Brian,

As discussed, please see below an outline plan for review and consideration by senior Ministry leadership.

1. RPD and City staff (TBD) consult with key stakeholders such as Courts Svcs, City of Victoria, Rev Al and the encampment "mayor" and occupants ahead of time to advise them of our intentions (that we will be issuing a vacate letter that describes all the social options available to them and potentially housing or shelter options and that they are asked to vacate the site). The purpose of this consultation is to gather concerns and obtain advice from these stakeholders that we hadn't thought of already and possibly support the merits of this action.
2. On approval from senior Ministry Leadership, issue communications via a letter to all campers advising them that:

-camping is not permitted on this property and they are asked to vacate (no time limit provided deliberately)

-here is a list of shelters available to them (including BC Housing, but also other community non-profits)

-here is a list of available community services and resources

Questions to resolve:

a. The tactics of delivering the communiqué (Vic PD will keep the peace during delivery).
Options include Sherrif Service, Public Servant;

b. Communications plan to respond to the immediate media interest in this action.

Following update is based on open source intelligence and information collected from various parties and sources:

- Chief Justice Hinkson delivered his decision regarding the application for an interim injunction to remove the campers from the Victoria Tent City.
- There will be no injunction, the matter will proceed to trial on September 7, 2016 (10 days). This date is likely to remain static unless there is an incident on site.
- The tone at the camp remains the same.
- Various cold weather shelters in the area will close soon. This may lead to an increase in the population of the tent city or a situation where other potential campers look for a different site.
- More structures and infrastructure are being observed on site including some two level structures and gravel paths.
- Local residents and businesses are starting to become more vocal in their opposition to the tent city. A meeting of these residents and business' that was to be held at a hotel in the area was cancelled by the hotel as a result of threats.
- An increase in thefts has been reported in the area.
- 24/7 Security coverage is in place (Paladin) at the courthouse and St. Ann's Academy (potential new campsite in close proximity).
- 1 dedicated mobile Security unit (Paladin) is patrolling 14 Provincial government sites in Victoria that are deemed to be at risk as potential new/expanded camping sites.
- Various stakeholders and tenants at the Courthouse report this situation as having a negative impact on their operations.

Hi everyone. Assuming that there are still individuals camping on the grounds tomorrow, we will be discussing and dealing with this, so I'd like to ensure we are all understand what the concerns are and what the next steps should be.

I know that several residents in the area have complained about the situation and have requested that someone do something about it. Over the course of Friday, some communication appears to have gone astray as did the response plan (outlined below). This resulted in Stephanie Melvin's direct phone number being provided to some of the concerned nearby residents. If anyone, (Sheriff's, Court Admin, HQ) receives a complaint, they should take contact information and assure the complainant that someone will get back to them as soon as practical – giving out a staff direct line is inappropriate.

In the event that the proposed approach (below) was interpreted as direction to allow the campers to stay put, I'd like to be clear that that is not the case. My interest, which I know you all share, is to ensure a coordinated, respectful response that is strategic and results in fewer incidents such as this one over the long term and better outcomes for those who may need assistance with shelter or health services. This as opposed to moving people along only to have them return again in a cyclical way. I understand that SSBC requested that Vic PD assist to disband the camp, in order to stop the situation from escalating and while working to convene the agencies that will work towards a longer term solution. SSBC also committed to keeping us informed and involved.

Please note Betty's email that states SSBC is the lead in preparing the response/strategy with engagement from us and other agencies in a coordinated way. Illegal or dangerous behaviour/activity is a whole different thing and should be dealt with promptly.

Depending on the situation this week, we should probably convene to talk about the next steps prior to a police response being initiated. Darcy can you please report on the situation to all of us first thing tomorrow.

If so, we could probably convene a joint meeting.

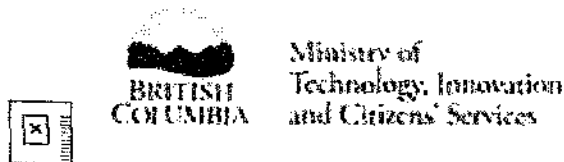

As you are aware, the individuals residing in the park area adjacent to Victoria Law Courts have been asked to vacate the site by Thursday, February 25, 2016.

It has come to our attention that a peaceful rally has been organized for Thursday starting at approximately 3:30pm. The Victoria Police Department is aware of the rally and will be monitoring the situation throughout the day. Please avoid the area at this time in order to assist police to manage.

This event is not anticipated to impact routine day-to-day court operations, however, please be vigilant and report any disruptions that interfere with courthouse business. Disruptions include those that interfere with persons having duties to discharge in a court of justice, including parties, witnesses, jurors and officers of the court. As well, the safety and security of staff and all who attend at court is paramount at all times. While there is no reason to believe that safety will be compromised because of this event, if you do have a concern please report it promptly to a Sheriff or your supervisor.

There will likely be increased public and media presence in the area and also possibly the courthouse. If you receive any questions from the media, other than routine court records access questions, please direct the individual to contact GCPE Media Inquiries at (250) 889-1121.

Again, it is not anticipated that this event will cause any disruption to the courts, but please do contact the Sheriffs or your supervisor if you have any concerns.

