III**BACKGROUND:**

Provincial officials have been engaging Carrier Sekani Tribal Council (CSTC) and its member nations for some time regarding Pipeline Benefit Agreements (PBAs) associated with LNG development.

(CSTC Backgrounder Attached). While Provincial officials identified the priority of completing the PBAs in a timely manner, in response to interests identified by CSTC, the Province also entered into a Natural Resource Protocol (Attached) to begin early discussions on a G2G Agreement.

IV **DISCUSSION:**

CSTC member nations are affected by three major natural gas pipeline projects intended to support LNG facilities. As part of its negotiation mandate, representatives from the Ministry have tabled financial benefit offers for these projects to CSTC. If completed, PBAs would provides.16 s.16

CSTC has been generally supportive of LNG development, subject to First Nation concerns regarding benefit sharing and environmental stewardship being addressed. Five CSTC Nations are part of the First Nation Limit Partnership which is supportive of the Pacific Trails Pipeline (Takla Lake and Tlazden are not part of FNLP).

As Provincial officials and CSTC representatives continue to negotiate, several outstanding issues have arisen that are impeding completion of the PBAs and impacting G2G negotiations.
