OBJECTIVES: Mr. Cyr wants to briefly discuss:

- The impact of the Air-France direct Paris-Vancouver flights;
- Potential emerging business opportunities; and

BACKGROUND:

Mr. Cyr wants to personally thank Minister Yamamoto for her support in past years when the Minister was responsible for Francophone Affairs, specifically, with respect to the Forum on Francophone Economic Development, and Économusée. Mr. Cyr and the Société de développement économique were instrumental in testing and launching Atlas BC, a user-friendly web-based public interface that depicts the Francophone business community's participation in business and economic development opportunities in BC.

Mr. Cyr was formerly with Transport Canada. He has worked very closely with YVR on the Air France direct flights file linking the BC business sector to the French companies. s.13

SDECB mandate is to represent the interests of the Francophone community economic sector and be a source of information to Francophone businesses. It does not provide financial support to businesses.

Air France Direct Flights:

- Air France launched its non-stop, seasonal service between Vancouver International Airport (YVR) and Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport on March 29, 2015.

According to SDECB:

- The new service will add \$13.7 million in Gross Domestic Product, \$8.8 million in wages and 248 jobs to the BC economy and provide small business opportunities particularly for tour operators, restaurants and gift shops especially those selling Native Art. It will also open doors for business exchange.
- Of the French tourists, 91% travel for personal reasons and 9% for professional reasons. In 2012, Canada got 461,919 tourists from France. Quebec got approximately 74% of the share, Ontario 18% and BC (in third position) got approximately 5% of the French tourists.

The economic impact of French tourism in Canada is \$527 million, which represents an average expenditure of \$1,292 per person-trip. The Paris connection may also increase tourism from Switzerland.

- France represents one of the largest European markets for British Columbia.
- SDECB and the BC Francophone Chamber of Commerce agree the direct Air France flights will positively affect business and trade between the two economies.

JTST Information:

- The new service will fly three times per week until May 4, then it will increase to five times per week until September 13, down to three times per week until October 24 and stop its service for the remainder of the year. Air France has indicated they would like to make this year round service.
- Air France represents 54% of passenger traffic at Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport. Additionally, Air France's network and connections to cities in the UK and Germany, which are corporate priorities for Destination BC, represent an important opportunity in terms of improved connection times and access to and from these key markets.
- According to YVR, the new direct flight will create an estimated 69 person-years (PYs) of employment, paying \$3.2 million in wages, \$1.8 million in taxes and \$6.4 million in value-added to the BC economy (GDP).
- In terms of the spending by additional visitors, YVR estimates that there's another 179 direct PYs of employment in BC's hotels, restaurants, shops and tourist attractions, paying an estimated \$5.6 million in wages, \$3.1 million in taxes and \$7.6 million in value added to the BC economy (GDP).
- In 2014, nearly 75% of French visitors to Canada choose Quebec as their destination. France is Europe's 2nd largest economy and despite tepid performance, France remains the world's 5th largest tourism market.

Économusée:

- The advancement of the Économusée approach in BC is a first in western Canada and is the result of a close partnership between the Societe de Developpement Economique and the BC government. Economusee has its origins in Quebec. Its goal is to promote artisan-entrepreneurs/businesses that use authentic and traditional production techniques and know how.
- This initiative contributes to creating diverse and strong economic activities in rural areas, increasing its attractiveness as a tourist destination.
- There are currently three Économusée sites on Vancouver Island and expansion in the Kootenay area is being developed. The initiative is supported by JTST and IGRS/Francophone Affairs Program.

Background:

About Air France and New Direct Vancouver-Paris Flights:

Air France will begin service between Vancouver and Paris, France starting March 29, 2015. The Boeing 777 flight will bring thrice-weekly flights from March 29 to May 3, 5-times-weekly flights from May 4 to September 4, and 4-times-weekly flights from September 5 to October 24. This is the first scheduled direct service between YVR and Paris.

The Air France service will add \$13.7 million in Gross Domestic Product, \$8.8 million in wages and 250 jobs to the B.C. economy. In a recent survey of Metro Vancouver residents, Paris ranked as the number one requested destination from YVR.

Since May 2004, Air France and KLM Royal Dutch Airlines have become the largest European airline group: one group, two airlines, and three businesses. Each airline has retained its individual identity, trade name and brand. The three core businesses are Passenger Business, Cargo and Engineering & Maintenance. Both airlines run their own operations from their respective hubs Paris-Charles de Gaulle and Amsterdam-Schiphol. Air France and KLM carry more than 77 million passengers per year. They operate 573 aircraft enabling them to fly to 243 destinations in 103 countries.

New Air France safety video getting a lot of media and online attention:

Air France has released a new safety video that makes it seem trendy – elegant, even – to protect yourself when you fly. The four-minute video, set to the song “Love is in the Air,” features French flight attendants providing safety information with stylish flair and a lovely French accent, explaining, for instance, that wearing your seatbelt “highlights your waistline,” and that personal electronic devices are very chic. About Vancouver Airport Authority:

Vancouver Airport Authority is a community-based, not-for-profit organization that manages Vancouver International Airport (YVR). Canada’s second busiest airport, Vancouver International Airport welcomed 19.36 million people in 2014,

facilitated more than 310,000 aircraft take-offs and landings and handled over 256,000 tonnes of cargo.

Fifty-three airlines serve YVR, connecting people and businesses to more than 110 non-stop destinations worldwide. The three most popular destinations, based on number of passengers, to and from YVR are Toronto, Calgary and Edmonton, followed by Los Angeles, Victoria, and Hong Kong.

YVR was voted Best Airport in North America, and Best Airport in the World for its size category of 10-20 million passengers, in the 2014 Skytrax World Airport Awards. This is the first time in Skytrax award history that an airport has maintained a #1 Airport in North America ranking for six consecutive years.

Vancouver Airport Authority is a dedicated community partner and in 2014 donated more than \$900,000 to local organizations.

Arrive via Canada Line at YVR by 11:45 a.m., exit left and head to the Domestic entry, where Ms Robyn McVickers, Communications and Marketing Director, will meet Minister Yamamoto inside the sliding doors and escort her to the speaker briefing and then to the aircraft gate.

YVR is welcoming Air France's inaugural arrival with celebrations in the terminal and a formal media event. Activities will take place in the secure side area of the terminal, so participants must go through airport security like they would as a passenger. Participants must have valid government issued photo ID, and cannot bring any liquids over 100 ml into the secure area.

The event will begin with formal speeches, followed by a ribbon cutting and will conclude with a Parisian themed photo op (mock-up of Paris' Pont des Arts bridge, where people attach locks to symbolize their love). Craig Richmond, President and CEO, Vancouver Airport Authority, will say a few words of welcome and emcee the event. Minister Yamamoto will be the third formal speaker, right after the Hon. Kerry-Lynne Findlay, Minister of National Revenue, Government of Canada.