Hello,

Here is the update from our meeting this afternoon:

VicPD:

- no major events over the weekend
- looking forward to this week – have been inundated with media request for the 25th and concern from neighbours and school
- have assured everyone that there are no overt actions planned – VicPD will do a media release tomorrow morning consistent with Province that deadline has come, hope was that people would voluntarily comply, will reassess after 25th to determine next steps – no enforcement planned for 25th – if there is going to be a protest will have adequate coverage to keep the peace

Our Place:

- staff on site last few days – didn't hear of concerns
- working to get people signed up for facility – uptake process is slow – 23 people right now – other people on a wait list who aren't on the courthouse grounds right now
- will not be able to have people indoor for first while – waiting for inspection report regarding possible updates – outdoor section open only with access to washroom and showers

BC Housing:

- on site on Sun. at YCC and some parents and children from Eagle View were volunteering

Cool Aid:

- approx. 30 people on list – hoping to move in 10 to 20 tomorrow
- a lot of other interest from other people not currently on courthouse site
- have enough storage for a shopping cart amount for each person – to move out of site

- starting a 9am tomorrow – as many people in the 2 days as possible – keep going until fill up – don't think it'll take longer than a week

VicFire:

- no new incidents

MCFD:

- daily visits, have not seen youth over the weekend

- working with one youth to get her back to Saskatchewan – probably tomorrow

OHCS:

- no update

Island Health:

- nothing significant to report

City:

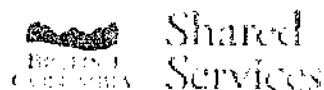

Dear Elected Officials,

I am writing this email as a concerned home owner/tax payer living in the neighbourhood of Tent City located on the lawn of the Victoria Courthouse. For many of us living in this area we have had to endure through so much negative actions from several troublemakers residing at Tent City. One should never fear the neighbourhood that we live in, but sadly we do now. With the news that Thursday February 25th is "eviction day" can not come soon enough. Unfortunately with many tenters being vocal about not leaving, we are terrified of what could happen. Our other biggest concern is why the necessity of Tent City people feeling the need to bring homeless people over from the mainland for a rally which could possibly escalate into a negative outcome.

The following is taken from their events page which was set up with almost 900 people being invited but close to a 100 currently attending as of this morning.

We are organizing vehicles to take supporters from three places in the lower mainland out to the Tsawwassen Ferry terminal. We plan to leave on the 1pm ferry and return on the 9pm ferry, arriving back at Tsawwassen at about 10:30pm. A school bus that can accommodate forty people will meet us (and later deliver us back to) the Schwartz Bay ferry terminal.

We have funding to support people who can't pay for the trip, and we will have food available for our group.

Meeting times

Vancouver, 11am

We will leave from the Carnegie Centre at Main and Hastings at 11am sharp. This is the only official meeting place for communities along the skytrain line. Come early for breakfast.

Abbotsford, 10:30am

A van will be leaving the Dignity Village Tent City on Gladys Avenue at 10:30am

Maple Ridge, 11am

A van will be leaving the Rain City shelter on Lougheed just east of 222nd at 11am and going straight to the ferry

I have elderly neighbours who are terrified to leave their home and some of them won't go out once the sun sets even if it is around 5pm. We are being held hostage in our own neighbourhood with our safety concerns being heightened. I do realize that all of you are working together trying to find a peaceful solution to this situation for which I thank each and every one of you. My concern lies with this upcoming rally and the need for homeless people from the mainland being bused over to attend Thursday's rally.

Tent City has now gone from looking like a campsite to a garbage dump. I am also very disturbed about the homeless person who was found dead of an overdose in the London Drugs Harris Green courtyard area off of View Street with piles of garbage dumped on them as well as signs of urination/defecation on their deceased body. I am told the discovery was beyond horrific for an employee who worked at one of the nearby businesses who came across the body as they were heading to work.

My apologies for not having my email well written, but as from someone who s.22 and constantly having to look over my shoulder when I walk through my neighbourhood an area of where I s.22

, I sadly no longer feel safe since the homeless took up residence on the lawns of the courthouse. It wasn't so bad when there were 3 or 4 tents, but since it grew into something much bigger then being renamed Tent City, it has become horrific.

Please if there is nothing that can be done regarding the rally, I do ask that measures are taken to ensure extra police/security presence.

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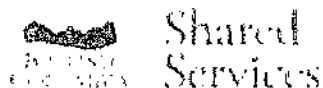

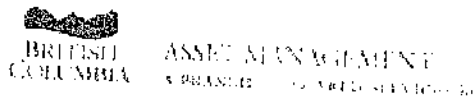

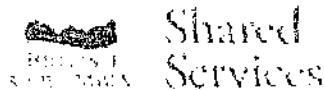

FAQs – Victoria Courthouse

Q: Is camping authorized at the Victoria Courthouse?

A: Camping is not a permitted use of the green space adjacent to the Courthouse. The current situation has arisen out of a rapid transition from the occasional use of the space for sleeping by homeless persons into a more intensively populated area. The issue is currently being managed in conjunction with other community partners.

Q: What is the Province doing about the issue of homelessness?

A: The Province is involved in supporting this difficult social issue in many ways. In addition to program work in the social services, public health, public security, and employment sectors of core Government, organizations such as BC Housing and a multitude of publicly supported non-profit organizations are working towards solutions to this issue. At this location specifically, the Province will continue to seek solutions that are compassionate to those who are currently camping at the location and in conjunction with the various stakeholders involved including the City of Victoria, adjacent property owners, employees at the Courthouse, and emerging community partner organizations.

Q: Why can't the site support a temporary camping location?

A: The Courthouse serves an important function in a democratic society. The Province is obligated to provide a safe workplace for those who work in the Courthouse as well as ensure that members of the public who come to access services in the Courthouse are and feel safe in doing so.

Q: What is the City doing about the situation?

A: The City is working in conjunction with the Province to address the needs of the community. Although the camping bylaw does not apply to this situation, the enforcement of trespass does. The Province expects the City to provide enforcement measures just as they would for any property owner, delivered in a compassionate, iterative manner.

Q: What is the short term response to this issue?

A: The short term response is that the Province wishes to restore the green space to the purpose it was originally intended; a public area that is safe and accessible to Courthouse staff and clients as well all members of the public.

Q: Are long term solutions in the works?

A: The Province is considering a variety of options that take into account the long term property needs to support the Justice program, the factors that brought the current situation into being, and the interests of the public. Stakeholders will be consulted prior to taking decisions on any future action that may take place.

Q: How are surrounding property owners or residents being considered in the solutions to this issue?

