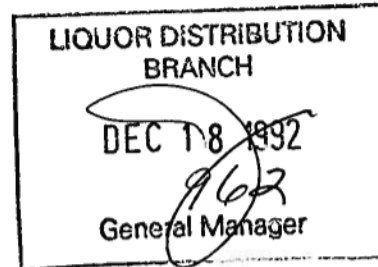

RE: REFRIGERATION SERVICE IN GOVERNMENT LIQUOR STORES

Dear Mr. Munroe,

This will confirm that, on December 14 last, we received a copy of your letter and attachment dated December 11, 1992, addressed to this Association and the Neighbourhood Pub Owners' Association of B. C., relating to the above matter.

As per previous discussions we believe it is safe for us to imply, from the time frame referred to by the Attorney-General, that it would be at least four years, from this date, before you would be proceeding with any further refrigeration in government liquor stores, beyond the initial 14 stores. In addition, we assume that no decision would be made to expand your refrigeration program until after we have had the opportunity to review with you the impact of this program.

Once again, we feel compelled to state that we are opposed to the entire concept of refrigeration in government liquor stores, for all of the reasons previously provided to you. However, in view of the fact that the government has made it clear that it intends to proceed with this initiative, in spite of our objections, we have agreed to use our best efforts to identify liquor store locations, at which refrigeration would have the least impact on our members.

The locations which we have been able to identify, to date, are as follows:
