



Successful Mission to Japan and Korea

Minister of Jobs, Trade and Technology Bruce Ralston and Minister of State for Trade George Chow undertook a successful trip March 16-22, 2019, aimed at strengthening trade and investment ties and expanding economic opportunities for people in B.C.

Mission activities focused on promoting new trade opportunities in Japan under the <u>Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement</u> (CKFTA).

The official delegation undertook 32 engagements (meetings, events, and site visits), interacting with approximately 276 unique Ministers' visit included a series of meetings with government officials and industry representatives to showcase B.C.'s potential technology, digital media, information and communications technology, agrifoods and tourism.

Seafood Expo North America

The Ministry organized and delivered a trade program at <u>Seafood Expo North America</u> (SENA), North America's largest seafood 19 in Boston. The team brought 18 co-exhibiting companies to the B.C. pavilion. Seven company attendees and seven stand-alo participated jointly in programs.

While the program was led by JTT Ministry staff and US Trade and Investment Representatives, the B.C. Minister of Agriculture Deputy Minister Wes Shoemaker attended SENA in support of the trade initiative and B.C. companies present. B.C. co-exhibitor at the show, and we expect that number to increase to \$13.9 M over the next 6-9 months.

Okanagan Indigenous Outreach

This past month, the Ministry developed a comprehensive outreach to First Nation communities in the Okanagan to understand potential and areas for development with local First Nation bands, businesses, and economic development offices.

The Ministry also conducted outreach programs to the <u>Osoyoos Indian Band</u>, <u>Penticton Indian Band</u>, <u>Westbank First Nation</u>, and with identified areas of interest for business development, such as land development for agriculture, tourism, and industrial details program, specific trade development potential was identified in tourism and inland fisheries.

Natural Products Expo West in Anaheim, California

The Ministry organized and delivered a trade show presence with eight B.C. company co-exhibitors at Natural Products Expo Wollargest trade show and conference for natural, organic and healthy products last month. This show was well-attended, with an indicating that the B.C. companies who participated are anticipating sales of \$2,000,000 as a result.

Trade War Will Worsen Before It Gets Better, Economists Say

Economists expect the trade war between the world's two largest economies to get worse before it gets better -- culminating in a deal by year-end.

President Donald Trump on Friday increased tariffs on \$200 billion in Chinese goods and the Asian nation retaliated, prompting traders to price in a U.S. interest-rate cut this year and sending global stocks plunging. A Bloomberg News survey on Monday showed a majority of 40 economists see Trump following through on his threat to impose additional 25% tariffs on all remaining imports from China, with a plurality expecting those higher levies by the third quarter.

"Both sides want a deal but there will be more escalation and more tension before they get a deal," said David Sloan, senior economist at Continuum Economics, who sees a trade deal reached this year and higher tariffs imposed by the third quarter.

"It is in the economic interest of both sides to reach a deal," Sloan said. "This will hit the U.S. economy significantly and probably the Chinese economy even more."

Underscoring that sentiment, Trump on Monday warned China against taking steps to substantially retaliate. He also said he's planning to meet with Chinese president Xi Jinping at next month's Group of 20 summit, and Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin signaled that talks are better than markets assumed. Bloomberg's survey

concluded just as the U.S. Trade Representative's office released a list of about \$300 billion of Chinese goods including toys and phones that Trump has threatened with a 25% tariff.

Overall, the trade war is increasing the chances of an even worse scenario. Four-fifths of economists surveyed say that higher tariffs heighten the risk of a recession in the U.S. by the end of next year. While first-quarter economic growth blew past estimates, the expansion is forecast to cool as the boost from tax cuts wears off and global demand slows. That kind of scenario -- tariffs dragging down already-weaker growth -- could encourage the Federal Reserve to cut interest rates, according to almost half of the respondents.