A: The Province also has an obligation to adjacent property owners to limit negative externalities that originate from the Courthouse property. Although to a certain extent, social issues prevalent in any urban space in British Columbia will be part of the landscape, adjacent property owners have a reasonable expectation to the peaceful enjoyment of their property and adjacent public spaces. Immediate and long-term solutions will include the interests of adjacent residents and property owners.

Q: Why doesn't the Province erect signage?

A: The Province previously determined that signs prohibiting encampments would be unnecessary and an ineffective strategy to discourage camping activity. What has since been learned is that signage will need to be part of the solution to communicate expectations on how the property is intended to be used.

As discussed, please see below an outline plan for review and consideration by senior Ministry leadership.

1. RPD and City staff (TBD) consult with key stakeholders such as Courts Svcs, City of Victoria, Rev Al and the encampment "mayor" and occupants ahead of time to advise them of our intentions (that we will be issuing a vacate letter that describes all the social options available to them and potentially housing or shelter options and that they are asked to vacate the site). The purpose of this consultation is to gather concerns and obtain advice from these stakeholders that we hadn't thought of already and possibly support the merits of this action.

2. On approval from senior Ministry Leadership, issue communications via a letter to all campers advising them that:

- camping is not permitted on this property and they are asked to vacate (no time limit provided deliberately)

- here is a list of shelters available to them (including BC Housing, but also other community non-profits)

- here is a list of available community services and resources

Questions to resolve:

- a. The tactics of delivering the communiqué (Vic PD will keep the peace during delivery). Options include Sherrif Service, Public Servant;

- b. Communications plan to respond to the immediate media interest in this action.

3. Our legal services team is currently preparing an injunction on the matter.

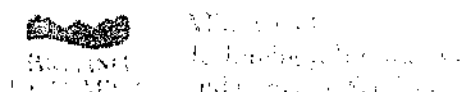

1. RPD and City staff (TBD) consult with key stakeholders such as Courts Svcs, City of Victoria, Rev Al and the encampment "mayor" and occupants ahead of time to advise them of our intentions (that we will be issuing a vacate letter that describes all the social options available to them and potentially housing or shelter options and that they are asked to vacate the site). The purpose of this consultation is to gather concerns and obtain advice from these stakeholders that we hadn't thought of already and possibly support the merits of this action.

2. On approval from senior Ministry Leadership, issue communications via a letter to all campers advising them that:

-camping is not permitted on this property and they are asked to vacate (no time limit provided deliberately)

-here is a list of shelters available to them (including BC Housing, but also other community non-profits)

-here is a list of available community services and resources

Questions to resolve:

a. The tactics of delivering the communiqué (Vic PD will keep the peace during delivery). Options include Sherrif Service, Public Servant;

b. Communications plan to respond to the immediate media interest in this action.

Graeme,

To support your task of drafting some FAQs for use by Courthouse management to respond to queries from staff or public using the courthouse, here's some possible candidates. We will have to ensure this is consistent with messaging applied by GCPE as well as any legal advice we may receive.

Q: Is camping authorized at the Victoria Courthouse?

A: Camping is not a permitted use of the green space adjacent to the Courthouse. The current situation has arisen out of a rapid transition from the occasional use of the space for sleeping by homeless persons into a more intensively populated area. The issue is currently being managed in conjunction with other community partners.

Q: What is the Province doing about the issue of homelessness?

A: The Province is involved in supporting this difficult social issue in many ways. In addition to program work in the social services, public health, public security, and employment sectors of core Government, organizations such as BC Housing and a multitude of publicly support non-profit organizations are working towards solutions to this issue. At this location specifically, the Province will continue to seek solutions that are compassionate to those who are currently camping at the location and in conjunction with the various stakeholders involved including the City of Victoria, adjacent property owners, employees at the Courthouse, and emerging community partner organizations.

Q: Why can't the site support a temporary camping location?

A: The Courthouse serves an important function in a democratic society. The Province is obligated to provide a safe workplace for those who work in the Courthouse as well as ensure that members of the public who come to access services in the Courthouse are and feel safe in doing so.

Q: What is the City doing about the situation?

A: The City is working in conjunction with the Province to address the needs of the community. Although the camping bylaw does not apply to this situation, the enforcement of trespass does. The Province expects the City to provide enforcement measures just as they would for any property owner, delivered in a compassionate, iterative manner.

Q: What is the short term response to this issue?

A: The short term response is that the Province wishes to restore the green space to the purpose it was originally intended; a public area that is safe and accessible to Courthouse staff and clients as well all members of the public.

Q: Are long term solutions in the works?

A: The Province is considering a variety of options that take into account the long term property needs to support the Justice program, the factors that brought the current situation into being, and the interests of the public. Stakeholders will be consulted prior to taking decisions on any future action that may take place.

Q: How are surrounding property owners or residents being considered in the solutions to this issue?

A: The Province also has an obligation to adjacent property owners to limit negative externalities that originate from the Courthouse property. Although to a certain extent, social issues prevalent in any urban space in British Columbia will be part of the landscape, adjacent property owners have a reasonable expectation to the peaceful enjoyment of their property and adjacent public spaces. Immediate and long-term solutions will include the interests of adjacent residents and property owners.

Q: Why doesn't the Province erect signage?

A: The Province previously determined that signs prohibiting encampments would unnecessary and an ineffective strategy to discourage camping activity. What has since been learned is that signage will need to be part of the solution to communicate expectations on how the property is intended to be used.

Graeme,

To support your task of drafting some FAQs for use by Courthouse management to respond to queries from staff or public using the courthouse, here's some possible candidates. We will have to ensure this is consistent with messaging applied by GCPE as well as any legal advice we may receive.

Q: Is camping authorized at the Victoria Courthouse?

A: Camping is not a permitted use of the green space adjacent to the Courthouse. The current situation has arisen out of a rapid transition from the occasional use of the space for sleeping by homeless persons into a more intensively populated area. The issue is currently being managed in conjunction with other community partners.

Q: What is the Province doing about the issue of homelessness?

