves your practice," said Moran.
- Physician assistants are educated under the same medical model as doctors through a 24-month graduate program, making them a more immediate solution to the health-care crisis, Sun said.
- Moran maintains physician assistants are "best suited" to rural areas, given that they can independently interpret X-rays, set a fracture, put a cast on, sew a laceration, intubate a patient, and remove foreign bodies from ears and noses.

As discussed at the January 26, 2023 meeting of the Internationally Educated Health Professionals (IEHP) subcommittee (of the FPT Committee on Health Workforce (CHW)), IRCC is exploring the creation of a new stream under the International Mobility Program (IMP) for Canadian employers to facilitate the hiring of temporary foreign workers in health care positions. This new stream is meant to help health care employers fill critical labour shortages in the health care sector, by streamlining the process for health employers by exempting them from the need for a Labour Market Impact Assessment (LMIA) under the Temporary Foreign Worker Program (TFWP), enabling foreign nationals to apply for a work permit directly to IRCC via the IMP. The deck presented at that meeting is attached for information, and we are following up to request formal feedback from the IEHP subcommittee members.

This new stream would be for temporary residence (i.e. to obtain a work permit) only, and would not feature a pathway to permanent residence for applicants – rather, applicants could apply to existing permanent residence pathways if they meet eligibility criteria. As is currently the case, applicants to this new stream would still need to demonstrate they can work in the occupation (i.e. meet credential/licensing requirements, or show that they can do so within a relatively short timeframe) as well as meet all other regulatory criteria.

To be eligible, applicants (foreign nationals) would require an offer of employment in one of the identified health occupations, and the employer would be required to offer the <u>prevailing wage</u> or higher [1] to the foreign worker (which is the current requirement of the TFWP).

IRCC is formally seeking feedback from provinces and territories on which health care occupations should be included in this new stream, using the attached list as a starting point. **IRCC would greatly appreciate your review and feedback from your jurisdiction's perspective on:** 

- 5. Which occupations <u>should be prioritized for inclusion</u> in this new stream, or alternatively those that <u>should NOT</u> be included.
- 6. Criteria or considerations used to advise on which occupations should be included/excluded
- 7. Whether the prevailing wage (or higher) criteria would be appropriate, and if not, recommendations for alternative wage methodology
- 8. Whether any additional criteria should be included in the proposed IMP stream

Please note that any employers seeking to fill positions in occupations not found on the list would still be able to apply for an LMIA to hire foreign nationals on work permits via the TFWP.

IRCC encourages you to consult with other provincial/territorial ministries in your respective jurisdictions who may have views on this proposed stream, noting that IRCC will also be sending this message/request for feedback to ministries responsible for immigration (Forum for Ministers Responsible for Immigration (FMRI)), and ministries responsible for employment (Forum for Labour Market Ministers (FLMM)).

#### **Key Background:**

- PAs are health care professionals that work under the direction and supervision of a licensed physician to provide a board range of health services.
- PAs act as 'physician extenders' that complement existing health services and are not independent practitioners.
- A PAs scope of practice is physician delegated, and the medical services assigned to the PA must be within the scope of the supervising physician. PAs are trained as generalists whose scope of practice is determined on an individual basis and outlined in a practice contract or agreement between the supervising physician, the PA, and often the facility or service where the PA will work. In Canada, a PAs degree of autonomy will also depend on the rules and regulations of the provincial jurisdiction where they practice.
- PAs can work in any healthcare setting and their activities may include conducting patient
  interviews, histories, and physical examinations; performing selected diagnostic and therapeutic
  interventions or procedures; and counseling patients on preventative health care<sup>1</sup>.
- PAs are a relatively new health profession in Canada, although their introduction to Canada began in Canadian Armed Forces in the 1950's<sup>2</sup>.
- There are approximately 800 PAs across Canada<sup>3</sup>.
- Ontario, Alberta, Manitoba, New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia have introduced PAs into their health workforces.
- BC does not currently have a PA training program. There are three PA training programs in Canada: 1) University of Manitoba 2) McMaster University 3) The Consortium of PA Education

Graduates of accredited Canadian PA program are eligible to write the Physician Assistant Certification Council of Canada (PACCC) PA Certification Exam. Individuals who successfully pass the exam are awarded the Canadian Certified Physician Assistant Designation.
- The CAPA is the professional association representing PAs nationally.

