In particular, the section below. Denise at BCFed referred me to the same study from Australia.
Cost of Paid Leave Provision to Employers
 As provisions for paid domestic violence leave are relatively new in Canada, there is no publicly available research that assesses the impacts to the Employer.
 Research from Australia, where domestic violence leave provisions for some Employers date back to 2013, suggest that approximately 1.5% of female employees, and 0.3% of male employees, are likely to utilise paid domestic leave provisions in a given year.
 Incremental wage pay outs to workers on domestic violence leaves are equivalent to less than 0.02% of existing payrolls. [1]