A: The Province is involved in supporting this difficult social issue in many ways. In addition to program work in the social services, public health, public security, and employment sectors of core Government, organizations such as BC Housing and a multitude of publicly support non-profit organizations are working towards solutions to this issue. At this location specifically, the Province will continue to seek solutions that are compassionate to those who are currently camping at the location and in conjunction with the various stakeholders involved including the City of Victoria, adjacent property owners, employees at the Courthouse, and emerging community partner organizations.

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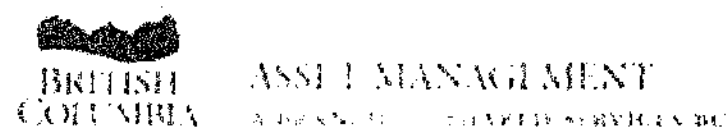

Background: Reporter would like an interview but will accept a statement. CTV did a story on this on Nov. 21, and is doing a follow-up to get the province's reaction. Saturday's story summary is as follows:

- Story says the grass at the courthouse is provincially owned and not a city park and therefore not subject to city bylaw so there is a loophole – they can camp overnight and past 7am.
- City says tents went up 19 days ago and city hasn't received a single complaint. They're being good neighbours.
- However, reporter interviews a couple across the street who are concerned because they think it could get out of hand.
- Reporter says it's unclear as to whether province will or has taken any action.

Original Questions:

- JAG:
- Is the same enforcement used at the courthouse as at other Victoria parks? (Caroline – this is between Sheriff Services and Vic PD)
 - Has anyone been told to leave? (Caroline – believe this is Sheriff Services and Vic PD)

MTICS:

- Is the Province worried that there is a loophole and campers don't have to leave the property by 8am? (MTICS)

- Does the province have a plan in place for this property? (MTICS)

Suggested Response:

The B.C. Government is aware that some people have taken shelter overnight at the Victoria Provincial Courthouse property. Government has been working closely with the Victoria Police Department, the City of Victoria and community outreach organizations to identify a long-term solution to the situation. To date, the temporary residents are initiating all clean up themselves and keeping things relatively tidy. We are only dealing with security issues for the building.

Homelessness is an issue in Victoria and the BC Government provides a range of supportive housing options for individuals without shelter. BC Housing works with local non-profit providers to find housing for people identified as homeless at the camp. Outreach workers also determine if any of the people at the camp need any support services, such as mental health and addictions services.

Hi everyone. Assuming that there are still individuals camping on the grounds tomorrow, we will be discussing and dealing with this, so I'd like to ensure we are all understand what the concerns are and what the next steps should be.

I know that several residents in the area have complained about the situation and have requested that someone do something about it. Over the course of Friday, some communication appears to have gone astray as did the response plan (outlined below). Dear ADM Cavanaugh:

As you are aware, the green space adjacent to the Victoria Courthouse is currently occupied by people, largely from the homeless population, who have erected various types of camping structures there. As the area constitutes private property, it is not subject to the "overnight shelter" provisions of the City of Victoria Parks Regulation Bylaw. Accordingly, the Victoria Police have no independent authority to require the campers to remove their structures during the day.

My understanding is that, as the representative of the property owner, your office has determined that no action will be taken with regard to this situation, unless there is direct interference with the use or safety of the courthouse. It is the position of the Victoria Police that such a position is unsustainable. Past experience has demonstrated that allowing entrenchment of campers in an open area that has not been designed for permanent camping leads to numerous public safety and public order issues. Past experience has also shown that a proactive approach to these types of situations is preferable to a reactive approach once the situation reaches a critical level.

The purpose of this letter is to confirm your position, in order to assist the Victoria Police and the City of Victoria in planning a coordinated response, should public safety or the broader public interest require intervention in the near future. I would like to add that, moving forward, we are willing to work with your staff in providing strategies to assist in the management of the situation.

Hello Lynda

I need to let you know that the situation with the campers on the lawn at Victoria Courthouse may be escalating. Sheriffs, WSI staff, Court Admin staff and Victoria City Police are frustrated with not being able to do anything about open drug use, open fires, needles and other paraphernalia strewn about, damage to sprinkler heads to keep from getting wet, as well as using the grounds as a public toilet.

I was informed this afternoon that Victoria City Police had sought permission from our Sheriff Inspector in Victoria to move people along, and that this permission has been given. Vic City Police may be moving them along as early as tonight.

The usual procedure is that a sign needs to be erected ("no camping") and a letter issued to the police by Court Services or SSBC, but I don't believe that can happen with the recent court ruling on public parks and the homeless which we of course want to honour. Our circumstances appear to go beyond what was conceived of by the Court.

I will keep you informed, but this situation may very well turn into a media issue, if not a legal one.

We are up to 11 tents in the park as of today—this is getting out of hand and the numbers are increasing on a daily basis.

According to Peter, the Courthouse Security Guards ask the tenters to leave and are ignored. When their Guard company calls the police, they do not respond.

I spoke to Deputy Chief Del Manak about police response, and he told me that if Sheriffs go out and tell them to leave and they refuse, to call the Vic PD to respond and they will have them leave. If there is any issue with whoever is running the police shift that day, then I am to call him directly.

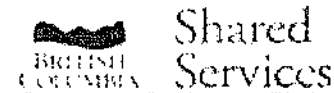

Thank you Graeme for outlining the breakdown of Ministries and positions with interest in this property.

We have received direction (since your previous email) from Stephanie Melvin that the Campers are to be left alone and that they are not asking for any assistance at this time from the VicPD.

Ms. Melvin confirmed for me that this direction has come directly from ADM Cavanaugh.

We have communicated our concern to ADM Cavanaugh that things could escalate if allowed to continue on the property without any form of management. We have asked to open a dialogue with her and have offered our assistance in developing a strategy to deal with the current situation and to assist with developing plans moving forward concerning the management of the greenspace as it relates to the homeless population.

