

Enclosed is a copy of Superintendent Sheppard's letter of March 26, and the Fort Welson Band Council Resolution regarding the additional 1,690 acres to be added to the proposed Old Fort Welson Reserve as shown on the enclosed print of the provisional plan of survey of this reserve. The said letter is in reply to our letter of June 10, 1963. copy of which should be on your file and which explains in detail the situation. As you know, this land, together with five other areas, was transferred to us by the Provincial Order in Council of November 28, 1961, to which were attached certain maps and sketches showing the selected areas outlined in red. Enclosed is a copy of the map show. ing, outlined in red, the area selected for the Old Fort Welson Reserve. From this map you can see that the additional 1,690 acres would be outside the area so marked. On Mr. Bartell's provisional plan there is the indication that the additional area is Provincial Crown land. However, it would be necessary to consult the British Columbia Department of Lands and Forests and determine whether they have any objections to the location of the selected additional area. Would you please take this matter up with the Department of Lands and Forests in order that we can proceed with the request for the SULTEY.

Reference is made to your letter dated May 7, 1964 regarding the survey of certain Indian Reserves authorized by the provision of Order-in-Council No. 2995, approved November 28, 1961.

A number of meetings were held with your predecessor in office regarding this entire matter and it was agreed that the areas requested by him would be full and final settlement of the entitlement of the Indians under the provisions of Treaty No. 8.

You will note that Order-in-Council No. 2995 is reasonably specific in delineating the areas to be surveyed to cover only those areas outlined in red on a series of maps attached to the Order and it further states: " and to further recommend that the lands conveyed to Her Majesty the Queen in the right of Canada in trust for the use and benefit of the Indians of British Columbia, as set forth in the preceeding paragraph, shall constitute full and final settlement of the land entitlement of those Indians residing in that portion of British Columbia covered by Treaty No. 8".

In view of the foregoing, I regret to advise you that this Department is not prepared to agree to the addition of a further 1,690 acres to the old Fort Nelson Reserve.
