Key Message:

- The BC Liberals made a series of bad choices at ICBC, and kept those choices and their disastrous result secret from people. Now it's people who will have to pay for their mess.
- British Columbians are still feeling the impact in their wallets from bad choices the BC Liberals made.
- John Horgan and the New Democrats are working hard to fix the problems created by the BC Liberals, and are determined to keep rates affordable for people.

Background:

- First the BC Liberals raided over a billion dollars from ICBC – money that should have been kept at ICBC to keep rates affordable for people.
- Then in 2014 the BC Liberals were warned that ICBC was headed for financial disaster, but they rejected advice on how to avoid it, deleted the recommendations from a report and hid it from the public.
- Three years later, in 2017, ICBC was revealed to be in financial chaos, with a staggering near-billion dollar loss for the year – even though the BC Liberals told people before the election it was going to be a small and manageable \$11 million deficit.

- The BC Liberals were blatantly dishonest with people about the financial mess they created at ICBC, and about what it meant for people's rates.
- Even worse – as a direct result of claims initiated under the BC Liberal government and because they ignored advice on how to keep claims under control – ICBC is looking at a staggering \$1.3 billion loss in 2018.

Take Money Away From Gangs, Give It To Victims Instead

I believe that when crime – particularly organized crime – threatens our citizens' right to live in safe, caring communities, then we need to fight back.

I need your help. The NDP wants to stop a critical program that allows police to seize drug money from gangs.

The program, called civil forfeiture, lets the authorities take cash, jewelry, and fancy cars away from gangsters. Since our government introduced it in 2006, \$73 million in proceeds of crime has been seized, with \$31 million of that re-invested to crime prevention and victim compensation.

But NDP Attorney General David Eby has worked against this program for years.

In 2009, when police tried to act after a raid that found:

A 9 mm handgun, a M1 carbine assault rifle, ammunition for both, as well as marijuana, cocaine, crack cocaine, heroin, methamphetamine and money were seized from the townhouse....

Eby said "It is very concerning that they would pursue forfeiture in a situation where they were unable to get a criminal conviction."

Province to launch coastal ferry review in January

VICTORIA - In January 2018, the Province will begin a comprehensive review of the coastal ferry service in British Columbia to evaluate its performance in meeting the needs of ferry users and British Columbia's coastal communities.

This review will identify what improvements can be made to the existing model and the Coastal Ferry Services Contract to better serve the needs of ferry users and coastal communities.

Under the terms of reference, the review will:

- * Examine whether the contracted ferry services are being provided for in a manner that supports the public interest.
- * Consider what changes to the price cap and regulatory model would ensure the ferry system is working as efficiently and effectively as possible for all British Columbians, and, in particular, for the ferry users and communities who depend on this essential service.

* Identify opportunities and recommend actions to enhance ferry service delivery and/or reduce costs without impacting existing service.

The review will not consider bringing BC Ferries back into government. The review is expected to cost approximately \$250,000, inclusive of all fees for technical expertise, research and analysis under the terms of reference to support the review process.

The Province has appointed Blair Redlin, former deputy minister of transportation and former CEO of the BC Transportation Financing Authority, as a special adviser to oversee the review. Redlin will report to the Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure, with a final report to be delivered to government by June 2018.

New Democrat statement on new disturbing details in B.C. Liberal "Quick Wins" hearing today

VANCOUVER – New Democrat MLA Ravi Kahlon (Delta North) issued the following statement regarding new disturbing details surfacing from today's B.C. Liberal "Quick Wins" sentencing hearing:

"In court today, we heard new and disturbing details about how the B.C. Liberal government systematically abused people's public dollars for their own benefit. We learned how deep and high up the scandal went, in both the B.C. Liberal government and B.C. Liberal party.

"We heard for the first time in court today that the premier personally had briefings and updates on the scandalous 'Quick Wins' program.
