Glyphosate (N-phosphono-methyl glycine), according to the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) most recent data on pesticide usage, was the seventh most widely used active ingredient in agriculture, with 34 to 38 million pounds used in 1997.[i] In 1995/96, glyphosate ranked as the second most used active ingredient in non-agricultural settings, with five to seven million pounds used in the home and garden and nine to twelve million pounds used in commercial settings.[ii] Glyphosate use is currently growing at a rate of about 20 percent per year, due in large part to the growing number of genetically engineered crops that are resistant to the herbicide.[iii] With this growth rate, it is estimated that as much as

100 million pounds of glyphosate was applied in 2000. Of course these numbers fail to reflect the poundage of inert ingredients in the formulations that are mixed with the glyphosate.

First registered for use in 1974, there are 63 glyphosate-containing pesticide formulations registered for use in the U.S. The isopropylamine salt of glyphosate, the active ingredient in 53 of these products, is used to kill a variety of broadleaf

weeds and grasses. The principal agricultural uses include corn, wheat, sorghum, citrus and stone fruits, potatoes, onions, asparagus, coffee, peanuts and pineapple.[iv] There are also a good number of non-food uses including ornamental, turf, forestry and rights-of-way.[v]

Some of the most widespread uses of glyphosate that have been attracting public attention include use in invasive weed management and home gardening. The increase of glyphosate use in these areas is directly tied to the larger problem of poor land management, including over grazing, over development, soil compaction and other stressors.

Glyphosate has replaced ecologically sound and sustainable cultural practices such as green-mulching, and preventive maintenance such as aeration and dethatching.

Mode of Action

Plants treated with glyphosate translocate the systemic herbicide to their roots, shoot regions and fruit, where it interferes with the plant's ability to form aromatic amino acids necessary for protein synthesis. Treated plants generally die in two to three days. Because plants absorb glyphosate it cannot be completely removed by washing or peeling produce or by milling, baking or brewing grains. It has been shown to persist in food products for up to two years.[vi]

Inert Ingredients

A letter published in the Feburary 6, 1988 Lancet (page 299) cited a Japanese report of 56 cases of toxic exposure to RoundupTM between June, 1984 and March, 1986. The individuals had ingested the pesticide, and experienced a range of adverse effects to their respiratory, cardovascular, and central nervous systems; nine patients died. An analysis of the findings identified one of the so-called "inert ingredients" (inerts) in the formulation, polyoxyethyleneamine (POEA), as the cause of harm. POEA is a surfactant, a chemical added to help glyphosate work its way into the plant tissue. RoundupTM contains 15% POEA.

All pesticide formulations are actually toxic soups, a mixture of the active ingredient (the registered pesticide) with a variety of other chemicals such as solvents, surfactants (like POEA), and emulsifiers – the inerts. Federal law classifies inerts as trade secrets and pesticide manufactures are not required to list inert ingredients on the pesticide label. Inerts, which can make up to as much as 99% of a pesticide formulation, are often highly toxic chemicals that can be more hazardous then the active ingredient.

Inerts known to be included in glyphosate products include ammonium sulfate, benziothiazolone, 3-iodo-2-propynl butylcarbamate (IPBC), isobutane, methyl pyrrolidinone, pelargonic acid, sodium sulfite, sorbic acid, and isopropylamine. All of these chemicals are associated with skin irritation, gastric and respiratory problems.[vii]

Acute Exposure

While EPA considers glyphosate to be "of relatively low oral and dermal acute toxicity," [viii] the agency does classify glyphosate in toxicity class I (class I chemicals are the most toxic in a scale from I-IV). Some glyphosate products are of higher acute toxicity, primarily due to eye and/or skin irritation.

The most recent data (1998) from California's Department of Pesticide Regulation finds that glyphosate ranks first among herbicides as the highest causes of pesticide-induced illness or injury to people in California.[ix] Beyond Pesticides' own pesticide incident reporting system has received numerous reports of people poisoned by exposure to glyphosate from around the country. These victims of pesticide exposure suffered from eye soreness, headaches, diarrhea, and other flu-like symptoms.