By the Numbers:

- Two-thirds of economists see a trade agreement between the U.S. and China this year, while almost a fifth expect one by 2020. Five economists, or 13% of respondents to the question, don't expect a deal for at least another five years.
- Just over half see the U.S. imposing 25% tariffs on all remaining imports from China; 30% estimate no additional tariffs and 18% see additional tariffs, but at a rate below 25%.
- Of those who expect higher tariffs from the U.S., two-thirds expect them to be imposed in the second or third quarter
- Fed reaction expectations are split: the largest share, 45%, say tariffs on the remaining imports from China make the central bank more likely to cut rates, while 25% say they'll lean towards holding rates and 23% see no effect on policy.

Mom-and-pop shops could get hit hard by newest B.C. taxes

Everybody knows land is expensive in Vancouver. But Brian Wener is getting increasingly worried about new taxes coming to the air above his head.

Wener, who runs Tuesdays Fine Drycleaners in Kitsilano, has struggled to keep up with rising property taxes in recent years, as have local coffee shops, pubs, book stores and many other mom-and-pop businesses across the city. Now, Wener worries the airspace above his West 4th Avenue business will eventually be hit with two new taxes from the B.C. government: the speculation tax and the additional school tax.

"It sounds crazy," Wener said. "We are already getting squeezed, and now we are going to get these new taxes on us? ... You're getting taxed on air?" Wener describes himself as a "very typical" Vancouver small-business owner. He's a commercial tenant who pays "a triple-net lease," meaning he pays rent, maintenance fees and property taxes to his landlord.

Like other commercial tenants, he has long paid some amount of tax on the airspace above his business because B.C. properties are assessed, and taxed, based on their "highest and best use." Effectively, that means older businesses in single-storey buildings - like Tuesdays' - are assessed on their development potential, which could be a multi-storey building with commercial space on the ground floor and residential units above.

Typically, the whole property - both the existing ground-floor business and all unbuilt residential potential above - would be taxed at the commercial rate, which is about four times higher than the residential rate.

Critics have long decried this system as unfair to small businesses. Many say a possible solution could be "split assessments," meaning those unbuilt condos in the airspace over the property would be taxed at the residential rate instead of taxing the entire property at the much-higher commercial rate.

Tuesdays Fine Drycleaners happens to be one such property that has received a split assessment. That means Wener's leased property - and others like it - have benefited from some measure of tax relief in recent years. Now, though, that benefit could be negated when the airspace over their shops gets hit with two new taxes announced last year by the B.C. NDP: a surtax on homes valued above \$3 million and a speculation and vacancy tax focused on certain high-cost urban areas and targeting people who own multiple residential properties.

The B.C. Ministry of Finance confirmed in an emailed statement that the additional school tax (or AST) would apply for the airspace above "properties that have had themselves re-classed from commercial to residential."

The speculation and vacancy tax (SVT) will not apply this year, the ministry's statement said, as there is "an exemption for vacant residential land to give existing property owners time to take steps to develop their residential property."

In future years, however, it's expected that the unbuilt development potential above businesses with split assessments could be hit with both the SVT and the AST.

"Some landowners have taken steps to have a portion of the airspace above their commercial land rezoned for residential purposes and reclassified for tax purposes," the ministry's statement said. "Taxpayers are entitled to arrange their affairs to reduce their tax burdens; however, like any other property owner who has vacant or

high-value residential land, they will now be subject to the SVT and AST unless that residential land is put to use."

The Ministry of Finance didn't make anyone available for comment Thursday, Friday or Monday. The ministry couldn't provide the number of commercial properties with split assessments that could be subject to the additional school tax and the speculation tax on their airspace.

But Vancouver property tax consultant Paul Sullivan estimated the new taxes could eventually affect "hundreds" of commercial properties in Metro Vancouver.

Sullivan, a partner at Burgess, Cawley, Sullivan and Associates, has calculated that some commercial properties that get hit with these new taxes on their unbuilt residential potential could face higher overall tax bills than if they had never received split assessments.