For example, every morning when the VicPD awaken homeless persons in the parks this provides us with opportunities to assess many things such as their exposure level to the elements, mental health status, physical health status, and many other vulnerabilities. We connect them at these times with mental health teams, connect them with housing providers, at times take them to hospital, or call the ambulance if they need immediate medical attention. In addition to that, because they are on City property, the Parks Department comes and cleans up accumulated garbage, needles, and human waste. The public works department then hauls all of that away to be disposed of properly.

Because the space they currently occupy is not on City property none of that management outlined above is happening. In effect, if the people there are allowed to continue to occupy the space, unabated, unrestrained and unmanaged it will be akin to actually creating greater vulnerabilities for them. The likelihood of an assault, overdose, exposure or other incident occurring increases as the population grows without any form of management.

One other point that was communicated to ADM Cavanaugh through Ms. Melvin was that there is green space in City Parks available all over the City. The people that are taking shelter on the grounds of the Courthouse are not doing so because there is nowhere for them to go. It is our experienced belief that they are taking up sheltering on that space because they are not being compelled to pack up every morning and move off the grounds.

As we have communicated our concerns to ADM Cavanaugh in writing the VicPD, respectfully will not be taking any action until we have received a response from her directly.

May I ask whether there has been communication between the two Ministries you've outlined below with respect to this issue been initiated?

 - o Outsource provider of Security Services (through WSI)
- ? Government Communications and Public Engagement
 - o Advisors for all Ministries
- ? Within both the Ministry of Justice and Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens Services, there are numerous individual stakeholders who have a part to play. For example, I report to a Director, Executive Director, ADM (Brian Fellows), Deputy Minister, and Minister. Thank you Graeme for outlining the breakdown of Ministries and positions with interest in this property.

We have received direction (since your previous email) from Stephanie Melvin that the Campers are to be left alone and that they are not asking for any assistance at this time from the VicPD. Ms. Melvin confirmed for me that this direction has come directly from ADM Cavanaugh.

We have communicated our concern to ADM Cavanaugh that things could escalate if allowed to continue on the property without any form of management. We have asked to open a dialogue with her and have offered our assistance in developing a strategy to deal with the current situation and to assist with developing plans moving forward concerning the management of the greenspace as it relates to the homeless population.

For example, every morning when the VicPD awaken homeless persons in the parks this provides us with opportunities to assess many things such as their exposure level to the elements, mental health status, physical health status, and many other vulnerabilities. We connect them at these times with mental health teams, connect them with housing providers, at times take them to hospital, or call the

ambulance if they need immediate medical attention. In addition to that, because they are on City property, the Parks Department comes and cleans up accumulated garbage, needles, and human waste. The public works department then hauls all of that away to be disposed of properly.

Because the space they currently occupy is not on City property none of that management outlined above is happening. In effect, if the people there are allowed to continue to occupy the space, unabated, unrestrained and unmanaged it will be akin to actually creating greater vulnerabilities for them. The likelihood of an assault, overdose, exposure or other incident occurring increases as the population grows without any form of management.

One other point that was communicated to ADM Cavanaugh through Ms. Melvin was that there is green space in City Parks available all over the City. The people that are taking shelter on the grounds of the Courthouse are not doing so because there is nowhere for them to go. It is our experienced belief that they are taking up sheltering on that space because they are not being compelled to pack up every morning and move off the grounds.

As we have communicated our concerns to ADM Cavanaugh in writing the VicPD, respectfully will not be taking any action until we have received a response from her directly.

May I ask whether there has been communication between the two Ministries you've outlined below with respect to this issue been initiated?

 - RPD is the Landlord of the Victoria Courthouse and 8.5 million square feet of Provincially owned buildings
- ? WSI Brookfield Johnson Controls
 - Outsource provider of Property Management Services
- ? Paladin Security
 - Outsource provider of Security Services (through WSI)
- ? Government Communications and Public Engagement
 - Advisors for all Ministries
- ? Within both the Ministry of Justice and Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens Services, there are numerous individual stakeholders who have a part to play. For example, I report to a Director, Executive Director, ADM (Brian Fellows), Deputy Minister, and Minister. I note it is not a park and therefore outside the purview of the city bylaws , I understand that it is land owned by the courthouse.

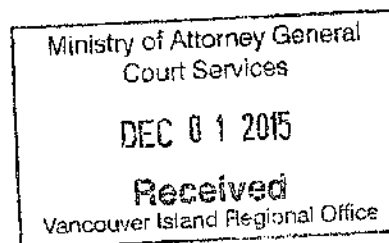
During the last week there have been two attempt break ins at ^{s.22} police were called on both occasions without good result , two bicycles have been stolen from the ^{s.22} condominium building .

s.22 the Court House on Burdett. We are writing to ask that the "tent city" which has sprung up, practically overnight, at the end of Burdett, be removed at once.

It really is a disgrace to this neighbourhood, the City and the Province. If the Province wants to provide a campground for homeless people, then they should provide a proper campground outside the limits of the city with bathroom and bathing facilities. The province spends millions of dollars every year to attract tourists to our beautiful province. As far as we know, the closest place they are allowed to camp is at Goldstream! They are not allowed to camp at Quadra and Burdett!!!!!!

In addition, the City thinks they have to provide accommodation for homeless people until they can provide housing. The problem here is that most of these people do not want to be housed. They have multiple paranoias about being inside. So, if we are waiting to "house" them, it will be a very long wait! Let's face it, these are not homeless people who are down on their luck, or have found themselves in financial peril. The majority of these people are mentally ill and/or drug addicts.

The mental illness and drug addiction creates all kinds of peripheral problems, which we are already experiencing at s.22 - multiple break-ins, stolen bikes, etc. The "site" itself is ugly, dirty, and obviously, one big outdoor toilet, as they have no toilet facilities. How many needles are in that grass?

When I was at the bakery on Blanshard yesterday, I heard two women, who park behind the courthouse, say they were afraid to go to their cars now at night. When people are high on drugs, as many of these "homeless" people are, they can be very aggressive and dangerous.

