- ➤ The Province and Carrier Sekani First Nations (CSFN) signed the "Pathways 2.0" Agreement in 2019; Pathways 2.0 focussed on establishing a process for collaborative economic development that is increasing CSFN participation in the regional economy as a focus for reconciliation.
- Implementation of Pathway 2.0 has been impacted by Covid-19 and s.16
- CSFN and BC are negotiating a significant forestry tenure transfer in the Prince George Timber Supply Area (PGTSA) as a high priority.
- CSFNs continue participating in the Omineca Environmental Stewardship Initiative (ESI), and continue to seeking changes needed to enhance stewardship of ESI values.

- CSFN and the Province developed a Bridging Agreement extending until November 30, 2018, and an Interim Revenue Sharing Agreement to extend the terms of the previous agreements to March 31, 2020, while Pathways 2.0 was being finalized.
- Environmental Stewardship Initiative CSFN Omineca Demonstration Project Renewal Agreement (2018)

### **Issues/Opportunities:**

- Forestry is a key priority in Pathways 2.0 for CSFN and BC. A forest tenures table is active and discussions have included major licensees. Minister of Forests is currently advancing an apportionment decision that will lead to significant transfer of timber volume to CSFN and other First Nations in the PG TSA.
- ➤ The Socio-Cultural Working Group is a successful committee that has developed projects for each community in the areas of language, education and skills training. The working group is focussed on long-term monitoring of related projects. Individual communities continue to engage with the Province, and collaborate on initiatives.
- CSFN continue to work on the Omineca ESI about which a Memorandum of Understanding has been signed by major licensees in Prince George Timber Supply Area. Work continues in Pathways 2.0 to implement immediate measures that respond to indigenous values – moose, water quality and old-forest biodiversity – that includes forest companies and supports land-use planning commitments with CSFNs.
