APPENDIX 2 – Group 1 Rates

TRAVEL EXPENSES FOR NON-BC GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES

The following are allowable travel expenses for non-BC government employees. All travel expenses must be paid by the individual (except for airfare, which may be billed directly to the ministry). **Important:** Original receipts and proof of payment are required, except as noted below. Claims must be supported by a letter of agreement.

1. **Meal Allowances:**

Effective November 18, 2012, the following meal allowances can be claimed which must not exceed \$48.00 per day (receipts are not required):

Departure/Return Times:

Breakfast 7:00 a.m.; Lunch 12:00 noon;

Dinner 6:00 p.m.

Full day	\$48.00
Breakfast only	\$11.75
Lunch only	\$13.50
Dinner only	\$22.75
Breakfast and lunch only	\$25.25
Breakfast and dinner only	\$34.50
Lunch and dinner only	\$36.25

2. **Mileage Rates When Using Private Vehicle:**

Effective April 1, 2013, the private mileage allowance is \$.52 per kilometre (receipts are not required). This rate can be claimed when using a private vehicle for travel. It is intended to cover costs of gas and maintenance.

3. **Taxi and Parking:**

Taxi and parking charges will be reimbursed if original receipts are provided. Tips identified separately on taxi receipts cannot be claimed.

4. **Car Rentals:**

Approved car rental agencies and the maximum rates for each community are listed at www.pss.gov.bc.ca/csa/categories/vehicle_rentals/vehicle_rentals_daily/vehicle_rentals_daily.html#suppliers. Other agencies are to be used only when these agencies cannot supply vehicles or when renting a vehicle outside BC. Individuals should ask for the government rate. Original receipts are required.

PAI (personal accident insurance) will not be reimbursed.

CDW/LDW (collision/loss damage waiver) will be reimbursed only when renting from a company not on the approved list for the specific community or when renting outside BC.

5. **Accommodation:**

a) **Hotel/motel** (Original receipt and proof of payment required).

Approved hotels and the maximum rates that may be claimed for rooms and supplementary items (e.g., parking) are listed in the [Accommodation Guide](#). Rates may vary between summer, winter and shoulder seasons. Only the single government rate will be reimbursed. The "number in party" identified on the receipt must show only one person.

Process for Selecting Accommodation:

- Select the most cost-effective hotel from the accommodation guide that meets your business requirements.
- Ensure the expectations of the ministry expense authority are clarified regarding the price of accommodation before travel takes place.
- Ensure the rates charged by the hotel for the room and supplementary charges are at or below the rates quoted in the accommodation guide.

If you cannot stay at any of the hotels listed in the guide due to an exceptional or emergency situation, pre-approval must be obtained from the ministry expense authority and attached to the expense claim.

b) **Private lodging** (receipts are not required):

\$30 per night may be claimed when private lodging is arranged (e.g., staying with friends).

6. **Airfare:**

Economy airfare only will be reimbursed. Airfare should be billed to the ministry to ensure the HST paid is recovered. Bonus points must be used for government travel and are not for personal use.

7. **Miscellaneous Expenses:**

Laundry (after 7 consecutive days away), personal phone calls (one five-minute call home for each night away), ferry charges and highway tolls can be claimed if supported by an original receipt. Portage, to a maximum of \$.50 upon arrival and \$.50 upon departure, may also be claimed (receipts are not required). Other miscellaneous expenses incurred when travelling (e.g., business calls, courier and photocopying charges) can also be claimed if they pertain to government business and are supported by an original receipt.

8. **Out-of-Province Travel:**

When individuals are required to travel out-of-province, a Travel Authorization form approved by the director must accompany the expense claim.

9. **GST:**

Expenses paid personally by the individual are subject to GST and the GST may be claimed.

