

BC Assessment has assessed several of the lots. FLNRORD would normally procure a 3rd party appraisal to determine the value of the lands, as BC Assessment does not always have all the information required to accurately value lands such as these. There have been very few transactions involving these properties.





- IRR has looked into if Port Edward LNG or either of the Top Speed Energy projects (Skeena LNG and Totem LNG) are eligible for benefits under Coastal Fund Agreements.

 - Has a proposed production capacity of 150,000 tonnes per annum
 - Is proposed to be located on a 37-acre site approximately five kilometres east of Port Edward adjacent to existing industrial facilities including BC Hydro operations and a natural gas pipeline (Pacific Northern Gas).

 - · Skeena LNG is:
 - One of two proposed north coast projects under development by Top Speed Energy Project
 - Has a proposed production capacity of 150,000 tonnes per annum, or as Skeena LNG's website puts it "about 0.6% the total volume currently being developed by LNG Canada in Kitimat."
 - Is proposed to be one of the tenants in the Qinhuangdao Economic and Technological Development Zone (QETDZ) Industrial Park located on the Skeena Industrial Development Park Lands, located near the Northwest Regional Airport

 - Port Edward LNG is:
 - One of two proposed north coast projects under development by Top Speed Energy Project

- Coastal Fund Agreements were negotiated in the context of large scale LNG projects, which would require

- In order to be eligible for benefits there is a three step assessment process:
 - 1. The project must meet the definition of a LNG Project under the agreement,
 - 2. The project must be within the Map Area which is part of the agreement, or specifically listed in the agreement as a eligible project' and,

- 3. A First Nation must issue a Incremental Funding Notice for the project following its Final Investment Decision (FID).
- Reflecting the contexts of the negotiations a FID is a defined term under the agreement, which requires a project to have obtained all of the following:
 - 1. Federal and Provincial Environmental Assessment Certificates,
 - 2. A federal natural gas export licence that remains valid and effective for the project,
 - 3. Financial resources and a funding plan in place for the project; and,
 - 4. All necessary internal and shareholder and investor approvals.
- Based on the information available to IRR the criteria for a FID, in particular the obtaining of Environmental Assessment Certificates, will not be met by Port Edward LNG, Skeena LNG, or Totem LNG as they are below the assessment thresholds in the *Reviewable Projects Regulation*.
- IRR has identified two projects that are currently in the Environmental Assessment Process that could meet the criteria for eligibility in the future: Cedar LNG, and Kitimat LNG. Both of these projects are explicitly listed in the agreement.
- If other LNG projects are proposed within the Map Area that are not explicitly listed in the agreements IRR
 would be pleased to look into the projects eligibility for benefits under coastal fund agreements as project
 descriptions become available.

After a hiatus in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and a postponement in November 2021 due to extreme weather, the Gathering was an important opportunity for our governments to safely hold space together and advance meaningful dialogue. More than 400 meetings with 105 First Nations were delivered during the event.

During our meeting, we discussed the Old Growth Strategic Review, your Cedar LNG project, language revitalization, and the proposed development of a health and wellness centre through the Northern First Nations Alliance.

Thank you for your comments regarding the proposed old growth deferrals. I will share your comments with my colleague Rick Manwaring, Deputy Minister of the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development. Chief Negotiator Heinz Dyck will work with you on the accommodation and reconciliation agreements and can also provide suggestions on key contacts for your Cedar LNG project.

As the First Peoples' Cultural Council (FPCC) is a BC Crown Corporation with the mandate to assist First Nations in their efforts to revitalize their languages, arts, and cultures, it is inappropriate for me to advocate for any First Nation's application to FPCC. I encourage your staff to continue to engage with FPCC staff to gain a full understanding of types of projects that fit (and do not fit) the funding eligibility criteria.



Dear Minister.

Thank you for spending time with the Haisla Nation at Kitamaat Village. It was our pleasure to welcome you to our community and to discuss our priorities, the most pressing of which is Cedar LNG.

As we discussed, Cedar will provide lasting economic prosperity for the Haisla people and represents economic reconciliation in its truest and most practical way. The project is led by our Nation and aligns very well with your government's climate and reconciliation agendas.

We described for you the additional costs the project is taking on to reduce carbon emissions. In fact, our decision to use electric drive raises Cedar's annual operating costs by \$75 million more than gas-driven technology would cost. This is obviously a significant burden for our Nation, and we ask BC to help mitigate this extra cost.

We also need your government's assistance to **ensure that we receive our EA authorization by the end of this year** as required by our agreement with LNG Canada. Our Nation's 10 percent capacity on Coastal Gas Link was the single biggest benefit in our agreement with LNGC; if we are unable to use this capacity we will be unable to support LNGC.

