Dear Ms. Sanderson:

Thank you for your letter regarding your concerns about the pricing of beer produced by small-production BC breweries.

I am fully aware of the challenges that have presented themselves in this sector. The Liquor Distribution Branch (LDB) and I have had numerous discussions with industry representatives over the last number of months.

Government is supportive of the small-production brewing industry in BC because we recognize the contributions it makes to our province. On the financial side, government has in place a tiered mark-up structure, whereby the mark-up applied to the products of small breweries is substantially less than what is applied to the products of the large breweries. This was put place in recognition of the fact that the cost of production of smaller breweries is substantially more than the large ones because they do not enjoy the same economy of scale.

It is important to note that the new wholesale pricing model is designed to collect the same amount of revenue for government as before April 1, 2015, while placing all retailers, including BC Liquor Stores, on an equal footing in terms of the price they pay at the wholesale level.

Breweries are looking at their pricing to strike the right balance between keeping prices at a level that product is marketable to customers while at the same time being sustainable for their business. Likewise, BC Liquor Stores, and undoubtedly other retailers such as yourself, are also looking for that right balance.

To Minister Anton.

We are writing to you to express concerns about the recent changes that took place within the liquor industry April 1st 2015. Some of the changes have been long overdue and very positive but one change in particular seems to be having an unplanned negative impact on a very vibrant part of the BC economy. The BC Craft Beer industry is a shining example of a home grown success story. Over 100 breweries representing millions of dollars in tax revenue and thousands of jobs and seeing unprecedented growth.

The challenge that has come up is that with the new structure of taxing/pricing to get the new wholesale prices for all retailers, public and private, it drove some of the wholesale prices up in some categories. It happened in a few areas but particularly in the Craft Beer category. Some individual items went up in wholesale cost anywhere from 5%-20%.

The majority of suppliers have assured us that they are not making any extra revenue, they submitted their pricing with the expectation they would maintain the same wholesale costs going forward. The only explanation of what happened is that the calculation to get the new wholesale prices inflated wholesale costs unintentionally.

The challenge presented by this is many layered.

For the Public LDB stores it is problematic because they promised the public they would not raise prices so they are forced to accept unsustainable retail margins in order to keep their promise. Their options are to continue operating at unsustainable retail margins or to raise prices, lose/lose

For Private liquor stores, they are forced to raise prices just to maintain margins, not gain any, but just to maintain and therefore not compete evenly with their Public counterparts. Clearly the goal of many of the April 1st changes were to level the playing field and not add to the inconsistencies.

For the Craft Beer Industry the challenge is the potential loss of revenue and a slowing of their growth overall. Retailers will buy less Craft Beer if pricing is an obstacle, consumers will reconsider their purchases if prices go too high, Public stores already dedicate less space than the Private stores to Craft Beer and with low margins they will be even less inclined to grow this category, again, lose/lose

We believe this was an unintentional calculation that has resulted in a negative way on all interested parties, consumers, public retailers, private retailer and Craft Beer producers and needs to be reviewed and reconsidered in order to maintain the fabulous momentum this sector is experiencing. Thanks for your time and consideration.

Recent memo from our partner

Here are some thoughts in point form.

- 1. This morning I received notice from the Craft Brewers Guild to check our vendor site as prices for our products had increased without warning.
- We found out our new pricing by going on the Vendor site and creating a doc 60 for licensee.
- Our sales team is now on the road with sell sheets with the wrong pricing information and we are forced to create all new collateral at our expense after only 2 months at this price structure.
- 4. It is almost impossible to list products with LDB for sale in the GLS channel (how is it that the company that sells the most product in the province and is supported by our investment and taxes is our biggest barrier to sales?)
- 5. Beyond listings we are also unable to use the provincial distribution system to get our 1 listed SKU to all the GLS stores in the province and are forced to use private distribution at a much higher cost.
- 6. The final point is why is it that breweries are forced to deposit gross sales to the Government when we are on a fixed markup and wineries are not required to do the same? This practice seriously penalizes a our cash flow as we transition into our busy season.

I hope this helps and good luck. Cheers

Thanks for taking the time to meet with me last week. As I mentioned in our meeting, my purpose was to introduce myself and my Company to you and Honourable Christy Clark, MLA Westside -Kelowna. I'm available to discuss the Craft industry at anytime, ensuring that my years of experience will yield an honest / direct discussion.