Symptoms following exposure to glyphosate formulations include: swollen eyes, face and joints; facial numbness; burning and/or itching skin; blisters; rapid heart rate; elevated blood pressure; chest pains, congestion; coughing; headache; and nausea.[x]

In developmental toxicity studies using pregnant rats and rabbits, glyphosate caused treatment-related effects in high dose groups, including diarrhea, decreased body weight gain, nasal discharge and death.[xi]

Chronic Exposure

One reproductive study using rats found kidney effects in the high dose group while another study showed digestive effects and decreased body weight gain.[xii] A cancer study looking at rats found an increase in pancreas and liver tumors in males as well as an increase in thyroid cancer in females.[xiii]

Alternatives to Glyphosate – Integrated Weed Management (IWM)

A good IWM program combines monitoring, proper landscape design, mulching, mechanical and cultural methods, and includes the use of heat, herbicidal soaps, and corn gluten meal. Biological control of weeds, using beneficial insects or pathogens is also an excellent approach.

For home gardeners and farmers alike, the best way to manage weeds is to prevent them. Home gardeners should make sure that their seeds are not contaminated with weed seeds and that all organic matter has been properly composted. Topsoil should also come from a reliable source.

For home gardeners and farmers alike, the best way to manage weeds is to prevent them. Home gardeners should make sure that their seeds are not contaminated with weed seeds and that all organic matter has been properly composted. Topsoil should also come from a reliable source.

Mulching is a great way to control weeds. A mulch is any type of material that covers the ground and precludes unwanted plants from growing. Organic mulches can be worked into the soil at the end of the season, providing valuable organic material to your garden.

RE: Industrial users (like Pipelines)

The Committee heard presentations from three organizations representing industrial users of pesticides. They shared the perspective that pesticides play an important role in their work and should not be banned. The Integrated Vegetation Management Association (IVMA) of British Columbia represents the industrial users of herbicides in BC: forestry, highways and railways, electrical utilities, oil and gas utilities, noxious weed control, contractors and suppliers, nurseries and agriculture. It argued that application of herbicides is the only effective method to maintain industrial sites weed-free and safe. Mechanical treatments like hand-pulling and steaming do not eliminate deciduous vegetation or control the spread of some invasive weeds.

Therefore the IVMA urged the Committee to give full consideration to the ramifications new regulations related to pesticide use could have on the vegetation management industry and in particular expressed concern that the undefined term "cosmetic use" leads to the stigmatization of herbicides and is subjective. The Integrated Environmental Plant Management Association of Western Canada, which represents professional certified pesticide applicators, and the BC Business Council, representing 260 large/medium-sized enterprises, supported the use of pesticides under the existing guidelines of Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency and BC's Integrated Pest Management Act and regulations. They do not support further restrictions and believe that pesticides are necessary and safe tools for homeowners and companies.





Myth Busting



Hydraulic Fracturing - Fracking

- Is the process of creating minute fractures in rock
- Practiced in BC since 1960s without a single incidence of groundwater contamination
- Typically there is between 2 3 km of impermeable earth between natural gas and water
- Natural gas wells are double-lined with steel and concrete to protect water supply
- It takes on average 17 million litres of non-potable water to fracture a well. Metro Vancouver consumes one billion litres of potable water per day. Gas extraction uses less than 0.5% percent of annual runoff
- Strict oversight on well drilling is undertaken by the Oil and Gas Commission with respect to seismic risk with the power to prohibit drilling.







Myth Busting

Hydraulic Fracturing – Fracking Beyond Natural Gas

- Has been successful in Canada in the petroleum industry since the 1950s
- Is the source of many products that we routinely use in our daily lives such as Butane, Ethane and Propane
- Sulphur is a principal by-product when fractured methane is purified prior to shipping.
- Fracturing increasingly used in the development of geothermal energy sources both in new wells as well as in reactivation
- Enhanced Geothermal Systems developing new sources of geothermal energy use hydraulic fracturing and large quantities of water in the production of steam to run electrical turbines.