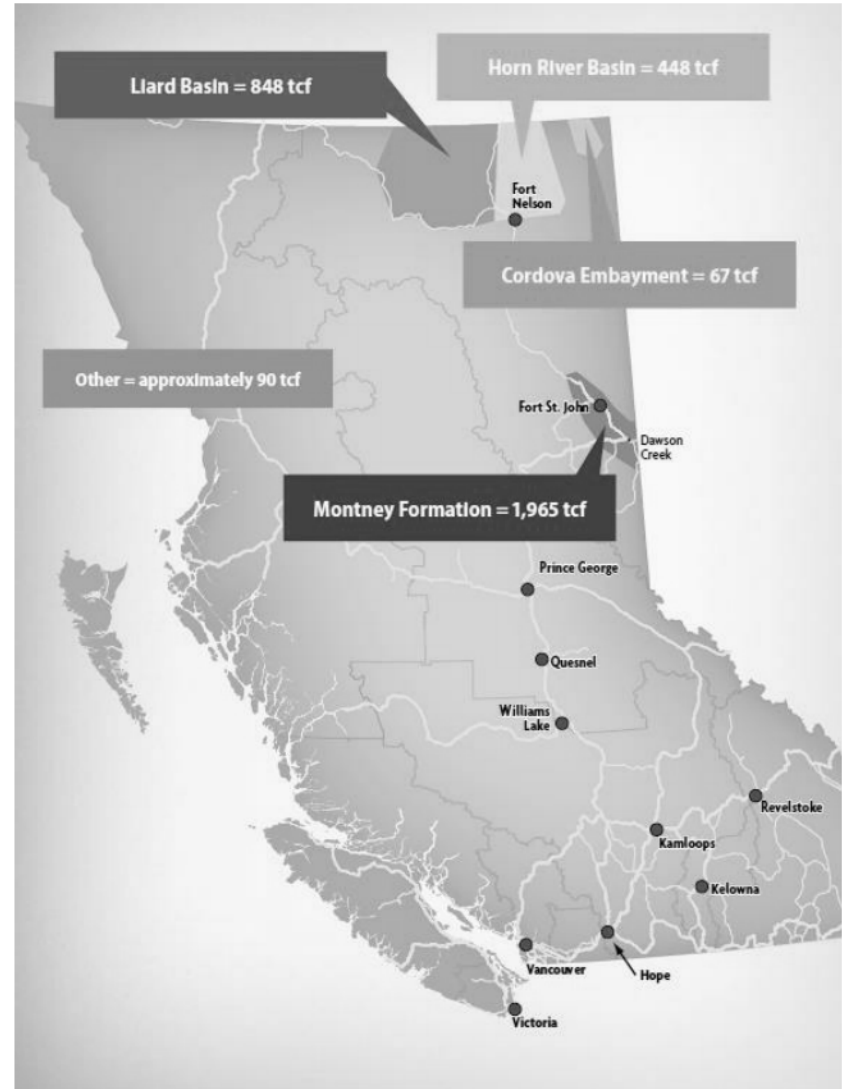

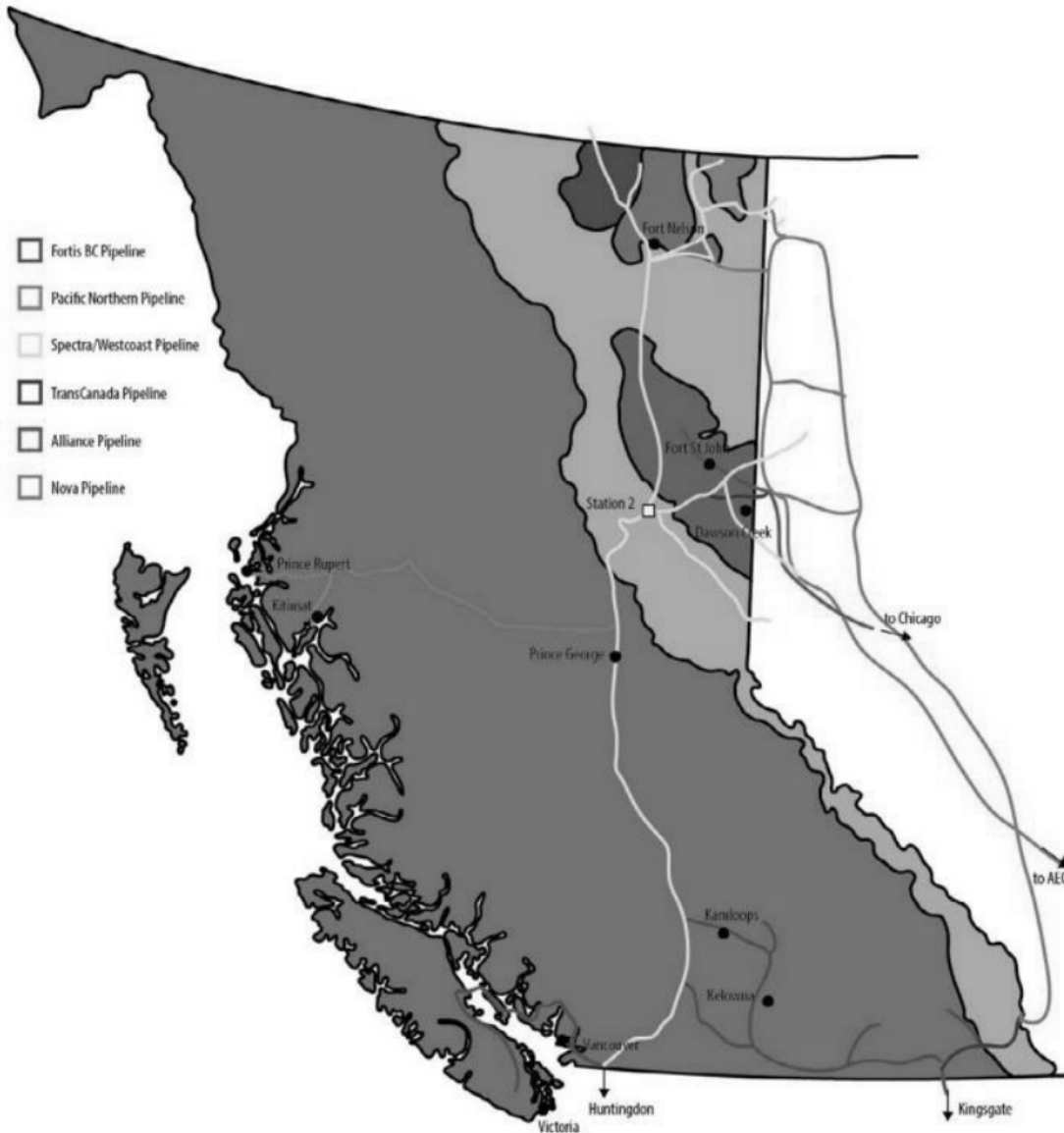

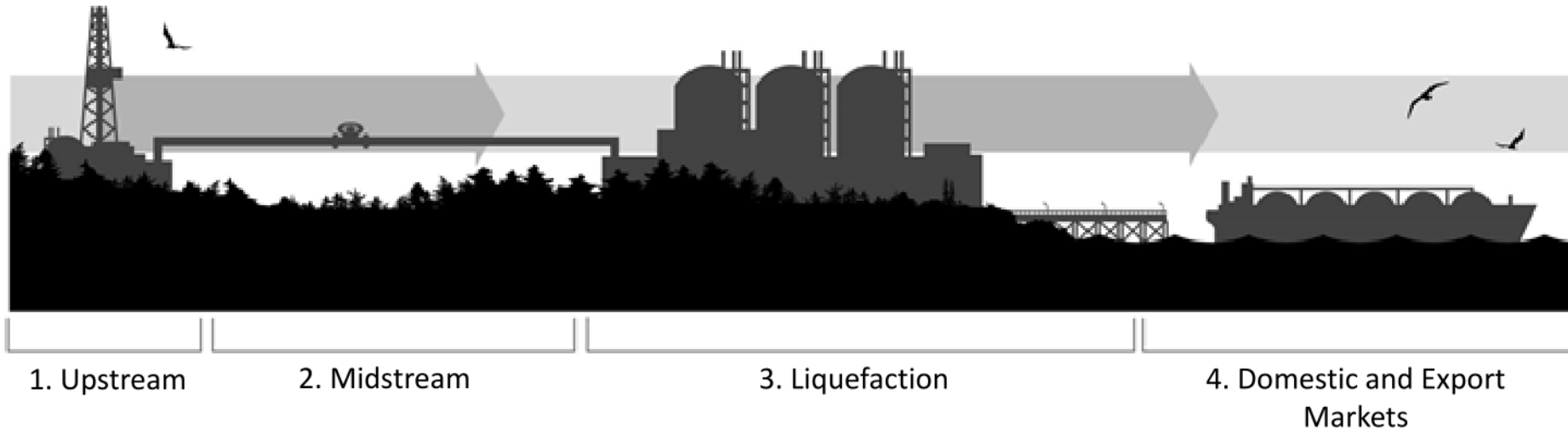


Natural Gas Transmission



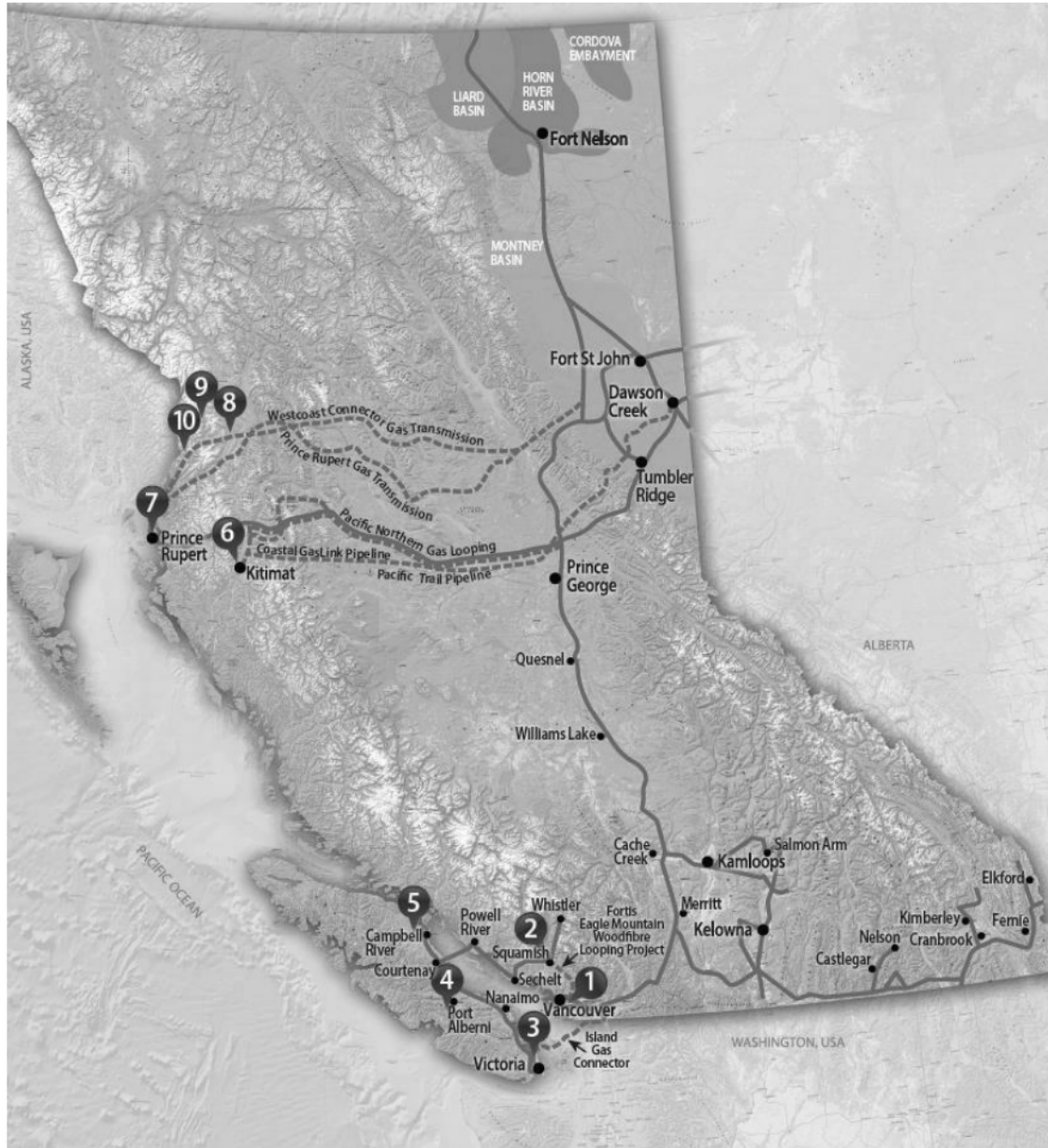
- There are more than 40,000 kilometres of natural gas pipelines in B.C.

- In British Columbia, Enbridge's (formerly Spectra's) pipeline system has been the backbone of the natural gas industry since 1957.

LNG – what and how



- LNG is natural gas that has been cooled to a point that it changes from a gas to a liquid, reducing in size by a factor of 600.
- In this compact form, natural gas can be stored and transported in a more economical manner.
- LNG is a colourless, odourless, noncorrosive, non-combustible, and nontoxic. If exposed to air, it quickly vaporizes back to its gas form. LNG leaves no polluting residue after vaporizing.

