- You sell a bottle of distilled liquor to your patrons, and offer customer service to the patrons.
- You bottle service package to the patrons includes its own server. The bottle is never left at the table or with the patrons, it is always in the hands of your server.
- You were coached within the last 12-14 year by LCLB to ensure you were providing this service the right way. You are not trying to hide anything.
- You are aware that this goes on at other establishments, and you feel yours is a more controlled environment than other establishments.
- You are offering a controlled environment that prevents patrons from going up to different bartenders and ordering three shots at a time.
- You are worried that not being able to continuing offering bottle service with affect your business model.
- The issues with bottle service was brought to my attention as some of the establishment in Vancouver have been advertising it on their websites, and other parts of the province think it is unfair that Vancouver is allowed to offer bottle service.
- My manager was not aware of what was going on within metro Vancouver and has asked me to look into it when establishments are selling "bottle service" to VIP tables
- I will be sending some information regarding your bottle service to policy to see what is acceptable.
- Until I have information back from policy and my manager you can continue operating as you have been. If the information/direction from policy comes back that what you are doing is against the terms and conditions, then you must look at your current business model and adapt to the Terms and Conditions.



The meeting was called, due to a series of violent incidents noted by the Vancouver Police Department. Clarke brought up the recent curb stomping that occurred outside of the establishment that will be released to the public to obtain further information. She informed Mike that the release will name their restaurant/night club. The concerning part on the video is when you see the assailant tuck their chain into their shirt and begin to square up. The assailant eventually hits the victim, and there is no movement by the establishment door-staff/security to intervene.

Mike informed us that all of his door-staff are paid \$25.00/hr to prevent greasing (taking payment to allow patrons into the establishment) and to deal with anything inside and outside the establishment. He has also stated that he has installed a camera in the back hallway leading to West Oak since the most recent stabbing. Mike acknowledged that his operation style differs significantly compared to his past business part, and that he wants to do everything that he can to comply with the LCLB and with VPD.

Clarke then brought up the stabbing that occurred in Pierre's a couple of Thursday's ago. Clarke was concerned because the first call to police came from St. Paul's Hospital around 2:00 am, an hour and quarter after the incident, and not from the establishment. She informed Tiffany and Mike, not calling the police when a serious incident occurs in the establishment is concerning and not acceptable especially since the establishment is part of Barwatch. Clarke then asked Tiffany if she knows what is going on in her room at all times, Tiffany replied with most of the time.

When the police showed up there was still blood (a crime scene) in the hallway leading to the bathrooms. Tiffany stated that she was unaware that there was blood in the establishment. She was dealing with a patron that was punched in the mouth and called the ambulance for that patron. She did see to individuals run from the establishment, one through West Oak and one through Pierre's.

Regarding the patrons that were in the establishment the night of the stabbing, they were inadmissible patrons and should not have been within the establishment. Clarke stated that these are not the type

of people that you want in your club. Bonneville then intervened and discussed an observation noted on the evening of June 23, 2018. Bonneville mentioned to Mike and Tiffany that while watching the door staff they were not properly asking for identification and seemed to be 'buddy buddy' with all the patrons entering into the establishment, which is completely unacceptable. Everyone entering into the establishment should be asked for ID to prevent the wrong people from entering into the establishment.

Mike mentioned that recently the establishment has been so focused on the numbers/capacity of the establishment and not the people entering into the establishment. It was mentioned to Mike, that the effort has been noticed on the numbers/capacity, but that he is responsible for much more than just worrying about the capacity of the establishment. Mike acknowledged that he needs to be more accountable and that there cannot be any excuses. Tiffany acknowledged that she needs to take more accountability and manage her staff appropriately to prevent these types of incidents from occurring in the future.

Mike is currently looking at creating signage that relates to searching patrons and bags prior to entering the establishment. The establishment has since ordered a head-set for the manager of West Oak, to ensure the establishment has better communication between the two sides. Mike would also like to see better communication between VPD, and that he is meeting with Tyler from VPD to open that line of communication.

In closing Clarke mentioned that her boss has asked when Pierre's is going be closed down. Mike was informed that the string of incidents that has occurred at the establishment has got to stop or else there will be further consequences.