Moreover, that 10 percent capacity would be directed to LNGC, which will produce a GHG intensity of 0.14 tonnes per tonne of LNG produced. Cedar, with our electric drive technology, will produce a GHG intensity of 0.07 tonnes per tonne of LNG produced, or half of LNGC's intensity. Clearly this would be a significantly worse result for BC's carbon strategy.

Thank you for listening to our concerns. We look forward to a follow-up meeting or discussion in the next month to ensure that Cedar stays on-track. My office will shortly be in touch to schedule this.



Re: Cedar LNG Project Environmental Assessment Certificate Decision – Kitsumkalum First Nation Withholding Consent

Kitsumkalum First Nation (Kitsumkalum) submits this letter to both the Provincial and Federal Ministers with authority under the Environmental Assessment process for the proposed Cedar LNG Project, in Kitimat, BC.

Provincial and Federal Governments and proponents need to understand that the coastal waters of BC are a resource that our culture, our members and our way of life depend on, and that Kitsumkalum never ceded ownership of. The Cedar LNG Project is just one of several recent projects that will result in

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increased shipping traffic, increased shipping of dangerous goods and the addition of a new types of vessels to transport liquified natural gas (LNG).

For the past 10 years, since large scale projects like LNG and petroleum product export facilities started showing up at our doorstep, Kitsumkalum has requested that marine shipping and ground (rail) transportation of materials be part of the environmental assessment. We have also continuously stated that cumulative effects are not adequately addressed in an environmental assessment, especially in the context of the ever increasing marine and rail traffic. We have been told over and over again by Canada and BC that land transportation is not in the scope of environmental assessments and that effects of shipping are narrowly scoped.

From the development of oil and gas in eastern BC, to the delivery of product through pipelines or by rail, to the liquification facilities and storage of the product, to the marine shipping of product overseas there are risks to environmental and cultural values. For Kitsumkalum the greatest risk lies in the potential loss and destruction of our way of life should a shipping incident occur. The federal processes to mitigate risks to the marine environment and to accommodate resource owners, should a spill or incident occur, are inadequate to non-existing.

Kitsumkalum actively participated in the environmental assessment process and put forward multiple concerns and impacts, the most important one being the risk associated with the marine shipping. However, these concerns went unaddressed by both the provincial and federal representatives.

Although Cedar LNG Project is suggesting mitigation to offset risks in the marine environment associated with marine shipping accidents and malfunctions, this is wholly insufficient to address Kitsumkalum's concerns. Furthermore, Cedar LNG does not have 'care and control' over the ships or shipping activities associated with their product. This is an example of the gap in regulatory jurisdiction, the uncertainty of the risks, and the lack of line of sight should an incident occur that puts our resource at risk.

Both BC and Canada continue to pass the buck to the other citing it's not within their scope/jurisdiction. Passing the buck is not an acceptable response. Similarly, regulatory gaps are not an excuse to avoid discharging the duty to consult and accommodate. The duty owed to Kitsumkalum is not restricted by legislation, and we remind you that the duty is owed by the Crown. Referring us to the proponent is not appropriate in this circumstance. This is a fundamental flaw within the existing assessment processes and it is the obligation of the Crown to address this. Otherwise, the duty to consult and accommodate cannot possibly be met. We also note that this assessment process, and the potential for the federal and provincial government to issue a positive decision despite Kitsumkalum's lack of consent is entirely at odds with the *United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples*, and the associated enactments by both BC and Canada.

First Nations and coastal residents are bearing all the risk of projects such as Cedar LNG and their shipping activities but are not receiving adequate benefits for the use of their resource (the ocean). As we have seen with shipping accidents over the past years, the north coast is not ready to deal with accidents, spills and ships sinking. Long distances for response, extreme weather events, inadequate marine equipment and lack of proximity of that equipment, and constricted inlets and shipping routes all add to the difficulties in responding to shipping incidents.

Kitsumkalum cannot give consent to another project with high-risk shipping activities without the federal government first addressing these outstanding issues. There needs to be clear mandate and direction to ensure that impacts associated with the care and control of vessels, their cargo for line of sight to compliance, enforcement and accommodation when an incident occurs are identified, assessed and appropriately addressed, as well as an assessment and gaps analysis of the emergency response capacity on the north coast of BC is required.

We wish to be clear that while Kitsumkalum commends the Haisla Nation for their vision, and we acknowledge that we are working with the proponent towards a mutually beneficial relationship, at this time, with the outstanding issues and impacts to our s. 35 Title and Rights unaddressed, we cannot support this project being issued a positive Environmental Certificate Decision.

- Haisla is focused on developing its Cedar LNG Project, which is a proposed small-scale floating LNG facility located on the Douglas Channel in Kitimat.
- Cedar LNG is approximately one-fifth the size of Phase 1 of LNG Canada and comparable in size to the Woodfibre LNG project near Squamish.
- It is in a substituted environmental assessment process with BC as the lead, hence the project requires both federal and provincial approvals.