The speculation tax and the additional school tax have received fairly widespread support, polling from Research Co. has found. Both have been touted by the government as measures to tackle the housing crisis and stabilize the market.

But applying the tax to the air above some mom-and-pop businesses seems to serve a different purpose, said Sullivan. And, he noted, split assessments have been heralded by many as a possible solution to the problem of businesses, particularly in Vancouver, hammered by soaring property taxes.

"Everybody says split assessments are the answer," Sullivan said.

In an emailed statement Monday, Vancouver's director of financial services, Melanie Kerr, said: "To further address challenges faced by small businesses, in particular those affected by tax increases arising from development potential, city staff are working with an intergovernmental working group to identify viable solutions such as split assessment."

Aaron Aerts, a Vancouver-based economist with the Canadian Federation of Independent Businesses, said news of the province's approach to taxing these split-assessment properties "seems to be bad news for small business in B.C. who were looking for help - it may be the exact opposite."

"This is problematic to me because as the province looks to fix the assessment process, more small businesses may fall into this definition," Aerts said. "Expanded split assessment is necessary, but if this is how they tax that segment, it could be even worse for some small businesses than the status quo."

Here are the Highlights for April 2019, and the briefing is attached:

- In April, employment increased by +5,900 in British Columbia to 2.56 million.
- There was a decrease of 24,000 in part-time employment and an increase of 29,900 in full-time employment.
- Year-over-year to April 2019, there are 82,100 (+3.3%) more people employed in British Columbia.
- In April, the unemployment rate fell slightly to 4.6% (-0.1 pct pts). British Columbia continues to have the lowest unemployment rate in Canada for the 21st month in a row.
 - Quebec came in second at 4.9% and Manitoba in third at 5.2%.
- Youth (age 15-24) employment increased by 10,600 in April and the youth unemployment rate fell to 9.1% (-0.9pct pts).
 - Quebec has the lowest youth unemployment in Canada at 7.0%.
- Average hourly wages are down -\$0.03 from \$27.07 in March to \$27.04 in April, a decrease of -0.1% from the previous month.
- Year over year wages are up \$0.17, an increase of 0.6%. BC ranked 8th in year over year growth amongst the provinces, with Quebec leading at 4.5%.

Canada:

- Employment in Canada showed strong gains (+106,500) with Ontario (+47,100), Quebec (+37,900) and Alberta (+21,400) showing gains in addition to British Columbia.
- The unemployment rate decreased slightly to 5.7% (-0.1 pct pts). The unemployment rate is 6% or lower for the 18th month in a row in Canada.



Minister here is the updated QA on gas prices. Its also being put on your ipad if you are looking for something to read.

Background:

- Premier John Horgan has sent a letter to the Chair of the BCUC asking him to undertake an investigation of gas prices in BC.
- The letter points out that refining margins in BC are twice the national average and asks the BCUC to hold hearings with experts and oil companies to investigate what is driving these prices.
- On April 6th, the Premier spoke with Prime Minister Justin Trudeau about options to increase the flow of gasoline through the existing pipeline.

Message:

- People in BC are rightly frustrated with gas prices that have sky-rocketed with no clear explanation.
- We have been examining options to address the situation the reality is options are limited at the provincial level.
- The Opposition's tax proposal would just be a subsidy to oil companies at the expense of services for people without bringing down prices.
- One of our key concerns has been the fact that refining margins in BC are twice as high as the Canadian average.
- We've asked the BCUC to investigate why this is the case and to call oil companies to explain the high prices consumers face.
- The Premier also spoke to the Prime Minister and asked him to look at increasing the flow of gasoline in the existing pipeline. We're pleased the Prime Minister said he would ask federal officials to look into it.

QA

Wouldn't it be easier just to expand the pipeline?

- The proposed pipeline expansion is intended to carry diluted bitumen for export.
- Trans Mountain told the NEB that their plans included no increase in refined products.
- Instead we've asked the Federal Government to look at options to increase the proportion of refined product shipped through the existing pipeline.