Wonder how many physicians would share the following views stated in this article:

- Physician assistants -- who have so far not been licensed to practise in B.C. -- would be roughly 30 to 40 per cent cheaper for the health- care system than physicians, Sun and Moran said, yet the patient receives "physician-quality care."
- They can typically tend to about 80 per cent of the daily patient load for family doctors, said Sun.
- Moran, a UBC associate clinical professor in the Faculty of Medicine, likens a physician
  assistant to a chief resident who has trained with a physician for five years and is ready
  to work independently. "A physician assistant is a chief resident who never leaves your
  practice," said Moran.
- Physician assistants are educated under the same medical model as doctors through a 24-month graduate program, making them a more immediate solution to the health-care crisis, Sun said.
- Moran maintains physician assistants are "best suited" to rural areas, given that they can
  independently interpret X-rays, set a fracture, put a cast on, sew a laceration, intubate a
  patient, and remove foreign bodies from ears and noses.

## **QP Summary Thursday February 7:** Health related topics / MMHA related topics

- Surrey South MLA Elenore Sturko spoke about the requirements from the federal government that this government hasn't met including timely access to treatment. The province is supposed to ensure that individuals can assess treatment when they need it. Why is the government proceeding with the decriminalization of dangerous drugs without first ensuring timely access to treatments as promised? Premier Eby responded that the toxic drug crisis is top of mind for all members. The goal of these initiatives is to keep people alive so that they are then able to get treatment. When we meet with families who have lost loved ones they wished that person was still with them so they could get treatment and the first step is keeping them alive. It is vital that we have a public network of treatment and that is what we're building and we are following the recommendations of the all-party committee on that. Early intervention is key here and I am encouraged that the opposition is embracing this idea and supports this. We all need to work together on these important issues. Supplemental from MLA Elenore Sturko. The Premier acknowledges that this is work is underway and that they didn't have the work completed prior to decriminalization. British Columbians have good reason to be skeptical when it comes to decriminalization. High school students are now accessing addictive hard drugs via vending machines through a process called diversion. The NDP has failed to provide oversight to ensure that addictive drugs don't get diverted to teenagers. How can families ensure their children and youth are safe? Premier Eby responded that everyone came together through the all-party committee and that it is best to put a healthcare worker between kids and predatory drug dealers. These healthcare workers help remove the stigma and have conversations and deal with the addiction, and this helps to keep people alive and have conversations about treatment. We support Foundry Youth Services and have opened 24 of these. We have doubled beds for youth treatment. People can go direct to treatment after leaving the emergency department so that we don't lose people after they've been seen in emergency. There are new treatments and stabilizations beds in Interior Health and we still have more to do but we are working together to support folks struggling with addiction.
- West Vancouver Capilano MLA Karin Kirkpatrick spoke about the federal letter of
  requirements that says there is an obligation to have beds and treatment available at the
  same time as decimalization which we are not seeing. Instead of an awareness campaign the
  NDP are letting allies do that education. Pivot Legal and a Vancouver area network of drug
  users are working to discourage people from seeking treatment. To the Premier, why is it that
  the only information about decriminalization and its harm coming from Pivot Legal instead of

public safety information coming from this government? Minister of Mental Health and Addictions Jennifer Whiteside responded that the supposition in the question is simply wrong. The requirements from the federal government and the application we made in collaboration with providers and public health officials with respect to how we communicate this has been discussed with multiple groups. We are working with youth groups, such as Foundry and groups that work directly with kids. There is a robust curriculum in our K-12 system and those are the primary mechanism were using to communicate with children and youth. Supplemental from MLA Karin Kirkpatrick .The province has committed to ensure that individuals who desire treatment can access it when needed but what we're hearing is that it's in process when it should be happening at the same time as decriminalization. The letter also calls for comprehensive consultation with communities, but communities are being forced to act on their own. Campbell Rives has passed a bylaw to give enforcement tools to address the use of hard drugs. To the Premier, why are communities being left on their own to manage the impact of open drug use in their parks and public areas? Minister of Mental Health and Addictions Jennifer Whiteside responded that the core planning table that met for years leading up to the exemption included BC Union of Municipalities and we've been working closely with respect to impacts in their communities. I understand that some communities are taking preventative measures to look at what they think may be problems down the road. Our conversations with municipalities have been to pull together to support individuals who need access to care and supports. We are working with 9000 frontline police offers to have training and education as to what decriminalization means and to reduce stigma, which is what we hear is most valuable from loved ones who have lost family members to drugs. We are working with municipalities to be there for problems that arise for them and we will continue to work with them.

- Saanich North and the Islands MLA Adam Olsen asked the Minister of Environment and Climate Change Strategy, does the Minister characterize the enforcement of environmental fractions of energy projects in BC? Minister of Environment and Climate Change Strategy George Heyman responded that there are district and outlined responsibilities for enforcement of regulations and conditions on permits. There are administrative procedures and administrative fairness in each regime. There's an escalating patterns of warning of penalties of orders that precede penalties and they are applied in an escalating process. One supplemental.
- Surrey White Rock MLA Trevor Halford spoke about the delays in our healthcare system. Last October the leader of the Opposition raised a case from White Rock about Farad who faced delay after delay and her cancer was missed. Now she's been undergoing radiation and she know needs a feeding tube. She was told she faced a 4-week delay to get her feeding tube. IF her weight continues to drop she will be forced to stop radiation which is affecting her ability to live. The Health minister has known about this case and it requires immediate action. Will this Minister give Farad and her family a chance and ensure that no other family has to go through something like this? Minister of Health Adrian Dix responded that anyone who is struggling with cancer deserves care and gets care in BC. In this case and others, we all care including all the healthcare workers, so of course I will look into the issue. This reminds us of our continuing need to invest in our healthcare system and provide more supports for people. That is what we will continue to do. When cases are brought to my attention I look into them and these very difficult situations have our compassion and support.

