

I hope you don't mind me taking the time to email you on a Friday evening.

As you know the BC Tech association recently announced their intention to cease their support funding for the programs and facility known as "The CUBE". The CUBE acts as one of only a few VR/AR Hubs in the province, where like minded companies and startups aggregate to explore and build what the future of spatial computing will be. This includes large companies like Microsoft, Lenovo, and Amazon, as well as small companies like my own (LlamaZOO), and Cloud Head Games, Archiact, uForis and a number of others.

The CUBE's mission statement is to engage with the community and industry to provide a catalyst in the discussion, exploration, and training of the future. The economy is changing, and as we tackle major issues like transportation, trade tariffs, indigenous reconciliation, gender equality in the work place, and the transitioning of resource based industries to the new economy; nowhere else in the world are we doing this more with a technology first approach then we are in B.C. Which is why initiatives like the CUBE are so critical.

While I maintain that there is always more to events then meets the eye, I know that the BC Tech association is not without issues. A lack of clear understanding, commitment, engagement, and a revolving door of staff over the last 18 months has contributed to the association struggling to achieve the CUBE's vision and mission. A "board" of 12 volunteer community members have dedicated several hundreds of hours of their time to the initiative with frustratingly little support from the BC Tech association. Furthermore the association has ceased further communication with us, the tenants, and the landlord during these recent events. But yet we stand strong and committed.

This clearly indicates a breakdown of communication between the tenants/members and the association, and perhaps also between the ministry and the association.

I want to express my genuine care, and desire to help. Myself and several others are actively working to save the CUBE, the "board" is making every effort to keep the space alive including working with the building owners; engaging with the Canadian Digital Technologies Supercluster; InnovateBC; and exploring other private options.

Minister Ralston, I recognize that you've been a champion of our endeavours across the industry since you've taken office. I appreciate this, and I want to help in anyway that I can.

There was a change in aircraft for summer 2019 but capacity for both Air Canada and Korean Airlines are about the same for 2019 as compared to 2018-indeed there is a slight increase of 500 seats year over year. Korean Airlines operated a B777-300ER (277 seats) earlier this year and switched to the B787-9 (269 seats) for the rest of the year. The seat difference is 8 seats per aircraft so not a big concern. So the reduction in capacity was due to a change in the aircraft used in the summer and not necessarily in passengers or schedule.

Good Morning,

Thought I would send out this, there has been a few issues around the question of travel from Vic to Vancouver.

I didn't have the answers at the time so I did my own research and asked my fellow employees for some information. Here is what I found out. So I thought I would share it. If you didn't already know. These are just guidelines. Some offices prefer to travel taking different ways. (flying, ferry etc) And that is up to that office to determine what works best for them. This is just a bit of information so you can see that either way can work. (alternative travel)

As per policy,

Staff are to find the most economical form of travel if possible when travelling to meet there government business.

- Staff travelling from Victoria to Vancouver or other destinations and they are on travel status can go
 over the night before if it's more economical (cheaper) then going over the same day as the meeting.
 Especially if the meeting is early the next day.
- Car pooling, taking the ferry without using assured loading is economical. Using private lodging vs hotel is also more economical for those who have that option.
 - Flights can range from 270.00 to 450.00 one way to Vancouver. Where the ferry with a reservations is around 91.00. When carpooling the passenger pays 17.20 while the driver pays for the reservation, one passenger and car.
 - Hotels can cost from \$200.00 plus per night where lodging is on average \$32.00 a night which is way cheaper.

Here is the totals for you, if you used assured loading the day of travel and could make it to your meeting on time it would cost \$150.00 one way. You save \$4.52 if you use the above private lodging claiming the one meal and ferry one way. If they car pool the driver of the vehicle would save \$4.52 the passenger would save \$74.70 for one way, if not using assured loading and leaving the night before. So either way they choose it's still cheaper. Even if it's just \$4.52 or \$74.70

If staff could get to their meeting the same day and it's cheaper than they should do that. If the meeting is way too early and they can't make the meeting on time. They can choose to fly if it's what they prefer. But if they find it cheaper to go the night before, stay in private lodging (not hotel), plus the ferry it is cheaper then flying the day of the meeting and using assured loading tickets.

Hotels plus ferry, and the extra meal may not be more cost effective if going the night before. You would have to do the calculations to find out. There are sometimes though that going the night before and staying in a hotel is the only option because flying or taking the ferry won't allow you to get to your meeting etc on time.

Below is a few scenario's that I have come across,

- Example: If a staff member has a meeting first thing in the morning on a Friday. They decided to go over the night before leaving at the end of their work shift. Leaving around 5:00 to 5:30 pm sometimes later.
 - They choose to take the ferry (car pool) or go on their own the night before because they could not meet their government business requirements they could not take the ferry and get there for a 8:00 and sometimes 9:00 meeting in Vancouver/Surrey. Trying to avoid using assured loading.
 - If they decided to fly it would end up being more expensive.
 - Staff that choose to stay in private lodging, choose to take the ferry the day before, and claiming for dinner are trying to be cost effective and that is the whole goal of business travel. It still ends up being cheaper then flying.
 - The ones that car pool it's even cheaper
 - On the day they travel to the ferry are entitled to claim for dinner and private lodging.
 - If they had to stay in a hotel, with the ferry, meal it's up to the expense authority or the person
 doing the travel to calculate and make sure it does not end up being more expensive then flying
 the day of the meeting. Or using assured loading ticket
- Example 2: Staff are required to travel for the Minister where the meeting is on the Monday and are using private lodging.
 - If staff choose to go over on the Thursday or Friday prior to the Monday meeting and it's more economical

- Take the Ferry/carpool are entitled to dinner as per the same reasons above
- They are also can claim for one night private lodging.
- In the notes section of the travel claim they can say what days that were personal so it leaves an audit trail. And make sure you don't claim for the lodging, meals, kms for those days of personal time.
- · See policy below.