The BCUC study won't actually help drivers in the short term will it?

- People are frustrated that gas prices can rise so dramatically with no explanation.
- We see refining margins that are out of whack with the rest of the country.
- We want to get to the bottom of this and root out any gouging.

The government studied gas prices in the 1990s and found no gouging – how is this different?

- The situation has changed significantly since the 1990s
- The significant gap in refining margins between BC and the rest of the country really started to grow in recent years.
- We've seen a 40 cent jump in gas prices over the last 3 months that is something we think is worth looking into.

Why not give the BCUC the power to regulate prices?

- At this point we want to get to the bottom of gas prices and refining margins that are out of whack with the rest of the country.
- We've asked the BCUC to make recommendations following their investigation that could include regulation if they determine it would help consumers.

Here is the response from FIN to your question about SRED:

JTT's question refers to change announced in the 2019 federal budget to the federal scientific research and experimental development (SR&ED) tax credit:

- The federal government offers a <u>non-refundable</u> SR&ED tax credit worth up to <u>15%</u> of qualifying research and development expenditures. However, Canadian controlled private corporations (CCPCs) are eligible for a <u>refundable</u> tax credit worth <u>35%</u> of eligible research and development expenditures, on up to \$3 million of qualifying expenditures annually.
- Eligibility for the higher refundable tax credit has historically been phased out on 2 factors: taxable income (between \$500k and \$800k in the previous year) and taxable capital used in Canada (between \$10M and \$50M in the previous year).
- The 2019 federal budget proposed to eliminate the taxable income factor, effective for corporations with taxation years that end on or after March 19, 2019.

B.C. also offers a provincial SR&ED tax credit worth 10% of qualifying expenditures regardless of the type of company. However, CCPCs that qualify for the higher federal credit receive a <u>refundable</u> B.C. credit, whereas other corporations or receive a <u>non-refundable</u> credit.

B.C.'s SR&ED credit is the responsibility of the Minister of Finance. JTT is not involved in the design or administration of the credit.

What Minister actually said: We are working to advance the interest of BC technology and certainly that is one of the recommendations that the innovation commissioner has given to me, that I should work more strongly with Ottawa, historically BC has not been a strong presence in Ottawa for jointly funded

programs and so I've certainly taken his advice I've been out to Ottawa a few times and met with a variety of ministers. I think we are advocating strongly on behalf of what is a really strong and growing industry across many sectors.

Answer attributable to Ministry:

- The reference in the Globe and Mail does not reflect the context of the conversation that Minister Ralston had with the reporter.
- Minister Ralston was discussing a measure raised by the Innovation Commissioner, from a report whose recommendations we have accepted.
- One of those recommendations from Dr. Winter includes improving the way the province leverages federal investments in innovation,.
- There is great work underway with the Province and the federal government in ministries across the B.C. government. In JTT alone, for example:
 - We are matching \$22.5 million in funds from the federal government in biotech company STEMCELL Technologies to help build an advanced manufacturing facility in Burnaby and hire about 2,200 additional B.C. workers in the years to come.
 - We are providing \$112 million in funding for innovative research equipment at postsecondary institutions across the province through the BC Knowledge Development Fund since summer 2017. The BC Knowledge Development Fund is also support by the federal government.





It is a 10' Pewter Plate with a Panel Pipe First Nations design

The design on the plate is referred to as a panel pipe design and is based on the Native's ceremonial panel pipe used during ceremonial events. The pewter plates have some finely etched designs known as panel pipe designs. It is based on the Northwest Coast natives' ceremonial panel pipe used in special events. If you look closely at the designs you can see many of the figures that are the cornerstone of Northwest coast artwork and culture. Eagle, Transformer, Raven, Bear, Killer Whale, Frog. The designs on the panel are of the mythical figures around which the Natives have developed a variety of stories and legends.