Myth Busting



Pipelines

- The first pipelines were built in the 1950s
- In BC there are more than 40,000 km of pipelines safely transporting gas
- Natural gas is colourless, odourless, non-toxic and noncorrosive. 24 hr per day monitoring required by law
- In the unlikely event of a leak, gas will evaporate and break down to carbon dioxide and water.
- Natural gas pipelines are buried under ground not laid upon the surface
- Natural gas pipelines are not permitted to be used to carry oil







Myth Busting



LNG Storage

- Natural gas is most safely stored in a cryogenic state (-160°)
- Tilbury Island (Delta) and Ladysmith (Vancouver Island)
 storage facilities safely operate as a peak shaving facility
- Will provide a safe and clean fuel for diesel conversions
- Will expand the opportunity for wider use of natural gas in domestic applications – i.e. diesel electric generation and the replacement of dependency on propane which is more volatile



On the matter of the "real" opportunity

- LNG is a transition fuel global benefit overall GHG
- Very significant revenue to the Province to support social spending programs – health – education – social support – infrastructure and debt reduction
- Diversifying markets away from single dependency on the US will also provide a much greater opportunity for domestic application







Myth Busting



LNG Shipping

- Natural gas when reduced to -160° compresses into a liquid which is devoid of oxygen and cannot burn.
- Because it is compressed (not pressurized) a very large volume of gas can be carried in liquid state
- It is the safest method of transporting gas and has been successfully shipped since the 1950s without incidence.
- LNG carriers are specially built with exacting standards and are all double hulled
- Due to the relatively small amount of marine traffic in the waters around Prince Rupert, Kitimat and Howe Sound exclusion zones will not be required
- LNG tankers will have three escort tugs and will have a marine Pilot at the helm through their entire passage in Canadian navigable waters. This ensures maneuverability and safety
- Speeds will be carefully monitored and enforced by Transport Canada to mitigate wake issues.














Where do we go from here?

Safety: The overlap of the Sandia hazard zones associated with transiting LNG tankers onto the shorelines of Howe Sound causes many of us concern for our safety in the event of an accidental or terrorist-initiated attack on these tankers. The guidelines provided by SIGTTO, the LNG industry's own organization, suggest not putting LNG plants in narrow, inland waterways with dense local populations and significant commercial, recreational and ferry traffic. Why would that guideline not apply to Howe Sound?

SIGTTO recommends that you do not put LNG facilities on inland waterways where there is lots of local boating. He has paraphrased/misquoted the attached document to his convenience and if you read the document closely in terms of wind, wave and location its probably a great site.

There is a great deal of mis-quoting out of context when it comes to SIGTTO guidelines especially the section which suggests that a terminal establish an ignition exclusion zone (7.2.4) to control access by small craft. However, if the document is read in full the proposed terminals in BC (including Woodfibre) are well located in terms of wind, wave interaction and other aspects of the SIGTTO that describe an "ideally located terminal" if there is such a thing. See http://www.scribd.com/doc/22492559/Site-Selection-Design-for-LNG-Ports-Jetties#scribd

Dr. Finn does not \$.22 to have a clear understanding of the role of SIGTTO nor the publications it produces. SIGTTO is non Governmental and produces technical documents that are for Guidance and Recommendation only and they contain what is considered best practice. As the documents are for guidance only and not codes and standards they cannot be rigidly enforced. SIGTTO acknowledges this and that the documents are written that way on purpose so that they cannot be seen to be at odds with the Statutory Requirements of a Government or Local Jurisdiction.

Marine: Where will these tankers be re-fuelled? Port Metro Vancouver prohibits ships of this size being refueled in the harbour anchorages. Do we face the prospect of large oil barges with 3-4,000 tons of bunker fuel being towed up the Sound for refueling?

This also came up last week in Squamish. There is no restriction on vessels in the size category of LNG carriers being bunkered in Burrard Inlet, Vancouver. Indeed we already regularly bunker larger cruise ships, container ships, tankers and Capesize bulk carriers (up to 200,000 tons DWT) in the inlet. The only limitation is draft under the keel and air draft to clear under Lions Gate Bridge). In case of necessity, the regulations were amended a couple of years ago to permit bunkering in English Bay subject to favourable weather conditions. There will be no bunkering in Howe Sound.





District of Squamish invites community to Speak; Listen; Learn on Woodfibre LNG and Fortis Pipeline projects

SQUAMISH, BC – The District of Squamish has announced a focused community engagement process to inform Council of the community's opinions and values on the Woodfibre Liquefied Natural Gas and Fortis Pipeline projects. The engagement will run March 9 to 23, 2015 and will include a confidential online questionnaire, an online PlaceSpeak discussion forum, and a public dialogue meeting on March 18. Links and information are available at www.squamish.ca/LNG

"Council needs the community to provide input to us on these projects, and to do so over the next two weeks, feeding into Council discussions before we submit our official response to the Environmental Assessment Office," says District of Squamish Mayor Patricia Heintzman. "I cannot stress enough how important the public's input is to our due diligence process on these projects."