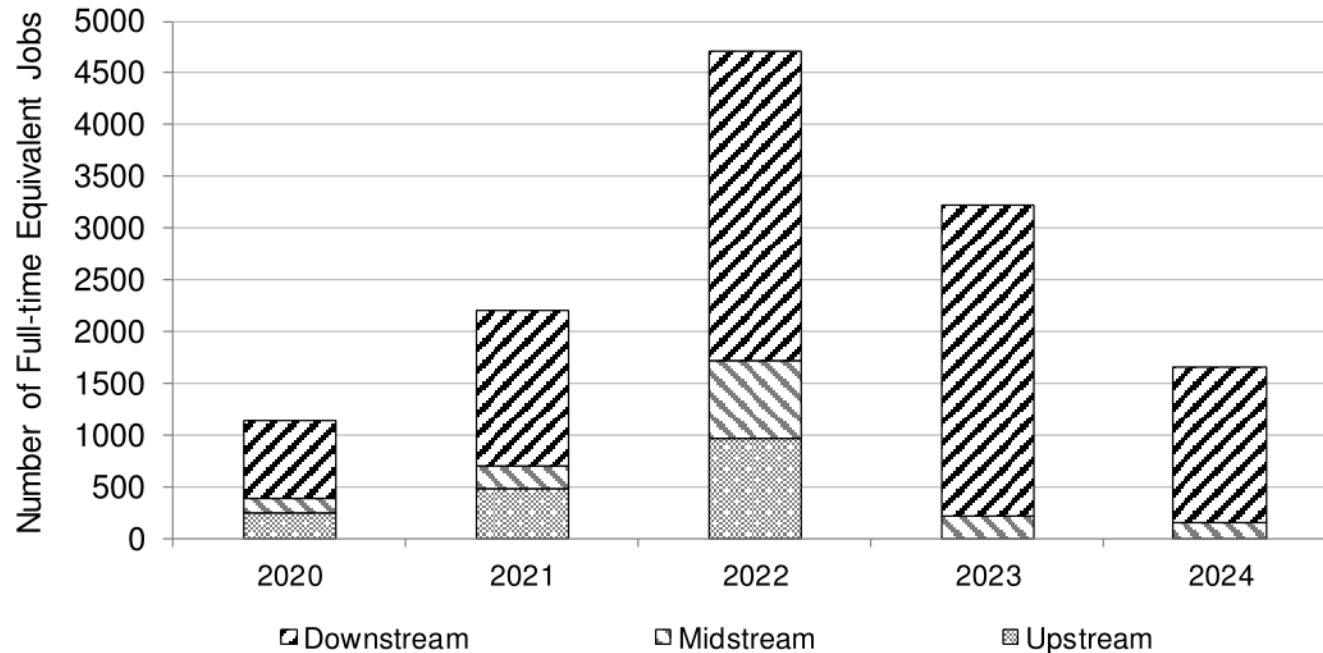

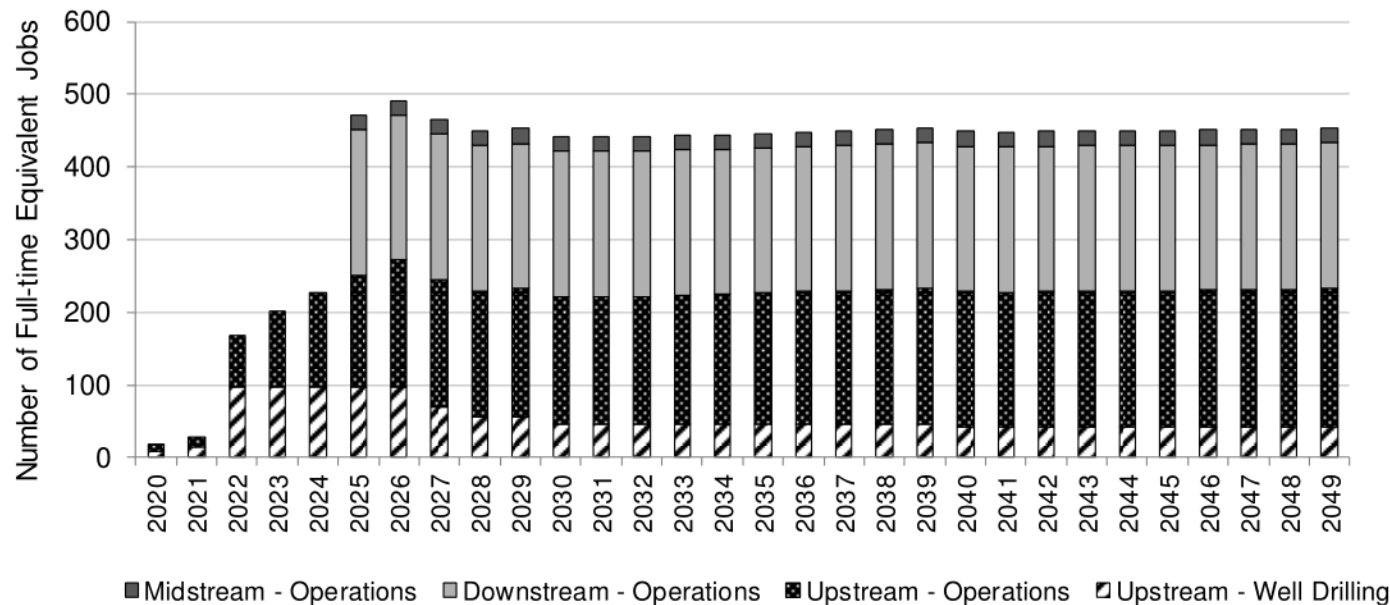

