Attached are the BC incentives/programs that were highlighted in the provincial section of the Amazon HQ2 proposal submitted in October.

Included are the three film/digital media tax credits. \$.17, \$.21 \$.17, \$.21

Also included is BCIC's Tech Co-op Grant program, which was established in order to support future talent in BC's tech sector. Tech firms hiring for co-op roles may apply for salary support upwards of \$2,700. Under the current criteria, Amazon would not be eligible for this program (companies must have < 100 employees on payroll).

Additional relevant programs include:

BCIC's Innovator Skills Initiative (BCIC-ISI): offers BC-based tech companies access to top talent and skilled workers, training of future employees, and resources for a specific project that will move their company forward. Students are selected to work with companies based on their skills and the company's needs. The students are paid through a BCIC-ISI voucher valued from \$2,500-\$7,500, which must be matched in-kind and/or in-cash by a company contribution. s.17

MITACS: provincial and federal government funded internship programs that allow for Masters or Ph.D. level research talent to help companies solve their business challenges. Internships start at four months and can scale up based on business needs. Each four month internship project receives \$7,500 in direct funding from Mitacs, with companies matching the organization's contribution.s.17

Small Business Venture Capital Tax Credit: provincial program for corporations that invest in shares of a registered venture capital corporation or eligible business corporation. This tax credit encourages investors to make equity capital investments in BC small businesses, in order to give small businesses access to early-stage venture capital to help them develop and grow. Investors receive up to a 30% tax credit on their investment \$.17 \$.17

Scientific Research & Experimental Development (SR&ED) tax credit program: provincial and federal government funded R&D program aimed at supporting innovation. It provides companies with a tax credit for eligible overhead and labour expenditures incurred in Canada for a wide range of R&D activities. For public and non-Canadian Controlled Private Companies, the federal credit is roughly 20% and the provincial portion is an additional 10%. In 2016, the program provided \$2.7 billion in tax assistance to business in all sectors performing R&D in Canada.

Industrial Research Assistance Program (IRAP): Likely not applicable to Amazon given their size, but the National Research Council's IRAP works with SMEs to provide innovation support, strategic research, scientific, and technical services. It assists firms to develop, adopt and adapt technologies and incorporate them into competitive products and services to be commercialized in the global marketplace. Funding occurs through a proposal development and review process with an IRAP Industrial Technology Advisor (ITA) playing an active, hands-on advisory role.