Prince George MLA Shirley Bond said the situation MLA Trevor Halford raised was brought to the Ministers attention months ago. It is unbelievable that the Minister of Health thinks that we can keep bringing these individual cases to his attention. It's a symptom of the problems with our healthcare system. There are reports of toxic work places where doctors and nurses face retaliation for speaking out and healthcare workers are resigning and there are critical staffing levels. There is a proposal on the Minister's desk to get help in Port Hardy Hospital and has support from the Government members. Physician assistants can't currently work here in BC and could start almost immediately. Will the Premier take what is a seemingly immediate step and direct the Health Minister to approve the proposal that will provide desperately needed help? Minister of Health Adrian Dix responded that the government has taken unprecedented action to build out healthcare teams. We have more than doubled the number of nurse practitioners and have built out teams with addictions specialists. Physician assistants have not been approved in past because the previous government repeatedly rejected it. This is a training issue. Their scope of practice has to be regulated and is being looked at by the College but when it comes to be team based care we have made unprecedented progress.

 Kamloops—South Thompson MLA Todd Stone spoke about how doctors should be practicing medicine instead of being muzzled by the NDP. Dr. Nataros can't get a physician assistant and instead has been suspended. He called for the Kamloops - North Thompson MLA Peter Milobar spoke about the toxic work environments in healthcare facilities. The Minister brushes those concerns off. We've heard about how people who are raising issues are threatened with muzzling and suspensions. Why do they feel that this is happening? What happens if you're in the administrative side of government? The former Chief Medical Officer for Interior Health was just convicted of sexual interference and sexual assault and it is disturbing to learn that after he was accused there was no suspension. A vile criminal was simply reassigned to other duties and continued to receive pay. To the Premier, why does the Ministry of Health continue to foster a toxic healthcare workplace by muzzling doctors, nurses and healthcare professionals while protecting the employment of someone convicted of the sexual assault of children? Minister of Health Adrian Dix responded that the opposition have put into question the ethics of one of our senior doctors and to attempt to juxtapose those two issues is disgraceful. Dr de Villiers is rightfully gone as he should be. People do have the right and always have the right to speak up and that is ensured by the legislative action in this chamber. The member is wrong as to the facts and to make such serious allegations when you're wrong speaks of the opposition and not of the government. We expect our public health officials to act with the highest standards and they do and we support people in their efforts to protect public safety, such as Dr Ben Williams.

Hi Calvin,

There are lot of nuances to the question, but here are some of the general differences.

Further to Ryan's comment Associate Physicians have medical degrees (from outside Canada), though have not met all of the qualifications required to become full physician registrants in BC (examinations, residency, etc.). The scope of practice for each of them would vary depending on the parameters of the sponsorship letter that they have with the Health Authority and their competency/previous experience. There is no one scope of practice for all associate physicians. As is outlined in the College of Physicians bylaws they may work in acute settings and community primary care settings, but scope of practice would vary depend the sponsorship letter and established supervision requirements.

Physician assistants <u>do not</u> have a medical degree (much more limited training), but take a typically take a 2 year program (three in Canada, more the US) in addition to some undergrad training that allows them to work as physicians assistants/extenders. The services they provide are delegated from and under the direction of the attending physician (i.e. they are physician extenders), they are

not independent practitioners.

Hope this is helpful.

There are lot of nuances to the question, but here are some of the general differences.

Further to Ryan's comment Associate Physicians have medical degrees (from outside Canada), though have not met all of the qualifications required to become full physician registrants in BC (examinations, residency, etc.). The scope of practice for each of them would vary depending on the parameters of the sponsorship letter that they have with the Health Authority and their competency/previous experience. There is no one scope of practice for all associate physicians. As is outlined in the College of Physicians bylaws they may work in acute settings and community primary care settings, but scope of practice would vary depend the sponsorship letter and established

supervision requirements.

Physician assistants <u>do not</u> have a medical degree (much more limited training), but take a typically take a 2 year program (three in Canada, more the US) in addition to some undergrad training that allows them to work as physicians assistants/extenders. The services they provide are delegated from and under the direction of the attending physician (i.e. they are physician extenders), they are not independent practitioners.