This tent city needs to be removed at once for multiple reasons. We are tax paying citizens and proud residents of the Province of B.C. It seems we have fewer rights than those who pay no taxes and cost thousands of dollars every year for extra police force and social service personnel.

We are asking that this Tent City be removed at once. Thank you.

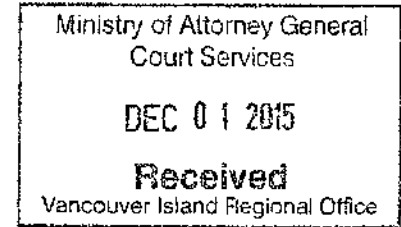

We are owners/residents at ^{s.22} . We are writing to protest the usage of what is now the courthouse park property (formerly a CRD park). Allowing this green space as an encampment has resulted in an unsightly and dangerous addition to what was a quiet park in our neighbourhood. One that we and our neighbours could use at any time. Which, I might add, is why a neighbourhood green space exists.

History has shown us that these encampments become hot beds of illegal drug use, of litter, of defecating and urinating in inappropriate areas, of loud and obnoxious behaviour. They also lead to break-ins and the resulting loss of valuables to properties in the area. They are a blight on the neighbourhood.

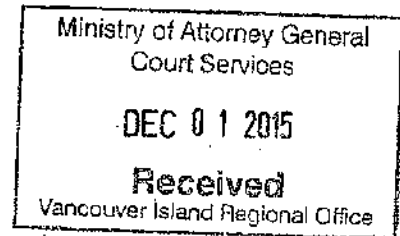
Women, children and older people are now afraid to walk by this area. It is considered unsafe. Surely this is not what the Courthouse has in mind for our shared neighbourhood park.

Re: The "Tent City" on the east side of Victoria Court House, Victoria, BC

I have been advised that my comments should be directed to your office.

I am both an owner and tenant of the ^{s.22} and an owner of the ^{s.22}
Both buildings are in very close proximity to what has now been referred to as the "Tent City" in the park east of the Victoria Court House. I cannot tell you how disturbed I am as a tenant; tax payer and building owner that this situation has been allowed to not only exist but seems, almost daily, to escalate. What used to be a quiet enjoyment area for everyone has now turned into a no man's land. The occupants have now taken over to the point that no one feels safe or would dare go into the park.

I have three major concerns:

1. The tent city is very unsightly and our tenants on the upper floors now have a view of the tents and the mess that has been created. City parks were never intended to be campgrounds as they provide no infrastructure for that purpose.
2. We feel that there may be an increase in security and/or crime in the area. Although there is no way to prove where this person came from, someone climbed over a 10 foot fence last weekend at the ^{s.22} and stole both tires and rims from a locked bike in our parking lot. Coincidence?
3. We have vacant suites in both buildings which we are trying to lease. Our leasing brokers have indicated that in this very tough commercial rental market the unsightliness of the park and the perceived potential security concerns will make the suites that much harder to lease.

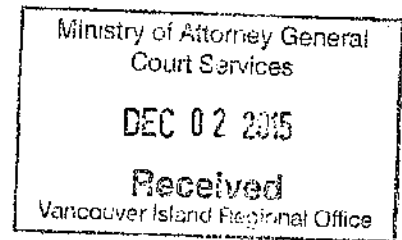
I understand from the media that the park is owned by the province so therefore does not fall under the jurisdiction of the city camping bylaw. I also understand that the province has not officially taken a stand on this issue and in casually asking a Sheriff why they have not done anything about it they inform me that they have been instructed not to interfere with the campers. So we really seem to have a no man's land with no jurisdictional body taking responsibility.

As a citizen, tax payer and property owner I therefore ask the Province, City or both to take a leadership role on this situation and return the park area back to the safe quiet enjoyment area it once was. I can appreciate the complexities of the homeless situation but allowing 20 to 30 tents in a central city park is not the solution to the problem.

I would hope someone in the Provincial Government is embarrassed that the situation has been allowed to get to this point.

Dear Ms. Melvin,

Thank you for taking the time to speak with me on the phone yesterday. As requested I have summarized my concerns in writing about the homeless camp on provincial court land at the corner of Quadra and Burdett Streets in Victoria, for your review and consideration.

Specifically my concern relates to the proximity of this camp to daycare facilities at the neighbouring YMCA and to Christchurch Cathedral Anglican Elementary and Middle school on Burdett Street. I have attached a map showing the proximity of the homeless camp to the YMCA daycare and Christchurch Cathedral Elementary and Middle School.

The children at the Anglican school use the cathedral land directly across from the homeless camp as their playing fields and the school itself is adjacent to this land. I understand that there is no easy solution to the homeless issue but allowing pseudo permanent camping at a location within metres of schools and day care does not seem appropriate.

While many of the homeless at this camp and across the city are courteous and responsible it is evident that others are suffering from addictions and mental health issues. Behaviour from some of these individuals is unpredictable and can be frightening at times. Our young children have already witnessed intravenous drug use, public urination, individual screaming rants, excessive profanity and perhaps most disturbingly had their passage blocked by obviously high users.

I am hopeful that there will be a quick resolution to the camping situation on the court house land. I do not profess to know the answer to such a complex issue as homelessness but I am certain allowing for pseudo permanent camps in close proximity to schools and daycare is not the answer.

I would appreciate your consideration of closing this camp and working with the necessary agencies and volunteer bodies towards achieving a more sustainable and appropriate solution.