ALSO: If staff are setting up meetings, conferences etc and are asked to serve at the events and are not given a meal they are entitled to claim a meal or meals depending how long the event is.

Given snacks is not considered a meal. For those that are on travel status and having to perform their duties. The only time they cannot claim meals when attending conferences etc is if they were given a meal as part of the conference, meeting. They are to deduct the meal provided from their daily meal per diem if any.

10.3.3 Combining Personal Travel

- 1. Travel that combines government and personal business must be reimbursed at the lesser of
 - actual transportation expenses; or
 - an estimate of the minimum acceptable expenses that would have been incurred if the personal travel had not taken place.
- 2. Additional expenses arising from personal extensions to business travel are the employee's responsibility.

10.1 Objectives

- ensure effective travel management and administration, and promote economy and efficiency in the use of travel funds
- support government's commitment to carbon neutral business travel by making choices that mitigate the production of greenhouse gas emissions.
- establish standards to ensure:
 - travel expenses are proper, reasonable and necessary for program delivery
 - accountability for travel claim requests and approvals, and travel emission reports and approvals
- provide and promote alternatives to travel to carry out government business

C.6 Ferry Travel

- Core Policy 10.3.11
- 1. Claims for the full cost of ferry travel will be reimbursed and receipts for vehicles are required. The cost of a ferry stateroom must be reimbursed only if it is used for overnight travel. Reimbursement for daytime use must have written approval from the expense authority. If used for overnight accommodation, enter the cost in the "Accommodation Costs" column of the travel voucher.
- 2. Receipts state the type of ferry travel used such as ALT (assured loading), COMM (commuter loading) and SCRIP (pre-paid tickets for commercial vehicles). Where these types of pre-paid tickets are used, enter the appropriate abbreviation in the "Bus/Taxi/Air/Ferry Costs" column of the travel voucher form (receipts are required as supporting documentation).

Assured Loading Tickets

ALTs should only be used if necessary, as they cost more than regular fares. They must not be used where paying the regular fare will maintain your business schedule. See the <u>BC Ferries website</u> for ALT information.

BC Ferries Reserved Boarding

Information on reservations may be located on BC Ferries' website.

Employees are responsible for the costs associated with cancellations, except in exceptional circumstances (i.e., they are involved in a traffic accident en-route). In such an exceptional circumstance, expense authority approval is required.

Please note that as the reservation service costs more than a regular fare, a reservation is only to be made during peak travel periods. Employees must have a valid business reason for requiring a reservation. Hope this all makes sense,



Thank you again for making these meeting arrangements. We need assistance to understand how we can get a long-standing work averaging variance renewed. Our efforts so far have not been fruitful. Some context and background:

The DDO (Designated Day Off) program provides staff with additional days off over the course of each year by staff working 8.5 hour days in general, with the extra half hour banked. These banked hours are then used to cover the pre-determined/scheduled DDOs.

DDOs are distributed over the course of the year – often creating four-day long weekends by adding a DDO to a long weekend. Additionally, we are able to shut down the operations over the Christmas / New Year's period using DDOs, so staff are able enjoy this special time of year with their families, without impacting their paycheque and without having to use valuable vacation time. In 2018, for instance, we have/had 13 DDO's which represents 104 hours (13x8) that were accumulated over the course of the year by working 8.5 versus 8 hour days.

From a legislative context, the Employment Standards Act

(http://www.bclaws.ca/Recon/document/ID/freeside/00_96113_01) provides a provision for averaging work hours. The mechanism is described in Part 4, "Hours of Work and Overtime", Section 37, "Agreements to average work hours", that allows averaging over 1, 2, 3 or 4 week periods. In order for the Christmas / New Year's period to be covered by DDOs, Wood requires work hours to be averaged over a greater period. This too is foreseen under the Act, where under Part 9, "Variances", Section 72 "Application for variance", the "director may provide a variance, per sub-item (h.1), for "a period specified in section 37 (1) (number of weeks covered by an agreement to average hours of work)".

It is Wood's request that the averaging agreement that has been in place since 2001 be renewed under these specific sections of the Act. We are perplexed as to why, when the legislation explicitly permits this type of variance, that the Ministry of Labour is to this point denying the renewal of this long-standing variance. The Ministry is instead advising that Wood is obligated to pay premium overtime to eligible staff, versus allowing an averaging agreement. This is an extremely costly impact on our operation and is pushing us in the direction of cancelling the program – a program that was put in place to the benefit of our staff and has 85% support level from our personnel.

We are seeking guidance from Minister Ralston on how to approach this matter with the government such that we are able to continue with our very popular DDO program.

Please advise should additional information be useful ahead of next week's meeting with the Minister. I will confirm the attendees (likely two people including myself) in the next day or so.





I wanted to be in touch regarding the possibility of meeting with Minister Ralston in Victoria in early May regarding the issues of major projects and fly-in/fly-out workers. With activity ramping up around LNG Canada, this is a critical opportunity for us to share findings, lessons, and best practices from our research.

Over the past seven years, the UNBC Community Development Institute (CDI) has been involved in **On the Move**, a major pan-Canadian study on mobile workforces. 



The design on the plate is referred to as a panel pipe design and is based on the Native's ceremonial panel pipe used during ceremonial events. The pewter plates have some finely etched designs known as panel pipe designs. It is based on the Northwest Coast natives' ceremonial panel pipe used in special events. If you look closely at the designs you can see many of the figures that are the cornerstone of Northwest coast artwork and culture. Eagle, Transformer, Raven, Bear, Killer Whale, Frog. The designs on the panel are of the mythical figures around which the Natives have developed a variety of stories and legends.