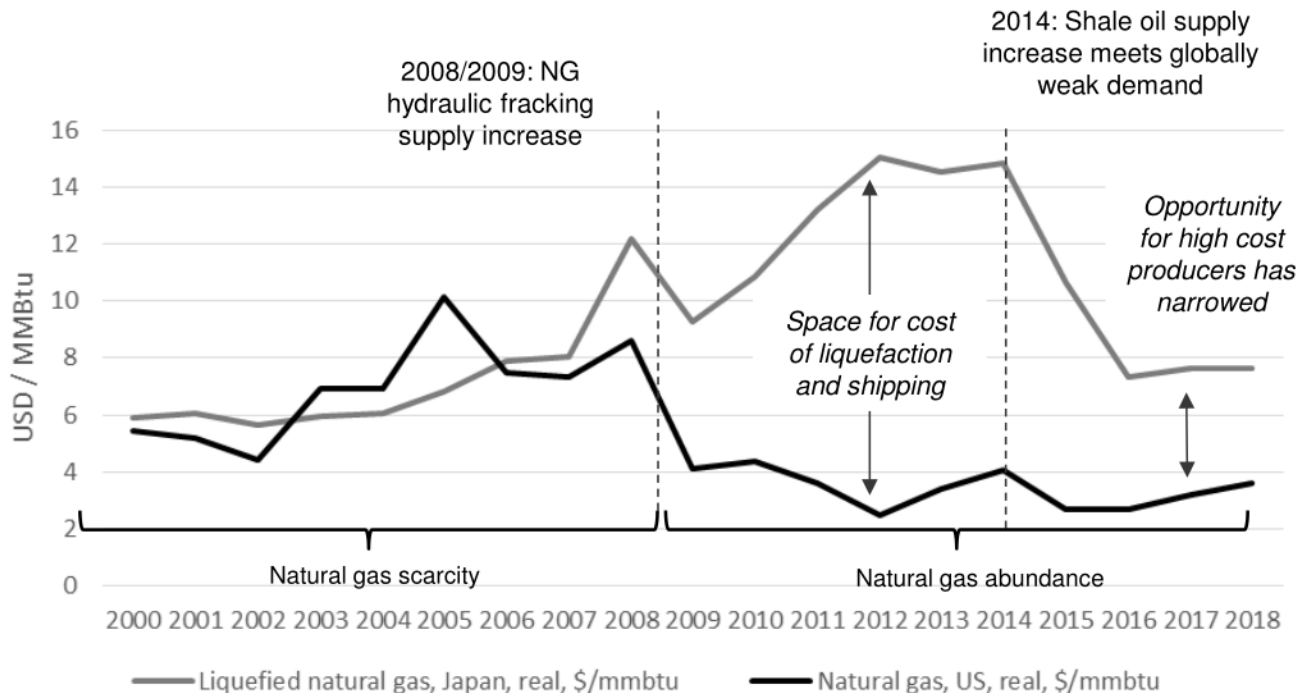

Price of LNG (Japan) vs. Natural gas (North America)