Council's official submission will be provided to the Environmental Assessment Office (EAO) by the end of April. Input gained on both critical issues and community values will complement the District's Community Committee work on the technical aspects of the project. The consultation will focus in on Squamish community members including those who live, work or own businesses here.

"We know that everyone has an opinion and we want to give everyone a chance to be heard," continues Heintzman. "The community is being asked to do three things: Speak; Listen; and Learn."

There are 3 ways to **SPEAK** and provide input between March 9th and 23rd. The first way is a private questionnaire. The second is through an online PlaceSpeak discussion, asking for comments on some critical questions. The third will be through a dialogue-based community meeting, to be held Wednesday, March 18th from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. at the Sea to Sky Hotel.

Besides speaking out, community members are also asked to **LISTEN** when taking part. "We ask people to remember that we are all friends and neighbours who *all* want the best for Squamish, and so we need to listen to one another respectfully," stresses Heintzman.

The final aspect is the need to **LEARN** from these discussions. "What can we learn about the issues, the options, our values and what success looks like? How can we help ensure the best possible outcome for Squamish?" Heintzman continues.

Community engagement expert Modus Planning Design & Engagement Inc. is supporting this consultation through the design and execution of the program to ensure that the various forums deliver high quality input to the District while allowing for a robust but civil exchange of views.

The costs of the engagement program will be billed back to the project proponents by the District. This is common practice when a municipality conducts consultation on behalf of a proponent's project to ensure that taxpayers are not required to fund such efforts. The consultation is being wholly directed by the District to meet the needs of Council through engagement of the community.





Hydraulic Fracturing - Fracking

- Is the process of creating minute fractures in rock
- Practiced in BC since 1960s without a single incidence of groundwater contamination
- Typically there is between 2 3 km of impermeable earth between natural gas and water
- Natural gas wells are double-lined with steel and concrete to protect water supply
- It takes on average 17 million litres of non-potable water to fracture a well. Metro Vancouver consumes one billion litres of potable water per day. Gas extraction uses less than 0.5% percent of annual runoff
- Strict oversight on well drilling is undertaken by the Oil and Gas Commission with respect to seismic risk with the power to prohibit drilling.












Pipelines

- The first pipelines were built in the 1950s
- In BC there are more than 40,000 km of pipelines safely transporting gas
- Natural gas is colourless, odourless, non-toxic and noncorrosive. 24 hr per day monitoring required by law
- In the unlikely event of a leak, gas will evaporate and break down to carbon dioxide and water.
- Natural gas pipelines are buried under ground not laid upon the surface
- Natural gas pipelines are not permitted to be used to carry oil








LNG Storage

- Natural gas is most safely stored in a cryogenic state
- Tilbury Island and Ladysmith storage facilities safely operate
- Will provide a safe and clean fuel for diesel conversions
- Will expand the opportunity for wider use of natural gas in domestic applications – ie diesel electric generation and the replacement of dependency on propane which is more volatile



- LNG is a transition fuel
- Diversifying markets away from single dependency on the US will also provide a much greater opportunity for domestic application
- Communities like Bowen currently dependent upon electric and propane sources may benefit from clean natural gas










LNG proponents and their prime contractors (EPCM) are global organizations with vast supply chains of proven suppliers. The normal drive for these companies is to rationalize their supply base, not expand it.

- ▶ Same message heard from original equipment manufacturers and global prime contractors in other sectors (aerospace, shipbuilding & energy).
- Even with a clear obligation to utilize local companies, their position is to only use local companies that are both qualified and competitive.
- They do not believe it is their job to develop B.C. companies.








Where do we go from here?







Global Supply Chains

LNG proponents and their prime contractors are global organizations with vast supply chains of proven suppliers. The normal drive for these companies is to rationalize their supply base, not expand it.

- Same message heard from original equipment manufacturers and global prime contractors in other sectors (aerospace, shipbuilding & energy).
- Even with a clear obligation to utilize local companies, their position is to only use local companies that are both qualified and competitive.
- They do not believe it is their job to develop B.C. companies.








Where do we go from here?
