Issue/Discussion:

The meeting with CCPIT Guangdong is organised at the suggestion of the BC-Guangdong Business Council. About 40 representatives of Chinese business community in BC will participate in the meeting.

BC would like to continue to expand the bilateral trade and investment with Guangdong province which accounts for 1/4 of China's total trade volume and a major source for overseas investment. The Chinese business community in BC will play an important role in achieving this goal.

Background:

- Established in 1957, CCPIT Guangdong is a provincial branch of the national non-governmental organization for the promotion of foreign economy and trade. It has established close relations with over 300 overseas industrial and commercial organizations and foreign diplomatic and consular missions in China. It has also established 23 economic and trade representative offices around the world.
- In February 2009, BC set up an International Trade and Investment Office in Guangzhou. In September 2015, CCPIT Guangdong opened its first economic and trade representative office in Canada. The CCPIT Guangdong's economic and trade representative office is based in Vancouver.
- In September 2015, BC's then Ministry of International Trade signed a MOU with CCPIT Guangdong on the cooperation in promoting bilateral trade and investment.
- Minister Ralston wrote a letter to President Lin in October 2017 to congratulate the 60th anniversary of CCPIT Guangdong and reaffirm BC's commitment to further strengthen the economic ties between Guangdong and British Columbia.
- Guangdong became the world's 14th largest economy in 2016 with GDP of \$1.15 trillion, ranking just after Russia. Guangdong accounts for 1/4 of China's total trade volume and 11% of the national consumption. It is the richest province of China and contributes about 1/7 of China's fiscal revenue.

Introduction

- Good morning. It's an honour and a pleasure to be here with you today.
- I would like to acknowledge that Mr. YAO Xinmin (SHIN-Min), the
 Vice President of CCPIT Guangdong is here with us today...
- And I would like to thank the B.C. Guangdong Business Council
 and especially Ms. Jeannie Cheng, President of BC-Guangdong
 Business Council and Mr. Siu Ngai (Ne-GAI) Lam, President of
 Canada Chaoshan (CHOW-Shan) Business Association, for bringing
 us all together to speak about matters that are important to the
 Province of British Columbia, and to our relationship with
 Guangdong.
- I would also like to take a moment to introduce you to my colleague, Minister of State for Trade, George Chow.
- Minister Chow was born in China, not far from here, and he went to primary school in Hong Kong before his family immigrated to British Columbia in 1965.
- Now, as a member of British Columbia's large Chinese community, as a businessman and as a former municipal politician, Minister Chow has much knowledge of Chinese business, government and culture.

 And like many of you in this room today with strong ties to Guangdong, this understanding is helpful-- as we seek to foster a stronger working relationship with our partners here in Guangdong.

The importance of the B.C.-China Relationship

- China and British Columbia have a long history of working together.
- From our mutual trade in goods and services, to technical cooperation, educational exchange and now booming tourism flows, our connections run deep.
- As the minister responsible for jobs, trade and technology) in a newly-elected government, this is my first visit to Asia in this capacity.
- We've travelled across the Pacific Ocean to get here, which is a really long way, but in reality, British Columbia and China are closely connected.
- Our shared history dates back to the 1800s, when Chinese migrants first made their way across the Pacific Ocean to B.C.
- And now, British Columbia is home to one of the largest Chinese communities in Canada, with relationships rooted deeply in

cultural and people-to-people ties, through family members on both sides of the ocean.

- This connection makes B.C. stand out as a great place to invest and do business because the Chinese business community in B.C. is knowledgeable about China's business and government culture.
- There is much that can draw on from each other in order to grow and strengthen our economic ties and create opportunities for both B.C. and Chinese companies.

Guangdong Sister Province Relationship:

- China is our province's second largest trading partner, with nearly \$6 billion in exports last year alone.
- At the heart of this important economic tie with China has been our 23-year long sister province relationship with Guangdong Province in southern China.
- Building on this long-standing sister province relationship, both provinces have also established the trade and investment representative offices in each other's territories.
- B.C. looks forward to continuing to work closely with the Committee of Chinese Councils for the Promotion of International Trade here in Guangdong to further strengthen these mutual and beneficial economic ties.

- Guangdong is an important trade and investment partner for BC.
- In fact, BC and Guangdong's economies are complementary and there is potential to advance greater collaboration in sectors such as agrifood, clean technology, environmental protection, forestry, liquefied natural gas (LNG), green building and tourism.
- I'd like to congratulate CCPIT Guangdong on its successes, including its 60th anniversary celebration last year.
- Over the past 60 years, the Council has contributed significantly to the promotion of trade and investment between Guangdong and the rest of the world.
- Many members of the BC-Guangdong Business Council Delegation joining today's meeting have their family roots traced back to Guangdong.
- And as I mentioned previously, the Chinese community in B.C. has contributed significantly to B.C.'s economic growth, and to the continuing friendship between the two provinces.

Goals:

 In 2015 and 2016, B.C. and Guangdong signed two Memoranda of Understanding to advance collaboration on low carbon development and on economic connectivity in support of the Belt and Road Initiative.

- Now, we're seeing more trade taking place in quickly growing sectors such as agrifoods, seafood, technology and clean energy.
- Today's meeting is both an important milestone in diplomatic relations and an opportunity for us to work together to identify additional business opportunities in Guangdong.
- We would like to continue to expand the bilateral trade and investment with Guangdong province which accounts for onequarter of China's total trade volume and is a major source for overseas investment.
- We will do this by keeping in touch with the Guangdong Economic and Trade Representative Office in British Columbia, run by CCPIT and through our Trade and Investment Representative Office, led by our Managing Director, Cathy Yao, in Guangzhou.
- Together, these offices are helpful resources in promoting trade between our provinces.
- Being here today to meet with you is an important step in strengthening our relationship, and I look forward to hearing your ideas on what more we can do to support trade and investment between B.C. and China.

- Our trade relationships in China are vital, and we will work hard to develop our common prosperity through trade.
- The Chinese business community in B.C. will play an important role in achieving this goal.

Conclusion

- I want to thank you all for coming today to hear about how much we value the well-established relationship between B.C. and Guangdong.
- As our business relationship with China is expected to grow, we know there's more work we can do together.
- I want to close by saying that Province of B.C. looks forward to keeping in touch with you and to continuing our close collaboration on projects that meet the needs of both B.C. and China.
- We encourage you to please stay in touch with our Guangzhou
 Trade and Investment Office.
