Katherine Rowe, Director of the Generation and Regulatory Branch, Electricity and Alternative Energy Division, has provided the following response:

Ms. Sayers is mainly correct – opportunities for Independent Power Producers (IPPs) to sell power to BC Hydro will be very limited for the foreseeable future, because BC Hydro currently has a surplus supply of electricity that is expected to last into the 2030s. Most recently, BC Hydro's Standing Offer Program, a continuous intake program for small clean and renewable projects with a nameplate capacity of 15 megawatts or less, was indefinitely suspended. This program has been the primary procurement opportunity for independent power producers, including Indigenous Nations, in recent years.

BC Hydro's electricity surplus is largely related to unforeseen changes in BC's domestic electricity demand. The Site C project will contribute to BC's electricity surplus for its first ten years of operation, but is not the primary driver of it. Site C will also enhance BC Hydro's system, providing more capacity to integrate the intermittent IPP electricity supplies that BC Hydro currently purchases from independent power producers into BC Hydro's grid; better enabling the electricity utility to continue delivering power safely and reliably to its customers.

The Province is aware that a number of Indigenous Nations have been exploring, or developing, clean and renewable generation projects in recent years, and that the indefinite suspension of the Standing Offer Program may potentially impact the economic interests of individual Indigenous Nations. The Province is engaging with Indigenous Nations and communities to discuss the extent to which the

indefinite suspension of the SOP may affect the economic interests of individual Indigenous Nations; a	nd
is committed to jointly explore options for mitigating those impacts, where they exist.

I promised to follow up on a few items at our last meeting on June 20, see below:

Interactive Digital Media Tax Credit

The interactive digital media tax credit is a refundable corporate income tax credit for eligible registered corporations that develop interactive digital media products (e.g. video games) in B.C., worth 17.5% of eligible salaries and wages. Amending the tax credit to focus on areas outside of Vancouver has been raised occasionally. For example, DigiBC requested, in its submission to the Select Standing Committee on Finance and Government Services' Budget 2019 consultation, that the credit rate be increased from 17.5% to 25%, with an additional 10% top-up for rural and northern regions.

The tax credit is the responsibility of the Minister of Finance, and suggestions to change the tax credit are regularly considered as part of the budget process. The interactive digital media tax credit rate has remained unchanged at 17.5% since the credit was introduced in 2010.

Significant considerations when considering enhancements to the credit are the costs involved (the credit is forecasted to cost \$55 million in 2019/20), the extent to which enhancements would incent the creation of new jobs as opposed to providing more funding for existing jobs, and competitiveness concerns (whether the health of the tech industry is such that it requires additional support in order to compete with other provinces).

In 2017, approximately 20% of tax credit applicants were from outside the Vancouver area, representing about 5% of the tax credit costs.

Small Business Venture Capital Tax Credit Program (SBVCA)

Venture capital is essential for BC companies to start a business, develop technologies, commercialize ideas, and grow their operations. The Small Business Venture Capital Tax Credit program de-risks venture capital investment in BC companies by providing a 30 percent tax credit to BC investors who invest in eligible businesses.

In 2018, \$38.5 million in tax credits were available enabling equity investment up to \$128.33 million annually. Since 2000, the program has helped BC businesses raise over \$1 billion in investment.

A review of the program was carried out in 2018. The goals of the review were to modernize the program and make changes that will help businesses successfully scale up and compete in global markets.

The attached document outlines the resulting changes to the Act and it's regulation. The amendments to the Act received Royal Assent in March 2019 with the Budget 2019,s.12; s.13

 year. Three initial focus areas:
 - Precision Health projects that leverage digital technologies to transform any aspect of healthcare delivery and life sciences.
 - Digital Twins projects that involve the digital representation of real-world objects or systems and the dynamics of how they function over their life cycle.
 - Data Commons projects that involve the aggregation of the diverse sources of data to create collaborative platforms on which to build new products.
- 2. Capacity Building Program Complements the tech leadership projects by investing in areas of the innovation ecosystem where there is a demonstrated need or opportunity. \$26 million over five years. Program objectives are:
 - Develop a diverse pool of talent to ensure a workforce prepared for jobs of tomorrow with a focus on improving the inclusion and participation of Indigenous people, underrepresented groups and women.