I believe the Government has provided many positive changes to the alcohol industry over the past 12 / 18 months. The best example of a positive change is the introduction of the lounge endorsement license. This one change has directly contributed to the success of newer / smaller breweries. In my opinion, those Brewers should be very happy. It is also very important to understand the segmentation within the BC Craft industry. It is not enough to believe the hype that 'Craft is Growing', collectively we must understand that not all oraft volume is created equal. This mindset will yield long term sustainable policies that will ensure success for BC Craft beer.

Dear Mr. Dressler:

Thank you for your June 13, 2015 email outlining CAMRA's position on craft beer pricing. As a key stakeholder in BC's craft brewing industry, which government fully supports, we appreciate your taking the time to provide critical feedback.

As you know, in recent years, the provincial government has stimulated extraordinary growth in the craft beer sector by eliminating unnecessary red tape and enacting key policy changes, including the relatively new graduated mark-up system for small breweries. With our support, craft beer sales have nearly tripled over the past five years – to the tune of \$73 million in provincial sales last year.

BC Liquor Stores have also been a long-time supporter of the BC craft brewing industry by selling and promoting craft products in stores. However, like any retailer, they must continually review their prices to ensure they strike the right balance between being marketable to customers and being sustainable for the retailer. The latest figures show that, compared to last year, sales of craft beer are up nearly 50 percent between April and June, which indicates that customers continue to find good value in these local products.

It is also important to note, that in the retail industry prices have always fluctuated, and they will continue to do so. A variety of factors can impact a product's retail price, including increases or decreases in supplier-related costs, the strength of the dollar, price rounding and price promotions. As you note, minimal price increases were applied to some beer in June, while in other cases, price promotions were applied making products less expensive.

While there will always be price changes that take place over time, BC Liquor Store's goal is to avoid passing along any excessive price increases to customers. Their goal is to generate revenue for the province, and it is in their interest to continue to price craft beer according to what is marketable for consumers and viable from a business perspective.



As a result, the prices of many products did increase slightly but this was because the mark-up announcement was so late in coming.

The latest price hike in June comes as a complete surprise and targets consumers directly as the breweries are not receiving a penny more from the Liquor Distribution Branch despite price increases that measure at times close to 10%. This increase is a blatant grab of consumer dollars by your government.

Your government seems very proud of their "public consultation" that took place in 2013 and we have often heard yourself, Parliamentary Secretary, John Yap and Premier Clark speak about how you have "listened to British Columbians' wants and needs" concerning changes to BC liquor policies.

We can guarantee you not one BC craft beer consumer submitted a request for increases to BC craft beer yet at our last count, over 87% of beers listed by the LDB have had increases since the new pricing system has taken effect. In fact, our numbers show that almost 200 listings have increased by more than 5%, 74 of those by more than 10%, most of those impacted by these hikes are craft beers.

There will come a point where prices will temper craft beer sales, which will impact the bottom line of craft breweries. Is it the intention of yourself and the BC Liberals to stifle one of BC's most vibrant and fastest growing industries? Are you purposely trying to turn consumers away

from our home-grown craft beers which could negatively impact jobs and the revenue brought in by our craft beer industry?

We implore you to reconsider these latest price increases and stop gouging the BC craft beer consumers who already pay some of the highest prices in North America for their favourite beers. Your government seems very proud of their "public consultation" that took place in 2013 and we have often heard yourself, Parliamentary Secretary, John Yap and Premier Clark speak about how you have "listened to British Columbians' wants and needs" concerning changes to BC liquor policies.

We can guarantee you not one BC craft beer consumer submitted a request for increases to BC craft beer yet at our last count, over 87% of beers listed by the LDB have had increases since the new pricing system has taken effect. In fact, our numbers show that almost 200 listings have increased by more than 5%, 74 of those by more than 10%, most of those impacted by these hikes are craft beers.

There will come a point where prices will temper craft beer sales, which will impact the bottom line of craft breweries. Is it the intention of yourself and the BC Liberals to stifle one of BC's most vibrant and fastest

growing industries? Are you purposely trying to turn consumers away from our home-grown craft beers which could negatively impact jobs and the revenue brought in by our craft beer industry?