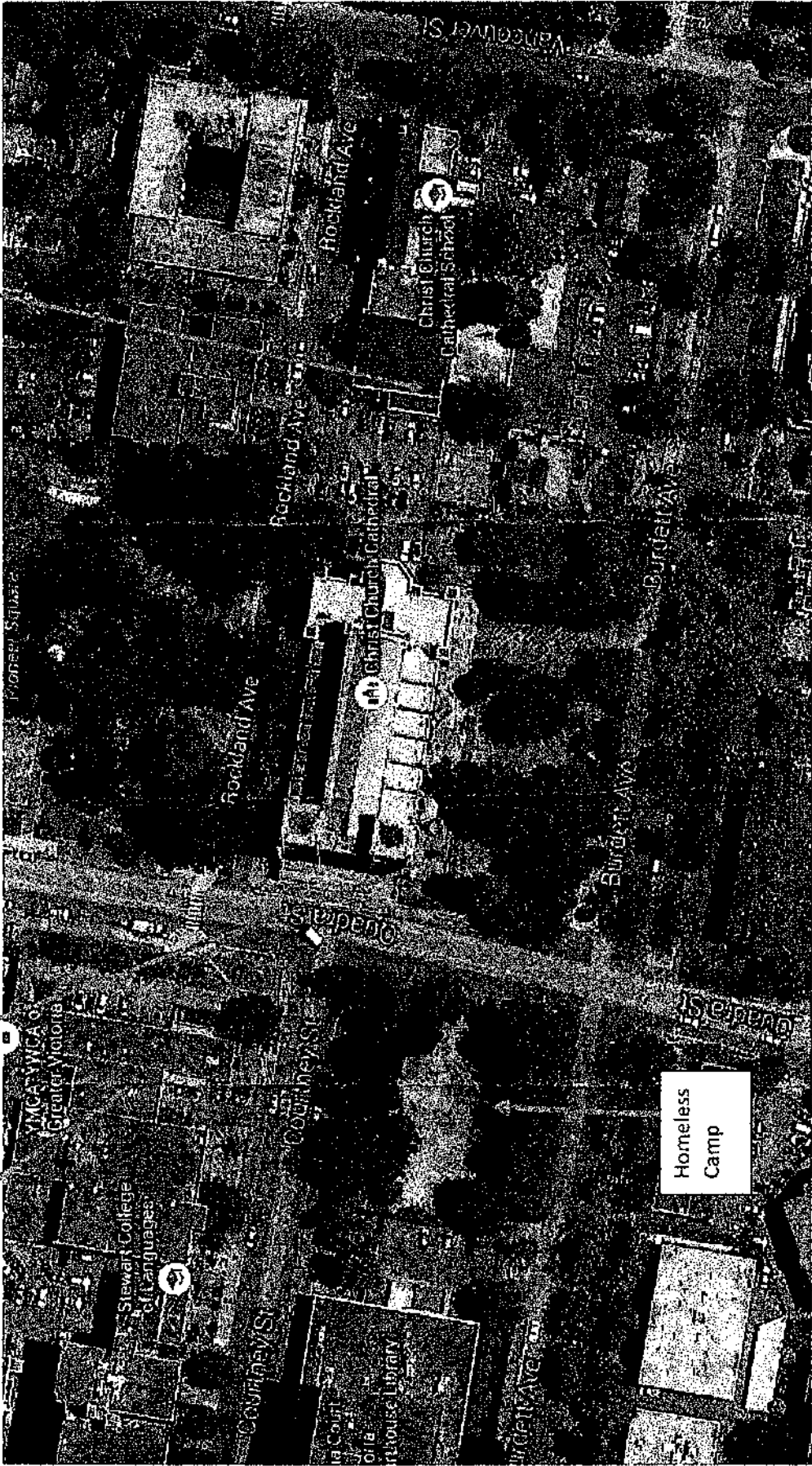

Here is the update from our meeting today (Dec. 22nd):

Vic PD:

- approx. 80-100 people on site – difficult to do a tent count. Estimate 80 – 100 people
- a couple of incidents over the weekend:
 - small contained fire was started (spirit fire), Victoria Fire Dept. attended and determined there was no fire hazard, requested group to keep the fire closely monitored
 - potential risk of overdose on site – Narcan kits are available and a number of people are trained to use them
 - believe that there is some drug trafficking on site – police attempting to track and arrest
- VicPD participated in a healing circle today with group (healing circle on Tues. and Thurs.) – was positive – increased risk is due to increased density and drug dealing – local group understands that maintaining stability is the key to ensuring enough time is available for solutions to be developed – the group is open to VicPD attending the site – for them respect is key
- group has indicated that they want to hear directly from the provincial government – upset with Premier's announcement, would like to hear of things in advance and have an opportunity for conversation
- once shelter is available believed that some will move in, but not all
- AVI is dropping off sharps containers and disposing of them

City of Victoria:

- City opening the shelter January 2nd
- December 30th, 7pm, holding a community meeting - public notices going door to door
- focused on draft lease of facility, back to BC Housing by end of tomorrow.

MTICS:

– will determine whether porta potty service is available on the 25th – will also determine whether a 4th porta potty is required

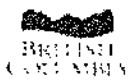

fyi - there was a call this a.m. with reps from the City of Victoria, BC Housing and VicPD regarding the campers at the Victoria Courthouse.

Summary:

- Currently about 110-120 campers on the site. MTICS working with a service provider to ensure on-going garbage collection. VicPD will assist to ensure this is done safely.
- Was a fatal overdose at the courthouse on Dec 26 and a stabbing on Xmas Eve. Was also a non-fatal overdose reported yesterday. For context, there have been about 7 other overdoses around Victoria in the past week. Some of the campers have indicated they will be looking for alternative camping sites as a result of the recent activity but there has been no confirmation.
- BC Housing and the City of Victoria working on negotiating a lease of the new shelter.
- The City of Victoria is planning a public information session tomorrow evening regarding the new shelter on Yates Street.
- *Target date for opening of the new shelter is Jan. 2
- Once the shelter is operational, MTICS will have a flyer distributed to the campers (draft attached) requesting they vacate and providing assurance they will be offered alternate housing arrangements.
- MTICS also working with legal regarding potentially having an injunction in place in the event some of the campers choose not to go to the new shelter.

WSI, Bee Clean and Vic PD have been out to tent city this morning to clear up the garbage in and around the tents. The rubbish in the parking lot is also being cleaned away, the one issue they have is although there was an empty container, this is now full again and they have to wait for the vendor to collect and replace bin. I've been told the regular schedule for the port-a-potties and garbage collection is now daily except on stat holidays.