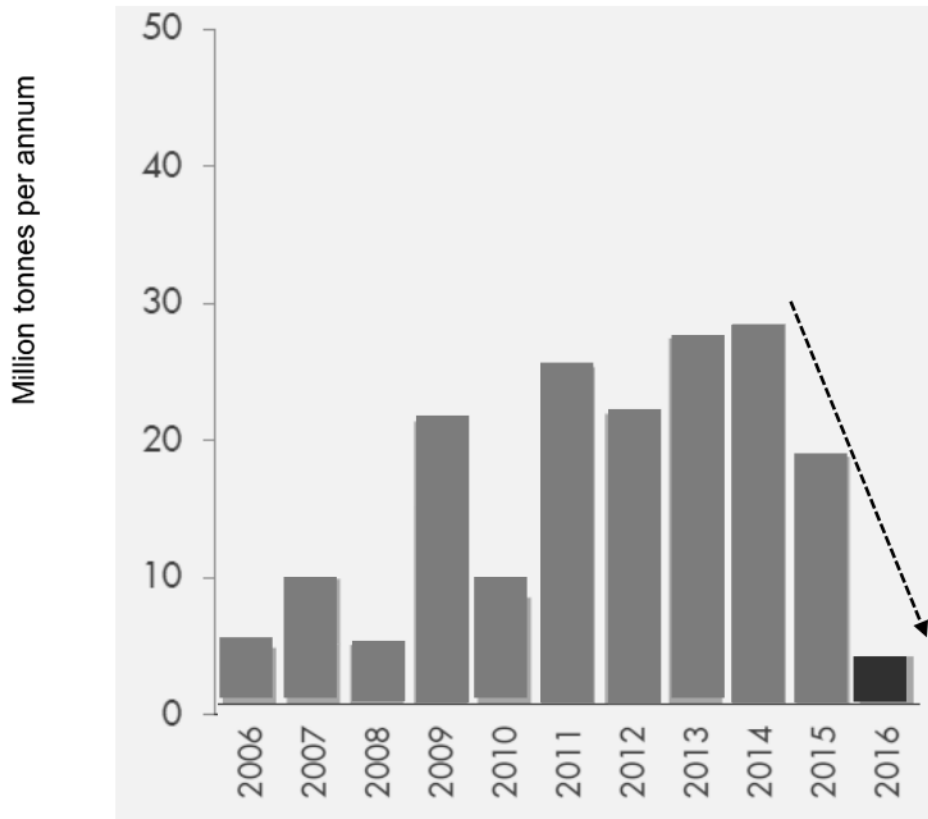

LNG Final Investment Decisions

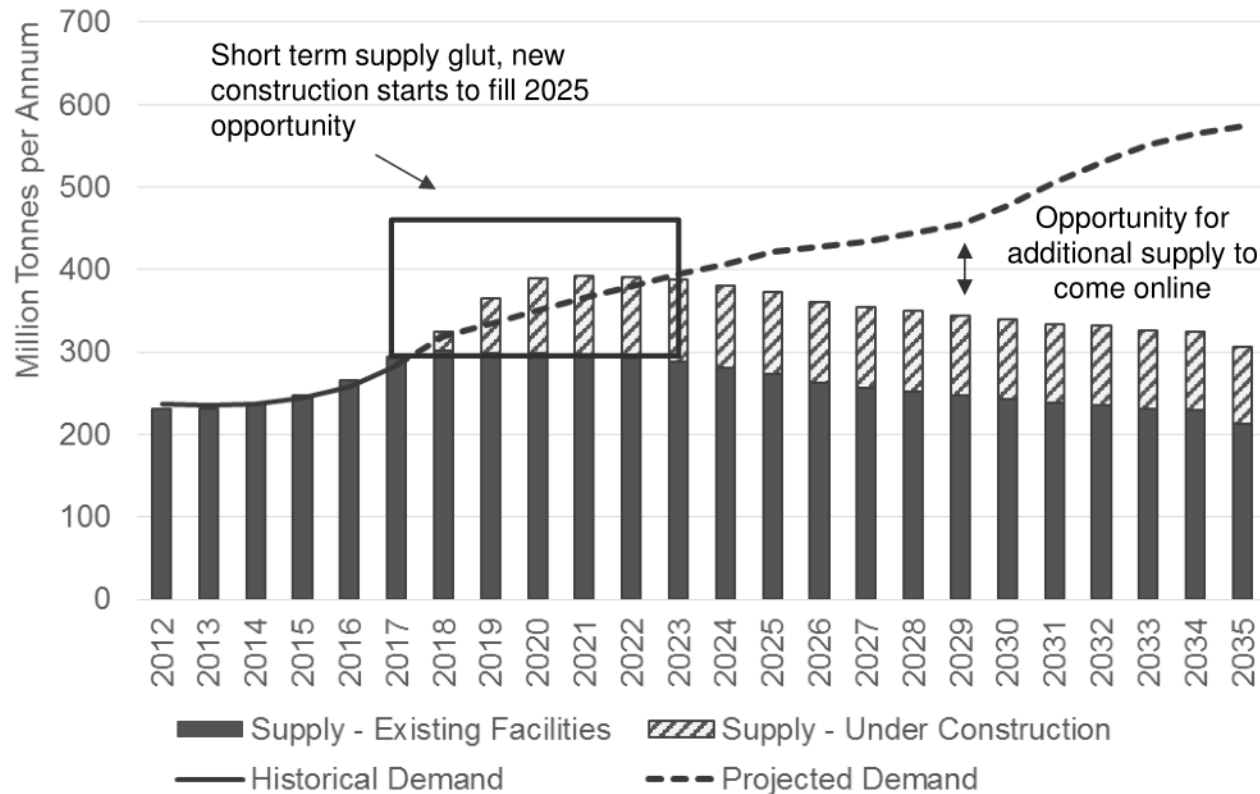

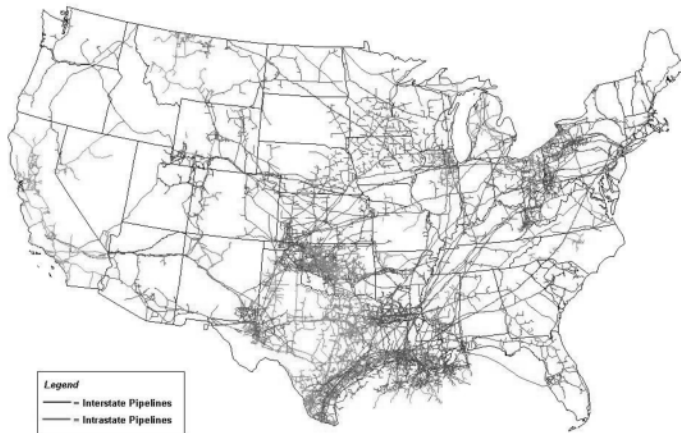

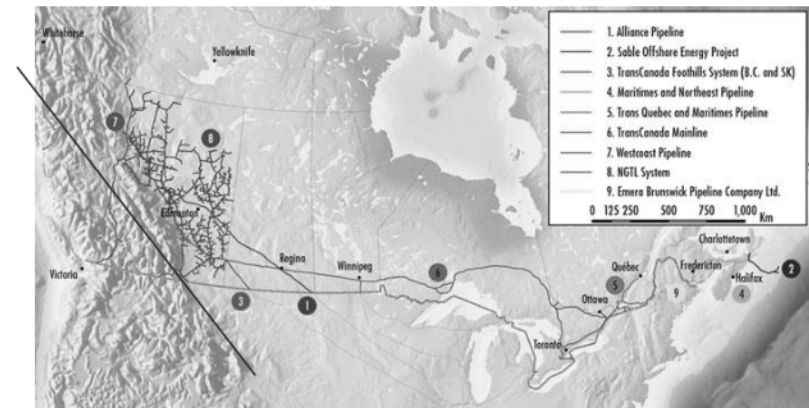

SUPPORTING LNG IN BC

Government activities related to LNG Industry:

1. Address environmental risks;
2. Address fiscal certainty; and
3. First Nation partnerships.

GOVERNMENT ENVIRONMENTAL ACTIONS

1. **No gas-to-oil pipeline conversions:** new regulation directing the Oil and Gas Commission not to permit any conversion of specified natural gas pipelines to oil pipelines.
2. **MOU:** Signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Federal Government on Environmental Assessments Processes¹. This MOU allows substitution of information or approval between the Provincial and Federal EAs
3. **GGIRCA:** The Greenhouse Gas Industrial Reporting and Control Act limits the GHG emissions from an LNG plant to 0.16 tonnes of greenhouse gases per tonne of LNG produced. Plants above the threshold must purchase credits to offset emissions in addition to the carbon tax
4. **LNG Electricity Rate:** An LNG-specific electricity rate was designed
5. **Stewardship:** \$30M to establish the First Nations Environmental Stewardship Initiative (ESI)
6. **Fugitive Emissions Regulation:** BC set a goal of reducing methane by 45% consistent with the federal government goal of reducing methane from oil and gas by 40- 45% by 2025.

1. Federal-Provincial MOU on substitution between CEAA and BCEAA processes and decisions

FISCAL ACTIVITIES

1. **Long Term Royalty Agreements:** Specified royalty rates over time
2. **Natural Gas Tax Credit:** Credit available to firms involved in natural gas activities up to the limit of reducing the BC corporate income tax by 3 percentage points
3. **LNG Income Tax:** Two-tiered tax applied payable by entities participating in liquefaction activities
4. **Accelerated Capital Cost Allowance for Corporate Income Tax:** Federal government introduced an LNG- specific capital class, allowing assets to be depreciated at an accelerated rate, effectively reducing taxable income following a major investment and deferring some taxation
5. **GHG Reduction Regulation:** Incentives distributed through FortisBC for converting engines from diesel to LNG, conditional on offtake agreements with FortisBC for LNG. These incentives were made available for transportation vehicles and stationary engines

The First Nations LNG Alliance represents the Haisla Nation, Kitselas First Nation, Wet'suwet'en First Nation, Burns Lake Band, Skin Tyee First Nation. We are in the process of adding Sauteau First Nation and a hereditary chief to our board.

The First Nations Limited Partnership consists of all 16 First Nations whose territories are impacted by the proposed 480-kilometre Pacific Trail Pipeline, part of the Kitimat LNG project. They are: Haisla Nation, Kitselas First Nation, Lax Kw'alaams Band, Metlakatla First Nation, Moricetown Indian Band, Wet'suwet'en First Nation, Ts'ilKaz Koh First Nation (Burns Lake Band), Skin Tyee First Nation, Nee Tahi Buhn Indian Band, Stellat'en First Nation, Nadleh Whut'en First Nation, Saikuz First Nation, Nak'azdli First Nation, Lheidleth T'enneh First Nation, McLeod Lake Indian Band, West Moberly First Nations.

The BC LNG Alliance represents the seven leading LNG projects in BC. Our members include LNG Canada (Shell Canada and its partners), WCC LNG (ExxonMobil), Kitimat LNG (Chevron Canada and Woodside Energy), Tilbury LNG, (FortisBC), Woodfibre LNG, Grassy Point LNG (Woodside Energy) and AltaGas.

and the additional tax revenues from the industry will help the province invest in programs and services that increase the quality of life for all British Columbians.

According to a Conference Board of Canada report, if an LNG industry comprising one small and two larger LNG facilities is built in BC, these three projects will contribute nearly \$3 billion of new revenue to BC's government annually and result in an increase in household disposable income in BC by an average of \$860 per person. This new revenue for BC could fund the construction of 60 new elementary schools, hire 1,400 new teachers, 2,500 new nurses and 900 family physicians and the construction of a new Pattullo Bridge, every year for 30 years.

Most notably, First Nations and LNG companies are forging a new way of doing business in BC that provides direct benefits to First Nations families and communities. Precedent-setting commercial agreements between industry and First Nations have been developed including: First Nations-led environmental assessments, environmental monitoring agreements between project proponents and First Nations that include the appointment of an independent environmental monitor, signed partnership agreements that include First Nations input into project planning as well as contracting, employment and training benefits, and financial benefits throughout the lifetime of the projects. These benefits are helping reduce poverty in First Nations communities by providing training and employment opportunities close to home, which has enabled people who have never had a job before to find employment.

- The Gathering was hosted in partnership with the First Nations Leadership Council and over the two days there were 566 one-on-one meetings between Sr. Govt officials (Ministers) and communities.
- The premier, all BC Cabinet Ministers & DMs, as well as NDP caucus, green caucus and some of the liberal caucus were in attendance.
- There were three plenary sessions (UNDRIP, Government Commitments & Mandate Letters and Emergency Management)
- There were also 5 breakout sessions running concurrent to 1:1 meetings including:
 - TRC Calls to Action
 - Children and Families
 - Transition to Pharmacare
 - Overdose Public Health Emergency
 - Softwood Lumber
- In his speech the Premier highlighted:
 - the government's strong cross-government commitments to work in partnership with First Nations and Indigenous peoples to adopt the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP), the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Calls to Action and the Tsilhqot'in Supreme Court decision.