I have also highlighted the partially obstructed steps down to Courtney Street, as a health and safety risk due to our new temporary emergency muster area being Pioneer Square and access to get there. Another problem being faced is when the garbage removal people come to empty one container and replace with a new one, they are limited to where they can place it if cars are parked in the space it normally goes.

If you have any queries or safety concerns, please let me know.

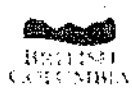

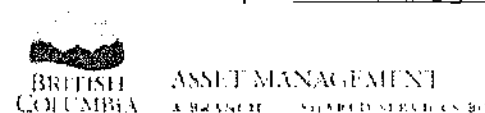

Here is the update from our meeting today:

VicPD:

- busy on site since Fri. – another couple of assaults have occurred – still have some high risk youth on site
- assault today on site when police were there
- TAPS lawyers organized a meeting last night at church across the street – to organize any legal opposition to possible injunction – deteriorated into a physical confrontation and cancelled meeting
- site continues to densify
- Safety Committee - small and functional – 2 VicPd, 1 VicFire, 2 campers, 1 MCFD – focus on tents being too close, pallets on the walkways, width of walkways, fire hazards (stoves & heating in tents) , manage youth on site – trying to work collaboratively with people on site – suggestions to make site safer work together – talked in general terms about health risks – their biggest concern is lack of running water – talking to them about using porta potties – disease (possible scabies in one of the tents – not confirmed)

VicFire:

- main concern other than state of the site – an appliance in a tent that looked like a chimney – let them know that it wouldn't be tolerated – campers on site said they would deal with it

City:

- comment on substantial resources allocated to manage site

Our Place:

- mixed reaction on site – emotions – anger & frustration – starting to shift a bit
- 20-25 ppl from site have viewed the location at View Roya l- reaction has improved since seeing the site – looking on it as an opportunity
- would be good to de-institutionalize site

BCHousing/OHCS:

- confirmed both new transition sites will be opened on Feb. 23rd
- have identified list of people
- Mt St Edwards – renos complete on 15th, ready to move in for 23rd
- working with Our Place and Cool Aid Society - try to move as many people by 25th – moving trucks in line

Sheriffs:

- no update

Island Health:

- no update

GCPE:

- considerable amount of coverage on topic on Friday

MCFD:

- youth still on site – including high risk youth
- at this stage still letting them on site – don't want to escalate but are looking at options

MTICS:

- right now 25th remains as deadline to vacate, if required, an application for injunction to go in shortly after
- thoughts around best use of time between now and 25th – how do we manage the transition period – how to engage neutral/influential stakeholders to encourage people to take advantage of opportunities – what to do post injunction and restoration of site

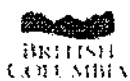

Scott McGregor passed on your contact details to me and asked me to send you an email. The Victoria Police Department has created a safety committee to manage safety concerns at Tent City. The Province is supportive of this committee. The committee was created after speaking with our Vancouver PD counterparts who had such a committee during the Oppenheimer Park occupation.

The committee consists of 2 police officers, 1 rep each from the Fire Department and MCFD, and 2 reps from the encampment. We plan to meet once a week (hopefully Tues or Wed) and are hoping to do this at the courthouse. We don't want to have our meeting at the police station or at tent city, but we need some place close for the campers. I spoke with Sheila Cooper and she has denied my request to use the courthouse. Are you able to help with this request? If you need any further information from me, just send me an email.

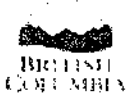

We will get our staff to walk them back through to the main courthouse at the end of their appointment. Many of our clients are already coming to see us when they are upset/distraught, without them having to then deal with their personal safety coming to the address too.

Also, is there anything we can set up for the clients who drive and park at the centre/on the street, who feel unsafe walking from their car (past Tent City). I know this is a lot to ask but I am not sure how long it will be until Tent City is moved on etc. Any suggestions to help relieve these temporary issues will be gratefully received.

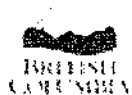

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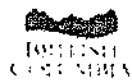

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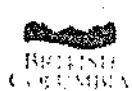

Disruptions include those that interfere with persons having duties to discharge in a court of justice, including parties, witnesses, jurors and officers of the court. As well, the safety and security of staff and all who attend at court is paramount at all times. While there is no reason to believe that safety will be compromised because of this event, if you do have a concern please report it promptly to a Sheriff or your supervisor.

There will likely be increased public and media presence in the area and also possibly the courthouse. If you receive any questions from the media, other than routine court records access questions, please direct the individual to contact GCPE Media Inquiries at (250) 889-1121.

Again, it is not anticipated that this event will cause any disruption to the courts, but please do contact the Sheriffs or your supervisor if you have any concerns.

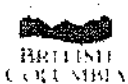

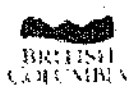

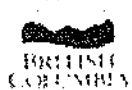

As I am sure you are aware, the individuals residing in the park area adjacent to Victoria Law Courts have been asked to vacate the site by Thursday, 25, 2016.

It has come to our attention that a peaceful rally has been organized on Thursday, starting at 3:30pm, and we would recommend that if possible you avoid this area. Precautionary measures have been taken and City Police is aware of the situation. While we do not anticipate this will impact routine day-to-day court operations, please be vigilant and report any disruptions that interfere with the operations of the court or if there is any incident of safety of public servants or visitors to the courthouse, promptly to the Sheriffs or your supervisor. This includes any disruptions at the courthouse that interfere with persons having duties to discharge in a court of justice, including parties, witnesses, jurors and officers of the court.

There will also likely be increased public and media presence in the area and also possibly the courthouse. If you receive any questions from the media, other than routine court records access questions, please direct the individual to contact GCPE Media Inquiries at (250) 250 889-1121.

Again, we do not anticipate that this will cause any disruption to the courts, but please do contact the Sheriffs or your supervisor if you have any concerns.
